BIG DAY ON TAP DOWN IN THE BAYOU

Fair Grounds drew its fields for Saturday, with the GII Louisiana Derby leading the way. The regally bred **Scipion** (A.P. Indy), winner of the GIII Risen Star S. Feb. 12, breaks from the seven post with Gary Stevens aboard. **High Limit** (Maria's Mon) opened some eyes winning a maiden and allowance at Delaware last season, and makes his much anticipated sophomore debut from the three hole with Ramon Dominguez in the irons. **Runway Model** (Petionville), winner of the GII Alcibiades S., and GIII Silverbulletday S. victress **Summerly** (Summer Squall) should make for an exciting running of the GII Fair

Grounds Oaks. While most of the focus will be on the sophomores Saturday, the best race of the day will come in the GII New Orleans H. **Badge of Silver** (Silver Deputy) made a sparkling seasonal debut, winning Gulfstream's GIII Hal's Hope S. by a neck over Dynever Jan. 8, and has his sights set on the nine-furlong test. He will face a solid cast, which includes MGSW **Limehouse** (Grand Slam), GSW **Second of June** (Louis Quatorze) and MGSW **Pollard's Vision** (Carson City).

SLOTS FOR GULFSTREAM, NOT CALDER

There will be slot machines in Gulfstream's immediate future, but not in Calder's. In Broward County, home of Magna Entertainment's Gulfstream Park, 57 percent of voters supported the plan to allow slot machines at pari-mutuel facilities, but in Miami-Dade County, home of Churchill Downs Inc.'s Calder Race Course, 52 percent voted against the measure. "We are gratified to see that voters have spoken in the way that we thought they would," Gulfstream President Scott Savin told *Associated Press*. But Tuesday's referendum was just one more step in the process to get slots up and running at the track. State legislators in Tallahassee will now decide how many slots will be allowed at each facility, what hours they can operate and how they will be taxed. "November was the first hurdle, this was the second hurdle and Tallahassee may prove to be the biggest hurdle of all," Savin said. A last minute anti-slot campaign led by Governor Jeb Bush was cited as the difference in Dade. "It is clear that Gov. Jeb Bush impacted the election results in Miami-Dade County," Thomas Meeker, president and chief executive officer of Churchill Downs, said in a statement. But the referendum could be back in front of Miami-Dade voters in two years, and Meeker views Tuesday's result as a temporary setback. "Churchill Downs Incorporated and Calder Race Course are now focused on 2007 and the opportunity to again take this important message of economic opportunity to the voters of Miami-Dade County," he said. "We are committed to South Florida horse racing and will continue to work with the members of the pari-mutuel coalition in both Miami-Dade and Broward Counties to further this important issue." Dan Adkins, an executive at Broward County's Hollywood Greyhound Track, remains confident that voters will change their minds in two years. "When Dade County sees how positive this is, when they see the capital improvements, the jobs created, Dade will see how this will work" Adkins told the *Miami Herald*.

Baffert Leaning towards San Felipe for Ruler...

Trainer Bob Baffert is leaning towards running **Roman Ruler** (Fusaichi Pegasus) in the Mar. 19 GII San Felipe S. rather than the GIII Gotham S. on the same day. Off since finishing fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile as the 2-1 choice, the sophomore worked one mile from the gate in 1:38 3/5 at Santa Anita yesterday, going in company with 2004 GII San Felipe winner Preachin at the bar. "I had to go with my gut feeling and he needed something like this," Baffert said of working Roman Ruler in company. "I like what I saw and I think he can go forward from here." Also probable for the 1 1/16-mile San Felipe are, **Don't Get Mad** (Stephen Got Even) **Consolidator** (Storm Cat), **Wilko** (Awesome Again), **Golden Shine** (Touch Gold) and **Giacomo** (Holy Bull).

KINGMAMBO RETURN TO STUD DELAYED

Kingmambo (Mr. Prospector--Miesque, by Nureyev), who was removed from his stud duties at William S. Farish's Lane's End Farm in February with a leg injury, will be given an additional three weeks off as he recovers from an arthritic condition in his lower neck. The 15-year-old stallion is also being treated for an EPM infection. Recent radiographs and a bone scan have revealed arthritis in the left facet joint of his C-6/C-7 articulation, an area that is commonly subject to wear and tear

due to the way horses arch their necks during the breeding process. The decision to delay Kingmambo's return to the breeding shed was made in conjunction with veterinarians. In the interim, Kingmambo will continue on a course of normal arthritis treatments of gastrointestinal protectants, and will receive the EPM treatment Marquis. During the 2005 breeding season, the stallion has covered 10 mares, four of which have been confirmed in foal. Three mares did not appear to take, while the other three, bred just this week, have yet to be scanned. While away from his duties, Kingmambo will be on his regular paddock turn-out at the farm. He will be closely monitored, with a breeding re-evaluation due Apr. 1.

RECORD STAKES SCHEDULE AT DEL MAR Del Mar has announced a record stakes schedule of \$6,775,000 for its 2005 meeting. The 43-day summer meeting, featuring 29 stakes races, will run from July 20 to Sept. 7. Topping the stakes schedule is the \$1-million GI Pacific Classic Aug. 21. Other Grade I races on tap are the GI John C. Mabee H. July 23, GI Eddie Read H. July 24, GI Bing Crosby H. July 31, GI Del Mar Oaks Aug. 20 and GI Del Mar Debutante S. Aug. 27. Track officials have opted to contest the one-mile GII Del Mar Breeders' Cup H. on the turf and have boosted the purse for the Sept. 4 event to \$350,000. "This is probably the most exciting stakes schedule we've ever presented at Del Mar," said the track's president and general manager Joe Harper. "We've made it richer, bigger and better--and you can't do much more than that." The complete schedule is available on www.delmarracing.com.

Clock Stopper Ready for the Richter Scale:

Clock Stopper (Gilded Time), winless in seven attempts since posting an \$80,000 optional claimer at Churchill last June, is on target for a start in Saturday's GII Richter Scale Breeders' Cup at Gulfstream. The five-year-old has faced top sprinters since his last victory, including second-place finishes in the GI Forego H. and GII Vanderbilt and a third-place finish in the GI De Francis Dash. "He absolutely needs a fast pace because he is a true come-from-behind sprinter," said Joanne McNamare, Dallas Stewart's assistant trainer. "He loves to close and the seven-eighths should really suit him." He was last seen finishing second in the Colonel Power H. at the Fair Grounds Jan. 9.

Breeders' Incentives Pass Legislature:

State Senator Damon Thayer announced yesterday that the Senate and House passed Governor Ernie Fletcher's tax modernization and budget bills. House Bill 272, the tax modernization plan, includes a provision that would create a breeders' incentive plan in the state of Kentucky by diverting taxes from the general fund to three breeding incentive funds to be administered by the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority. "I am grateful to Governor Fletcher for his commitment to Kentucky's top agricultural industry," Thayer commented. "This incentive for the horse breeders will help Kentucky retain its position as the Horse Capital of the World."
