A top-class group of seven Kentucky Derby hopefuls will come together for Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. Included in the field are five graded stakes winners, while the other two--**Mr Sword** (Rizzi) and **Bandini** (Fusaichi Pegasus)--have placed in Grade II events. Installed as the 9-5 morning line favorite is **High Limit** (Maria's Mon), the lightly raced Bobby Frankel trainee who was impressive in a gate-to-wire tally in the GII Louisiana Derby at Fair Grounds Mar. 12. But it wouldn't be a surprise if Nick Zito's **Sun King** (Charismatic)--2-1 on the morning line--was the crowd's choice at post time. The highly touted colt has so far made good on a promising juvenile campaign that saw him complete the trifecta in the GI Champagne S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. The dark bay won his seasonal bow, a Feb. 26 Gulfstream allowance, by 5 3/4 lengths, then romped in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 19. "I love the horse personally," said Zito. GREATER GOOD DRAWS WIDE IN ARKANSAS

'Robust' First Session...

Tattersalls' 2005 Breeze-Up Sale got off to a solid start in Newmarket last night with Sheikh Mohammed's son, Sheikh Rashid bin Mohammed al Maktoum, purchasing the evening's top two lots. Buying for Darley Stud Management, Sheikh Rashid went to top dollar for a colt by Swain (Ire) out of Robust (Conquistador Cielo). The dam is a half-sister to GI Belmont S. winner Danzig Connection (Danzig). Shunsuke Yoshida of Japan's Northern Farm was the immediate underbidder. "Her pedigree was nice and she breezed very well," said Sheikh Rashid. "I just got a good feeling about her, and sometimes you have to go with that feeling. I'll discuss with my racing manager [Johnno Mills] where she'll go into training and decide in the next few days." Willie Browne of Mocklershill Stables had picked up the filly for just \$45,000 as a yearling at Keeneland in September. Earlier in the day, Sheikh Rashid outfought agent Bobby O'Ryan for the day's second-best selling juvenile, going to 220,000gns for a colt from the first crop of Fantastic Light (Rahy). Consigned by Malcolm Bastard, the Irish-bred colt hails from the outstanding female family of A.P. Indy. Sheikh Rashid signed seven tickets for a total of 849,000 guineas. Yoshida, acting for his father Katsumi, did not go home empty-handed, purchasing a son of King's Best for 150,000gns. Also going for 150,000gns was a Sadler's Wells colt out of G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Wannabe Grand (Ire) (Danehill), who will join trainer Ed Dunlop after being bought by Peter Goulandris's Hesmonds Stud. The sale concludes this evening with a session starting at 5 p.m.

The bay broke sideways, but was quickly into stride and settled in second through an opening quarter in :21.59. She motored to the front between calls, had three on the field after a half in :43.75 and was under a hand ride down the lane, winning easily. "She just has brilliant speed," said jockey Jerry Bailey, celebrating his 50th Keeneland stakes win.

Karen's Caper entered this 1000 Guineas trial as one of the least experienced aspirants, but the 15-2 chance belied that greenness to emerge a genuine contender. Restricted to two all-weather starts last term, she opened her account on Lingfield's polytrack in October and spent the winter under wraps at Manton before progressive homework put her in the Classic picture. Settled in mid-division throughout the early stages, she produced a withering run to reel in Cape Columbine (GB) in the final 50 yards and book her ticket to the mile Classic May 1. "She's still a bit woolly in her coat and is crying out for a mile, but she did it nicely," her trainer John Gosden commented. "She will come on a bundle and the form is very solid, as the runner-up is a lovely filly." Jockey Jimmy Fortune paid tribute, adding, "She is a big, scopey filly and hopefully she'll improve. She got caught out running into the dip and just lost her action for a couple of strides, but ran on well when she met the rising ground." Trainer David Elsworth confirmed that the runner-up, a half sister to Group 1 winner Cape of Good Hope (GB), will also take her place in the 1000 Guineas line-up.

Norse Dancer hardly missed a step last term, hitting a peak at the height of summer when splitting Sulamani (Ire) and Bago (Fr) in the G1 International S. at York, and Azamour (Ire) and Powerscourt (GB) in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown. Off the track since finishing fourth in the G1 Champion S. at this course in October, he was held up towards the rear by John Egan early before closing on the free-wheeling Hurricane Alan entering the "dip." Pushed out on the uphill rise, his momentum carried him past the game long-time leader inside the final 50 yards for a narrow victory. "He is absolutely top class," commented owner-breeder Jeff Smith. "John [Egan] said he had to dig a bit there because he's not as his full racing peak, but he's done it beautifully. That puts a question mark over his distance, so we will be looking at either the G1 Lockinge S. over a mile [at Newbury May 14] or G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup [at The Curragh May 22] over further."

Last year's renewal boiled down to a contest between champion Halfbridled and Victory U.S.A.--who won going away--and while there's nothing of that class in here, several could make strides toward the May 6 GI Kentucky Oaks with solid performances. Trainer Nick Zito, loaded to the gills with top three-year-old males, sends **In the Gold** to post wearing the same Live Oak colors as Derby prospect High Fly. The chestnut was 16 lengths adrift when runner-up to Sis City in the Feb. 5 GII Davona Dale S., a performance that gained luster when Sis City came back to romp by a similar margin in Saturday's GI Ashland S. In her most recent, In the Gold was a nose away from victory in the Mar. 5 GII Bonnie Miss S. at Gulfstream. **Punch Appeal**, tough to fault with six wins in 10 starts, won the Delta Princess S. in December, but has been off since running third in the Jan. 15 Tiffany Lass S.

Amix of fine breeding and steady upbringing helped build the legend for the 17th century Scottish highlander Today, equine namesake **Rob Roy** will not lack for the right type of preparation as he faces his first big test in the G3 Craven S. at Newmarket. Philip Newton's colt stood out from the crowd when taking a seven-furlong maiden on his sole start here in October. He bids to emulate his sire, who captured this in 1984. Rob Roy hails from the Sir Michael Stoute stable, which has been successful in this race seven times since 1985, including subsequent 2000 Guineas winners Shadeed and Doyoun (Ire). He faces Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's G2 Champagne S. scorer **Etlala**, who blotted his copybook when a disappointing eighth in the G1 Dewhurst S. at this track in October. Previously, he had beaten Cheveley Park Stud's **Iceman** at Doncaster and bids to provide connections with back-to-back renewals following the exploits of Haafhd (GB) 12 months ago. Iceman, who was carrying a five-pound penalty for his success in the G2 Coventry S. when losing to Etlala, was far from disgraced in two subsequent visits here when third in the G1 Middle Park S. and fourth in the Dewhurst. He finished a place behind the Franconson Partner's **Montgomery's Arch** on that occasion, and that G2 Richmond S. scorer was reported in "top form" by his trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam. "His work to start with this year was very lazy--but now it is fantastic," he reported on his website yesterday. "He is in top form--he'd have to be, running in the Craven. He will need the run in the race, so there's improvement for the Guineas. "

GOING WILD LOOKS TO BOOST EARNINGS IN LEXINGTON

After watching **Going Wild** (Golden Missile) tire badly and finish last of seven in Saturday's GI Wood Memorial S. at Aqueduct, trainer D. Wayne Lukas found himself with a horse that would likely lack the graded earnings to make it into the GI Kentucky Derby. Lukas, never afraid to call an audible, now plans on sending the big colt to the GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland Apr. 23 in order to boost his graded winnings. Considered by many a top contender for the Run for the Roses, **Going Wild** put together a string of solid performances before the Wood. Unfortunately for owners Bob and Beverly Lewis, however, he had just \$40,000 in graded earnings from his second-place effort in the GII Santa Catalina S. Mar. 5. **Going Wild** had previously won the Jan. 17 San Miguel S. and Feb. 5 Sham S.--neither of which are graded. Lukas has had luck using the Lexington as a prep in the past--Charismatic won in Louisville after capturing the Lexington, while Proud Citizen, winner of the 2002 Lexington, ran second to War Emblem in that year's Derby.

WHEN FARMER MET ZITO

One of the leading two-year-olds of 1996 was Acceptable, a Nick Zito-trained son of Capote raced by George Steinbrenner's Kinsman Stable. Tracy Farmer, who in 1993 bought a 135-acre property near Midway, Kentucky, named Shadowlawn Farm, became interested in the colt and purchased an interest in Acceptable, who was second to Boston Harbor in the 1996 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

Thus began the relationship between Zito and Farmer, who will team with **Sun King** (Charismatic) in Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. Farmer, 66, has campaigned the likes of champion Hidden Lake (in partnership with Three Chimneys' Robert Clay) and Albert the Great, and found himself having to break a promise at the Keeneland January sale in 2003.

"I told my wife before the sale that I definitely wasn't going to buy any horses," Farmer explained. "So I had to tell her when I got back that I lied."

The object of his affections that Monday afternoon was a colt by Kentucky Derby winner Charismatic, ultimately knocked down to Farmer for \$400,000. It was the top price for a short yearling during the sale.

"I liked his conformation, his family, and his dam, which I knew," he continued. A son of the mare Clever But Costly (Clever Trick), the colt is a half brother to GISW Traitor, MGSW Ocean Drive and to Clever Bertie, the dam of Hurricane Bertie and Allamerican Bertie. Bernard Flint, who trained the latter two fillies, served Farmer as an advisor on his purchase.

"I'll tell you what, this colt has everything he needs to be a fantastic racehorse," Flint said following the sale. "He is the best yearling that I have ever seen. He is just a super individual. All he needs to do is keep growing, stay sound and he can be any kind of horse."

Sun King was sent to Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Stud in Ocala, Florida, to be broken. Live Oak bred and races High Fly, another of Nick Zito's top chances in the Kentucky Derby.

"They call and congratulate me on Sun King and I call and congratulate them on High Fly," Farmer explained.

And if that wasn't ironic enough, now it seems that Bellamy Road, another Zito-trained runner owned by Kinsman, will have the bulls-eye on his back in Louisville three weeks from Saturday.

"Eventually you have to run against your friends," Farmer said with a chuckle.

CHRB Submits Unpaid Medical Claims To Guild:

According to the California Horse Racing Board, the Jockeys' Guild has failed to pay the medical claims of as many as 17 California jockeys and, in some cases, the bills have been unpaid so long that they have been sent to collection agencies. The CHRB, which pays the Guild \$1 million a year to cover health insurance for the riders, sent the Guild documentation of 12 cases of unpaid claims, and is waiting for authorization to send the paperwork on an additional five cases. In a letter to Guild Vice President Albert Fiss, CHRB Commissioner Richard Shapiro wrote, "We have been advised these claims have been unpaid and left unresolved. No matter what the reason, it is an obligation of the Jockeys' Guild to serve and assist its members in such a manner that no one is turned over to a collection agency, and to fully inform jockeys as to the proper procedures and health care providers for their medical needs." The CHRB received the documents regarding these cases from Ron Warren, Jr., who, along with jockeys Russell Baze and Francisco Duran, has formed the California Jockeys' Guild, a group independent of the Jockeys' Guild.

Aidan O'Brien has seven entered including Susan Magnier's unbeaten **Yeats (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), who has been off the track since taking the G2 Derby Trial at Leopardstown last May, while Rochelle Quinn's G1 Irish Derby scorer **Grey Swallow (Ire)** (Daylami {Ire}) adds further strength to the Irish team. "We couldn't have asked for a better set of entries for the Vodafone Coronation Cup and it is shaping into a mouthwatering contest as Warrsan bids for an historic third success," commented Epsom's Managing Director Stephen Wallis.

ACT OUT OF GUINEAS

The Sangster Family's **Playful Act (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) will sidestep the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 1, the *Racing Post* revealed yesterday. Trainer John Gosden announced the news that last year's G1 Fillies' Mile winner will wait for the G3 Tattersalls Musidora S. at York May 11. "The colts have been very well forward, but the fillies have been very backward, and she's no exception," he told the *Post*. "There is no point forcing her for the Guineas as she's not up to a solid piece of work right now. It's silly to force the issue and far more sensible to wait for the Musidora. At the end of the day, on her breeding and on the evidence of last season, she's probably a lot happier going a mile and a quarter first time out."
