**MIDWEEK ESCAPADE**

The big question last time was whether 10 months on the sidelines would tame the spitfire that is **Madcap Escapade** (Hennessy). Having overcome a slow start to scorch a field of solid competitors in the GII Shirley Jones H., the four-year-old answered that question and begged another: is there a filly or mare in America that can outspurt her? Only time will tell, but the Frank Brothers trainee seems to overshadow a good field in today's GIII Vinery Madison S. at Keeneland. As a sophomore, she capped a four-race winning skein with a victory in the 8 1/2-furlong GI Ashland S. over this strip in April, but suffered a hip fracture shortly after finishing third in the nine-panel GI Kentucky Oaks and went missing. In her comeback, the Shirley Jones, she dwelt at the start and spotted the field several lengths, but made quick work once she recovered and won going away by two lengths. The hard-knocking **Bending Strings** (American Chance) was first or second in eight of 13 starts last year. She was given a freshening off a second in the GI La Brea S. Dec. 27 and returns making her first start at Keeneland.

**AFLEET ALEX DRILLS FOR ARKANSAS DERBY**

Grade I winner **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet) flashed a half-mile breeze in :46 1/5 at Oaklawn yesterday morning. He galloped out in :58 3/5. "He did it easily," said trainer Tim Ritchey. "It was just a maintenance work. He's fine." The three-year-old kicked off the year with a brilliant win in the Mountain Valley S. Mar. 5, but came out of a poor effort in the GIII Rebel S. with a lung infection two weeks later. Though he's expected to be entered in Saturday's \$1-million GII Arkansas Derby, the bay is also nominated to the one-mile Northern Spur Breeders' Cup S. on the undercard.

**TATTS BREEZE-UP SALE GETS UNDERWAY**

After watching the workouts, Tattersalls' marketing director Jimmy George said, "The breeze was very well attended, everything went smoothly and there were some eye-catching performances. Everyone seems to think that this is as strong a breeze-up catalogue as there has ever been in Europe and it looks to have attracted a lot of attention."

*Jewels in the Rough..*

With last season's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud heroine Paita (GB) and Michael Tabor's classic hopeful Walk In The Park (Ire) among several black-type performers to come out of last year's sale, the standard of this fixture continue to grow. Among the standouts, vendor Thomond O'Mara's Knockanglass Stables will offer lot [lot 152](#), a Gone West colt purchased for \$20,000 at Keeneland in September. The Knockanglass draft also includes [lot 133](#), a Chester House colt purchased for \$22,000 as a yearling. The youngster breezed in good style. American consigner Kip Elser, who has again sent a draft to Newmarket from his Kirkwood Stables, will offer [lot 39](#), a Red Ransom colt, and [lot 176](#), Flashing Numbers (Polish Numbers), who both moved in good fashion. Another Kirkwood offering, [lot 82](#), a Giant's Causeway half sister to stakes winner Haint (Devil's Bag), changed hands as a yearling for \$250,000 to Mikki Tsuge at Keeneland in September. Con Marnane's Bansha House Stables offers the only Danehill catalogued, [lot 66](#), a sister to Group 3-placed Summerland (Ire), while the following lot through the ring--presented by Wiltshire-based Malcolm Bastard--is a Sadler's Wells colt out of G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Wannabe Grand (Ire) (Danehill). The latter was bought for 180,000gns at Tattersalls in October. Jamie Railton's team includes [lot 179](#), Perfect Order (Red Ransom), a filly who cost \$75,000 as a yearling. Emma O'Gorman--who sold Paita (GB) last year--offers a draft which includes [lot 10](#), a racy Galileo (Ire) filly. The sale's start has been delayed by a half hour to 5:30 p.m. tonight due to an extra race on today's Newmarket card. Selling will begin at 5:00 p.m. tomorrow.

**ALINGHI TO FRANKEL** Alinghi (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), purchased last week by John Messara's Arrowfield Stud for a reported A\$3 million, will be shipped to the U.S. Sunday to join the barn of trainer Bobby Frankel, according to *AAP Racing and Sports*. "There are no set plans regarding her racing program, but there are numerous Group 1 races for fillies and mares that will suit Alinghi in America," Messara commented. "We will wait and see how she settles in after the trip and the new environment in New York. Ideally she will be set for turf races, although that is not ruling out the option of running her on the dirt at some stage." The four-year-old filly won this season's G1 Robert Sangster S. and G1 Newmarket H.

**High Limit Ready for Toughest Test...**

Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland may be short on numbers, but it is certainly not lacking for quality. A field of six or seven is expected when entries are taken this morning, headed by Gary and Mary West's GI Louisiana Derby hero **High Limit** (Maria's Mon). Trainer Bobby Frankel is looking forward to the challenge and thinks the depth of the competition will benefit his charge. "I thought about the Arkansas Derby because it is going to be an easier race," the conditioner said yesterday during a media teleconference. "But I think a horse like mine sort of needs a tough race, because he's so lightly raced. I'd rather have a tough race for my horse right now." Frankel, who has posted runner-up finishes in the Kentucky Derby over the past several years with Aptitude and Empire Maker, won the Blue Grass two years ago with Peace Rules (third in the 2003 Derby) and sees some of that runner in High Limit. "I sort of think he's got more talent than Peace Rules," he commented. "But this horse will do whatever you want. That's why I think he'll rate, if he has to, because he's very kind in the morning." Ramon Dominguez, aboard the undefeated colt in each of his three career starts, has a return call on Saturday.

**Mr. Sword Preps for Blue Grass**

**Mr. Sword** (Rizzi), prepping for Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S., zipped five furlongs in :57 4/5 Tuesday at Keeneland. The Paraneck Stable colorbearer galloped out three-quarters in 1:10 2/5 and seven furlongs in 1:25 2/5. "He worked super," said trainer Jennifer Pedersen. "The way it looks now, there will be a lot of pace in the race. That's what he needs. He's such a terrific horse. We'll just keep our fingers crossed." Mr. Sword is coming off a third-place effort in the Mar. 26 GI Lane's End S. at Turfway Park.

**Holthus's Best Ever?....**

Trainer Bob Holthus has been the leading trainer at Oaklawn Park no fewer than nine times and won the 1988 Arkansas Derby with Proper Reality, "the best horse I've had so far," the 70-year-old Nebraska native says. So far, Enter **Greater Good** (Intidab), who approaches Saturday's \$1-million event in tip-top shape. "He put in his last work last Saturday [6f in 1:12 3/5] and got his last quarter in :23 and change," Holthus commented. "He's got a great disposition and he's never missed a day of training. He's made it through the toughest part of the campaign and now all we need is luck and we have a good chance." So is the conditioner surprised that a horse by a multiple graded stakes winning sprinter and a grandson of a champion sprinter wants to go this far? "For some reason he stays on," Holthus offers. "The biggest thing that he's got going for him in that he's very kind to rate. He's just such a kind horse." Similar to Proper Reality, Greater Good comes into Saturday's race off victories in the Feb. 19 Southwest S. and the GIII Rebel S. Mar. 19. Proper Reality went on to be fourth behind Winning Colors in the Run for the Roses.

"She probably didn't have the best of runs in the Rockfel, so that puts her close to Maids Causeway," commented jockey Michael Hills yesterday. "I rode her the other morning and was very impressed as she picked up and showed me a lot of class." Sir Michael Stoute, who took this in 2000 with Petrushka (Ire), saddles the intriguing **Read Federica**, who looked to need every yard of this trip when taking a course-and-distance maiden in October.

It doesn't always cost a fortune to create the winner of the most sought-after prize in American racing. Of 13 renewals of the GI Kentucky Derby since 1992, eight have been captured by stallions who were standing at \$10,000 or less when they sired the Derby winner. This situation is almost certainly a result of the "compression" of the breed: the fact that for some time the standard of the very best horses has remained static, while the average horse has continued to improve. As a result there is a much smaller difference between the potential of the \$10,000 stallion and the \$100,000 stallion than there was between horses of similar relative values 50 years ago (and a significant proportion of that accounted for by commercial factors).

This year could well see another classic sire from the bargain basement, as the only Grade I Derby trials run this year--the Florida Derby, Wood Memorial and Santa Anita Derby--have fallen to High Fly (Atticus), Bellamy Road (Concerto) and Buzzards Bay (Marco Bay). The pedigrees of High Fly and Bellamy Road have been covered in detail in the *TDN* in the last week, so now it is the turn of Buzzards Bay.

Despite being prepared for the Derby in California, Buzzards Bay is, like Bellamy Road, a Florida-bred. He actually began his career at Calder and was purchased by Fog City Stables after breaking his maiden at that track in October. He ended his two-year-old campaign with a fourth in a Hollywood allowance event, but led throughout to capture the Golden Gate Derby by a nose in his three-year-old debut. He wasn't able to adopt front-running tactics in his next two starts which resulted in a disappointing 10th in the GIII Risen Star S. and a staying-on third in the GIII El Camino Real Derby. But for the Santa Anita Derby, Buzzards Bay held sway at every call, battling on gamely to deny another longshot, General John B., and the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile victor Wilko.

Buzzards Bay's sire Marco Bay, who stands for \$3,000 at Hidden Hill Farm in Ocala, Florida, does have a Derby win to his name, albeit in the Tampa Bay version. He also took the Sam F. Davis Breeders' Cup S. at Tampa the same year, and at four captured the Kelly Olympic Breeders' Cup S. on the turf at Atlantic City. Marco Bay has sired only one other stakes winner from his first six crops, that being the filly Bay Street Gal from his first crop. *Cont. p7*

Marco Bay is a son of Fred Hooper's brilliantly fast two-year-old Copelan, but if Buzzards Bay's male line is predominantly speedy, there is plenty of stamina in the distaff side of the pedigree. Buzzards Bay's unraced dam Lifes Lass is by Seneca Jones, a modest performer, but a son of Alydar and GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Tiffany Lass (herself by Kentucky Derby and Belmont winner Bold Forbes). Buzzards Bay's granddam, stakes-placed Letters of Life, is a daughter of another Belmont victor in the shape of Arts and Letters. A half sister to the prolific New York-bred stakes winner Elegant Life, Letters of Life is out of Life, who is by Bold Hour, a talented son of Bold Ruler who captured the Amory L. Haskell H. and Grey Lag H. at 10 furlongs.

Retired Manhattan businessman Jay Shaw, breeder of both Buzzards Bay and Marco Bay, reportedly purchased Lifes Lass specifically to breed to Marco Bay, as he felt that the bloodlines of Seneca Jones suited his horse. From our point of view, what is particularly interesting about the background of Seneca Jones is that his dam Tiffany Lass is a Bold Ruler/Ribot cross, and Marco Bay's granddam (and Jay Shaw's foundation mare) Mariwitch is a Ribot/Bold Ruler cross. For good measure, the Ribot/Bold Ruler cross is also repeated in Buzzards Bay's granddam Letters of Life.

There is a second interesting pedigree play at work here, too. Buzzards Bay's grandsire Copelan is inbred 3x4 to Fred Hooper's brilliant horse Olympia. Letters of Life, the granddam of Buzzards Bay, is inbred 4x4 to Olympia's sire Heliopolis, and her granddam Catch Phrase is bred on the same cross as Olympia.

The Royal Ascot Racing Club's **Motivator (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) will not run in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket Apr. 30, it was announced yesterday. Revealing the news in a statement, the syndicate's managing director Harry Herbert said that the G2 Dante S. at York May 12 would be the stage for the unbeaten colt's comeback. After watching the G1 Racing Post Trophy winner work under new pilot Johnny Murtagh yesterday morning, Herbert explained, "This was Motivator's first serious piece of work of the year and we wanted to get a guideline from Johnny, who was keen to ride him [Tuesday] and has committed himself to an association throughout the season, which is what we were looking for. Michael Kinane has heavy commitments elsewhere. Johnny got off Motivator and said that he was a horse who will take some beating in the Arc and described him as a very serious middle-distance performer. We feel he is a mile and a quarter or a mile and a half horse, and have sat down and decided that he will not now go for the 2000 Guineas and instead be aimed at the Dante. These decisions are never easy--there are so many pieces of the puzzle to fit together--but we feel it is in Motivator's best interests for his long-term career to go for a Derby trial and, if he runs well in that, tackle the Vodafone Derby which has always been his target. Not many horses win both the Guineas and the Derby. His physique and pedigree suggest he is a middle-distance horse, though he also possesses an abundance of speed."
