**It's a Wonder...**

Another highlight of the Murray Smith consignment is hip 11, a filly by Wild Wonder out of Grannies Feather (At Full Feather). The gray is a full sister to Fusaichi Rock Star, who brought \$825,000 at the 2004 Fasig-Tipton Calder sale and this year proved himself worthy of the price tag with a win in the GII San Vicente S. But there is another reason that this one is special to Smith. "I bought the dam at the Texas yearling sale in 1995 for \$11,500--she was the most expensive At Full Feather ever," she recalled. "She was big and gorgeous, but with no pedigree. I sold her as a two-year-old for \$25,000. She got hurt and ended up as a dressage horse. I think the story is that the lady who owned her got pregnant, but didn't want to sell her because the horse was her pet. She contacted a friend, Joe Sankovich in Ocala, and he told her he'd just gotten a free breeding season to Wild Wonder and to send the mare on over. A couple of years later, I was at Joe's looking at some horses and he showed me this filly, and I couldn't believe it. I had to buy her. It's a neat story--everything comes full circle."

**A Breath of Fresh Air...**

One quarter of the 12-horse consignment that Becky Thomas' Sequel Bloodstock brings to Barretts this year are by freshman sires. Headlining the trio is hip 8, a colt by Horse of the Year Tiznow (Cee's Tizzy) that was clocked in :10 during the first under-tack show. But the move was not typical of what Thomas has seen in the first crop by Tiznow. "The Tiznows don't look like they have that early speed--they aren't 5 1/2-furlong horses," she said. "This colt is speedier than you'd

expect, but he is still more of a distance type. He was not precocious, not right away. He's very, very laid back. I had to train him to do what I wanted, which was go fast." But Thomas believes the sons and daughters of the two-time Breeders' Cup Classic hero will be worth the wait. "Obviously,

I loved Tiznow as a racehorse and I have bred mares to him," she said. "It's great that you can get to a horse of that caliber for \$30,000." The Florida-based consignor is also pleased with what she has seen in the progeny of the top sprinter Five Star Day (Carson City), sire of hip 181. "I love the Carson City-line stallions," Thomas said. "They are just hard-knocking, hard-hitting horses. And, because of [hip 181], I booked two seasons to Five Star Day this year, and I bought a mare in foal to him. I really liked her from the git-go." The chestnut also dashed off a furlong in :10 flat at the first preview. "She is very fast," Thomas said. The trio of first-crop lots is rounded out by the final two-year-old in the catalogue, hip 202, a daughter of GII Del Mar Futurity winner Forest Camp (Deputy Minister). A May foal, she went an eighth in :10.50 at the first under-tack show and bettered that time by a tick Sunday. There is another freshman that has caught Thomas's eye, although she doesn't have a representative of his at Barretts. "The two-year-olds by Songandaprayer have worked well and sold well," she said. "They definitely look early. He is worth watching."

**Getting the Jump on the Competition...**

Paula Capestro started her horse trading days with Thoroughbreds she got off the track, training them as hunters and jumpers and putting them on the market.

She also spent nearly two decades wheeling and dealing in real estate, but returned to the horse business in 1993 and is now making a name for herself as a consignor. "I was selling seven or eight horses a year when I was in my early 20s, but eventually decided to pursue real estate instead," Capestro explained. "I did that for 15-20 years and was just riding on the side, but time was marching on, so I thought I'd stick my nose into the racehorse business. I got my trainer's license in Florida with the help of Janet del Castillo, and that was when I was

introduced to pinhooking. I got my first peek at it and thought, 'Hmmm, this is interesting. Maybe I could support myself by buying and selling horses.' I just picked up the phone book and found Jerry Bailey, and he was kind enough to help me out." After learning the ropes with the help of Bailey, Capestro returned west and got her California trainer's license with the help of Gloria Haley. "I started on a very small scale--I didn't have much money," she remarked. "Jerry had taught me how to condition the horses for the sale, and I would get them ready here in California, then put them into Jerry's consignment and he would sell them for me. I had just two or three horses every year. After a few years, some friends encouraged me to try selling the horses myself, so I did, and I have done OK." Capestro, who trains at San Luis Rey Downs in California and also owns a farm in Ohio, had the sales topper at the Barretts May Sale in 2003, selling a French Deputy filly for \$375,000. She sold a pair at Barretts March 2004, including a Lion Hearted filly that brought \$240,000. But her 2005 March consignment could be the best yet. "I just love the horses that I have," she said. "They are all good at what they do. I think I have quality bloodstock, and I just hope that everybody likes them as much as I do."

**A Team Effort...**

Capestro sells many of the horses in association with Kathleen Schonefeld. "We have a great partnership," Capestro said. "She has a great eye for a horse and, being based in Kentucky, she gets to see a lot of these horses before anyone else. A lot of times, that helps us buy at a good price. We have a good working relationship and we have been lucky together." The two are offering a colt by A.P. Indy and a filly by Giant's Causeway today (see *Hip Happenings*). But her door is also open to new clients. "I am always looking for investors who have confidence in our program and want to invest with us," she said. "You can always use additional funding. That just allows you to be that much better at your job." At any level, it's a job Capestro loves doing. "I love working with babies," she said. "I'm really into horse health--it's a big thing to me to have happy, healthy horses. I devote a lot of my time and money to promoting the welfare of the racehorse, and I like doing it. I am a lucky person."

**An Awesome Display...**

Jerry Bailey was the leading consignor at Barretts March 2004, selling eight of the 11 he sent through the ring. The offering starred \$2-million sales topper **Dubai Escapade** (Awesome Again), a half sister to GISW Mad-cap Escapade, who broke her maiden in impressive fashion at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 5. The Bailey consignment realized an aggregate of \$3,605,000 last year, an average of \$450,625. But the best could be yet to come for Bailey. "I feel like we have the best set of horses we've ever taken to a two-year-old sale," he

said of the group he will send through the ring at Barretts today. "Horse by horse, there is a consistency of quality. They have worked well--we had six horses breeze in :10.20 or better at the first preview, and that's hard to accomplish. That speaks for the quality, and the physicals

match the way they look on the racetrack. When that happens, you know you have a pretty good group of horses." One of the potential headliners in the barn--hip 171, a Maria's Mon colt out of a half sister to Storm Cat--was unable to strut his stuff at the first preview due to a bout of colic (*see Hip Happenings*). But, training under optimum conditions at the home base in Ocala, Florida, it is rare for a horse in Bailey's barn to miss a day at the track. It is this fact that keeps the horseman stabled out east, despite the fact that he has been concentrating his energies on the Barretts Sale for the past few years. "There's no place better for a training base than Ocala," he said. "If you think of all the rainfall that they've had here in California this winter, you know that they've had to miss a lot of training. In Ocala, that's rare. Even if there is rainfall, we have sandy tracks that handle it well. In California, they aren't always able to get on the track. That gives us a big advantage. In Ocala, you can get on the track most every day of the month, and that's so important when you are trying to get these young horses ready for the sales. You don't have a lot of time to waste." Bailey hopes that extra edge will be evident in the bidding, but he is wary after watching the first two juveniles sales this year. "The two-year-old market is strong at the top, but it looks like the middle isn't the greatest," he remarked. "When you see only four out of 10 that make the catalogue sell at Fasig-Tipton, that's kind of scary for a consignor. It is a must for pinhookers to sell horses."

**Tough Act to Follow...**

The 2004 Barretts March Sale featured the dispersal of a majority of The Thoroughbred Corp. holdings, which saw 52 hips sell for an aggregate of \$6,453,200. Last year's catalogue saw 79 hips bring \$13,728,000, an average of \$173,772 and a median of \$100,000. Can those figures be matched in 2005? Gerald McMahon is confident they can. "I think the catalogue is better this year," he remarked. "We have a larger number of the better horses and we're optimistic, because that dictates the sale." But McMahon admitted it is hard to predict what the market will do after studying the results at the OBS February and Fasig-Tipton Calder sales. "I think we have had mixed signals thus far in the two-year-old market," he said. "The first sale at OBS was very solid, with the middle-market horses selling well, and there were great prices at Fasig-Tipton at the top end, but it was hard to get a lot of those horses sold. Our sale is composed of both types of horses. We have a lot of middle-market horses, and those are the ones we are anxious about." If the first preview is any indication, however, there will be plenty of action at the Hinds Pavilion today. "We had really good attendance at the first preview," McMahon explained. "We did some promotion with the Thoroughbred Owners of California to really encourage owners to come out and I think that paid off. We had a lot of owners here--we served about 320 meals--and it was a lot bigger than the first show has ever been." He added, "The signs are positive, now it's just a matter of translating those signs into solid prices across the board."

From the first crop by Tiznow, who had a two-year-old sell for \$1 million at Fasig-Tipton Calder, the bay is a half brother to MGSW Sapphire N' Silk (Pleasant Tap). This is also the immediate family of graded winners Pok Ta Pok, Eagleton, Popol's Gold and Penny's Reshoot. The colt, purchased for \$120,000 at the FTSAUG sale, was clocked going an eighth in a rapid :10 flat at the first preview. "He has a lot of Dixieland Band in him," Becky Thomas said. "He is good-bodied, his hocks are behind him. He looks like he will get a distance."

**Hip 11, f, Wild Wonder--Grannies Feather, by At Full Feather**  
*Consigned by Murray Smith, agent*

The gray, named Bliss Fit, is a full sister to Fusaichi Rock Star, who brought \$825,000 at the 2004 Fasig-Tipton Calder sale. That colt has since won two of his five starts, including the GII San Vicente S. last time out. Bliss Fit was sharp in the first under-tack show, going a quarter in :21.50. "She's gorgeous," Murray Smith said. "She's a big, beautiful, gray filly, a beautiful mover, and the update with 'Rock Star' winning is certainly plenty helpful."

The dark bay filly is a half sister to Kicken Kris (Kris S.), who won the GI Secretariat S. and was placed first in the GI Arlington Million last year. Her sire, Forestry, had a \$3-million colt and a \$725,000 filly at Fasig-Tipton Calder, and his eight juveniles sold thus far this year have realized a median price of \$350,000.

Pegged as one to watch by consignor Jerry Bailey, the bay breezed a furlong in :10.20 at the first under-tack show. His second dam is GIII Fair Grounds Oaks winner Marshua's Echelon, who produced GISW Run Man Run. His sire, Grand Slam, had a \$2.9 million colt at Fasig-Tipton, and his four juveniles sold this year have realized a median price of \$300,000. "I've always been very fond of him," Bailey said. "He has taken everything in stride, like a good horse will do."

**Hip 45, c, Hennessy--Meadow Flyer, by Meadowlake**  
*Consigned by Jerry Bailey Sales Agency, agent*

Just a tick off the fastest work of the day, the chestnut dashed off an eighth in :9.90 at the first under-tack show. Out of a stakes-placed mare who has already produced six winners, he was a \$180,000 FTKJUL yearling. "He looks the part," Jerry Bailey said. "He would have to be one of the better horses in my consignment."

The only A.P. Indy at the sale, he is out of a half sister to SP Morning Devotion, who is the dam of European champion Balanchine, winner of the G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 Irish Derby; as well as Group 2 winners Romanov (Ire) and Red Slippers. His second dam is a half sister to champion It's in the Air. The colt's three-year-old half brother, Spirited Way (Fusaichi Pegasus), was a \$500,000 FTSAUG yearling. "He is a solid, big-time horse," Paula Capestro said. "He's strong, and it's all natural--I haven't pushed him at all. He's sound and he has a lot of air. He's the kind of horse you'd really like to have in your barn, the kind you dream about."

Now named Stormer, the chestnut filly is the lone Giant's Causeway at Barretts this March. She is from the family of GSW Wortheroatsingold, dam of GSW Daylight Savings, but Paula Capestro feels she favors her sire's side of the tree. "She is awesome," Capestro said. "She has a beautiful pedigree and she's very precocious. There isn't another filly who can gallop next to her, she's that aggressive. They can't go head-and-head with her. She will definitely be an aggressive racehorse. That's what Giant's Causeway throws--tough, tough horses."

A May foal, the bay was precocious enough to go an eighth in :10.50 at the first preview and followed that up with a quarter in :21.50 Sunday. A daughter of stakes winner Sun Luck, she is a half sister to stakes winner Tahoe City (Fast Play), from the family of graded winners Hawkin's Special and Chati.

**Hip 120, f, Fusaichi Pegasus--Synformer, by Sovereign Dancer**

*Consigned by H.T. Stables (Allen Jenkins), agent for Cam Allard*

The only FuPeg in the sale, she was clocked going a furlong in :10.10 at the first preview. The dark bay, a January foal, is a half sister to GII Blue Grass S. winner Wild Syn. Her page also features Grade I-winning juveniles All Fired Up and Awesome Humor. She brought \$200,000 as a KEESEP yearling.

**Hip 129, c, Indian Charlie--Tupelo Belle, by Turkoman**  
*Consigned by H.T. Stables (Allen Jenkins), agent*

This one caught the crowd's attention at Sunday's under-tack show, drilling an eighth in a bullet :10 flat, and was out for inspection by the right buyers after the work. A half brother to stakes winner and Puerto Rican champion Mister Fanucci (Announce), the bay is from the family of Canadian champion Silken Cat, herself the dam of 2004 Eclipse winner Speightstown.

**Hip 135, f, Tale of the Cat--Unchained Princess, by Clever Trick**

Tale of the Cat had them talking at Fasig-Tipton Calder, topping the sale with his \$5.2-million colt. While just four of his 14 juveniles through the ring this year have sold, that quartet have realized a median price of \$450,000. This filly, a \$145,000 FTKJUL yearling that sold in utero for \$125,000 at Keeneland November, breezed a furlong in :10 flat at the first preview. She is a three-quarter sister to SW Unchained Storm (Storm Creek) and half to SP Valid Miss Chain (Valid Appeal) and SP Sweep Princess (End Sweep).

**Hip 143, c, Songandaprayer--What a Knight, by Tough Knight**  
*Consigned by Murray Smith, agent*

The dark bay wowed 'em at the first under-tack show, dashing off a quarter in a sizzling :20.60. Named What a Song, the colt was a \$47,000 KEENOV weanling and a \$95,000 FTKJUL yearling. He is out of stakes winner What a Knight, who is herself a full to SW Tough Tara and a half to SW Time of Sale and SW Foxy Island. "I don't think you would ever guess that a horse would work in :20.60, but I felt pretty confident that he would work well," Murray Smith said. "He is a beautiful mover, he's strong and he's solid. He's like an

His dam, City Gold, never made it to the races, but she is out of MGSW Terlingua, making her a half sister to supersire Storm Cat and MGSW Chapel of Dreams. Maria's Mon has had just two juveniles sell to date in 2005, but the pair achieved an average of \$280,000. This colt, bred by Overbrook Farm, brought \$350,000 as a KEESEP yearling. "We had a little misfortune with this colt," consignor Jerry Bailey said. "He became colicky on Sunday, the day before the first breeze show, and we weren't able to preview him. He was quite an expensive yearling and he is a very nice horse--he has delighted us all year long. But he is back on his feet. You don't know how much that's going to take out of them, but he is training well."

**Hip 181, f, Five Star Day--Dance Alexa, by Southern Halo**  
*Consigned by Sequel Bloodstock (Becky Thomas), agent*

A \$90,000 KEESEP yearling, the chestnut is out of an unraced 3/4-sister to GSW Hay Let's Dance. It came as no surprise to consignor Becky Thomas when this one threw down an eighth in :10 at the first preview. "She's very fast, but, from the first, she really has just coasted," Thomas said. "What you see is just natural ability--she just goes."

**Hip 187, c, Dixie Union--Devil's Orchid, by Devil's Bag**  
*Consigned by Sequel Bloodstock (Becky Thomas) agent*

The Canadian-bred colt is out of GISW Devil's Orchid, dam of SW Mountain Orchid (Mt. Livermore). "He's a very nice horse, a pretty mover," Becky Thomas said. "But when I bring him out, he doesn't look like one of my horses--he looks a bit fat. He just hasn't had to put a lot of effort into anything he has done so far--he's very, very natural." With no effort, the dark bay was able to go an eighth in :10 at the first preview.

## FRESHMAN FIGS at Barretts



### FRESHMEN SIRE BREEZEFIGS AT BARRETTS SELECT

By Robert D. Fierro, DataTrack International

In our review of how Freshman Sires of 2005 did at the OBS and Fasig-Tipton sales at Calder we introduced BreezeFigs, an objective "speed figure" analysis derived from digital video of breeze shows at two-year-olds in training sales. We also came up with a BreezeFigs Freshman Sire Index (BFSI), which is a weighted average of their progeny's performance at breeze shows at a given sale.

We continue our projections with the Barretts Select and we'll also point out how they compare to a couple of other sires whose progeny have already established a pattern on the racetrack.

Freshmen sires need at least three horses to breeze at a particular sale to earn a BSFI. The comments are not our overall assessment of the stallion's prospects in general, but are only a snapshot in time a reflection of how their progeny performed at this particular sale based on the BFSI.

Barretts is unusual in that the shows are held on a bullring track at Fairplex where the finish of the breeze is actually on the clubhouse turn. Ironically, this often results in faster times, but it does not alter the underlying components of BreezeFigs that are self-adjusting for this factor. It's also a catalogue that featured fewer Freshmen progeny this year than usual.

Here's how the Freshmen stacked up at Barretts, ranked by BFSI, highest first (for an explanation of Par, see the box below):

**FIVE STAR DAY** had three go, all at 1/8 mile, two of which were substantially above Par on our charts, and one of them had a very long stride length. Like at Fasig-Tipton, they impressed as fliers.

**SONGANDAPRAYER** had four work, and they continued to impress with their overall consistency. They throw out stride and speed factors similar to each other, which is a compliment.

**POINT GIVEN**'s four did well at both distances, showing good speed. A couple were strong on what we call Thrust the ability to maintain the speed they showed over a longer distance.

One of last year's hot freshmen, **DIXIE UNION** continues to throw out runners who chalk up BreezeFigs at or above Par at these sales his three this time all showed well at 1/8 of a mile and had an overall profile similar to that of FIVE STAR DAY's kids in this sale. Leading California sire BERTRANDO had a half-dozen in the sale, and his progeny racked up similar BreezeFig numbers to those of Freshman SONGANDAPRAYER.

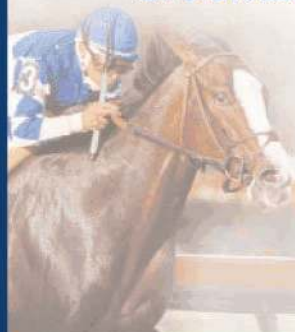

*BreezeFigs were developed by Bob Fierro and Jay Kilgore to bring objective analysis to Breeze Shows at two-year-olds in training sales. We use digital video to distill data about speed, stride, and thrust (the ability to sustain power over racing distances). In our research, these and other factors separate horses that might look fast from those that are likely to be faster once they get to the races. Each horse's BreezeFig is compared to a "Par" figure for each sex at each distance at each sale. Horses with BreezeFigs above Par generally compete more successfully when they get to the races and Daily Racing Form will be offering an on-line BreezeFig handicapping tool soon.*

"He was a very bright fellow who was always available to help people," said Mr. Smith's brother, Jack Smith. "He had a good time. He loved to go to the races."
