CRIMINAL TYPE DIES IN JAPAN

The 1990 Horse of the Year **Criminal Type** (Alydar--Klepto, by No Robbery) died Mar. 9 in Japan from a gastric rupture, according to published sources. The 20-year-old stallion had been scheduled to join Kentucky's Old Friends Equine at Hurstland Farm at the conclusion of the breeding season. His death comes just few weeks after that of his champion half sister

Estrapade, who has been buried at Hurstland Farm. A homebred for Calumet Farm, Criminal Type broke his maiden in France at two, but was repatriated for his four-year-old season, when he won a pair of allowance races in California. The liver chestnut kicked off his five-year-old campaign with three straight wins, including the GII San Pasqual H. and the GII San Antonio H. Second to Ruhlmann in his next two, including the GI Santa Anita H., Criminal Type defeated that runner in the GI Pimlico Special in May, which began his impressive four-race winning streak. Following his defeat of champions Easy Goer and Housebuster in the GI Metropolitan H., he trumped 1989 Horse of the Year Sunday Silence in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup in June and added a facile victory in the GI Whitney H. in August. The Calumet colorbearer made just one more start, finishing sixth under 127 pounds in the GI Woodward, but came out of that race with an injury and was retired. With a record of 24-10-5-3 and earnings of \$2,351,817, he garnered Eclipse Awards as the nation's top older horse as well as Horse of the Year. Criminal Type began his stud career in Kentucky, siring graded stakes winners Hoolie and Madame Adolphe, but after two seasons was sold to Japan, where he met with limited success. He is also the broodmare sire of GI Travers S. hero Ten Most Wanted. A son of graded stakes winner Klepto, Criminal Type was a half brother to 1986 champion turf mare Estrapade as well as Italian Group 1 winner Isopach (Reviewer).

FOG OUT

The undefeated **Lost in the Fog** (Lost Soldier) will not compete in the Triple Crown races, his connections have announced. Leaving no doubt about the horse's

immediate future, Lost in the Fog will not be supplemented to the Triple Crown. "We were looking at a scenario where we could get one more one-turn race into him before the Kentucky Derby and I certainly don't feel that is the proper way to bring him along," trainer Greg Gilchrist said. "We did kick around the idea of getting a couple of two-turn races and point for the Preakness. But we decided against that, as well. With things like future wagering involved, we thought we had better put a stop to this and let everyone know that we are not going to run in the Derby." Gilchrist added that any possible distance limitations Lost in the Fog may have did not enter into the decision. "Whether or not he can go two turns, it has nothing to do with that," Gilchrist said. "It's about the longevity of his career and doing the right thing by the horse. There are plenty of other races out there that we can run in." Gilchrist said the colt will likely start next in the seven-furlong GIII Bay Shore S. at Aqueduct Apr. 9. **Triple Threats cont. p2**

SATURDAY SHOWDOWN

On Saturday afternoon, four different tracks across the nation will host Triple Crown preps, which will include some of the most highly regarded three-year-olds around. At Santa Anita, the GII San Felipe S. will feature the 2005 bows of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero **Wilko** (Awesome Again) and the beaten favorite in that race, **Roman Ruler** (Fusaichi Pegasus). Oaklawn will host the GIII Rebel S., which will see Eclipse Award finalist **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet) take on the likes of **Greater Good** (Intidab) and **Rockport Harbor** (Unbridled's Song). In Florida, trainer Nick Zito has opted to send **Sun King** (Charismatic) to the GIII Tampa Bay Derby. And in New York, **Galloping Grocer** (A. P Jet) will attempt to make amends in the GIII Gotham S.

'Grocer' Hopes to Regain Freshman Form...

Last year's Nov. 27 GII Remsen S. boiled down to a battle of two unbeaten, with **Rockport Harbor** (Unbridled's Song) just edging a game Galloping Grocer. And while the race seemed to confirm the emergence of two solid Kentucky Derby contenders, it's been slow going for both horses since. Each has suffered minor setbacks, and only Galloping Grocer has raced--coming home a tired fourth in the Feb. 12 Whirlaway S. at Aqueduct. With **Rockport Harbor** returning in the Rebel at Oaklawn and Galloping Grocer set to line up in the Gotham at Aqueduct, this weekend will go a long way in gauging the Remsen's form. For Dominick Schettino, who conditions Galloping Grocer for Robert D. Rosenthal and Bernice Waldbaum, the Gotham will likely determine whether or not to continue on the road to Kentucky. "I'd say he'd have to be first or second to keep going with him," said Schettino. "Of course, if he got into traffic trouble or had some really bad racing luck, that would change it, but we expect him to be one-two Saturday." **Cont. p3**

Gallopig Grocer emerged from the Whirlaway with a gash to his left hind leg, then bruised a foot while training a few weeks later. But Schettino is confident his charge is coming into the Gotham the right way. "We had to take care of the gash and lost a couple of days when he bruised his foot, but all that's behind him," he said. "He's come out of his last two works very good. And he's grown since last year—especially in his hind-quarters. He's really muscled up." Schettino confirmed the Apr. 16 GI Wood Memorial S. at Aqueduct would be next for Gallopig Grocer, provided the New York-bred gelding performs well in the Gotham.

WILL THE SLIPPER FIT FASHIONS? Leading young sire Redoute's Choice (Aus) has an unprecedented six representatives in Saturday's A\$3-million G1 Golden Slipper at Sydney's Rosehill Gardens race-course. Among the sextet is the tough filly **Fashions Afield (Aus)** from the team of trainer Gai Waterhouse

and jockey Chris Munce, who combined last year to win with Dance Hero (Aus). The Vinery colorbearer is unbeaten in three outings, including a professional tally against her own sex in the G2 Reisling S. Mar. 5.

"She is so professional and does not knock herself about," Waterhouse said after the race. "She is Golden Slipper class with great cruising speed." Fellow Redoute's Choice youngster **Snitzel (Aus)**, a A\$260,000 Magic Millions graduate, has lost only once--and that with a bad trip--in five attempts. Owner Damion Flower is not convinced his

wide barrier is a disadvantage here. "There will be six races before the Golden Slipper and they'll be cutting up the inside section of the track," he explained. "A pattern has developed. Horses are winning by coming out wide or spilling off the fence, coming across behind three or four horses." New Zealand raider **Dr Green (Aus)** (Fusaichi Pegasus) is among three chances for the son of Mr. Prospector and, if the headstrong colt copes with the pre-race pressure, has the brilliance to cause an upset. Woodlands Stud, who bought just a handful of yearlings at Easter last year, has two Slipper representatives in **Domesday (Aus)** (Red Ransom) and **Mnemosyne (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), A\$420,000 and A\$400,000 purchases, respectively. The Bob Thomsen-trained filly **Media (Aus)** (Gilded Time), who will be partnered by Shane Dye, has shown marked improvement at each of four appearances.

ELDERS BATTLE IN BMW Also on the card Saturday at Rosehill is a clash for Horse of the Year honours as the tenacious **Grand Armeé (Aus)** (Hennessy) takes on pin-up mare **Makybe Diva (GB)** (Desert King {Ire}) in the A\$2.25-million G1 BMW S., a 2400-meter event. Dual Melbourne Cup winner Makybe Diva returns quickly from her record-setting G1 Australian Cup victory last Saturday. "She's absolutely flying and Grand Armeé will know he is in a race when they clash in The BMW," said jockey Glen Boss. "Tactics will play a big part. Grand Armeé has shown he can run along a bit in front and still keep going." The race, whose past winners include Octagonal (NZ) and Might and Power (NZ), has in recent times has been dominated by three-year-olds. Jockey Shane Dye will ride the sophomore **Cheval de Troy (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}), supremely unlucky in last week's Rosehill Guineas. Dye believes the star horses are beatable. "They've both got queries," said Dye. "Grand Armeé has got to run the journey. He must perform at 2400 meters, and Makybe Diva has got to back up after winning the Australian Cup at Flemington last Saturday. Every year the three-year-olds run well and they don't have to be favourites to win it."

LOS ALAMITOS TO REPLACE HOLLYWOOD?

Owner Mike Pegram hoping to establish a partnership with Los Alamitos Race Course principal Dr. Edward C. Allred to expand the track to allow for Thoroughbred racing, according to statement on the Los Alamitos website. Pegram indicated that the recent announcement that Churchill Downs Inc. was exploring options for the Hollywood Park property in Inglewood, California spurred his interest in Los Alamitos. The proposed agreement would call for Pegram to finance an estimated \$40 million in capital improvements at the Quarter Horse facility, and to head any group conducting Thoroughbred racing dates. Included in the proposed redevelopment is the expansion of the 5/8-mile track to a one-mile oval with a seven-furlong grass course inside. Also in the expansion plans are 700 new barns, 3,000 new grandstand seats and an outdoor saddling paddock as well as three new patron parks. "Without Ed Allred's full support as the owner of Los Alamitos I wouldn't even consider this venture," said Pegram, who lost out on a bid to Churchill Downs to buy Fair Grounds last fall. "Also, if I didn't feel we could build a first-class Thoroughbred facility, I would not move forward. All you have to do is take one walk around Los Alamitos and you can see the potential for revitalizing Thoroughbred racing in southern California." Allred, who has been the sole owner of Los Alamitos for more than 10 years, is supportive of Pegram's efforts to bring Thoroughbred racing to the Orange County track. "We've always believed Los Alamitos is a prime location for horse racing in California," said Allred. "I hold no personal interest in pursuing Thoroughbred dates and so it was essential for someone like Mike to step forward and take on that responsibility. I am very comfortable supporting Mike in this. This could be a wonderful opportunity for California horse racing."

ROBERT LEVINE DIES Trainer Robert Levine, who followed his son Bruce into the conditioning of racehorses, died Thursday morning from unspecified causes. He was 86 years old. A longtime owner, Levine did not begin his training career until the age of 64. "I retired from the textile business, and for the first two years, I didn't do anything," he said in a 1985 interview. "I didn't like being bored, so I decided to take up training." His first major horse was Koluctoo

Jill, winner of the GII Ashland S. and the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. in 1985. Levine was quick to credit his son for his own success. "The son taught the father," he said. "He had some horses I owned, and he did a very good job with them. He didn't push me into the business, but I was encouraged by what he had done. And I couldn't let him outdo me." Levine was the trainer and co-owner, with Robert Braumsdorf, of the three-year-old filly Jill Robin L. (Precocity), recent winner of the GII Bonnie Miss S. at Gulfstream. Pre-deceased by his wife Shirley, Levine is survived by his son Bruce and daughters Jill and Robin. There will be a service Sunday Mar. 20 at 10 a.m. at the Gutterman Funeral Home in Rockville Centre, New York.

NY Breeding Fund Announces Registration Changes:

The New York State Breeding and Development Fund has announced that, beginning Apr. 11, the existing "sealing" procedure will be eliminated for registered New York-breds. Instead, a feature entitled Registration Status will be posted on www.nybreds.com, allowing industry participants such as racing secretaries, auction companies and bloodstock agents to verify New York-bred status. As a result, owners and breeders will no longer need to forward--via certified mail--the Jockey Club certificate to the NYSBDF office for an official seal. A certification card will instead be issued, provided all other registry requirements have been fulfilled. "By eliminating the need to send Jockey Club foal papers into the Fund office, it streamlines the process for breeders and makes the entire procedure more efficient," said Martin Kinsella, executive director of the Fund. "Internet advancements have made it possible and easier to process New York-bred papers without waiting to receive the paper copy of the Jockey Club certificate, and the time has come to utilize these tools."

Additional Cases of Strangles Reported at Trackside:

Additional cases of strangles have been identified at two quarantined barns at Churchill Downs' Trackside Louisville training center. A total of 49 horses were tested for the equine bacterial disease, of which 19 tested positive for possible infection, and six which were inconclusive. "It's no surprise, given that a horse infected with strangles had been identified in that population, that other horses in the population in the quarantined barns have tested positive for the infection," explained State Veterinarian Robert C. Stout. "The good news is that the initial case of strangles was identified early, and that measures to contain the ailment to the quarantined barns appear to have been effective." Strangles is a bacterial infection that causes fever, nasal discharge and throat swelling. In severe cases, it leads to the formation of abscesses in the throat that limit a horse's breathing. Horses in the quarantined barns have had alternate training hours scheduled for them. Persons coming in contact with the horses are required to undergo bio-security measures when entering and leaving the barns.

INGLIS RULES THE WORLD

The Cheltenham bandwagon rolled on to the day three at the Gloucestershire track yesterday and the former Stayers' Hurdle, in its new incarnation as the £200,000 G1 Ladbrokes World Hurdle, went the way of well-backed 5-1 chance **Inglis Drever (GB)** (In the Wings {GB}). The Howard Johnson-trained gelding exhibited abundant reserves of stamina to land the three-mile feature in decisive style and foiled yet another of the meeting's £200,000 punts into the bargain. Forced to play a waiting game in rear for most of the St Patrick's day contest, the six-year-old gelding looked a spent force before the home turn but proved most game as he seized the initiative at the final flight before forcing his way clear up the punishing climb to defeat former champion and 6-5 pick **Baracouda (Fr)** (Alesso) by a decisive three lengths. The four-day jumps Festival draws to a close today with steeplechasing's blue riband, the £350,000 G1 totesport Cheltenham Gold Cup.

JOCKEY DEATHS SPARK CALL FOR SAFETY REVIEW

A fortnight after a bronze memorial to 298 Australian jockeys who lost their lives riding was unveiled at Caulfield, industry safety is under scrutiny in the wake of two additional deaths. Apprentice jockey Gavin Lisk died in a Melbourne hospital Wednesday after suffering head and spinal injuries during a fall in a race at Moe Monday. Fellow Victorian jockey Adrian Ledger, 25, died in Canberra hospital Monday as a result of severe head injuries sustained in a fall Sunday at Corowa, in southern NSW. Australia's racing community is currently holding a series of fundraisers for Canberra jockey Ray Silburn, 38, who has been told he will not walk again after a fall Feb. 25. Racing NSW Chief Executive Peter V'landys said after talks with Chief Steward Ray Murrhiy, he would recommend instigating a research and development program to study all aspects of jockey and horse safety. "We will look at employing a project manager, in all likelihood a doctor, to examine safety and in particular skull caps and face wear, as well as running rails and barrier stalls, with the Board receiving the report within two months," he said. Racing Victoria Chief Steward Des Gleeson has promised a thorough review of jockey and horse safety once mandatory inquiries into both the weekend incidents have concluded, but he added that racing was dangerous. "I think everybody, when they get involved in the racing industry, they do it with their eyes wide open and they understand that there are inherent risks," he said.
