GI Cigar Mile H. winner Lion Tamer at the finish of the GIII Sport Page H. Those credentials have earned **Mass Media** (Touch Gold) top weight of 117 pounds for today's GII San Carlos H. at Santa Anita. The four-year-old started his career under the tutelage of trainer Cole Norman

at Louisiana Downs, but soon left the bayou for the barn of trainer Bobby Frankel. He kicked off 2004 with a Belmont allowance win in June, but faded fast in the GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga and finished seventh. The dark bay bounced back to post consecutive wins in the Sept. 12 Fly So Free S. and Oct. 31 Sport Page. Sent off the 6-5 favorite in the Dec. 26 GI Malibu S., he was caught behind horses in the stretch, but still managed to finish fifth, just two lengths behind winner Rock Hard Ten. The four-year-old made his first start beyond two turns since his juvenile campaign in the Jan. 15 GII San Fernando BC H. at a mile and a sixteenth and ran a game race to finish second to Minister Eric. He goes route to sprint, a move that has earned Frankel a 31-percent success rate. Veteran **Hasty Kris** (Kissin Kris) will have to avoid getting mired along the rail after drawing post one, but has been first or second in 11 of 16 Santa Anita starts. A winner over track and trip in an optional claimer in October, he comes off a four-length score going 6 1/2 furlongs Jan. 20.

HORSE OF THE YEAR ALL ALONG DEAD

Champion and Horse of the Year **All Along** (Fr) (Targowice--Agujita {Fr}, by Vieux Manoir {Fr}) died Wednesday at the age of 26, Three Chimneys President Dan Rosenberg announced yesterday. "All Along was euthanized due to the infirmities of old age," Rosenberg said. "You hear that phrase all the time, but I'd like to point out that the Wildensteins authorized us to treat her with thousands of dollars of drugs in the last month in our attempts to try to improve her quality of life. When it became clear that we could do no more, they willingly made the difficult decision for euthanasia." All Along was voted Horse of the Year in 1983, when she won the G1 Prix de l' Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp, the GI Rothmans International at Woodbine, the GI Turf Classic at Aqueduct and the GI Washington D.C. International at Laurel in the short span of only 41 days. She was the first foreign-based horse to be voted an Eclipse Award as Horse of the Year and was also the first to win the American title without racing on dirt. Bred and raced by Daniel Wildenstein, she retired as the leading money-winning mare in the world in 1984 with earnings of \$3,018,420 and was pensioned two years ago at Three Chimneys. All Along was the dam of MGSW Along All (GB) (Mill Reef), SW Arnaqueur (Miswaki) and three stakes producers. She is buried in the Old Bradley Place cemetery, along with Maplejinsky and Igual, the dam of King Ranch's homebred Triple Crown winner Assault.

CHAMPION ESTRAPADE DEAD

Estrapade (*Vaguely Noble--Klepto, by No Robbery), the champion turf mare of 1986, died of an apparent heart attack at Hill 'n' Dale Farm near Lexington yesterday. She was 25. Bred by Nelson Bunker Hunt, Estrapade started her career in France, winning four of her nine starts, including the G3 La Coupe de Maisons-Laffitte. She headed to North America at the end of her four-year-old season in 1984, finishing third in the GI Yellow Ribbon Invitational H. in her only U.S. start that year. The chestnut went five-for-11 in 1985, posting wins in the Yellow Ribbon, GI Santa Ana H., GI Gamely H. and GII Las Palmas H., but lost out on year-end honors to GI Breeders' Cup Turf heroine Pebbles. **Cont.**

Sent to the Keeneland November Sale that fall, Estrapade was purchased by Allen Paulson for \$4.5 million. She came back the following season to beat the boys, becoming the only distaffer to win the GI Arlington Million and also besting males in the GI Oak Tree Invitational S. She closed out her career with 12 wins from 30 starts and earnings of \$1,937,142. The Eclipse winner could not follow up on that success in the breeding shed, producing just six foals, four of them unraced. Her lone stakes winner was Rice (Blushing John), who set a course record of 2:12 when taking the Meadowlands Endurance S. Her last live foal was Holy Estrapade (Holy Bull), an unraced five-year-old. Michael Paulson had decided to pension the mare this season and she was scheduled to be moved to a farm run by the Thoroughbred retirement organization Old Friends yesterday. She will be buried at the Old Friends facility based on Hurstland Farm in Midway.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH FOR SWEET CATOMINE?

Trainer Julio Canani said there's a chance champion juvenile filly **Sweet Catomine** (Storm Cat) may race against the boys in next Saturday's GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream rather than the Mar. 13 GI Santa Anita Oaks, reports the *Blood-Horse*. Continued rain on the West Coast prompted Canani to consider the Pam and Martin Wygod colorbearer, winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, for the Fountain of Youth, and said that the forecast would play a major role in his decision. "The owner is in Mexico and is coming back [Saturday], and we'll talk about it then," Canani told the *Blood-Horse*. "But her next scheduled race is the Santa Anita Oaks, and then from there we'll see where we want to go. But right now, everything depends on the weather. It's supposed to start raining again Sunday night and continue for the next two or three days, and you don't know what's coming the rest of the week. What we're doing is covering our bases so we don't miss something. If the weather is bad next week, then we'll switch." Sweet Catomine's last start was a facile victory in the GIII Santa Ysabel S. Jan. 16.

SOPHOMORES GEARING UP AT OAKLAWN

Leading three-year-olds **Rockport Harbor** (Unbridled's Song) and **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet) were on the Oaklawn Park worktab yesterday, gearing up for a tilt in the Mar. 19 GIII Rebel S. Fox Hill Farm's undefeated winner of the GII Remsen S. posted a 1:27.40 seven-furlong workout, while the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up went a bullet six furlongs in 1:13.60. Trainer John Servis was very happy with his charge, who worked for the first time since bruising his foot last weekend. "We dodged a bullet, a big bullet," Servis said. "I am tickled to death with the work. He went a little fast early, but I loved the way

[jockey] Willie [Martinez] put him to sleep on the turn, and picked him up again. He galloped out good and came back fine. We'll see how he is tomorrow and then play it by ear." Trainer Tim Ritchey believes Afleet Alex is right on schedule after posting his second published workout of the year. "[Jockey] Jeremy [Rose] told me Alex had plenty of gas left in the tank," Ritchey commented. "It was a good building work. He started out easy and finished strong. He got his final quarter in :23 and change, which was fine. He galloped out strong and wasn't blowing much."

FALLON TAKES BALLYDOYLE JOB

Weeks of intense speculation ended yesterday when Kieren Fallon was confirmed as the new stable jockey at Ballydoyle. Despite the six-time British champion jockey denying rumours that he was due to replace Jamie Spencer as the number one rider at the County Tipperary base, his appointment was confirmed in a Coolmore press release. "Owners John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith are delighted to announce that Kieren Fallon will be the retained jockey for the horses at Ballydoyle and elsewhere for the 2005 season," it read. Fallon will give up his post as retained jockey at Sir Michael Stoute's Freemason Lodge yard, which he has held since 1999. He will also have first call on all Magnier, Tabor and Smith-owned horses trained at other establishments, while his association with last year's dual Oaks and Breeders' Cup heroine Ouija Board (GB) has yet to be confirmed.

KINGMAMBO TO MISS ONE WEEK

Lane's End's leading sire **Kingmambo** (Mr. Prospector) will be given a week off from stud duty after cutting his leg, according to the *Blood-Horse*.


"He cut his leg behind the knee and it got infected, but it's now on the mend," Lane's End Farm owner William S. Farish told the publication. "It got swollen like a leg can do. But he'll be back in action in four or five days." The 15-year-old stallion stands for a \$300,000 live foal at the Versailles, Kentucky operation.

Little Money Down to Forward Gal:

John Oxley's **Little Money Down** (West Acre), a Gulfstream allowance winner Feb. 13, breezed an easy four furlongs at Gulfstream in :52.20 Friday and will start in next Saturday's GII Forward Gal S., according to trainer John Ward. "We're bringing her back in just 20 days, and this work is eight days out," Ward explained. "With [trainer, Todd] Pletcher's fast filly [Old Hat S. winner Maddalena] in there, she'll have plenty to chase in the race." **Hot Storm** (Stormy Atlantic), upset winner of Sunshine Millions Oaks, is also expected for the Forward Gal.

Maryland House Passes Slots Bill:

By a vote of 71-66, the bill to legalize slot machines in Maryland passed the House of Delegates Friday afternoon, *Associated Press* reports. But the bill went through significant changes after being passed by the Senate last week, and the new version of the bill will need Senate approval before it lands on the desk of Gov. Robert Erlich, who is expected to sign it into law. If all hurdles are cleared, slot machines will be installed at both Laurel Park and Pimlico.

Killenaule, a back-to-back stakes winner last October, ended his juvenile campaign with a third-place finish behind Rockport Harbor in the GII Remsen S., but was a well-beaten seventh in his return in the Jan. 15 Count Fleet S. at Aqueduct. "He didn't seem to handle [Aqueduct's] inner track," trainer Todd Pletcher said of his charge's Count Fleet effort. "Our original plan after the Remsen was to keep him in New York for the winter and try the stakes there. But horses sometimes just don't seem to take to that inner track, so we shipped him down to Palm Meadows where he's been training well." Killenaule, the 2-1 morning-line favorite, will break from post nine but that doesn't concern Pletcher. "It's maybe a little further out than we'd like, but he's pretty versatile as to his running style," Pletcher said. He's got enough tactical speed to get a good stalking position, but is certainly capable of taking the lead if there's a slow pace in front of him."

American Horse Council Seeks Support for H-2B Bill:

The American Horse Council is calling for support of a bill that would grant "H-2B" visas to alien workers in the horse industry even after the Congressionally mandated cap of 66,000 H-2B workers has been reached for the year. The U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services issued an announcement on Jan. 3 that the 2005 quota for H-2B workers had been met, and that no more petitions for such workers would be heard until Oct. 1 of this year. But the "Save Our Small and Seasonal Businesses Act," a bill introduced by Sen. Barbara Mikulski and Rep. Wayne Gilchrest, both of Maryland, would exempt many alien workers in the horse industry from this quota. Super Derby Worth \$750,000 in '05:

Harrah's Louisiana Downs has increased the purse and distance for its signature event, the GII Super Derby, for its upcoming 2005 season. The race will return to its original 1 1/4 miles distance and will be worth \$750,000. The Super Derby was run at 1 1/4 miles from its inauguration in 1980 through 2001 and was shortened to 1 1/8 miles in 2002. Purses are also on the rise at the Bossier City track, with average purses expected to be \$210,000 per day, up from \$187,000 in 2004. "We are delighted to announce this purse increase," said Ray Tromba, Louisiana Downs vice president of racing operations. "This is a direct result of increased revenues in our casino and simulcast operations." The track's 93-day meet opens Apr. 29 and runs through Oct. 9.

High Limit Probable for Louisiana Derby:

Gary & Mary West's **High Limit** (Maria's Mon), who drew rave reviews in two dominating wins at Delaware Park last October, will likely make his sophomore debut in the GII Louisiana Derby at Fair Grounds Mar. 12. The bay began his career with trainer Tony Dutrow, romping by 10 3/4 lengths in his first outing at Delaware Oct. 4. Three weeks later, he captured a first-level allowance by 7 3/4 lengths while jockey Ramon Dominguez sat motionless, prompting the Wests to transfer the colt to the barn of Hall of Famer Bobby Frankel. High Limit, unraced since, worked seven panels at Palm Meadows Thursday in preparation for his New Orleans rendezvous, getting the distance in 1:25 2/5. "I think everybody was very happy with the work," said assistant trainer Brian Lynch, adding, "It looks like they are headed to the Louisiana Derby with him."

Island Fashion Big 'Cap Bound:

Island Fashion (Petionville), second to Southern Image in last season's GI Santa Anita H., is going to take another shot at the boys in this year's running Mar. 5. "I've been a little bit too easy on her," trainer Marcelo Polanco said Friday, a day after his charge worked six furlongs in a bullet 1:11.20 at Santa Anita. "She needed to show me something and we got a good work out of her. We put a horse in front of her and she relaxed the first part and went fast at the end. It was just what I wanted. Up to now, she's running in the Big 'Cap." The MGISW was last seen finishing second to Salt Champ (Arg) in the GI Santa Monica H. Jan. 30. No filly or mare has ever won the Santa Anita H. in its 67 previous runnings. Possible Big 'Cap entries **Borrego** (El Prado {Ire}) and **Supah Blitz** (Mecke) were on the Hollywood worktab yesterday. Borrego worked six furlongs in 1:12, while Supah Blitz stopped the clock at 1:16.60.

Puerto Banus Retired:

Multiple graded stakes winner **Puerto Banus** (Supremo--Drina, by Regal and Royal), a half brother to GI Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Spain, has been retired from racing after suffering a suspensory injury, the *Blood-Horse* reported. The six-year-old won the 2003 GII Sunset H. and the 2004 GII San Luis Obispo H. He was injured while preparing for his 2005 debut in the Jan. 22 GII San Marcos S. "It was a freak thing," trainer Kristin Mulhall told *Blood-Horse*. "It's not a terrible injury, but he tore a bunch of fibers in his suspensory. He's old enough and a graded stakes winner, so it's probably the right thing. With time we could bring him back, but he'd probably never be as good as he was." With his win in the Sunset H., Puerto Banus became Mulhall's first graded stakes winner while racing for the partnership of Taub, Papiano and Noctis, LLC. He was on the board in nine of 20 starts with five wins and earnings of \$380,410. Stud plans have not been finalized.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.
