STORM BUILDING AROUND SWEET CATOMINE

The saga continued when juvenile champion filly **Sweet Catomine** (Storm Cat), who finished a lackluster fifth in Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby, was removed from trainer Julio Canani's barn and placed in the care of John Shirreffs. Shirreffs confirmed that the bay hadn't arrived as of Monday afternoon, but was reportedly 'en route.' Owner Martin Wygod would not comment on the matter, but did say that the removal of the horse, along with four others, had nothing to do with the investigation launched by the California Horse Racing Board. According to the CHRB, it intends to interview Sweet Catomine's veterinarians as well as Santa Anita's official track veterinarian, who conducted the required pre-race examination on race day. In addition, the CHRB filed complaints Monday against Wygod and Dean Kerkhoff, a racehorse transport driver, who allegedly identified the filly to the stable guard as a 'pony' when she left Santa Anita at 3 a.m. Apr. 4 for special medical treatment. Sweet Catomine was later returned to Santa Anita at 8:29 the following evening and was again falsely identified as a 'pony.' The complaint also states that Wygod violated Rule 1902 (Conduct Detrimental to Horse Racing) in connection with statements made before and after Saturday's race concerning the health of the champion. "The preception of the betting public was that they were wagering upon reliable information, which was widely broadcast," states a CHRB release, outlining the official report. "The information concerning the true condition of the horse was not complete, or factual, in its interpretation." Wygod and Kerkhoff are scheduled to meet with Hollywood Park stewards Apr. 23. "Protecting the betting public and insuring the integrity of the industry are our highest priorities," said CHRB Executive Director Ingrid Fermin. "I am pleased that the investigative staff responded so quickly, and we intend to continue our proactive approach to restoring the confidence of the fans. All licensees will be treated the same."

Blue Grass Hopefuls Breeze

Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's **Bandini** (Fusaichi Pegasus) and **Closing Argument** (Successful Appeal), owned by Philip and Marcia Cohen, worked five furlongs at Keeneland Monday in their final major moves ahead of Saturday's GI Blue Grass S. Bandini, trained by Todd Pletcher, working in company, was caught in 1:00 2/5, while Closing Argument closed out the distance in 1:00 4/5. "We're definitely going to run in the Blue Grass," confirmed Closing Argument's trainer

Kieran McLaughlin. "We made that decision [Monday] afternoon. He came out of the work very well and we're all set." As for a shot at the Kentucky Derby, McLaughlin added, "If he runs 1-2-3 in the Blue Grass, we'd obviously look that way with him. The owners aren't into the Derby fever so much, but if he deserves to be there, then we'll be there." At Churchill Downs, **Sun King** (Charismatic) and **High Limit** (Maria's Mon), accompanied by jockey Joe Deegan, also received a tightener for their upcoming Blue Grass start. Tracy Farmer's Sun King, who won the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 19, covered five panels in 1:00 4/5 and Gary and Mary West's High Limit recorded a crisp :59 2/5 for the same distance. "He went a little quick, but I think the track was a little quick this morning," said Bobby Frankel of High Limit's work, the second fastest of 38 moves at that distance yesterday. In the Sun King camp, Nick Zito was pleased with his charges' work. Zito's colt, who turned in fractional times of :24:40, :36.20 and :47.40, ranked 12th among 38 at the distance. "He's doing well," said Zito. "He works very, very even, which is a great attribute that he's got. You've got to put together those times and I like what he's doing right now."

DUBAWI BURNS BRIGHT IN TRIAL Dubawi (Ire) (Dubai Millennium {GB}) was the star of the show at Godolphin's annual turf trials at Nad al Sheba yesterday. Last year's G1 National S. hero forged four lengths clear of Doncaster maiden winner **Tasdeed (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) and G3 Sirenia S. winner **Satchem (Ire)** (Inchinator {GB}) in a time of 1:37.70 after the mile gallop under jockey Frankie Dettori. Dubawi now heads straight to the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket Apr. 30. "Dubawi had an excellent race-course gallop and came through it in a very pleasing manner," commented Simon Crisford. "That will put him spot-on for the 2000 Guineas. There were six horses involved in the gallop and Dubawi quickened up very well in the straight. He drew several lengths clear and maintained his advantage to the line. It was a very encouraging effort--we are delighted. He will improve for this racecourse gallop and we are looking forward to Newmarket. Frankie said Dubawi felt great. Tasdeed and Satchem filled the minor places, with a short-head between them." Crisford also stated that plans for Tasdeed and Satchem, as well as Newmarket maiden winner **Belenus (Ire)** (Dubai Millennium {GB}) and last year's top-rated juvenile **Shamardal** (Giant's Causeway) will be decided in the next 10 days.

In a contest which lost some of its lustre with the scratching of Fraloga (Ire), Perfect Hedge recorded an impressive first stakes success. Passed over in the betting in favor of Listed Prix Rose de Mai winner Argentina, she belied her lack of experience to add to previous wins in a newcomers' race at Fontainebleau last November and a conditions event at Maisons-Laffitte Mar. 18. As Hermance set steady early fractions, the eventual winner shared stalking duties with Argentina before settling in third at halfway. Making solid progress from the quarter pole to lead at the distance, the homebred powered away late to retain her unbeaten record. "After winning two races easily, that was a real test against some nice fillies and she passed it in style, quickening brilliantly," said Nicolas Clement. Of future plans, he added, "We will save her for the moment before deciding what's next. Obviously, she could go for the [G1] Prix Saint-Alary [Longchamp May 22] or we may keep her fresh and go for the [G1] Prix de Diane Hermes [Chantilly June 12]."

Rhein Kraft, breaking from the 17 post, came from just off the pace and held off the late-closing Cesario for a narrow victory. "Last year when I drew the outside post in this race, I asked trainer Hiroshi Kawachi for advice," explained winning rider Yuichi Fukunaga. "He told me to let the horse go as she liked by the first turn and then see what to do next. I couldn't make good use of his advice last year [when seventh], but thanks to his advice I did win this year." Rhein Kraft won her first Japanese group race in the G3 Fantasy S. last November, but ended the year with her only defeat to date, a third-place finish in the G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies in December. She won the Mar. 13 G2 Fillies' Revue in her last outing. Trainer Tsutomu Setoguchi said the three-year-old filly will now be pointed toward the May 22 Japanese Oaks.

If anyone ever wondered why there is such strength in depth in America's Thoroughbred market, the run-up to this year's Kentucky Derby is surely providing the answer.

Take a look at the *Blood-Horse's* list of prep races and you will find that for every Graded winner by such high-priced stallions as Storm Cat, A.P. Indy and Danzig, there are a lot more by much cheaper sires. Among them are Intidab (whose 2001 fee of \$12,500 has fallen to \$3,500), Lost Soldier (\$4,000), Maria's Mon (\$12,500), Distorted Humor (\$12,500), Malibu Moon (\$3,000), Wild Wonder (\$4,500), Successful Appeal (\$5,000) and Robyn Dancer (\$4,000).

Now two more "cheapies" can be added to the list following Saturday's GI Derby trials. The Wood Memorial saw a sensational effort from Bellamy Road, a son of the \$3,500 Concerto, while the Santa Anita Derby was won in very game style by Buzzards Bay, a son of the \$3,000 Marco Bay.

The question now is whether a son of such low-priced stallions can establish himself as the leader of his generation at Churchill Downs. History suggests this could happen. Elusive Quality stood at \$10,000 when he sired Smarty Jones; Distorted Humor at \$12,500 when he sired Funny Cide; Our Emblem at \$10,000 when he came up with War Emblem and Maria's Mon at \$7,500 when he got Monarchos. Previous examples include Real Quiet, a son of the \$10,000 Quiet American; Silver Charm, by the \$6,000 Silver Buck; Go For Gin, who is by the \$10,000 Cormorant, and Lil E. Tee, a son of the \$7,500 At The Threshold.

However, you will find only one winner of the Kentucky Derby in the last 20 years--the excellent Spend A Buck--whose sire stood for as little as \$5,000. So can a \$3,500 stallion like Concerto realistically be expected to strike a major blow for the bargain-basement stallions?

I think it is very much in Concerto's favor that he is by Chief's Crown, who could hardly have had a more ideal pedigree for the classics. Chief's Crown's four grandparents included Northern Dancer, who started odds on to complete the Triple Crown in the 1964 Belmont S.; Secretariat, who became the first Triple Crown winner since Citation in 1948 and Chris Evert, the champion three-year-old filly of 1974 who won the NYRA Filly Triple Crown.

Chief's Crown--the champion of his generation at two in 1984--started favorite for the 1985 Kentucky Derby, finishing a creditable third, and again when he was beaten a head by Tank's Prospect in the Preakness. He rounded off his Triple Crown campaign with a third in the Belmont S., so was didn't fall far short of living up to his illustrious ancestry.

Chief's Crown has succeeded in extending his ancestors' classic influence, but in Europe rather than the USA. His son Erhaab triumphed in the 1994 Epsom Derby and another son, Grand Lodge, was responsible for Sinnidar, who followed up his victory in the 2000 Derby with further successes in the Irish Derby and the Arc. Then in 2003 it was Chief's Crown's son Key of Luck who sired Alamshar, winner of the Irish Derby and King George. (Cont. p5)

Concerto put himself in line for a tilt at the 1997 Kentucky Derby when the Kinsman Stable homebred strung together successes in the Whirlaway S., John Battaglia Memorial S., GII Jim Beam S. and the GIII Federico Tesio S. He had previously earned an Experimental Free Handicap figure of 114 during a juvenile campaign which featured wins in the Storm Cat S. and GIII Kentucky Jockey Club S.

Although Concerto lined up for the Kentucky Derby as a winner of seven of his 10 starts, including his last five, he was only seventh choice in a 13-runner field and he couldn't maintain his good early position, fading into ninth. It was a similar story in the Preakness, when he faded into sixth, and the message was that he simply wasn't talented enough.

Concerto was nevertheless good enough to win three more stakes races, including the GIII Clark H., in nine further starts at three and four, and his bankroll stood at over \$1.3 million by the time he retired to Ocala Stud Farm. The farm's spokesman Karl Koontz commented at the time that Concerto had "remained sound over a hard campaign," adding that, "he should be able to add some distance to the short-bred Florida mares."

Bellamy Road is a member of Concerto's third crop, which contains only 25 named foals. In fact, there are only 107 named foals in his first three crops, so he has had limited chances of establishing himself so far (his best winners prior to Bellamy Road have been in Puerto Rico). However, that will soon change, as he covered 100 mares in 2002 and 118 in 2003. This surge in his popularity was probably set in motion by one of his first-crop daughters selling for \$230,000 early in 2002. He then came up with a pleasing percentage of first-crop winners, headed by the stakes-winning Collymore Hall.

There is good cause for saying that Bellamy Road has a right to be a cut above the average Concerto foal. His dam, the minor winner Hurry Home Hillary, is by Deputed Testamony, winner of the Preakness and the Haskell Invitational H., and she comes from an exceptional female line.

Bellamy Road's third dam, the Mr. Prospector mare Rub Al Khali, produced a couple of useful juveniles to Local Talent and Explodent. More to the point, she was a half-sister to the high-class Out of Place and to Lead Kindly Light, the Grade III-winning dam of Gold Fever.

When Bellamy Road's fifth dam, Ten Cents a Dance, visited Bellamy Road's great-grandsire, Danzig, the outcome was Versailles Treaty, an outstanding filly whose career figures stood at 20-9-9-2. Although fast enough to win the GI Test S. over seven furlongs, Versailles Treaty also won the GI Alabama S. over a mile and a quarter, so stamina was not a problem for her and it is also unlikely to be a problem for Bellamy Road. Another mare from this family visited Chief's Crown to produce Chief Honcho, winner of the GI Brooklyn H. over 1 3/8 miles.

Perhaps I should add that Bellamy Road's seventh dam is the famous Exclusive, whose son Exclusive Native sired two winners of the Kentucky Derby, including Affirmed. With a background like this, Bellamy Road's cost of production could well fade into insignificance.
