Blood-Horse

A FAVORITE AND EIGHT FLY SWATTERS

With just five weeks remaining until Thoroughbred racing's version of the Big Dance, a field of nine sophomore colts squares off in today's finale of the Florida Regional, the GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park. 'Coach' Nick Zito has been down this road before, 16 times to be exact. But the New York native has never won this important Kentucky Derby prep race. "I want to win this race, but winning Classic races is pretty important, too," Zito explained. "I may not have won the

Florida Derby yet, but I bring horses to this race and that's pretty good in itself." Indeed, both of his Kentucky Derby winners raced for the Orchids--Strike the Gold (second in 1991) and Go for Gin (fourth in 1994). Zito brings a two-headed attack into this year's event in an attempt to halt his skid--Live Oak Plantation's High Fly (Atticus) and My Meadowview Farms' Noble Causeway (Giant's Causeway). Having never Beyered less than 94 in any of his five career starts, High Fly endured a wide trip in the GIII Holy Bull S. Feb. 5, but still managed a third-place effort, two lengths behind Closing Argument, and eight clear of the fourth-placed horse that afternoon. Transferred from the barn of Bill White following that effort, the chestnut posted a 3/4-length victory from just off the pace in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Mar. 5.

A Worthy Second Fiddle...

Despite spotting his stablemate valuable experience, Noble Causeway has proved he deserves this chance. Runner-up to Bandini in a seven-furlong maiden Jan. 6, the \$1.15-million Keeneland September yearling registered a two-length victory on the Holy Bull undercard and made it two-for-two at today's nine-furlong distance with a 3 1/4-length allowance score Mar. 5. His 96 Beyer for that effort is just shy of High Fly's 99 for winning the Fountain of Youth.

Papi's Connections Not Lacking for Confidence...

Despite the fact that he remains a maiden in four starts, Papi Chullo (Comeonmom) enjoys the full confidence of his owner Greg Norman. "I have the horse to beat," said the 45-year-old, who co-owns a construction business with his brother in California. The gray colt, who finished a good second to Going Wild in the Feb. 5 Sham S. at Santa Anita, made his first transcontinental journey for the Fountain of Youth. Racing over a surface better suited to speed types that afternoon, the Florida-bred rallied from eighth to be fourth, beaten 4 1/2 lengths.

Honey Ryder set a course record in defeating Briviesca in the 11-furlong GIII The Very One H. Mar. 6. Prior to that, the grey ran out of ground when fourth, beaten 1 1/2 lengths by Snowdrops in the GIII Suwanee River H. Feb. 12. In her only other outing at today's distance, she was a close third in the GII La Prevoyante H. Dec. 18 at Calder. This contest will also feature a rematch of the three blanket finishers from a Mar. 7 allowance over course and distance: Ellieonthemarch won by a neck over Coquinerie, with Stormin' Daina a head further back in third.

Navesink River, fourth in the GIII Pegasus H. and GIII Discovery H. on the main track last fall, tried the infield for the first time in the GII Red Smith H. Nov. 20 and gave a good account of himself, finishing fifth after contesting the pace. The decision to switch surfaces has continued to pay off this year, as the four-year-old, out of a half sister to Florida Derby winner Vicar, missed by a neck in the GIII Mac Diarmida H. Jan. 30 and was fifth, beaten less than a length, in the GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. Mar. 6. Gigli encountered traffic trouble on the turn in the latter event then flew home to miss by a nose in that blanket finish. Quest Star, a lackluster 10th in the Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H., is the two-time defending champion of this marathon.

Triple Threats

SHAMARDAL OFF TRIPLE CROWN TRAIL

Godolphin's **Shamardal** (Giant's Causeway) will not take part in the Triple Crown after returning from his disappointing effort in the G2 UAE Derby with sore shins. Last year's G1 Dewhurst S. scorer had been touted as a possible G1 Kentucky Derby contender before finishing ninth in last Saturday's contest. Racing Manager Simon Crisford told the *Racing Post* that the colt would face a spell on the sidelines. "Shamardal is slightly shin-sore, but otherwise seems very perky," he said. "We will keep an eye on him and give him plenty of time to recover before we decide what plans to make for him."

DESTINATION UNKNOWN FOR GALLOPING

Grocer Galloping Grocer (A.P Jet) exited his five-furlong drill Wednesday at Aqueduct in fine shape, but his next start is still undecided. "I'm not sure yet where we're going to run him," said trainer Dominick Schettino. Connections are considering either the Apr. 9 G1 Wood Memorial or the GII Illinois Derby the same day at Hawthorne. "I'll get together with [owner Robert] Rosenthal over the next day or two and discuss it." Galloping Grocer completed Wednesday's work in :59 with jockey Mike Luzzi aboard and with a new figure-eight bridle. Luzzi rode the gelding in his last start, in which he finished third but was promoted to second in the Mar. 19 GIII Gotham S. "He might have displaced [his soft palate] in the Gotham, and the new bridle would prevent that from happening," Schettino said. After opening his career with three straight wins against allowance foes, Galloping Grocer was second in the GII Remsen S. and fourth in the Whirlaway S. before the Gotham.

STRANGLES UPDATE Three horses have reportedly tested positive for strangles at Tampa Bay Downs. The barn in which the horses are stabled has been quarantined and the infected horses have been isolated. The barn will remain under quarantine until a PCR test and culture returns negative for every horse in the barn. The three infected horses will be required to test negative three times before they are allowed back into the general population. All horses from the affected barn have been scratched from this weekend's cards. Until further notice, no entries will be accepted from South Florida, with the exception of horses entered for the Apr. 9 Florida Cup races. Those horses will be admitted with a negative PCR test and a negative culture from nasopharyngeal washes or swabs taken after Apr. 2. Participants are required to leave the grounds immediately following that day's racing.

Calder Set to Reopen Stable Area...

Calder Race Course in Miami, Florida, is set to reopen its stable area today, after closing its gates a week ago in an effort to help contain the recent outbreak of strangles. The stable area will be open to all horses, with the exception of those under restriction at Palm Meadows and Gulfstream Park. Horses shipping into Calder must have a health certificate signed by a veterinarian which includes the following statement:

"The horse(s) represented on this health certificate has/have not originated from a barn or premises under quarantine for strangles, nor has/have been exposed to a confirmed or suspected case of strangles, nor has/have shown signs suggestive of strangles, nor has/have been febrile (feverish) within the previous three weeks."

The California Horse Racing Board also issued a statement yesterday that it will require horses traveling from Florida to California racetracks and CHRB-regulated training centers to have a vet certificate containing that same verbiage. **Cont. p5**

Strangles Update cont.

Trackside Cases Reportedly Contained...

A third series of tests on 49 horses stabled at the Trackside Louisville training center thought to be at risk for strangles suggests that steps to contain the spread of the bacterial infection have been effective and that nearly half that number is ready to return to the general horse population. Results of tests conducted Mar. 24 on horses in quarantine at Trackside Louisville, Ellis Park and other locations found that seven horses tested positive for strangles. That number is two more than the number of positives from a second round of tests Mar. 17, but the result was not unexpected, according to officials. "The fact that some horses have again tested positive for the disease on the third round after they had returned negative results in the second is not surprising," said Dr. Robert Stout, state veterinarian for the Commonwealth of Kentucky. "The threat that those horses could become infected is the reason they had been separated from horses that had tested negative on the first two tests." Added Steve Sexton, president of Churchill Downs, "The results of the third round of tests on the horses in the Trackside Louisville quarantine are promising and continue to validate the protocols recommended by state agriculture officials."

The G1 Blue Diamond S. placegetter **Mannington (Aus)** (Danehill--Bint Marscay {Aus}, by Marscay {Aus}), in foal to Red Ransom, is expected to be among the most sought-after mares. "She is a magnificent mare, a group-winning daughter of Danehill from Golden Slipper winner Bint Marscay," said Vinery spokesman Adam White. "It's nearly impossible to buy into this family, mares like Mannington just don't come up for sale." Mannington's first foal is the promising More Than Ready two-year-old Benicio (Aus). "He was an outstanding first foal, made A\$525,000 at Easter last year and is showing real promise in the Lee Freedman stable," said White. Mannington also has a weanling filly by Fusaichi Pegasus. Her Group 1-winning half sister Bollinger (Aus) is at stud in North America where she recently produced a filly by Gone West. "With Bollinger and Bint Marscay both based in the U.S., there is real potential for this family to gain international recognition," added White. The dispersal signals a change in direction for Vinery principal Dr Tom Simon, who emphasized this week he intends to remain an active force in Australia, with stallions including Mossman (Aus), More Than Ready and Red Ransom, as well as continuing to race horses such as G1 AJC Sires' Produce S. winner Fashions Afield (Aus). The sale begins Sunday at 11 a.m., continues Monday at 10 a.m. and Tuesday at 10 a.m.

INGLIS BROODMARE SALE BEGINS SUNDAY

Hot on the heels of a record-setting Easter yearling sale, the Inglis Australian Select Broodmare Sale is expected to reach new heights on Sunday with the complete dispersal of Vinery Australia's broodmare bands. REDOUTE'S CHOICE '05 FEE ANNOUNCED

Breeders of more than 200 mares covered by **Redoute's Choice (Aus)** (Danehill--Shantha's Choice {Aus}, by Canny Lad {Aus}) last spring at a fee of A\$44,000 must be congratulating themselves after Arrowfield announced the sire, who dominated this week's Inglis Easter Yearling Sale, will stand his fifth season at a fee of A\$220,000, including GST. Redoute's Choice has 10 individual stakes winners from his second crop and accounted for six yearlings sold at A\$1 million or more at the Easter sale. Arrowfield's 2005 roster also includes Wednesday's G1 Galaxy winner **Charge Forward (Aus)** (Red Ransom--Sydney's Dream {Aus}, by Bletchingly {Aus}), whose fee has been set at A\$24,750. Others are: **Dehere** A\$38,500, **Falbrav (Ire)** \$38,500, **French Deputy** \$38,500, **Danzero (Aus)** \$33,000, **Flying Spur (Aus)** \$33,000, **Hussonet** \$24,750 and **Oriente** \$19,250. Five-time Group 1 winner **Elvstroem (Aus)** (Danehill--Circles of Gold {Aus}, by Marscay {Aus}) will stand at Blue Gum Farm in Victoria at a fee of A\$35,000. The five-year-old won last Saturday's G1 Dubai Duty Free and is expected to start next in the Apr. 24 G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin.
