S. winner **Footstepsinthesand (GB)** (Giant's Causeway) heads a two-pronged challenge from Ballydoyle alongside the same partnership's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere victor **Oratorio (Ire)** (Danehill). "Footstepsinthesand has been working well and has done nothing wrong, but it was very hard to choose," explained jockey Kieren Fallon, who has opted to ride Oratorio.

"[Footstepsinthesand] only wants to please, whereas Oratorio only does what he has to. As he's lazy, it's hard to get a horse ready first time, but it wouldn't shock me if Oratorio finished in front since he's a tough horse who goes on any ground." Fallon is wary of the favorite's imposing presence on the first British Classic, however. "I thought Dubawi looked a superstar last year and he'll be very hard to crack--he stands out, having had the sun on his back all winter," the rider added. Harry Dobson's G3 Craven S. hero **Democratic Deficit (Ire)** (Soviet Star) will attempt to confirm the placings of that trial at Newmarket Apr. 14 with Philip Newton's runner-up **Rob Roy** (Lear Fan), Tony Richards' third-placed **Kandidate (GB)** (Kabool {GB}) and Cheveley Park Stud's fourth **Iceman (GB)** (Polar Falcon), all of whom return for another crack.

Keeneland yesterday. His success follows that of Horse of the Year Mineshaft in 2003 and Midway Road in 2004. The lightly raced six-year-old had won two of three previous starts at this oval, including a money allowance Apr. 9 when he defeated **Pies Prospect** (Crafty Prospector) and **Best Minister** (Deputy Minister).

After racing in second down the backstretch, the chestnut ranged up turning for home, put his head in front and fended off a challenge from favored Pies Prospect. "He's a wonderful horse," said winning trainer Neil Howard. "We've always been very high on him but it took a while for him to come around. We'll keep him nominated to all the appropriate races. ICEMAN COMETH ALONG Iceman's trainer John Gosden expects last year's G2 Coventry S. winner to have improved since that effort. "He's come out of it well and finished well in the race and has worked pleasingly since," he said yesterday. "As long as they don't get too much rain at Newmarket and he gets his favored fast ground, he should run a big race, as there's no doubt he's a superior horse on fast ground." Just three horses dropped out at the final stage, including Franconson Partners' **Montgomery's Arch** (Arch) and The Queen's **Forward Move (Ire)** (Dr Fong). "The word on the streets of Newmarket is that Dubawi will not be beaten and one can sense a growing feeling that we might be going to witness a very special performance here on Saturday," Newmarket's Managing Director Lisa Hancock said yesterday. "Though I say it myself, the Rowley Mile looks in tremendous shape, all ready for the electric atmosphere of Guineas weekend when the first champions of the season will emerge." **Field p3**

2000 GUINEAS FACTS

- Sir Michael Stoute is the most successful current trainer in the 2000 Guineas with five victories. His winners are: **Shadeed** (1985), **Doyoun (Ire)** (1988), **Entrepreneur (GB)** (1997), **King's Best** (2000) and **Golan (Ire)** (2001).
- The last favorite to win was 5-6 **Zafonic** in 1993.
- The record time of 1:35.08 was set by **Mister Baileys (GB)** in 1994.
- In the last 10 years, three winners have been trained in Ireland, **Refuse to Bend (Ire)** (2003) by Dermot Weld and **Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)** (2002) and **King of Kings (Ire)** (1998) by Aidan O'Brien.

Triple Threats

ZITO PAIR STRETCH LEGS Trainer Nick Zito sent out two of his five Kentucky Derby candidates for workouts yesterday morning at Churchill Downs. **Sun King** (Charismatic) cruised through five-eighths in a minute flat, while **Andromeda's Hero** (Fusaichi Pegasus) covered the same distance in 1:01.80. Sun King worked in company with a pair of stablemates. "Sometimes you work horses psychologically," Zito said. "That's why I worked him with those two horses. We wanted to make him feel good."

Andromeda's Hero has pleased his trainer since running third in the GII Arkansas Derby. "I thought he worked extremely well," Zito said. "All I wanted was the last part. He's a horse that obviously comes from behind and it looks like he is getting better. He is definitely a horse that can get the mile and a quarter trip. The work was exactly what I wanted."

'High' Hopes...

Gary and Mary West's GII Louisiana Derby hero **High Limit** (Maria's Mon) worked alongside stablemate Ghostzapper for a six-furlong breeze in 1:13.80. Ghostzapper went five-eighths in 1:00.40. Frankel had considered putting blinkers on High Limit for the Derby, but has decided against it. "It would be very hard to do right before this race," said Frankel. "If it was normal race, we might try it. I'm not that brave. I think if he has a horse in front of him, he'll pay attention. I think he does it when he gets to the lead too soon."

Double Gs...

Greater Good (Intidab), winner of the GIII Rebel S., went three-quarters in 1:17.40. The ridgling was a bit rank before his drill. "He finished pretty strong," said trainer Bob Holthus. "He got away a little bit from the boy [jockey John McKee] going around to the pole and he probably did a little more than we'd like for him to. But he did finish strong and he galloped out seven-eighths in (a minute and) 31. One good thing is we've got plenty of time to overcome it." The GII Illinois Derby victor **Greeley's Galaxy** (Mr. Greeley) went a mile in 1:40.60. "He got tired, and that's what I wanted him to do," commented trainer Warren Stute. "That's the way you get them fit. A lot of horses that run are short, but very seldom mine."

OBS APRIL CLOSES SLIGHTLY DOWN The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company concluded its Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training with moderate declines versus last year. For essentially the same number of horses sold, both gross receipts and average were off the 2004 figures by just over five percent, while the overall median of \$17,000 was 5.5 percent lower than last year's \$18,000. The percentage of buybacks advanced to 28.6 percent versus 19.9 percent in 2004. A pair of colts topped yesterday's final round of bidding, achieving identical final bids of \$190,000. William Condren went to that amount to acquire hip 1069, a bay colt by Greenwood Lake from the consignment of Michael Sherman's Farnsworth Farms. The colt, who worked a quarter mile in :21 3/5 during the under-tack preview, is a son of the stakes-winning mare Fortune Forty Four (Fortunate Prospect) and is a half brother to MSW & GSP Smoke Chaser (Smoke Glacken). Steve Klesaris, bidding on behalf of Puglisi Stables, was the successful bidder on hip 1205, a bay son of Siphon (Brz). Consigned to the sale by Wingate Sales Agency (France Weiner), agent, the Feb. 12 foal was produced by the Conquistador Cielo mare House Dressing and is a half brother to Canadian stakes winner Taos (Dr. Adagio). He breezed three-eighths of a mile in :34 flat during the under-tack show. *Full sales figures, see p2*

Race-Day Security Barns to Begin at Belmont:

The New York Racing Association has announced the implementation of race-day security barns beginning at the opening of Belmont's spring meeting Wednesday, May 4. The program will be duplicated at Saratoga and at Aqueduct later in the year. Two barns at Belmont, 8 and 23, with a total of 93 stalls, will be used to provide a secure environment for all entered horses. Once a horse has entered the barn, only the trainer and his/her stable employees will be permitted entrance; no private veterinarians will be admitted. Entered horses must arrive at the security barn a minimum of six hours prior to their race. "I am pleased that NYRA is stepping up to the plate and taking on this initiative," said trainer David Donk. "Obviously, I am for it because this is the future of racing. Eventually, I think the future is a 24-hour security barn with a camera in every stall. This is for the betterment of racing and a great day for both the \$2 bettor and the serious gambler." The program is the first of its kind in the nation.

AGSC Implements Drug Testing Protocol:

The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association's American Graded Stakes Committee has announced that it has implemented its drug testing protocol. Working with racing commissions and their testing laboratories, racetracks and horsemen groups, the committee has implemented the protocol in each of the states that has conducted a graded stake so far this year. That includes Arkansas, California, Florida, Illinois, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, and New York. Texas will implement the protocol later this month. Also, Delaware, Iowa, New Jersey, and Virginia voluntarily implemented the protocol on their graded stakes races in 2004 and will use the protocol again in 2005 when their race meets begin. "The primary goal of this protocol is to ensure the integrity of the grades assigned, but we also hope this will be part of a broader industry initiative that leads to increased testing and the development of uniform laboratory standards," said Dell Hancock, a TOBA member of the committee.
