AMERICANS ARRIVE IN DUBAI

A team of 13 horses representing the United States has arrived in Dubai to take part in the \$15.25 million World Cup meeting at Nad al Sheba Mar. 26. Four

horses slated to run in the \$6-million G1 Dubai World Cup were among the horses aboard the Saturday morning flight from Los Angeles. Last year's GI Whitney S. winner **Roses in May** (Devil His Due) and graded stakes winners **Choctaw Nation** (Louis Quatorze), **Congrats** (A.P. Indy) and **Lundy's**

Liability (Brz) (Candy Stripes) reportedly traveled well and are currently stabled in the World Cup quarantine center. Several horses slated to contest the G1 Golden Shaheen were also on the chartered flight, including multiple Grade I stakes winner **Pico Central** (Spend a Buck) and **Bear Fan** (Pine Bluff), victorious in last year's GI Barbara Fritchie H. and GI Vagrancy H.

AGA KHAN BUYS LAGARDERE OPERATION

It has been confirmed that the Aga Khan has acquired all of the Lagardere family's bloodstock interests. The holdings, which include the French studs Haras d'Ouilly and Haras du Val Henry as well as 188 horses, have an estimated value of €40-50 million, according to *Racing Post*. Following Jean-Luc Lagardere's death in 2003, his horses raced in the name of the Lagardere Family, but speculation that they would be sold arose last summer. Among the horses in the transaction are leading stallion **Linamix** (Fr) (Mendez {Fr}), who will remain at Haras du Val Henry; 62 broodmares; and 74 horses in training. The racehorses, which include group winners **Diamond Green** (Fr) (Green Desert) and **Valixir** (Ire) (Tremolino) and the Group 1-placed three-year-old filly **Fraloga** (Ire) (Grand Lodge), will remain with their current trainers. The aforementioned trio are conditioned by Andre Fabre. The Aga Khan's retained jockey Christophe Soumillon will have the mount aboard all of the ex-Lagardere runners. Though the Aga Khan is renowned for his success with homebreds Alamshar (Ire), Dalakhani (Ire) and Shergar (Ire), he has made significant acquisitions in the past, most notably when purchasing Marcel Bousac's bloodstock empire in 1978.

TOC: NO CHOICE BUT TO EVALUATE OPTIONS

The Thoroughbred Owners of California, faced with the possibility of losing a major racetrack partner, has been discussing its options for the future given ongoing rumors Hollywood Park may be sold and no longer offer horse racing. Churchill Downs Inc. owns Hollywood Park, which races from April through late July, and November through late December. The company's intentions for the facility have become a topic for speculation given the rumors and CDI policy. Hollywood Park president Rick Baedeker had no comment and referred questions to CDI director of communications Julie Koenig, who said the publicly traded company doesn't comment on rumors. She said CDI wouldn't comment unless a deal was in place. TOC president Drew Couto, who was at Hollywood Park March 16, said the TOC for some time has been mapping a strategy for racing dates and facilities. The Hollywood Park rumors have been on and off for some time, while the status of the two major Northern California tracks, Bay Meadows and Golden Gate Fields, has come into question from time to time. Couto said he couldn't comment on the plan should Hollywood Park cease to exist. But he did say the TOC, which negotiates purse contracts with California tracks, "definitely has plans for what a new calendar would look like and what options we have." Couto said the CDI no-tell policy "forces you to independently evaluate your options and make your own plans." He said TOC board members are concerned the no-comment answer is a way of "stiff-arming" them at a time when they need answers to properly prepare for the short term and long term. "They are the least informative of our track partners," Couto said of CDI. "They provide the least amount of information. As you can imagine, my board doesn't appreciate it."

The colt, who won a seven-furlong allowance at Gulfstream Jan. 8, has earnings of \$55,300.

MILLIONAIRE FLYER REGAINS CROWN

The highlight of the second day of the Cheltenham festival was the £250,000 G1 Queen Mother Champion Chase and the race did not disappoint the near-capacity crowd as 2003 champion **Moscow Flyer (Ire)** (Moscow Society) produced an exemplary round of jumping to regain his title of Europe's premier two-mile chaser. In doing so, the 11-year-old broke through the £1-million barrier in lifetime earnings. Indeed, his connections' only moment of worry came when jockey Barry Geraghty slipped on the rain-softened grass as he attempted a Cordero/Dettori-style flying dismount in the winner's circle. The race was an eagerly awaited affair with 2004 champion **Azertyuio (Fr)** (Baby Turk {Ire}) also lining up alongside last season's champion novice **Well Chief (Ger)** (Night Shift). It was the former who was the first to crack when failing to clear the water jump, effectively ending his chance in the contest, although he did eventually run on to finish a distant third. Settled just behind the early pace, Moscow Flyer jumped to the front with a spectacular leap at the third-last fence and he maintained a searching gallop all the way to the line from there to safely hold the vain bid of Well Chief by two lengths. The winner boasts the remarkable record of winning every one of his 18 completed jumps starts, from an overall 39-25-2-3, with earnings of £1,039,030. The action continues with the G1 Ladbrokes World Hurdle as today's feature.
