**ARMEE MARCHES INTO HONG KONG**

Tabbed by champion trainer Gai Waterhouse as "the best she has trained," Australian galloper **Grand Armee (Aus)** (Hennessy) leads a strong one-two punch for his country in Sunday's G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin. A four-time Group 1 winner at 2000 meters, the six-year-old was dealt a potential blow when he drew post position 13, one from the outside, for the \$1.8-million event. But Waterhouse remains confident in his chances. "I'm not the least bit worried," she told *Australian Associated Press*, declaring her charge a "second-to-none" chance. "I've never been concerned about barrier draws in Australia and I'm not concerned over here either." Grand Armee is the mount of Hong Kong's leading jockey Douglas Whyte, who won the QE II in 1997 and 1998. **Elvstroem (Aus)** (Danehill) has firmed into co-favoritism after landing the nine hole yesterday. "It's worked out perfectly," commented trainer Tony Vasil. Added jockey Nash Rawiller, "From there I should be able to sit poised behind them in front or, if there's not enough speed, I can go on with it." The four-year-old comes into this off a front-running score in the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. Mar. 26.

**Phoenix Reach (Ire)** (Alhaarth {Ire}), whose last trip to the SAR resulted in an upset score in the G1 Hong Kong Vase in December, made it two straight international wins with his two-length victory in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic Mar. 26, a race in which South Africa's **Greys Inn (Zabeel {NZ})** was fourth. **Epalo (Ger)** (Lando {Ger}), winner of last year's G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup, missed the international meeting in December with an injury, but prepped for the QE II with an easy five-length victory in the G3 Grosser Preis Wirtschaft Apr. 10. River Dancer scored for the home team last year; the best chance for the locals this time around is **Vengeance of Rain (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}). The four-year-old bested **Russian Pearl (NZ)** (Soviet Star) and **Sambuca (SAf)** (London News {SAf}) in the G1 Hong Kong Derby Mar. 13. *Full Field p3*

**LEXINGTON: LAST LICKS FOR DERBY HOPEFULS**

Eight sophomores will attempt to earn a last-minute trip to the Kentucky Derby in Saturday's GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland. Headlining the field is **Rockport Harbor (Unbridled's Song)**, representing last year's Derby-winning team of trainer John Servis and jockey Stewart Elliott. The gray colt was unbeaten in four starts last season, including wins in the GII Remsen S. and GIII Nashua S., but after a troubled spring has made only one start at three. He **Rockport Harbor** was second behind Greater Good **Steve Sherack** in the GIII Rebel S. and then missed a scheduled start in last week's GII Arkansas Derby with a blood clot in his neck. Also looking to get back on the Derby track is the D. Wayne Lukas-trained **Going Wild (Golden Missile)**. After opening 2005 with wins in the San Miguel S. and Sham S., the dark bay colt ran a gutsy second behind Declan's Moon in the GII Santa Catalina S., but was soundly beaten when last in the Apr. 9 GI Wood Memorial S. "He's really bounced back," Lukas said of Going Wild's dull performance in the Wood. "He looks good and his energy is good. I'd be hard-pressed to make an excuse for him this time. I don't know what happened there." While keeping top company, Going Wild has only amassed graded stakes earnings of \$47,500. Without a win Saturday, that leaves him on the outside looking in on a full Derby field.

**CLASSIC TRIAL-G3 preview cont.**

Trainer Michael Bell already holds one Epsom Derby ace in current ante-post second favorite Motivator (GB). His lesser known **Glen Ida** can enhance Fitzroy Stable's fortunes by staking his claim for a G1 Derby Italiano run in Rome May 22 here. Placed in his first two starts, he completed his freshman education with a maiden victory at Newcastle in September and returned to action with an impressive handicap success at Kempton Mar. 28. If continuing on the upgrade, he should be in the shake-up. Dermot Weld's **Merger** boasts strong form and is another for consideration. A five-length winner on debut at Thurles last September, he filled the runner-up berth behind Albert Hall (GB) in the G2 Bresford S. at The Curragh Oct. 10 and behind Indesatchel (Ire) in the Loughbrown S. back at that track Apr. 3 on his seasonal return. **Fracas** created a highly favorable impression on debut when securing a maiden at Leopardstown Apr. 10 and this unexposed individual holds legitimate claims for a place. **Kings Quay** should not be discounted. He returns here off a last-out second in the Listed Feilden S. at Newmarket Apr. 14.

**BELLAMY ROAD WORKS**

Kinsman Stable's **Bellamy Road** (Concerto) had his first work since a dominating 17 1/2-length victory in the Apr. 9 GI Wood Memorial when he went an easy five furlongs at Churchill Downs yesterday. The colt worked in fractions of :13.20, :25.40, :38 and :49.40 and completed the drill in 1:02.80. He galloped out six furlongs in 1:16.40. After the work, trainer Nick Zito said his challenge with the colt is keeping him in the form of that Wood Memorial victory. "I'm just trying to keep him there," Zito said. "Obviously, the horse won by so many lengths and he was so impressive. So that's what we're trying to do, just keep everything

the same and hopefully it will work out." Zito is enjoying pre-Derby activities with five separate horses. "For me, it'll never happen again," Zito said. "It's five different ownerships--it's a once-in-a-lifetime deal and I don't think it'll happen for me again, certainly. We just hope we make the best of it, that's all. You just hope that every single one of them is worthy of that honor. It's a privilege to be here."

**Runway Model Works...**

Kentucky Oaks hopeful **Runway Model** (Petionville) breezed a half mile at Churchill yesterday in :47.20--the fastest of 31 works at the distance. Jockey Brian Peck was in the irons for the move. "Right now, I couldn't ask for her to do any better," trainer Bernie Flint said after the work. "She did that all on her own. I wish the Oaks were tomorrow. Everyday I'm getting a little more confident." Runway Model is coming off a distant second-place finish behind Sis City in the Apr. 2 GI Ashland S.

**Triple Threats**

**AFLEET ALEX ARRIVES**

Fresh off his impressive win in Saturday's GII Arkansas Derby, **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet) arrived at Churchill Downs yesterday. Just hours after his arrival, the colt was jogging over the Churchill strip. "He's doing well," said trainer Tim Ritchey. "He came out of the race very well." Outlining Afleet Alex's pre-Derby schedule, Ritchey said, "[Friday] he'll go out and jog two miles early. He'll come back, we'll cool him out and, after the break sometime, he'll go back out and jog a little bit and then gallop." Ritchey added that Afleet Alex would work either next Monday or Tuesday.

**CHURCHILL INCREASES JOCKEYS' INSURANCE**

Churchill Downs Inc. has finalized agreements with AIG Insurance to provide \$1 million in on-track insurance coverage for jockeys competing at CDI racetracks in states where riders are not covered by workers' compensation programs. Tracks implementing the new coverage are: Arlington Park, Calder Race Course, Churchill Downs, Ellis Park, Fair Grounds and Hoosier Park. Jockeys at Hollywood Park are already covered by California's workers' compensation program. CDI had previously provided jockeys with \$100,000 in coverage. The company will be paying the majority of the cost of the new premium, but is also depending on support from racehorse owners in Florida, Indiana, Illinois, Kentucky and Louisiana. "While racetracks do not employ jockeys, they are important contributors to our live racing product and Churchill Downs Inc. is committed to funding the lion's share of the cost for the \$1 million in on-track coverage," commented Andrew G. Skehan, executive vice president and chief operating officer. "This is an industry-wide issue that requires an industry-wide response and we look to our horsemen to assist us in paying for the added cost of this increased coverage."

**SCOOP THE GOLD DIES** Scoop the Gold (Forty Niner--Leap Lively, by Nijinsky II), the dam of multiple Grade I winner High Yield (Storm Cat), died Apr. 17 after suffering a ruptured aorta. The 15-year-old mare was purchased by Brushwood Stable for \$475,000 at the 1995 Keeneland November Sale. A stakes winner on the racetrack, Scoop the Gold produced five foals. High Yield, her second foal, sold to Coolmore for \$1,050,000 at the 1998 Keeneland July sale. He went on to win the GI Toyota Blue Grass S., GI Hopeful S. and GI Fountain of Youth. Her fourth foal, named Turbo Storm (Storm Cat), sold for \$1 million at the 2002 Keeneland September sale. That colt was unraced. Scoop the Gold's final foal, a yearling filly by Giant's Causeway, will be retained by Brushwood Stable.

**GENERAL MEETING PENSIONED** General Meeting (Seattle Slew--Alydar's Promise, by Alydar), the sire of millionaires General Challenge and Excellent Meeting, has been pensioned from Golden Eagle Farm due to severe arthritis in his neck. The 17-year-old stallion has sired the earners of over \$22.6 million and 26 stakes winners. In his best year at stud, General Meeting was 12th among North American sires with progeny earnings over \$4.2 million. That year, he was represented by three-time Grade I winner General Challenge and Grade I winner Excellent Meeting. He is also the sire of Grade I winner Magical Allure and Grade II winners Career Collection, Classy Cara and Yearly Report. "General Meeting has been wonderful to both me and [the late] John [Mabee] over the years and is irreplaceable to our breeding program and to California breeders," commented Golden Eagle owner Betty Mabee.

Campaigned exclusively on the turf, Gun Salute was a close second at Ellis Park in his Aug. 23 debut before graduating by 1 3/4 lengths in his next appearance Sept. 3. The bay defeated Rey de Café in a two-lifetime allowance over this lawn Oct. 14, but was sidelined off a fourth-place finish to that rival in the Oct. 29 Bourbon County S. Sixth to Interpatation (Langfuhr) and Tadreeb (Theatrical {Ire}) in the GIII Palm Beach S. at Gulfstream Mar. 26, the homebred was getting first Lasix and blinkers for the second three-year-old turf stakes of the meet. Five wide much of the way beneath Cornelio Velasquez, Gun Salute advanced into contention approaching the quarter pole and drove clear late to the victory. "He had been a little bit shy of other horses," commented trainer Bill Mott on the equipment change. "Today when he made his run, he was a little more professional about it." It's true. Perfect Drift does remember the way to the winner's circle. The six-year-old gelding endured a tough 2004 campaign, where he registered runner-up finishes to Roses In May in the GIII Prairie Meadows Cornhusker BC H. and the GI Whitney H. and to Pleasantly Perfect in the GI Pacific Classic. Second in the GII Hawthorne Gold Cup, the bay was a respectable fourth in Ghostzapper's GI Breeders' Cup Classic and was last seen when third to Saint Liam in the GII Clark H. Nov. 26. Favored to earn his first victory since the 2003 Hawthorne Gold Cup, Perfect Drift was kept within striking distance while four wide, circled three wide into the stretch and pulled away to defeat a solid field. "It's great to have him back in the winner's circle," said winning trainer Murray Johnson. "We'll see how he comes out of this and weigh out our options to get us to the [GI, June 18] Stephen Foster [H.] the best way." That could mean another start on the grass in the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic May 7. [Click for a video replay.](#)

Broad Hopes decimated the field in the off-the-turf Denise Rhudy Memorial S. at Delaware Park in August 2003, but went missing for nearly 17 months off a seventh-place effort in the GII Lake Placid S. over the Saratoga turf course two weeks later. The bay returned with a sixth in a Gulfstream sprint allowance Feb. 17 and most recently filled that same spot racing over the Hallandale turf course Mar. 12. Favored in this short field, the Augustin homebred was allowed to trail for the opening half mile, began to gain ground on the turn, rolled five wide to lead into the lane and went on to register a decisive victory.
