**SWEET CATOMINE RETIRED**

Mr. & Mrs. Martin Wygod's **Sweet Catomine** (Storm Cat--Sweet Life, by Kris S.), the reigning Eclipse Award-winning two-year-old filly who became embroiled in controversy following a fifth-place finish in the GI Santa Anita Derby, has been retired from racing. She will be

sent to Kentucky and will be bred to A.P. Indy. Following a runner-up finish in her career debut, the bay filly rattled off five consecutive victories, all in stakes company, including the GI Del Mar Debutante, GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and the GI Santa Anita Oaks. After her five-length defeat as the even-money favorite in the Apr. 9 Santa Anita Derby, owner Marty Wygod revealed to the press that he had been "50-50" on whether to run Sweet Catomine in the race because she had bled during her final pre-race work and was in season. Wygod also reported that she had been

sent to the Alamo Pintado equine medical clinic in the week leading up to the Derby. "I felt this was in her best interests," Wygod said of the retirement. "She was evaluated in John Shirreffs's barn by three veterinarians and, after their analysis, that if it were any other horse we would probably continue to race her. With her, I wanted to take a more conservative view." Wygod transferred all of his horses from trainer Julio Canani following the Derby. While the filly's racing days are now behind her, the investigation surrounding the Santa Anita Derby continues. The California Horse Racing Board has filed complaints against Wygod, Canani and the van driver responsible for delivering Sweet Catomine to the clinic. There has also been a lawsuit filed by a fan, seeking undetermined damages and claiming that he and other racing fans were misled and defrauded by Wygod's failure to share the information about his horse. Sweet Catomine heads to the breeding shed with a record of 7-5-1-0 and earnings of \$1,059,600.

**CLOCK STOPPER INJURED**

**Clock Stopper** (Gilded Time--Great Fun, by Farma Way), who won his first graded stakes in last Saturday's GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup S. at Keeneland, has emerged from the race with a tendon injury, casting doubt upon his future. "Dr. Robert

Copelan is dealing with the injury," said Overbrook's Ric Waldman. "For now, plans for the future are uncertain." Trained by Dallas Stewart, the one-run closer seemed to always run out of ground in his races, posting runner-up finishes in the GI Forego H., GII A.G. Vanderbilt H. and the

GIII Smile Sprint H. last year and a third-place effort in the GI Frank J. DeFrancis Dash. In his two starts prior to the Commonwealth, the five-year-old gelding was second in the Colonel Power H. at the Fair Grounds and second in the GII Richter Scale Breeders' Cup H. Bred in Kentucky by Dr. Lance Bell and David Hochberg, Clock Stopper's career record stands at 20-6-7-3 and earnings of \$779,524.

**DON'T GET MAD STILL POSSIBLE FOR DERBY?**

B. Wayne Hughes' **Don't Get Mad** (Stephen Got Even) arrived at Churchill Downs Tuesday and while he is being prepared for a run in the \$100,000 Derby Trial Apr. 30, trainer Ron Ellis would not totally dismiss a Run for the Roses. "Who knows?" the conditioner said from Keeneland, where he was attending Tuesday's sale. "For now we're just looking at the one race, because he could always go to the Preakness off that race if he were to win that. But I wouldn't rule anything out until we see how he runs." With a full field expected to be drawn in two weeks, it seems unlikely that the colt, sixth in the GI Santa Anita Derby, would draw into the race. With \$60,000 in graded stakes earnings, Don't Get Mad is currently 21st among Derby hopefuls.

### JOCKEYS' GUILD WILL NOT BOYCOTT CDI

The Jockeys' Guild Inc. has entered into an agreement with Churchill Downs Incorporated (CDI) which stipulates that its members will not refuse to provide their services at the seven tracks operated by the Louisville-based company. With the announcement, CDI has withdrawn its request for a preliminary injunction, which would have prevented any boycott organized by the Jockeys' Guild. "Churchill Downs Inc. was prepared to seek a preliminary injunction prior to our case going to trial and prior to the opening of our spring Thoroughbred meets to ensure our operations, including the 131st Kentucky Oaks and Kentucky Derby, would go forward without incident," Andrew G. Skehan, CDI's executive vice president and chief operating officer, said in a release. "The joint stipulation and consent order now in place gives us that assurance as we prepare for the start of our 2005 Thoroughbred racing seasons at Arlington Park, Calder Race Course, Churchill Downs and Hollywood Park."

In the ruling handed down in U.S. District Court for the Western District of Kentucky, the Guild has agreed not to "interfere with the operation of Churchill Downs Incorporated" and "coerce, encourage, suggest, advise or induce any jockey not to provide jockey services in Thoroughbred races" at CDI tracks. In return, CDI agrees to refrain from threatening, intimidating, disciplining or coercing any jockey, although CDI retains the right to expel any person, including jockeys, from its premises for just cause.

Dance Daily, a \$90,000 KEESEP yearling, blossomed into a \$600,000 BESMAR juvenile as the highest-priced filly at last month's auction. Despite several sharp drills since, she was let go as the 7-2 third choice, but proved much the best here. After an awkward start, the chestnut was shuffled back behind horses and was forced to take up on the turn. Jockey Rafael Bejarano guided her to the outside and Dance Daily responded, shifting into overdrive and opening up to win by two lengths.
