LONG SHOT IN LEXINGTON?

With **Going Wild** (Golden Missile) coming off the worst performance of his career and questions surrounding **Rockport Harbor** (Unbridled's Song), has the door been left ajar for an upset in today's GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland? Todd Pletcher staged such

an upset when he sent the lightly regarded Flower Alley to victory in the GII Lane's End S. at 10-1 odds, and will try to replicate that feat with **Coin Silver** (Anees). The colt, owned by Peachtree Stable, was a tired third going nine furlongs against Gulfstream

allowance rivals Apr. 2. He scales back a sixteenth of a mile today, but he'll have to avoid a speed duel with the free-running Rockport Harbor. The same could be said for **Actxecutive** (Noactor). The chestnut joined Steve Asmussen's barn last fall after seconds in the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S. and GII Best Pal S. and, returning from a seven-month absence, led gate-to-wire for his new trainer in an Oaklawn allowance Mar. 18. It'll be interesting to see if Rafael Bejarano--typically D. Wayne Lukas' go-to jockey--will send him from post one or try to settle in behind the leaders. Tampa Bay shipper **Forever Wild** (Jules) ran a good second to Sun King in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 19 and will be at double-digit odds for anyone willing to take a shot on a trainer--Joan Scott--who's hitting at a 33-percent clip in 2005.

HE'S GOT GAME

Undeclared in his five starts, former claimer **Lord of the Game** (Saint Ballado) faces the toughest assignment of his career in today's GIII National Jockey Club H. at Hawthorne. The four-year-old made his debut for a \$10,000 tag on New Year's Eve and changed hands after crushing that field by 22 lengths. He followed with allowance victories at Fair Grounds Feb. 5 and back at Hawthorne Mar. 11 before beating optional claimers at the Illinois oval Apr. 2 and Apr. 12. But he takes on **Badge of Silver** (Silver Deputy) this afternoon. The five-year-old is a perfect two-for-two this term, winning the Jan. 8 GIII Hal's Hope H. at Gulfstream and the Mar. 12 GII New Orleans H. at Fair Grounds. He was scheduled to make his next start in the Apr. 9 GI Carter H., but trainer Bobby Frankel had to go to Plan B when the Ken and Sarah Ramsey colorbearer came up with a foot abscess just before that race. After spending a few days in the barn, Badge of Silver was back in training, working six furlongs in a bullet 1:13 1/5 at Churchill Downs Apr. 16, but he could be vulnerable. "He's not 100 percent," Frankel told *Daily Racing Form*, but added, "but I don't think these horses are as good as he is." **National Jockey Club field, p2**

QUIFF READY TO MAKE NOISE

Khalid Abdullah's **Quiff** (GB) (Sadler's Wells) will carry a seven-pound penalty when she makes her seasonal bow in the G3 Betfred Gordon Richards S. at Sandown this afternoon. Mick Kinane has the mount for Sir Michael Stoute aboard the Juddmonte homebred. After romping by 11 lengths in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks in August, the blaze-faced bay was a valiant runner-up to Rule of Law in the G1 St. Leger S. at Doncaster Sept. 11. Adreamisborn has finished on the board in 12 of his 13 starts over the last two seasons. The six-year-old gelding was five-for-10 last year, with three stakes wins on the main track. In the money in his first two tries this term, the dark bay picked up his first added-money score on the grass in his latest, the Mar. 19 GIII Stanford Breeders' Cup H. at a mile and a sixteenth on this course. He faces the 2004 GI Santa Anita Derby hero **Castledale**. The bay was sidelined after finishing 14th in the GI Kentucky Derby and ran fifth in both the Jan. 15 GII San Fernando BC H. and the Feb. 5 GII Strub S. on his return. The winner of the GIII Generous S. on the turf at two, he was back on the grass for an optional claimer at Santa Anita Mar. 17 and just missed, finishing second by a head. **Imitation**, graded-stakes placed on the grass at three, was out of action for 22 months before returning in an allowance race at Santa Anita Mar. 3. The five-year-old set the early pace before weakening to be fifth and should benefit from that tightener.

Better Talk Now scored the two biggest victories of his career over yielding courses and, with rain in the forecast, he could get soft turf again here. The bay gelding showed his affinity for off going last year with wins in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. at Saratoga and the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Lone Star. He has not been out since running sixth as the even-money chalk in the Dec. 4 GI Hollywood Turf Cup, but is unbeaten in two prior tries at Aqueduct. Trainer Graham Motion said, "I couldn't be happier with how he is doing," but added, "We're looking at the big picture here. This is a good conservative race to get started with and we wouldn't be disappointed if he doesn't win."

There may be questions about the temperament of **Norse Dancer**, but the imposing bay has compiled an impressive record to date. He has posted five career placings at the Group 1 level, including seconds last year to Sulamani (Ire) in the G1 International S. and Azamour (Ire) in the G1 Irish Champion S., as well as a third to Russian Rhythm in the G1 Lockinge S. He finished up 2004 with a fourth-place finish in the G1 Champion S. Oct. 16, but demonstrated his current well-being with a victory in the G3 Earl of Sefton S. at Newmarket Apr. 13. **Stream of Gold** looked a group winner in the making when posting an impressive three-length score in the highly competitive Lincoln H. at Doncaster Apr. 2, but he does look in the deep end here on his stakes debut. **Hurricane Alan**, a neck adrift of Norse Dancer in the Earl of Sefton, recorded a career-best when winning this contest at 25-1 last year.

CHAMPION JOLYPHA DIES French champion **Jolypha** (Lyphard--Navajo Princess, by Drone) died Mar. 26 from foaling complications, according to published reports. The 16-year-old sustained a ruptured intestine while foaling an Empire Maker colt at Juddmonte Farms in Kentucky. A full sister to European champion Dancing Brave, the dark bay carried the green and pink colors of owner/breeder Juddmonte to victory in three of five starts in France for trainer Andre Fabre. She captured the G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix Vermeille, earning highweight status as France's top three-year-old at 9.5 to 11 furlongs. Sent to the U.S., Jolypha ran a bang-up third in the 1992 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Gulfstream to champions A.P. Indy and Pleasant Tap, then was sent to Bobby Frankel for her four-year-old campaign. She managed an allowance win and a second to Flawlessly in the GI Beverly Hills H., but failed to place in the GI Ramona H. and GI Goodwood H. and was retired with a record of 10-4-2-1 and earnings of \$973,226. She produced two winners from eight foals of racing age. Still to come are Apartment, a juvenile filly by Aptitude, and a yearling filly by Chester House.

It had been 28 years since the last Irish-trained runner, **Artaius**, captured this contest for Vincent O'Brien and Lester Piggott in 1977, but that statistic was consigned to history by **Fracas** yesterday. "It was a good effort to come here on his second start against experienced horses," said winning trainer David Wachman. "We took a punt coming over here to find out more about him and I suppose we know a bit more now. We can go to the next stage, there's the G2 [Derby Trial] at Leopardstown [May 8] and he's in all the trials, but I'll talk to Jamie [jockey Spencer] to see where he slots in." Returning off a promising 10-furlong maiden score over heavy ground at Leopardstown Apr. 10, the bay went postward at 9-2 and was positioned in a tracking fourth early. Making progress under pressure inside the final quarter mile, **Fracas** gave a moment's cause for concern when brushing into **Hearthstead Wings (GB)** (In the Wings {GB}) as he seized the initiative approaching the eighth pole. Spencer was alert to the danger, returning his mount to an even keel, and the partnership maintained control up the final climb to defeat useful yardstick **Merger** and the unlucky **Hattan**.

Zito Duo Breezes at Churchill Downs...

Trainer Nick Zito sent out two of his five Kentucky Derby candidates to breeze at Churchill Downs yesterday morning. Breaking off at the half-mile pole and working to the seven-eighths pole, GI Florida Derby winner **High Fly** (Atticus) was clocked going five furlongs in 1:06 3/5, while stablemate **Noble Causeway** (Giant's Causeway) was caught in 1:04 3/5.

The two had been scheduled to breeze today, but a forecast of inclement weather caused Zito to move the works up a day. "When they started talking about rain on Sunday, too, and hail and this and that...I said, 'let's not fool with Mother Nature,'" he explained. The Brooklyn-born horseman was not concerned with the less than sparkling times. "The main thing is, regardless of what times they got, both horses went super," Zito said. I loved the way both horses went around the turn. **High Fly** scooted around that turn. **Noble Causeway** looked great. They both looked super and that's all we could ask for. We'll do some serious work next week."

Six-furlong Move for Greeley's Galaxy...

GI Illinois Derby hero **Greeley's Galaxy** (Mr. Greeley) worked six furlongs at Churchill yesterday, getting the distance in 1:16.80 before galloping out seven-eighths in 1:32.40. "He felt fabulous," said exercise rider Mikki Fincher.

MAJOR HORSEMAN'S GROUPS ON NTRA FENCE

Two major horsemen's groups in key racing states are reassessing their membership in the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, officials said. Meanwhile, some non-members are at least considering rejoining the organization pending review of the new NTRA strategic plan. Officials with the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and Thoroughbred Owners of California said Apr. 22 they are on the fence. They spoke during a horsemen's forum at the Association of Racing Commissioners International convention in Lexington. Under a handle-based formula, the two groups combined have contributed about \$2 million a year in dues. "The economic realities in Kentucky will force us to reassess horsemen's membership in the NTRA," said Marty Maline, executive director of the Kentucky HBPA, the largest HBPA affiliate in terms of membership numbers with about 6,000. Maline said the NTRA is now less involved in marketing. He also said the Kentucky HBPA was assured the NTRA wouldn't be involved with the "drug issue," but ended up facilitating national model rules that have supplanted Kentucky's equine medication policy. "It has been a source of frustration with some of our horsemen," Maline said. As for the TOC, chairman Alan Landsburg said a soon-to-be-released internal report would help decide "whether we go all the way, half of the way, or no way. We have support for at least two-thirds of what they do on our board." Click [here](#) for the complete story.

NUMBER OF FOALS TO DETERMINE BC FEES

Beginning with the 2006 breeding season, the nomination fees for Breeders' Cup stallions will be determined by the number of registered live foals in their crops. The Breeders' Cup Limited Board of Directors approved the move, which was based on a recommendation by the Racing and Nominations Committee, at their meeting in Lexington Apr. 21. The nomination fee for stallions with one to 49 live foals will be the advertised stud fee. That cost will rise to 1 1/2 times the stud fee for stallions with 50 to 99 live foals, and to two times the stud fee for stallions with 100 or more live foals. "The number of mares bred and the resulting live foals have nearly tripled since the beginning of the Breeders' Cup program," said Pamela Blatz-Murff, the senior vice president of Breeders' Cup Operations and the chair of the Nominations Committee. "Our Board feels that these changes in stallion fees bring the program more into line with the reality of the marketplace."

LADIES FOR LIFE RAISE \$150,000 Ladies for Life, an organization formed in 2004 to support research programs and to raise awareness of cancer in women, last week presented a check for \$150,000 to the Ovarian Cancer Research Fund at the University of Kentucky. The donation will be used to fund the University's screening program for the early detection of ovarian cancer, the largest of its kind in the U.S. "We hope to make significant progress in the early detection of ovarian cancer with this support," said Dr. Jack van Nagell, Jr., who heads the program, "and the two ladies who inspired the formation of Ladies for Life, Susan Hundley and Janice Jones, would be very proud of the work they are doing."
