**NO OAKLAWN FOR AILING GHOSTZAPPER**

Trainer Bobby Frankel announced that 2004 Horse of the Year **Ghostzapper** (Awesome Again) would miss his intended start in next weekend's GII Oaklawn H. after he was diagnosed with a sinus infection. "The horse got sick last weekend, and has been running a temperature," Frankel said. "He's already missed four days of training, and he'll miss a few more. Of course I'm disappointed we won't be coming, but we're not about to take any chances with this horse. We will take a step back and wait for the Met Mile [GI, May 30, Belmont]." According to Frankel, the five-year-old may use Keeneland's GIII Ben Ali S. Apr. 28 as a springboard to the Met Mile. Frankel shipped the bay, accompanied by stablemates **Badge of Silver** (Silver Deputy) and **High Limit** (Maria's Mon) from Palm Meadows to Churchill Downs last Friday. Frankel, who saddled the last two winners of the Oaklawn H.--Medaglia d'Oro in 2003 and Peace Rules in 2004--had been hoping to run Badge of Silver in Ghostzapper's stead, only to discover that the Ramsey colorbearer was not nominated. **Hennig Opts In With Eddington**

With the defection of Ghostzapper, Mark Hennig confirmed that **Eddington** (Unbridled), who worked five eighths in 1:00 3/5 Thursday at Gulfstream, will be flown in for Saturday's race. "As soon as I heard the news, I started to make plans to send Eddington to Hot Springs," he said. "He'll be flown there next Wednesday." Following Eddington's most recent start, a victory in the GII Gulfstream Park H. Mar. 5, Hennig originally planned to run the chestnut in the GI Pimlico Special May 20. "The more I thought about it, I felt that there was always the chance that Ghostzapper, coming off the layoff, wouldn't make the Oaklawn H.," explained Hennig. "If that was to happen, I wanted to be in a position to run Eddington there, so I nominated him."

**REDOUTE'S CHOICE COLT TOPS EASTER FINALE**

As if the first two sessions of Inglis' Easter Yearling Sale held in Newmarket hadn't cemented Redoute's Choice's strangle-hold on the Australian sire ranks this year, the nine-year-old annihilated his competition during Thursday's final day. Lot 597, the second-to-last offering of the day, reeled in a cool A\$1.4-million from Gerald Ryan. Arrowfield, also responsible for a A\$500,000 Spinning World filly Thursday, consigned the topper. The bay colt is the first foal out of the stakes placed mare Luanda (Mr. Prospector), who is a daughter of multiple graded stakes winner and Grade I placed Via Borghese (Seattle Dancer).

**Clash of the Titans...**

The two titans of this year's Inglis Sale--Arrowfield and Coolmore Australia--concluded the three-day sale almost on par in aggregate--A\$11,260,000 for Arrowfield and A\$11,285,000 for Coolmore--but it was the latter who came out the overall winner. Arrowfield sold 32 horses, including the sales topper, for an average of A\$351,875, while 56 of Coolmore's representatives averaged A\$201,518.

**Fasliyev Filly Tops the Ladies**

The top-priced filly at the final Easter session was a A\$600,000 daughter of Fasliyev, purchased by S. Okada of Japan. Selling as hip 428 from the consignment of Coolmore Australia, the bay is the fourth foal from the champion racemare Dane Ripper (Aus) (Danehill). Dane Ripper earned over A\$3 million in a

career which saw her twice named Australia's champion older mare. Her 12 wins included the G1 Cox Plate, the G1 Australia Cup, the G1 Manikato S. and the G1 Stradbroke H. According to Coolmore's Peter O'Brien, the yearling was the image of Dane Ripper. "The markings, everything is the same," he told AAP. "If you stood them together you wouldn't be able to tell the difference. She looks like a beautiful running filly." O'Brien explained that Dane Ripper has had some misfortune in her young career as a brood-mare. "She had a Zabeel foal that died of a heart attack in the paddock," he added. She has a Fusaichi Pegasus weanling and is now in foal to Encosta de Lago (Aus).

**No Doubt who's #1..**

This year's Easter Sale ended on a high note, with gross and median rising by 20 percent. The aggregate topped out at A\$90,528,000, while the median stood at \$150,000 by sale's send. Helping to bolster those figures was the red-hot Redoute's Choice. The son of Danehill was credited with four of the top six lots, all colts, with three surpassing the A\$1-million mark on the final day.

**DETTORI TO RIDE WILKO IN SA DERBY** Last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner **Wilko** (Awesome Again) was temporarily left without a rider for the Apr. 9 GI Santa Anita Derby when Corey Nakatani opted to stay with the filly **Sweet Catomine** (Storm Cat) for the race. But one international phone call later, the problem was resolved. Top European jockey Frankie Dettori, who was aboard for Wilko's Juvenile win, contacted trainer Craig Dollase and offered his services, which the conditioner promptly accepted. "He called me," confirmed Dollase. "He wanted to ride the horse, so he's flying in from Europe for the race. I'd rather have a jockey who showed that kind of initiative than not." Wilko, who ran fourth in his 2005 debut, the GI San Felipe S. at Santa Anita Mar. 13, is progressing nicely from a quarter crack to his right fore, according to Dollase. The trainer added, "I'll breeze him this week, [but] I'm not sure what day. So far, so good."

**DAY DOING WELL AFTER SURGERY** Hall of Fame jockey Pat Day is recovering from Wednesday's hip surgery in Vail, Colorado. Day had the surgery at Steadman-Hawkins Clinic to repair cartilage in his right hip joint. "There was a little more deterioration in there than they thought there was at first," the 51-year-old reported to Churchill Downs officials yesterday. "But they were able to clean it all up, repair the major portion of the cartilage and clean up the bone spurs. The doctor was very happy with the outcome of the surgery and everything went really well." Day has already begun rehabilitation and has not completely ruled out riding in the May 7 Kentucky Derby. Elected to the Hall of Fame in 1991, Day has won 8,780 races and captured the Eclipse Award as the nation's leading rider in 1984, 1986, 1987 and 1991. He won the Kentucky Derby in 1992 aboard Lil E. Tee.

**MADCAP ESCAPADE WILL GO TO MADISON** After considering the GI Apple Blossom H. for **Madcap Escapade** (Hennessy), owner Bruce Lunsford and trainer Frank Brothers have decided to instead run the four-year-old filly in the GIII Vinery Madison S. at Keeneland Apr. 13. "After Madcap Escapade worked seven-eighths at Gulfstream [yesterday in a bullet 1:25 2/5], I sat down with the owner," Brothers said, "We decided to take the more conservative route and go to Keeneland for the Vinery Madison. It's early in the season. It's just one race. There will be other races." Madcap Escapade was likely to run up against a tough foe if she had run in the Apple Blossom: the defending GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine **Ashado** (Saint Ballado).

**Churchill, HBPA Settle Dispute:**

Churchill Downs and the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association have resolved a disagreement over the distribution of revenues from certain sponsored races at the track. In November, 2004, the Kentucky HBPA filed a lawsuit against the Louisville track in Jefferson Circuit Court over money generated by races listed as "presented by" a race partner, rather than a specific event sponsorship. While declining to release specific details of the agreement, Churchill Downs President Steve Sexton said both parties were satisfied with the resolution. "We value our strong relationship with the Kentucky HBPA and it helped lead to the resolution of this issue," commented Sexton. "We look forward to a continued growth in that relationship as we work together in the months to come on important issues that will help move our industry forward." Susan Bunning, president of the Kentucky HBPA, said, "The mutual effort by the Kentucky HBPA and Churchill Downs to sit down and resolve this issue is a testament to the strength of the relationship of our organizations. We applaud the spirit of cooperation exhibited by both organizations in these negotiations and look forward to working with Churchill Downs on other important issues in 2005 and beyond."

**Island Sand Sharp in Work:**

Last year's GI Acorn winner **Island Sand** (Tabasco Cat) appeared to have put her problems behind her when she drilled three quarters in a bullet 1:12 3/5 at Oaklawn Thursday in preparation for the Apr. 9 GI Apple Blossom H. "I thought it was better than good," said trainer Larry Jones. "In fact, I thought it was Island Sand's best work ever. She did everything right and finished strong." The four-year-old, third in the GIII Azeri Breeders' Cup H. at Oaklawn Mar. 12, sustained an injury to her left hind foot when a trailing horse stepped on her, and still showed signs that she hadn't completely recovered when she covered three quarters in a slow 1:16 2/5 Mar. 25. "She clearly was still tender in that foot that day," said Jones. "but her work this morning was more like it. All systems go for the Apple Blossom."

**Pomeroy Stretches Legs at Keeneland:**

Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's **Pomeroy** (Boundary), who's been on the sidelines since winning the GI King's Bishop at Saratoga last August, worked a leisurely five furlongs at Keeneland yesterday in 1:06 2/5. The colt was restrained all the way. It was Pomeroy's first published work since early December.
