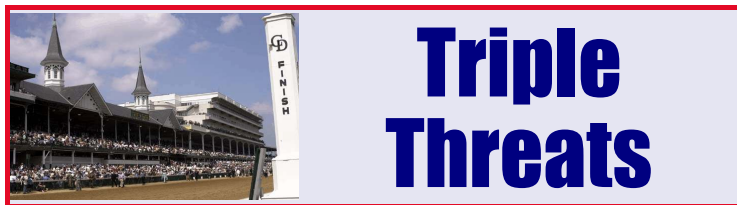
NO MORE VISA TRIPLE CROWN CHALLENGE

Unveiling a change in its marketing strategy, Visa USA yesterday announced that it will not renew its 10-year sponsorship of the Visa Triple Crown. Instead, the company has signed a five-year deal with Churchill Downs Incorporated to sponsor the GI Kentucky Derby. The agreement goes into effect in 2006. "We've had an unbelievably successful partnership with the Visa Triple Crown, but we must always work to keep our approach fresh and relevant to our

cardholders. This move gives us the ability to strategically position our Visa Signature product alongside the signature event in Thoroughbred racing," said Michael Lynch, senior vice president of Visa USA. "By creating unique new programs like this, we increase the value of Visa Signature cards to cardholders and increase cardholders' loyalty to the Member financial institutions that issue them." Putting a positive spin on the news, Ed Seigenfeld, the executive director of Triple Crown Productions, told AP, "We're sad to see them go, but Visa has been an unbelievable promoter of our product. Ten years is a pretty long time. Aside from the dollars they've put in, they've always given us nothing but tremendous support." Seigenfeld added that the Triple Crown would begin looking for a new sponsor immediately. "We're not going to let the grass grow under our feet," he said. Since Visa began its association with the Triple Crown in 1996, there have been six three-year-olds with the chance to sweep the series in the Belmont S., but all six failed in the attempt and the \$5 million Visa Triple Crown bonus was never awarded. "All of us at Visa are really hoping that this is the year we finally award our \$5 million Visa Triple Crown Challenge Bonus," Lynch said.

sesamoid. Following a routine gallop at Churchill Downs Sunday morning, the chestnut stumbled several times as he was coming off the track. He cooled out OK, but was uncomfortable while walking the shedrow Sunday afternoon. X-rays taken yesterday revealed the fracture. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas said, "With sesamoid injuries, you can bring back a \$25,000 claimer, but not this level of horse." The injury will not require surgery. Purchased for \$1.25 million as a KEESEP yearling, Consolidator won the GI Breeders' Futurity at two and the GII San Felipe S. at three. He retires with three wins, a second and a third from 10 starts and earnings of \$661,760. **Going Wild** (Golden Missile) will carry the Lewis's green and gold colors on the first Saturday in May. Jockey Rafael Bejarano, was to ride Consolidator in the Derby, will now have the mount on the Nick Zito-trained **Andromeda's Hero** (Fusaichi Pegasus).

Final Tune-up for Coin Silver...

GII Coolmore Lexington S. hero **Coin Silver** (Anees) had his final Derby workout yesterday, going five furlongs in 1:01 at Churchill Downs. With Hall of Famer Angel Cordero Jr. in the irons, the colt worked in company with GII Illinois Derby runner-up Monarch Lane. "The clockers had Coin Silver in 1:01, and I caught him in a minute and four-fifths, but it was just what we wanted," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "He went very well. When he pulled away from Monarch Lane he got a little bit idle, but then picked it up again at the end." He added, "We didn't do too much with him today...we're just looking to keep him happy and on edge."

Buzzards Bay Fires a Bullet...

Buzzards Bay (Marco Bay), who captured the Apr. 9 GI Santa Anita Derby at odds of 30-1, dashed six furlongs in a bullet 1:11.40 at Santa Anita yesterday morning. The blaze-faced three-year-old galloped out seven panels in 1:26 under regular rider Mark Guidry. "The work was excellent," trainer Jeff Mullins said. "Buzzards Bay broke off about four lengths behind [stablemate Florida Keys] and hooked up with him at the three-eighths. There was a horse in front of them going a half. Mark did a good job, just took him to the outside on the turn--he was in the three path pretty much the whole way--and went on from there. He's a good work horse when he has a target. He came back good. We scoped him and he scoped clean." Buzzards Bay will head to Churchill Downs Wednesday.

Sort It Out Sharp Under Twin Spires...

Sort It Out (Out of Place), second in the GII Coolmore Lexington S., zipped a half in :47.20 at Churchill yesterday. The sophomore will bid to give trainer Bob Baffert his fourth Derby victory. "He really surprised us this morning," Baffert said. "He was aggressive all the way. That's the best he's ever worked. He was reaching out and really did it nice. He was wanting to do more and I was talking to [exercise rider Dana Barnes], telling her to take a hold." Sort It Out will be one of the longshots on the first Saturday in May, but Baffert is feeling optimistic about his chances. "I really feel this horse has moved forward and is turning a corner," he said. "I'm very upbeat about him and think he has a chance to get a piece of the purse Saturday. He proved he deserves the chance in the Derby and he's brought excitement to the barn."

First Derby Starter for McLaughlin...

Trainer Kieran McLaughlin will saddle his first Kentucky Derby starter when he puts the tack on **Closing Argument** (Successful Appeal) Saturday, but it won't be the first time he has been in the paddock for the first leg of the Triple Crown. McLaughlin made his Derby debut 17 years ago.

"When I was an assistant to [D. Wayne Lukas], I was here the year Winning Colors won the Derby [1988]," he said. "But it's different coming here with your own horse." Closing Argument breezed yesterday morning, going five-eighths in 1:01.60. "He went along fine and came back in great shape," McLaughlin said. "He's all set now. He'll walk tomorrow, then gallop the rest of the week."

Wilko Arrives in Louisville...

Wilko (Awesome Again) arrived at Churchill Downs late Sunday night and just walked the shedrow yesterday morning. "He shipped fine," trainer Craig Dollase said. "But it's a long trip and, with the time change, he's a little sleepy. He'll probably gallop [Tuesday], but we'll play it by ear." The winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile comes off a rallying third-place finish in the GI Santa Anita Derby.

Summerly Preps for Oaks...

Summerly (Summer Squall), getting ready for Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks, breezed a half in :48.20 under jockey Corey Lanerie yesterday. Trainer Steve Asmussen was on hand at Churchill Downs to supervise the move. "She's such a talented filly and she looked beautiful on the track this morning," Asmussen said. Summerly suffered her only defeat of 2005 when fourth behind **Sis City** (Slew City Slew) in the Apr. 9 GI Ashland S., but her conditioner is expecting major improvement Friday. "We think we've got her turned back around for the Oaks," Asmussen said.

When Hascombe Stud achieved the second-highest price of 750,000 guineas at last year's Tattersalls October yearling sale, it wasn't surprising that the successful bidder on that colt by Danehill out of Rockerlong was Demi O'Byrne.

The shrewd Irish buyer has become an admirer of the yearlings from this comparatively small but very select stud operated by Anthony Oppenheimer near Newmarket--and with every justification. In 1999, O'Byrne paid 115,000 guineas for a Green Desert filly from the Hascombe draft which, as Rose Gypsy, became a Classic winner for the Susan Magnier-Michael Tabor partnership with her victory over Banks Hill in the French 1000 Guineas.

Then, four years later, O'Byrne paid 170,000 guineas for Hascombe's well-related colt from the first crop of the admirable Giant's Causeway. The colt, out of Rainbow Quest's Group-winning daughter Glatissant, was unraced when O'Byrne splashed out 750,000 guineas for the Danehill colt out of Glatissant's talented half-sister Rockerlong. We soon discovered why the agent was so keen to land Rockerlong's son. The Giant's Causeway--Glatissant colt, named Footstepsinthesand, made his debut 12 days later and led throughout to win impressively by nearly five lengths.

Back in action eight days later, Footstepsinthesand coped well enough with the soft ground to win the G3 Killavullan S. And now he has followed in Rose Gypsy's Classic-winning footsteps by taking the 2000 Guineas in fine style.

Footstepsinthesand collected the Classic which, at the end of last season, seemed to be at the mercy of the unbeaten Shamardal, another of Giant's Causeway's first-crop sons. For a while it looked as though Giant's Causeway was going to complete a magnificent Classic double when Maids Causeway moved determinedly into the lead entering the final quarter mile of the 1000 Guineas, but Kingmambo's daughter Virginia Waters had much too much finishing speed for her. The question now is whether Noble Causeway can round off an excellent spell for the Ashford stallion by putting up a bold show in the Kentucky Derby.

If he does, no one can have any complaints about the adjustments that have been made to Giant's Causeway's fee. Having fallen to \$75,000 in 2004, his fee for 2005 was initially announced as \$135,000 before being upped to \$150,000 at the start of the year. Then, in April, the eight-year-old's fee was raised once again, this time to \$200,000, possibly in response to breeders looking for viable alternatives to the then-sidelined Kingmambo.

Incidentally, Kingmambo had a magnificent weekend. In addition to siring three consecutive Group winners at Newmarket, he was responsible for the dams of Maids Causeway and Suzuka Mambo, winner of the G1 Tenno Sho.

Footstepsinthesand is the latest of an increasingly impressive number of Group 1 winners to have emerged in recent years from Hascombe, which has been owned by the Oppenheimer family since the end of 1965. His predecessors include Sasuru (1997 Prix d'Ispahan), Rebecca Sharp (1997 Coronation S.), Compton Admiral (1999 Coral-Eclipse), Balisada (1999 Coronation S.), Summoner (2001 Queen Elizabeth II S.) and Rose Gypsy.

Footstepsinthesands' second dam, the Green Dancer mare Dancing Rocks, was another of Hascombe's accomplished graduates. Despite being foaled as late as May 22, she was a very promising winner of both her juvenile starts before developing into a very good three-year-old. Her finest moment came when she defeated the Oaks winner Time Charter to take the G2 Nassau S. over a mile and a quarter. She appeared to find a mile and a half too far when fourth in the Yorkshire Oaks.

Dancing Rocks had every right to develop into a very good broodmare. In addition to coming from the female line responsible for Blenheim, a Derby winner who became champion sire in North America, she was a daughter of Croda Rossa, winner of the prestigious Premio Lydia Tesio. Croda Rossa was herself a half-sister to Cerreto, winner of the Italian Derby, and Croda Alta, a smart filly in Italy.

Dancing Rocks lived up to expectations, producing three stakes-winning daughters plus two others which have produced stakes winners. Although her General Assembly filly Council Rock failed to win in 10 attempts, she produced the very speedy Superstar Leo, Europe's top-ranked juvenile filly of 2000.

Dancing Rocks' mating with Rainbow Quest in 1990, which resulted in Glatisant, came soon after the Derby victory of Quest For Fame, a Rainbow Quest colt out of another Green Dancer mare. Glatisant followed in her mother's footsteps to an extent. Although foaled as late as May 21, she too won both her starts at two, including the G3 Prestige S. over seven furlongs. However an injury to a hind leg ruled her out of the G1 Cheveley Park S. Her three-year-old campaign was largely an anti-climax, although she turned in one good effort, when second in a Listed race over a mile.

As Glatisant failed to show she stayed a mile and a quarter and her dam struggled over a mile and a half, Footstepsinthesand strikes me as a rather unlikely Derby candidate and I feel the Irish 2000 Guineas is a more sensible next step. Another consideration is whether he has the temperament of a mile-and-a-half horse. He sweated up at Newmarket and it is interesting that Timeform notes that Glatisant sweated up profusely when she disappointed on her final start. Dancing Rocks also displayed a tendency to sweat up and Timeform said she "seemed a rather nervous type." Perhaps this inclination was one of the reasons behind the choice of the unflappable Giant's Causeway as a mate for Glatisant.

Another incentive was that Giant's Causeway's sire Storm Cat had already hit the jackpot with other granddaughters of Blushing Groom, siring the multiple Group 1 winner Aljabr in addition to Giant's Causeway. Sending a daughter of Rainbow Quest to Giant's Causeway produces 4x3 inbreeding to the exceptional Blushing Groom, through Rahy and Rainbow Quest. Significantly, Rahy has a mare by Herbager as his second dam, while Rainbow Quest is out of another Herbager mare, so the inbreeding to Blushing Groom comes through two very successful stallions with similar bloodlines.

Inbreeding to Blushing Groom is well worth trying, as he won five Group 1 events before siring as many as 92 stakes winners from only 512 named foals. This stratagem hasn't been tried very often, but has also produced the Group 3 winner Clifden (inbred 3x3).

Footstepsinthesand's win extends the remarkable run of Classic success being enjoyed by Rainbow Quest's broodmare daughters. Rakti took the 2002 Italian Derby, Kris Kin the 2003 Derby and North Light the 2004 Derby. An impressive record for a stallion who is still active at the age of 24!

Curragh Option for Dubawi...

Godolphin's **Dubawi (Ire)** (Dubai Millennium {GB}) may bid to redeem his reputation in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 21 after disappointing in Saturday's G1 English 2000 Guineas. Last year's G1 National S. winner was sent off the 11-8 favorite, but could only finish fifth in the Newmarket Classic and connections are blaming the fast ground for his eclipse. "We are firmly convinced that the ground was against him," Racing Manager Simon Crisford told the *Racing Post*. "When he cantered to post his action was not ideal. He was hitting it quite hard and constantly changing leads and legs and when asked the big question he was hanging across the track." Original plans to run Dubawi in the Epsom Derby may be shelved now, with the Irish Classic the most likely alternative. "We will keep an eye on him and then start all over again, but the Irish 2000 Guineas is a possible target depending on how he is," Crisford said. "He should get the ground he wants at The Curragh and that is what's important."

O'Shea Rested...

Susan Magnier's **Kitty O'Shea (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) looks likely to miss the G1 Epsom Oaks June 3 after suffering a setback. Aidan O'Brien revealed the news about the six-length winner of the Mar. 20 Listed Park Express S. at The Curragh Saturday. "Kitty O'Shea was our Oaks filly, but she is on the easy list and will need three weeks box rest, so that has ruled out a prep race," he said. "If she does go to Epsom, she will have to go straight there and then only if everything goes without a hitch when she resumes exercise."

Elopa was pitched into stakes company after an impressive debut success at Mulheim in early October and acquitted herself with style on two forays to France. On the first occasion she found only Australie (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) too strong in the G3 Prix de Flore at Saint-Cloud at the end of the month, but looked a different proposition when taking the Listed Prix Petite Etoile back at that track in November. Positioned in third throughout the early stages of this contest, she was temporarily short of room on the rail before finding a gap at the furlong marker. It proved as easy as one-two-three for Indesatchel here, as he added this contest to his earlier triumphs during this rain-soaked spring. A consistent juvenile, he turned the corner this term in the soft when recording easy successes in the Listed Loughbrown S. over course and distance Apr. 3 and the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury 13 days later. Held up by Jamie Spencer while traveling smoothly in third as Obe Gold (GB) (Namaqualand) cut out moderate fractions, Indesatchel made up the deficit in facile fashion to lead with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining before quickening clear of Emerald Cat. "He did it very easily today and the ground is the key to him," commented trainer David Wachman. "We'll consider supplementing him for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains [French 2000 Guineas at Longchamp May 15]--he's a seven-furlong horse, but he may get a mile around there. He'll have a break after that and his long-term aims will be the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest [at Deauville Aug. 7] and G1 Prix de la Foret [at Longchamp Oct. 1]." The runner-up struggled throughout the last half mile to cope with conditions.

WYGOD THREATENS TO BOW OUT In an interview with the *L.A. Times* published yesterday, owner Martin Wygod said he may be bowing out of the Thoroughbred industry. "I might be getting out of the business," Wygod told the publication. "I'm seriously thinking about it, and I'm going to discuss it with my family. I've been in this 40 years, and it might be time to move on." Wygod was at the center of the controversy surrounding his champion Sweet Catomine, who was falsely identified as a stable pony when sent from Santa Anita to an equine clinic the week before the GI Santa Anita Derby. The filly finished fifth as the

favorite in that race, and Wygod subsequently stated that she bled in her final workout and suffered foot problems in the days leading up to her subpar effort. The California Horse Racing Board brought charges against Wygod in relation to those events, but the charges were dropped. While he declined to name those he suspected of being involved, Wygod told the paper, "There was a conspiracy to get me." According to the *L.A. Times* story, Wygod's attorney's have subpoenaed CHR Executive Director Ingrid Fermin, seeking a deposition regarding the case. Wygod also revealed that the decision to retire Sweet Catomine was made after an X-ray of her left hind leg showed a spot that had not been evident during her juvenile campaign.

SUCCESSFUL APPEAL RETURNS TO WALMAC
Successful Appeal (Valid Appeal--Successful Dancer, by Fortunate Prospect), who underwent colic surgery on Apr. 25, has returned to Walmac Farm, *The Blood-Horse* reports. "He is doing great," Steve Sharp, the director of marketing and sales at Walmac, told *The Blood-Horse*. "He's happy, healthy and on schedule as far as his recovery. Dr. Rolf Embertson [the attending surgeon] will be back May 25 to confer with Walmac's veterinarian, J.D. Howard, and stallion manager, Ron Gilbert." The top freshman sire of 2004, the nine-year-old stallion is expected to be sidelined for four weeks.

Handle down at Keeneland Spring Meet:

The on-track handle at the 16-day Keeneland spring meet, which ended Friday, was off slightly from the record totals set during the 15-day stand in 2004. The total on-track handle was \$27,635,729, down 1.3 percent from last year, while the average daily on-track handle of \$1,727,233 was off 7.5 percent. A single-day record \$3,599,648 was bet on Blue Grass day, besting the mark of \$3,516,621 set in 2002. The total handle from all sources was \$129,208,427, a decrease of 9.3 percent from 2004, with the daily average handle from all sources was \$8,075,527, down 15 percent. Keeneland officials attributed the loss to the decision to drop several simulcasting locations. "Wagering on track remained solid and much of the decline off track can be attributed to our decision to drop several simulcast outlets," said Keeneland President Nick Nicholson. "We believe the short-term loses from this decision will result in positives for Keeneland and the industry in the future."
