Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.), who had exuded much talent in his 13-month career, posted his most impressive victory yet in leading home a one-two finish for trainer Richard Mandella in the 68th running of the GI Santa Anita H. "He's such a nice horse to do what he's done," said Mandella, who was winning his third Big 'Cap. "He hasn't raced that many times and he's accomplished everything now."

Rock Solid

Rock Hard Ten started his career under the tutelage of Jason Orman, winning first time out last February at Santa Anita and adding an allowance win in March. He ran second by a head in the GI Santa Anita Derby in April, but was disqualified to third and subsequently failed to draw into the GI Kentucky Derby due to a lack of graded stakes earnings. The towering colt resurfaced with a second, albeit 11 1/2 lengths behind Smarty Jones in the GI Preakness S., but could only manage a fifth in the GI Belmont S. He resurfaced with a sharp win in the GII Swaps Breeders' Cup S. July 10 at Hollywood, but faltered as the 4-5 chalk in the GI Haskell Invitational Aug. 8 and was sidelined with a minor illness. Handed over to Richard Mandella, he made his comeback with a rallying victory in the seven-furlong GI Malibu S. Dec. 26 and added a hard-fought nose win over Imperialism (Langfuhr) in the GII Strub S. Feb. 5.

Race Sets Up Well for Rock Hard Ten

Sent off as the 7-2 second choice here, Rock Hard Ten bounced out of post 10 and settled into a stalking fifth as Truly a Judge (Judge T C) led from Grand Reward (Storm Cat) and even-money Saint Liam (Saint Ballado), but took closer order heading into the far turn. As Grand Reward turned for home with the

lead, Saint Liam packed it in, and Rock Hard Ten loomed up on the outside. The handsome four-year-old hit the front in midstretch and strode home majestically 1 3/4 lengths ahead of stablemate Congrats (A.P. Indy). "The sky's the limit for him," said winning rider Gary Stevens, who celebrates his 42nd birthday today. "I think Richard said it best in the winner's circle that he's going to continue to improve. You haven't seen the best of him."

What's Next?

You may have to wait awhile until Rock Hard Ten's next appearance. "We'll give a little bit of a rest," said Mandella. "What that means, I don't know exactly, but we'll give him a break because we want him to be good later in the year, too."

'Saint' Doesn't March On

Saint Liam had been bet down to even-money on the strength of several top performances back East, but the bay faded when the real running began in the stretch of the Big 'Cap. "I can't see anything that went wrong right now," said trainer Richard Dutrow Jr., "but obviously he didn't run his race. I won't know more until he's checked out."

Leroidesanimaux made his first U.S. start last January, finishing a close fourth in a downhill allowance, but everything has come up roses since then for the Brazilian-bred. After a pair of allowance victories going a mile over this course, the handsome chestnut posted a front-running tally in the GII Inglewood H. at Hollywood May 1, but didn't run again until Oct. 30. He swept down the hill to win the GIII Morvich H. and tallied up the one-mile GI Citation H. at Hollywood Nov. 27 before getting a break. Breaking alertly from post two, the crowd's choice bowled along on the lead under an attentive Jon Court and turned for home with a full head of steam. A host of challengers came after him in the stretch, but Leroidesanimaux maintained his momentum and kept Buckland Manor pinned on the rail. "[Trainer Bobby Frankel] just didn't want me to get in any kind of speed duel," said Court. "And the horse is so competitive." Leroidesanimaux has proven that a mile is his metier, but he may be tried over nine furlongs later this year.

Declan's Moon burst on the scene when he upended Roman Ruler to win the GII Del Mar Futurity Sept. 8, and subsequent victories in the GIII Hollywood Prevue S. Nov. 20 and the GI Hollywood Futurity Dec. 18 secured his championship season. The ebony gelding had been training smartly this year and was heavily favored to make a triumphant return to the races. After bumping Going Wild at the start, the Maryland-bred went three wide in third on the first turn as Spanish Chestnut led from Going Wild. The trio continued in that order until the stretch, when Victor Espinoza asked the favorite for a bit more. Declan's Moon lengthened his stride and moved by a gritty Going Wild in the final sixteenth. "His ears were going back and forth, just waiting to come on and go," said Espinoza. "He's gained some weight and he's getting stronger than before. He's more relaxed and more professional now."

Previously trained by Bill White, High Fly aired by 9 1/4 lengths in his Oct. 9 debut at Calder and followed that up with a three-length tally at that track Nov. 20. The chestnut made a spectacular stakes bow in winning the Aventura S. by nine lengths on opening week-end here at Gulfstream, but came back to earth when third as the 3-5 chalk in the GIII Holy Bull S. Feb. 5 after breaking from the outside. He was transferred to Nick Zito's barn since then and had been training forwardly in the interim. Getting away smartly here, High Fly settled into second as B. B. Best led. He moved to the front in midstretch and set sail for home, with Bandini finding his best stride late. "He broke exceptionally well and was up to the task today," said winning rider Jerry Bailey. "He'll go a mile and a quarter, no question about it. It's just a question of how fast he'll do it." Lost in the Fog kept his perfect record intact with this victory. He earned a pair of triple digit Beyers in his first two starts--at Golden Gate and Turf Paradise--before winning on national TV in the Sunshine Millions Dash Jan. 29 here at Gulfstream. With three swift works under his belt since, the dark bay was bet down to 1-2 and came out running from his outside post, but conceded the lead to longshot More Smoke. The favorite ranged up to take over turning for home and pulled away from his rivals, but didn't look too enthusiastic during the gallop out. Still, the sophomore will likely be stretching out next, though his target remains uncertain. "I would say he went from being 75-25 to 50-50 for the Florida Derby [GI, 4-2]," said winning trainer Greg Gilchrist, "and we will put up the \$6,000 [Triple Crown nomination]. Other possibilities might be the Santa Anita Derby or the race in New York [Wood Memorial]. It will depend on how quick he snaps back from this race." A sizzling pace proved the downfall for 3-5 Maddalena (Good and Tough) and allowed Letgomyecho to maintain her unbeaten record. The Dixiana Farm colorbearer had rolled to a 5 1/2-length debut victory on New Year's Day at Calder and followed that up with a four-length allowance tally in a six-furlong contest over this surface Feb. 6. Sent off as the second choice in this field, the dark bay settled into fifth, nearly five lengths back of a :44 2/5 half. She took to the outside approaching the stretch and finished up nicely for her first stakes success. There's big plans for Letgomyecho. "We think this horse is dying to go two turns," said winning trainer Rusty Arnold. "The Ashland [GI, KEE, 4-9] will be next and then, hopefully, on to the Kentucky Oaks [GI, CD, 5-6]." Maddalena had no choice but to go to the front after breaking from the rail. "We were forced to go too fast to keep running like that," said jockey John Velazquez.

Stepped up in class last time, the bay finished third, beaten 17 1/4 lengths behind Sis City in the GII Davona Dale S. Feb. 5. Gaining the services of Jerry Bailey here, she was never far back, was three wide around the final turn and rallied in the stretch to post the narrow victory. "Would you believe on this big day, my partner [trainer] Bob Levine is home sick in New Jersey, but I just spoke to him on the phone and he came alive again when I called him," owner Robert Braunsdorf said. "We had high feelings for this horse for some time, but we hadn't been getting much attention. I said if we got [Jerry] Bailey to ride this horse, maybe we'll get some attention. In this race we had about a length and a half to make up in the stretch and I think Bailey did that for us today." Ideally placed a few lengths off the pace of Zakocity, he ranged up into contention on the turn, opened by daylight in upper stretch and was well clear of a strung-out field. "He's been running in tough company," said trainer Mark Hennig. "I don't think people give him enough credit. He's a better horse than he was last year." Hennig said he was undecided on Eddington's next start.
