MUSICAL CHIMES RETIRED

Musical Chimes (In Excess {Ire}--Note Musicale {GB}, by Sadler's Wells) has been retired from racing and will be sent to Gainsborough Farm in Versailles, Kentucky, later this week. Breeding plans have not been set for the current season. Victorious in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) during her sophomore season, the Sheikh Maktoum Al Maktoum homebred won the G1 John C. Mabee H. at Del Mar and Santa Anita's GII Oak Tree Breeders' Cup Mile against males last year. The five-year-old finished fifth in both starts this term, including the G1 Frank E. Kilroe Mile H. Mar. 5. The mare retires with four wins from 20 starts and earnings of \$965,489.

PROUD ACCOLADE TO MISS LA. DERBY

G1 Champagne S. winner **Proud Accolade** (Yes It's True), early favorite for Saturday's GII Louisiana Derby at Fair Grounds, spiked a fever Saturday and has been knocked out of contention for the classic prep. "It's obviously bad timing," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "We'll just try to get him back right." Pletcher still has **Vicarage** (Vicar) on track for the race, and with the defection of Proud Accolade, Johnny Velazquez will get the call on the colt. "He's been training well," said Pletcher.

"It's time to see how he handles two turns on the dirt. We're optimistic." Vicarage, eighth on the turf last term in his only prior start going two turns, finished third behind winner Proud Accolade in the GII Hutcheson S. Feb. 5.

DERBY/OAKS ODDS SET FOR POOL 2

Unbeaten juvenile champion **Declan's Moon** (Malibu Moon) is the wagering co-favorite, along with the mutuel field at 5-1, for the second of three pools of Churchill Downs' 2005 Kentucky Derby/Oaks Wager. The wager will open at 12:00 p.m. EST Mar. 10 and will continue through 6:00 p.m. EST Mar. 13. Five horses have been added to the second pool, including GIII Risen Star S. winner **Scipion** (A.P. Indy) (30-1) and **Fusaichi Rock Star** (Wild Wonder) (15-1), winner of the GII San Vicente S. Leading the ladies in the second pool is **Sweet Catomine** (Storm Cat), who was installed the 4-1 choice in advance of this weekend's wager. The towering filly, who closed out the first pool as the 9-2 slight choice over the mutuel field, stands ahead of 6-1 shot **Sis City** (Slew City Slew), who is co-second choice with the mutuel field. Among those making their debut appearance in the KOFW is GII Forward Gal S. winner **Letgomyecho** (Menifee), who was introduced at odds of 15-1. HUM ALONG DIES

Hum Along (Fappiano--Minstress, by The Minstrel), the dam of champion two-year-old filly Storm Song, died Feb. 23 at Ashford Stud while foaling a colt by Giant's Causeway. The colt, bred by Barnett Enterprises, is doing well at the farm. Once placed in two starts for the Phipps Stable, Hum Along was purchased by Spendthrift Farm for \$100,000 at the 1996 Keeneland January sale, carrying a foal by Summer Squall. Later that year, her filly by that same sire, Storm Song, won the G1 Frizette S. and G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Woodbine en route to an Eclipse Award. Storm Song was purchased by Jaime S. Carrion for \$1.4 million at the 1997 Keeneland November sale. Pregnant to Kingmambo, Hum Along was consigned to the 1999 November sale and was purchased for \$900,000 by Alexandra Scrope, who moved the mare to Ashford Stud. The following September, her foal of 1999, the Storm Cat colt Tasmanian Tiger, brought \$6.8 million from Demi O'Byrne. Hum Along, who was 16 years old at the time of her death, produced nine foals, five of which were winners. Storm Song is her lone black-type earner.

MAGNA REPLACES McALPINE AS CEO Two weeks after reporting a fourth-quarter loss of \$41 million, Magna Entertainment Corp. said it would replace Jim McAlpine as chief executive officer with Thomas Hodgson, according to the *Globe and Mail*. Hodgson was also named a board member of the company. "MEC remains committed to its strong vision and leadership position within the horse racing industry," said MEC founder and Chairman Frank Stronach. "However, at this point in our development, we need to focus on financial and operating discipline at many of our operations." According to a statement from MEC, McAlpine will remain at Magna as vice-chairman of corporate development and as a member of the company's executive management committee. Magna is one of the largest owners of race tracks in North America--operating or managing some 13 Thoroughbred sites--including top venues Gulfstream Park, Santa Anita Park and Laurel Park.

There is nothing new about South American horses excelling in North America. Just recently, however, we've been seeing a slightly different trend. This is the presence of standouts from South America, sired by stallions which stood in both hemispheres, but have proven far more successful in South America than in the U.S.

Last year, Spend a Buck, a GI Kentucky Derby winner who sired only one U.S. Grade I winner while standing in this country (and that out of a South American mare), was represented by MGISW Pico Central and GISW Hard Buck, both conceived in Brazil. Similarly, Numerous (a son of Mr. Prospector whose U.S.-sired crops weren't able to earn him a permanent place at stud in this country) has already been represented by three 2005 graded stakes winners in this country--Miss Loren, Mr. Light and Miss Terrible--who were sired from his shuttle crops. Then, a few weeks ago, Salt Lake, who had only one previous U.S. Grade I winner, came up with a second when his South American-sired filly Salt Champ captured the GI Santa Monica H. Another horse who's proved capable of getting top-class U.S. runners from his Southern Hemisphere crops, but who never worked out in the U.S., is Candy Stripes. A lightly raced son of Blushing Groom, Candy Stripes never won a black-type event, but did finish third (promoted to second by the stewards), beaten two lengths, in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas). At stud in Argentina, Candy Stripes made a great start to his new career. His early crops including Seaborg, winner of South America's greatest race, the G1 Gran Premio Internacional Carlos Pellegrini; as well as horses like Different, a champion in Argentina and a multiple Grade I winner in the U.S.; and Criollito, a Group 1 winner in his native country and successful in the GIII Churchill Downs H. in the U.S.

With his runners showing so much talent in North America, Candy Stripes was acquired to stand at Taylor Made Farm in Kentucky. Unfortunately, he didn't hit it off anywhere near as well with North American mares. From his U.S. stint (which also included a spell in Florida) he sired just four stakes winners, with only the Canadian filly Sweetest Thing capturing a graded event. Returned to South America, however, Candy Stripes has continued to shine. Not only has he sired numerous additional high-class performers in Argentina and Brazil, but has he also been represented by Eventuail, victor in South Africa of the G1 South African Guineas and G1 Turffontein Summer Cup; Lundy's Liability, winner in 2005 of the GII San Antonio H.; and Leroidesanimaux, winner of this weekend's Kilroe Mile. The Kilroe was Leroidesanimaux's sixth consecutive win from seven U.S. starts, and he's also taken the GIII Morvich H., GII Inglewood H. and GI Citation H.

Although Leroidesanimaux was foaled in Brazil, his pedigree is a very European one. Not only is Candy Stripes by Blushing Groom out of a French-bred daughter of Lyphard, but his dam Dissemble is a British-born daughter of Ahonoora. Unraced, Dissemble was sold for only 3,000gns at the 1992 Tattersalls December Sales. In Brazil, she has produced the group-winning Disport (by the Sadler's Wells horse Blue Stag); Uapybo (by Blush Rambler, like Candy Stripes a son of Blushing Groom), hero of the G1 Gran Premio Sao Paulo and placed in the G1 Gran Premio Derby Paulista; and Leroidesanimaux. Dissemble is now at stud in the U.S., and her War Chant weanling realized \$625,000 at the 2004 Keeneland November Sales, while her winning daughter Zaragoza Girl, a five-year-old by Trempolino, realized \$500,000 in foal by Elusive Quality at the same sale.

At the time of Dissemble's exportation to Brazil, she had a yearling half-sister by Kahyasi. At two, that filly would gain a stakes win in the Prix de Sablonnets and she would also be twice stakes placed the following year. It is, however, as a broodmare that Dissemble's Kahyasi half-sister--Hasili--would make her name, and in that role she is one of the greatest of her time. To date, Hasili has produced five stakes winners, four of them by Danehill. The first of these, Bank's Hill, earned championship honors in both the U.S. and Europe. Her victories included the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf, G1 Coronation S. and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois. Hasili's second foal Dansili was co-highweight older horse in England and the highweight older horse in France at 7-9.5 furlongs. He captured three group events and also earned places in six Group/Grade I events.

HINTS OF SPRING

The cast of candidates for the 2005 Kentucky Derby is beginning to take shape. Last Saturday, at Gulfstream Park, Santa Anita and Oaklawn, six colts threw their names in the hat. They join another half dozen or so who had either run earlier this year, or were top two-year-olds last year, and are nearing their 2005 debuts. Three of the top candidates are undefeated, headed by pro tem Derby favorite Declan's Moon, impressive winner of last Saturday's GII Santa Catalina S. He hasn't done much wrong, either: unbeaten winner of his four races at two and champion two-year-old colt, and a facile winner of his three-year-old debut. Perhaps significantly (as we were discussing last week), he's from his sire's second crop. His sire, of course, is the runaway success story Malibu Moon. Also very interesting, to students of pedigree, followers of the market, and the like: the top two 'third-crop' (first foals four-year-olds of 2005) sires in North America so far this year are Malibu Moon and Old Trieste--both sons of A.P. Indy.

But there is a big 'but' about Declan's Moon--his Beyer numbers. Yes, he ran a 107 when he beat Roman Ruler in the GII Del Mar Futurity, but his three subsequent numbers have been: 98 (GIII Hollywood Prevue), 96 (GI Hollywood Futurity), and, last Saturday, again 96. Even if he gets nine furlongs in next month's Santa Anita Derby, he seemingly does have to improve a lot to win a Kentucky Derby at 10 furlongs. Those who ignore numbers will love him, because he does keep winning impressively, but all the speed figure systems begin with relative times, after all, and over the years, time has always proved a reliable standard in American racing.

He could do no more than win impressively, but on the other hand, Declan's Moon isn't scaring off the opposition, either. There are two other unbeaten colts who are interesting contenders: Lost in the Fog (by the Danzig horse Lost Soldier) and Rockport Harbor, last year's GII Remsen S. winner (Beyer 102) by Unbridled's Song. Lost in the Fog took his record to four-for-four in the GII Swale S. last weekend, running his longest race yet--seven furlongs--in his fourth consecutive triple-digit Beyer number: 103 - 109 - 102 - 105 in the Swale. He's a danger to all if he keeps that up as the distances lengthen. Rockport Harbor is pointing for the GIII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Mar. 19, where he'll meet recent Oaklawn S. winners Afleet Alex (the Breeders' Cup Juvenile second, winner of last Saturday's Mountain Valley S.) and Greater Good (from the first, small crop by Phone Trick's son Intidab), winner of last month's one-mile Southwest S.

Nick Zito took over the training of High Fly after he disappointed as favorite in the GIII Holy Bull S., and the Live Oak colt duly came back to form with a game win in Saturday's GII Fountain Of Youth over Bandini, a colt from Fusaichi Pegasus's first crop who had won twice at the meet and who was clearly on the upgrade. High Fly had run a Beyer 100 when winning the Aventura S. at the beginning of the meet, and he ran a 99 winning the Fountain of Youth--respectable, but not scary. Both horses presumably will advance to the Florida Derby, where they will meet Holy Bull (Beyer 98) winner Closing Argument. Trainer Zito has already run two other interesting candidates from his barn at the meet, particularly last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile third Sun King, who ran an impressive Beyer 104 winning an allowance race two Saturdays ago. Zito also has Noble Causeway, a Giant's Causeway colt who has won two straight, including a nine-furlong allowance last Saturday in a Beyer 96. He had been second to Bandini three starts back, so--as it should--the form of Gulfstream's two-turn allowance races for three-year-old colts is holding up.

It remains to be seen whether Proud Accolade, from Yes It's True's first crop, will be as effective around two turns as he has been around one. He did beat Afleet Alex and Sun King in the GI Champagne around one turn last fall at Belmont, but subsequently flopped twice around two. He dropped back to win the GII Hutcheson S. around one turn (7.5f) last month, but his Beyer was only 93. However, one colt who will definitely get the trip is GI BC Juvenile winner Wilko, due to reappear in the GII San Felipe S. on the 19th. He ran a respectable Beyer 98 winning the Juvenile, staying on stoutly when all others had cried enough, and was entitled to lose to Declan's Moon (who ran a 96) in his 12th start at two, the GI Hollywood Juvenile. History has hammered home the lesson that these are two things you must be able to do to win the Kentucky Derby: you must have the seasoning, and you must get the trip. Whether he has the inherent class to win a Classic, we shall see (he was outclassed by Europe's top two-year-old, Shamardal, when they met in Goodwood's GII Vintage S. last year). But he will not fail for lack of seasoning or lack of stamina, I'd bet on that.

Interestingly, Wilko's British trainer, Jeremy Noseda, may have another rabbit to pull out of his hat for American racegoers: this is a colt called Stagelight, from the first crop of maybe the best horse ever sired by Sadler's Wells (that's saying something), Montjeu. Bought privately out of Aidan O'Brien's yard after finishing sixth of seven in a seven-furlong Listed race, Stagelight resurfaced in January and won a seven-furlong conditions race at the Dubai Carnival. He then came back and won the GIII UAE Guineas at a mile, again on the dirt. Meanwhile, the colt he had beaten in his first race, a Dynaformer colt called Parole Board, came back and hosed up in a maiden race. Last Saturday, Parole Board won easily again, running an estimated Beyer figure of 101. The colt he easily beat in his maiden win, a Giant's Causeway colt called British Isles, came back and broke his maiden. Parole Board, who is owned by Sheikh Mohammed's son, Sheikh Rashid, is evidently not under consideration for Kentucky; his trainer is keen to move him to the turf after the Mar. 26 UAE Derby, and he is quoted at 33-1 for the Epsom Derby. But, if Stagelight can again beat Parole Board--and whatever Godolphin has up their sleeve--on Mar. 26, over nine furlongs on the dirt, connections might well be tempted to bring him to Kentucky. I doubt that too many pundits (this one included) would have had Montjeu on their list of first-year sires likely to have a runner in the Kentucky Derby in his first crop.

Hasili's fourth foal Intercontinental recently took the 2004 renewal of the GI Matriarch S., and the fourth, Cacique--a three-year-old of 2004--has taken the G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein and G3 Prix Daphnis as well as finishing second in the G1 Prix Jean Prat and G1 Grand Prix de Paris. Each member of that quartet was sired by Danehill. To the cover of Green Desert, Hasili produced Heat Haze, heroine of four graded stakes, including the GI Beverly D. S. and GI Matriarch S. in 2003.

Another half-sister to Dissemble, Arrive (also by Kahyasi), was a Listed winner in England, while a third half-sister, Skiable (Niniski) was stakes placed and is dam of the 2003 G3 Coventry S. winner Three Valleys. That Juddmonte runner, now campaigning in the U.S., placed third to Leroidesanimaux in the Citation.

Dissemble's granddam Sookera was a member of the first crop sired by Roberto. She won the G1 Cheveley Park S. and Chesham S. and was named champion two-year-old filly in Ireland. She subsequently produced three stakes winners, including G1 Nunthorpe S. victor So Factual, and G3 July S. hero Bold Fact. She is also third dam of Hawksley Hill, a winner of nearly \$1.5 million. Hawksley Hill is by Rahy, a son of Blushing Groom, which makes him bred along similar lines to Leroidesanimaux.

Rush Bay Out of La. Derby:

GSP **Rush Bay** (Cozzene), runner-up in last year's GII Kentucky Jockey Club S., will bypass Saturday's GII Louisiana Derby and will likely resurface in an Oaklawn stake or allowance test. "The owner [Phoebe Mueller] is from Arkansas, so we'll look there," said trainer Tom Amoss. The bay finished eighth most recently in the GIII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds Feb. 12.

Fair Grounds Announces Purse Increase:

New Orleans's Fair Grounds Race Course announced yesterday it would boost overnight purses by 12 percent, effective Friday, Mar. 11. The increase, which track officials attributed to strong on-track handle and simulcast sales of the track's live racing cards, will include the final 12 days of Fair Grounds's 133rd season. "We are pleased to be able to elevate our purse structure for the remainder of the season," said Randall Soth, Fair Grounds' president and general manager. "It is especially gratifying that we are able to make this offering even though we have already paid \$500,000 more in purses to date than we did last season." An average of \$24,000 per day will be added to overnight purses. The increase does not include stakes races.

A well-known politician, Clay served as a state representative, United States Senator, Congressman, Speaker of the House and Secretary of State and three times ran for President. In his role of gentleman farmer, Clay developed his Ashland estate into a national model of progressive farming and was one of the leaders in establishing the bluegrass region of Kentucky as the nation's premier Thoroughbred breeding center. The Horse Park exhibit recaps the story of Clay and his heir's role in the development of Kentucky as a breeding Mecca and features original furniture, silver and paintings, along with Civil War and horse related artifacts. It runs through Oct. 31.

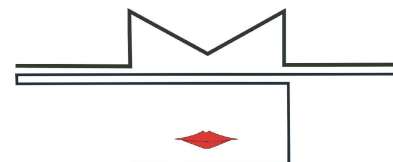

ANOTHER JOCKEY ARRESTED IN PROBE

The City of London Police have arrested a sixth jockey in connection with the on-going investigation into alleged race-fixing. Gyles Parkin, 32, had been associated with father and son trainers Mick and Tim Easterby before a heavy fall in 2002 put his career on the sidelines. Held on suspicion of conspiracy to defraud, Parkin becomes the 26th person to have been arrested in the investigation, including the former British champion jockey Kieren Fallon.

TOTE OPENS UP VIA AT THE RACES

Punters in Europe and North America can now bet directly into the English Tote due to a deal struck between that organisation and At The Races, it was announced yesterday. As part of the continuing program of incorporating a worldwide audience for its channel "At The Races International," ATR will be available in North America within weeks via the web and simulcast networks. "At The Races, as a British company with the well-being of the British horseracing industry as its top priority, is in the best position to be able to maximise international revenues and feed them back into the sport," commented Chief Executive Matthew Imi yesterday.

THIS WEEK IN HISTORY...

March 10, 1808...Diomed, winner of the inaugural Epsom Derby in 1780, died in Virginia at age 31. Imported to the U.S. in 1798, he became an influential American sire.

March 10, 1993...Jockey **Eddie Delahoussaye** became the 14th rider to record his 5,000th career winner, riding Ackler to victory at Santa Anita.

March 11, 1943...After siring 350 foals who won over \$3 million, 26-year-old **Man o' War** was retired from stud duty.

March 12, 1966...In the last race of his 40-year career, **John Longden** won the San Juan Capistrano H. at Santa Anita Park aboard George Royal. He retired with a then-record number of victories, 6,032.

RORY'S JESTER FILLY TOPS PERTH SALE A filly by Rory's Jester (Aus) topped the Western Australia record when she sold for A\$200,000 at Tuesday's first session of the Magic Millions Perth Yearling Sale. Lindsay Park agent Mark Pilkington signed the ticket for [lot 113](#), a full sister to the highly regarded two-year-old Shan Dian (Aus). Pilkington admitted to going over "his limit" to outbid the Belhus Racing team, but felt the New Zealand-bred chestnut was a standout. "We have the full sister Shan Dian back at home and we think she is a great talent," Pilkington reported. "And I bought this filly tonight for the same syndicate that race her." Pilkington indicated that the syndicate that would race the filly would include Lindsay Park owner David Hayes, who will train her when he returns from Hong Kong in September. "The other members of the syndicate are from Western Australia and they have been great supporters of Lindsay Park over the years," he added. Oakland Park Stud consigned the topper, the second foal from Group 3 winner Paradise Park (Aus) (Bletchley Park {Ire}). "She was a really lovely filly," said Oakland Park's Neville Duncan. "It is great to see such good judges bidding on her and she is sure to get every chance with Lindsay Park." Oakland Park sold the session's three top-priced yearlings. "It's been a great sale to date," Duncan continued. "We're very happy with the results so far and I'm glad others share the good opinions I had on the three horses tonight."
