HOW SWEET IT IS

She has done little wrong to this point winning five of six starts, but last year's champion juvenile filly **Sweet Catomine** (Storm Cat) will face her biggest challenge

when she takes on the boys in today's GI Santa Anita Derby. She overcame a tough trip in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies S. last October to win by 3 3/4 lengths, and has been sharp in her two scores this season in the GIII Santa Ysabel S. Jan. 16 and in the GI Santa Anita Oaks Mar. 13. "The Breeders' Cup was pretty

exciting, but this is obviously a very important race for

Pam [wife and co-owner] and I and the filly," owner Marty Wygod said. "[Trainer] Julio [Canani] is very excited. He's excited, I'm excited." Sweet Catomine schooled after Thursday's first race at Santa Anita. "She's as cool as a cucumber," Canani said. **Don't Get Mad** (Stephen Got Even), a \$350,000 OBSMAR juvenile purchase, may have the best chance to pull off the upset. He started his career with two straight victories at Churchill

Downs last season under the tutelage of trainer Paul McGee, then opened his three-year-old account in the barn of Ron Ellis. The bay flashed an eye-opening late turn of foot while second in the GII San Vicente S. Feb. 13, but

didn't show the same late interest going around two turns for the first time in the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 19. He finished third that day, but Ron Ellis believes the sealed track may have hurt his colt's chances. "The track was hard as a rock," Ellis told *Daily Racing Form*. "The horse was smart enough to protect himself."

Will the BC Juvenile Champ Show Up?

While all the focus will be on last year's Juvenile Fillies heroine, the upset winner of the Juvenile comes into the Santa Anita Derby a bit under the radar. **Wilko** (Awesome Again) has only run twice since his shocking upset over Afleet Alex and Sun King at Lone Star last October. He turned in a sharp third behind Declan's Moon in the GI Hollywood Futurity last December, then finished fourth off the layoff in the San Felipe last out. Jockey Frankie Dettori gets the call. "If Wilko runs his Breeders' Cup race again, he should be thereabouts," Dettori commented. "One thing he doesn't lack is courage. He had his problems as we all know, but we try to put them behind us and think positive."

WILD ROAD TO THE DERBY CONTINUES

It may not be one of the best GI Wood Memorial fields ever assembled, but an evenly matched group of eight will line up in the 81st running today. **Going Wild** (Golden Missile) has really gotten his act together since breaking his maiden at Santa Anita Dec. 26. The \$600,000 FTFEB juvenile purchase held on gamely for a nose victory in the San Miguel S. Jan. 17, and was able to stretch out his speed to nine furlongs with a win in the Sham S. Feb.

5. Most recently a good second to Declan's Moon in the GII Santa Catalina S. Mar. 5, the D. Wayne Lukas trainee seeks his first graded stakes victory here. "He walked into this barn dead on 11," assistant trainer Peter Hutton said of Going Wild, who arrived at Belmont late Thursday night. "I was a little concerned that would zap him a little bit, but we took him out there this morning and it couldn't have went any better. He looked good, his energy's good and you can see he's got a lot of confidence to him right now."

Likely favorite **Bellamy Road** (Concerto) notched the GIII Cradle S. at River Downs in his second career start last September, but could do no better than seventh as the 2-1 choice while making his final start for trainer Michael Dickinson in the GI Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland Oct. 9. Given some time off after that outing, the dark bay made quite a sophomore debut for trainer Nick Zito, beating up on allowance rivals by 15 3/4 lengths at Gulfstream Mar. 12. "The one thing we've tried to do over the years is get a horse to go a distance of ground," trainer Nick Zito told *Daily Racing Form*. "I'm hoping he's gotten into our system and does learn to relax."

Top Five Gotham Finishers Return...

The top five finishers in the roughly run GIII Gotham S. return for New York's final prep for the Kentucky Derby. **Survivalist** (Danzig) leads the way off his Gotham score over **Pavo** (Marquetry), **Galloping Grocer** (A. P. Jet), **Naughty New Yorker** (Quiet American) and **Byanosejoe** (Cherokee Run). Jerry Bailey replaces Alan Garcia aboard Pavo, who rode without his irons for the majority of the Gotham. Pavo was disqualified from second after Garcia struck a rival with his whip in deep stretch. Trainer Dominick Schettino remains confident in Galloping Grocer after two disappointing starts this season. "Everybody forgets how big he ran in the Remsen," Schettino said. "Going a one-turn mile is no comparison to a two-turn mile and an eighth. Stretching back out should help him big time."

Sis City has been on quite a roll since being haltered for \$50,000 by Richard Dutrow last summer. She won her first start off the claim by 16 lengths in Monmouth's Mongo Queen S., then ran a respectable third in the GI Frizette S. Given a 20-1 chance in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies S., she crossed the line fourth after pressing the early pace. The bay closed out her juvenile campaign with a victory in the GII Demoiselle S. and picked up right where she left off in her first start this season, winning the GI

Davona Dale S. by 16 lengths Feb. 5. Sis City will run for the first time in the silks of Stonerside Stables, who purchased a majority interest in the filly after the Davona Dale. "I haven't run her back since the Davona Dale because I wanted her coming here really, really sharp," Dutrow told *Daily Racing Form*. "And she is." **Summerly** enters this off three straight Fair Grounds victories, including the GIII Silverbulletday S. Feb. 12 and the GII Fair Ground Oaks Mar. 12. Jockey Gary Stevens replaces Jerry Bailey, who will be in New York. **Sharp Lisa** also enters the Ashland riding a winning streak. Freshened up off a sixth-place finish in the Juvenile Fillies, she returned to finish second in the GI Hollywood Starlet S. Dec. 19. Sent off at 4-5 in the GII Santa Ynez S. Jan. 17, she bounded home a 1 1/2-length victress and added the GI Las Virgenes S. last out Feb. 12.

Ashado enjoyed a very successful sophomore season, and in the end it netted her an Eclipse Award as champion three-year-old filly. She started off 2004 with a win in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks, then ran second to Madcap Escapade in the GI Ashland S. She picked up her first Grade I with a victory in the Kentucky Oaks and added another with a win in the Coaching Club American Oaks after finishing second in the GI Mother Goose S. She disappointed as the 3-5 chalk in the GI Alabama S., but quickly redeemed herself with an easy win in the GII Cotillion H. The \$170,000 KEESEP makes her first start since her victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff Oct. 30. "We felt like it's important to start her off at a mile and a sixteenth," trainer Todd Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. "That's the main reason she hasn't started until now. We've accomplished what we wanted in keeping her fit, yet freshening her. She's right where I want her to be for her first race of the season." Hard-knocking Cal-bred **Dream of Summer** always gives her all and enters this in top form. The gray mare earned a 103 Beyer Speed Figure when second by a nose in the GI Santa Margarita H. last time Mar. 12. **Island Fashion** seeks her first victory since notching Santa Anita's GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H. last October. She began the new year with a good second in the GI Santa Monica H. Jan. 30, but couldn't handle the boys in her next start, finishing ninth in the GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 5.

Forest Danger, winner of the GIII Bay Shore S. on Wood Memorial day last year, seeks his first Grade I victory versus this competitive bunch. The speedy colt's only loss came to the likes of **Medallist** in last May's GIII Withers S., but emerged with a hairline fracture in a rear leg. Making his first start since, he fired fresh off the bench at Gulfstream, winning a \$100,000 optional claimer by 9 1/2 lengths with a 118 Beyer Feb. 14. "Obviously, he got us very excited with the way he ran in February," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "I think he could be one of the best sprinters in the country. Hopefully, we can get a Grade I win. He proved last year in the Bay Shore that he likes that track." **Medallist** has had problems handling turns and drifting out in deep stretch in the past, but looked sharp winning his last two starts, including the GIII Deputy Minister H. at Gulfstream Feb. 5. **Mass Media** earned a 115 Beyer over this track in last season's GIII Sport Page H. Shipped out to California thereafter, he hasn't been able to repeat that effort in three starts this season, including a sixth-place finish in the GII San Carlos H. Feb. 26. **Don Six** is only one for seven at this distance, but has turned into a monster since joining Scott Lake's barn in December. He was last seen finishing second by a nose to subsequent G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen winner Saratoga County in the seven-furlong GII General George H. Feb. 21, but appears dead fit off a pair of sparkling Philly Park works, including a :44 3/5 bullet Mar. 19. "I can't help but feel that if we had run in Dubai we would have been the ones getting our picture taken in the winner's circle," Lake said. "I don't think seven furlongs is Don Six's ideal distance, but he's at the top of his game and couldn't be doing any better."

A pair of colts making their stakes debuts--and breaking side by side--just might be the ones to watch in this \$500,000 affair. The speedy California-based **Greeley's Galaxy** has drawn the rail. After breaking his maiden over a sloppy track Feb. 19 at Santa Anita, the chestnut promptly tallied a two-turn allowance Mar. 10 at that track. He is the only entrant here not nominated to the Triple Crown, and this race will allow his connections to gauge his ability. "We don't really know how good he is, but I think he's a nice colt," trainer Warren Stute told *Daily Racing Form*. He will run in Stute's son Glen's name today. Kent Desormeaux has the ride. "Kent's very high on him, which kind of helps," Stute added. Coming out of post two is **Monarch Lane**, a 5 3/4-length debut winner at Gulfstream Jan. 16. The chestnut followed that up with a third, albeit 8 1/2 lengths adrift of the winner, to Sun King and Survivalist in a one-mile allowance Feb. 26. "We're stepping up a bit, but he's shown some ability in both of his starts," trainer Todd Pletcher told *DRF*. "He's a colt that's trained well, and he acts like a horse that wants two turns and a route of ground. **Kansas City Boy** was a close second in the GIII Holy Bull S. Feb. 5, but struggled home seventh in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 12. **Magna Graduate** captured the John Battaglia Memorial S. Mar. 5 before checking in fourth in the GII Lane's End S. Mar. 26.

He has shown the ability to adapt to a variety of pace scenarios and will be dangerous here. The regally bred **Grand Reward**--a son of champion Serena's Song--wired a good allowance field at Santa Anita Feb. 12. He was dismissed at 54-1 in the GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 5, but nearly stole it before finishing fourth by 2 3/4 lengths to Rock Hard Ten in that 10-furlong contest. Morning-line favorite **Eddington** had a very good winter in Florida, finishing third in the GI Donn H. Feb. 5 before taking the GII Gulfstream Park H. a month later.

KEY INTERSTATE GAMBLING RULING ISSUED

An appellate board of the World Trade Organization has handed down a 146-page ruling which could have far-reaching effects on Internet wagering. The ruling stems from a dispute between the United States and the island nation of Antigua, which claimed that the U.S. was illegally restricting its residents from placing wagers, via the Internet, with "legal, licensed and regulated betting outlets," a statement with which the WTO agreed. Antigua also argued that the Interstate Horse-racing Act, upon which all Internet wagering is based, was inconsistent with U.S. prohibition on Internet gambling. The Appellate Body also reversed an original ruling by the WTO by confirming that the U.S. had demonstrated that its gambling laws were "measures necessary to protect public morals or maintain public order." **Cont. p2**

However, the Body also ruled that in order for the "public policy" exemption to apply, the U.S. must address the inconsistency in the Interstate Horseracing Act. It wrote, "The U.S. has not shown, in light of the Interstate Horseracing Act, that the prohibitions embodied in those measures are applied to both foreign and domestic service suppliers of remote betting services for horse racing and, therefore, has not established that these measures satisfy the requirements of the [public policy exemption]." Officials at the National Thoroughbred Racing Association are presently reviewing the ruling with counsel, but were generally pleased with the proceedings. "We are in the process of analyzing the WTO Appellate Body's lengthy and complex decision," NTRA Commissioner D.G. Van Clief Jr. explained. "From our initial review, we applaud the decision in so far as it reaffirms the sovereignty of United States gaming laws."

GENERAL ASSEMBLY DIES Multiple Grade I winner **General Assembly** (Secretariat--Exclusive Dancer, by Native Dancer) died last week at Gestut Olympia in Germany, according to *Racing Post*. The 29-year-old stallion was put down after suffering heart and circulatory problems. He captured the 1979 GI Travers S. and GII Gotham S., as well as the 1978 GI Hopeful S. while racing in the colors of his breeder Bertram and Diana Firestone for trainer Leroy Jolley. After beginning his stud career in 1980 at Gilltown Stud in Ireland, General Assembly returned to the U.S. to stand at Pillar Stud and Spendthrift Farm. He spent two seasons in France before moving to Gestut Olympia in 1995. General Assembly was represented on the racetrack by Hong Kong champion Quicken Away (Ire) and 1984 GI Frizette S. winner Charleston Rag (Ire). He is also the sire of European group winners Hadeer (GB) and Kamakura (GB), as well as Peruvian group winners Cruzan Gold and Mr. Andy.

Peb Set to Finish Derby Mural:

Thoroughbred racing cartoonist Pierre "Peb" Bellocq is expected at Churchill Downs today to put the finishing touches on a mural that depicts everywinning jockey in the 130-year history of the Kentucky Derby. The mural, which measures 36 feet by five feet, has been mounted on the wall of the second floor of the track's new clubhouse. The mural starts with Oliver Lewis, who rode Aristides to victory in the first Kentucky Derby in 1875 and ends with Stewart Elliott, who rode Smarty Jones to win last year's Run for the Roses. "This work--to do something for Churchill Downs--has been a dream of mine for a long, long time," said Bellocq. "There was an inspiration about it, especially because of my affinity with jockeys." Churchill Downs president Steve Sexton added, "The goal of our \$121-million renovation of Churchill Downs is to strengthen our foundation and ensure a bright future for both our track and the Kentucky Derby, but a critical part of that job is to protect and sustain the Derby's history and traditions and Peb's wonderful work will play an important role in that task."

First-Quarter Wagering Figures Down:

North American wagering and purses fell in the first quarter of 2005, according to figures released yesterday by the National Thoroughbred Racing Association and Equibase Company LLC. It was the first time since the Thoroughbred Racing Economic Indicators was introduced in October 2002 that declines were recorded in all three statistical categories: wagering on U.S. races, U.S. purses and U.S. race days. During the first quarter, United States and Canadian pari-mutuel wagering on U.S. races was \$3,314,341,688--down six percent from the 2004 first-quarter figure. Purses fell 2.43 percent to \$202,425,864. The total number of U.S. race days fell 1.84 percent to 1,175. NTRA officials blamed the declines on record rains in California, severe winter weather in the Midwest and Northeast and the major construction at Gulfstream Park. "It appears that January and February were the culprits," NTRA Commissioner D.G. Van Clief, Jr. said. "Wagering levels returned to near-normal levels and race days increased one percent in March. We'll be monitoring the numbers over the next few months to gain some additional perspective and look for any trends."
