Blood-Horse

HAIL THE HURRICANE

Gestut Ammerland's **Hurricane Run (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) produced a late show of dramatic acceleration to annihilate his rivals in yesterday's G2 Prix Hocquart at Longchamp and jump to the head of France's sophomore middle-distance division. His future looked bright when winning a debutantes race at this track in October and a course-and-distance conditions event back here last time Apr. 15, but the Parisians could not see beyond the 2-5 pick **Ruwi**



Hurricane Run *France-Galop*

(GB) (Unfuwain). Sitting tight on the tails of the leaders under Christophe Soumillon early, the button was pressed as Ioritz Mendizabal threaded the market leader to the front on the inside at the quarter pole. Although not immediate, Hurricane Run's response was emphatic as the 3-1 shot rushed by that rival out wide before turning the final eighth into a procession, with Ruwi destroyed and the staying-on **Silver Cross (Fr)** (Kahyasi {Ire}) five lengths down at the line. "Being as green and inexperienced as he is, Epsom will not suit him," commented trainer Andre Fabre. "Therefore, he will run next in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club [French Derby at Chantilly June 5], but the race I really have in mind for him is the G1 Irish Derby [at The Curragh June 26]. The mile-and-a-half trip and track will be perfect for this type of horse." Trainer Jean-Claude Rouget blamed the drying ground for Ruwi's fourth-place effort. "I still believe he is a good horse," he said. "Maybe the ground made a difference, but you never know until you try."

GALAXY ADDED TO PREAKNESS MIX

Owner B. Wayne Hughes reported yesterday his GII Illinois Derby winner **Greeley's Galaxy** (Mr. Greeley), 11th in Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby, will start in the May 21 GI Preakness S. "He looked all right after the race," commented the colt's trainer Warren Stute. "We'll know more in a day or two." Greeley's Galaxy shipped back to California shortly after the Derby. Hughes also owns **Don't Get Mad** (Stephen Got Even), fourth in the Derby, who remains possible for the Preakness.

ELVSTROEM ADDED TO LOCKINGE

Britain could get an early look at **Elvstroem (Aus)** (Danehill) after the five-year-old was supplemented for Saturday's G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. at Newbury. Connections stumped up the £16,000 fee to add the G1 Dubai Duty Free winner to the mile contest. Also supplemented yesterday was Abdulla al Khalifa's G3 Dahlia S. winner **Tarfah** (Kingmambo), while Elite Racing Club's multiple Group 1 scorer **Soviet Song (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) was a notable scratching after a dirty scope. "We will have to play it by ear regarding what we do next, but if she scopes clean by then we should have her ready for the G2 Ridgewood Pearl S. [at The Curragh May 21]," trainer James Fanshawe told *PA Sport* yesterday. Among the 15 remaining entries are Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's GI Breeders' Cup Mile runner-up **Antonius Pius** (Danzig) and Gary Tanaka's G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. hero **Rakti (GB)** (Polish Precedent), who will run only if the ground is good or better.

Fracassant was treated sympathetically by Andre Fabre as a late-maturing type last term and that patience is beginning to pay dividends now as the four-year-old recorded a career best here. Having rounded off his 2004 campaign with a hard-fought success in the Listed Prix Vulcain at Deauville in October, he returned to finish a length second to old rival Geordieland in the Listed Prix de la Porte de Madrid at Saint-Cloud Apr. 19. Settled in fourth throughout the early stages by Christophe Soumillon, he closed on the leaders on the approach to the straight and was asked to lengthen passing the quarter pole. Challenged and passed by Geordieland at the eighth pole, he responded to driving to edge ahead in the final 100 yards and assert as Alost finished with a late flourish. "He will follow the program for older horses of his type and run next in the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly [June 5]," Fabre commented.

Rhein Kraft bagged her first Japanese graded stakes victory last November in the G3 Fantasy S. before closing out the season with a third-place finish in the G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies the following month. Victorious in the G2 Fillies' Revue S. in her 2005 debut, the filly came back to make it two straight in the G1 Japanese 1000 Guineas Apr. 10. Settled close-up to the early pace, Rhein Kraft powered to the front in the stretch to gain her first victory against the boys. "I think she is in great condition," said winning jockey Yuichi Fukunaga. "She had no problem with the long trip to Tokyo."

Inti Raimi punched his ticket to the May 29 G1 Japanese Derby with a gutsy victory in Saturday's G3 Kyoto Shimbun Hai. A winner in his debut last August, the colt finished sixth in the G3 Niigata Nisai S. in September before heading to the sidelines for the remainder of the season. Second in first start back in a lower-class stakes Mar. 12, he followed up with a win last time in a lower plate race Apr. 3. Sent off the well-supported favorite this time, Inti Raimi came from well off the pace to hand Commedia dell'Arte a narrow defeat. "He was very green and didn't have a good start, but still won, so I am sure he has tremendous potential," said jockey Tetsuzo Sato.

When a 50-1 shot wins from a 71-1 chance in an ordinary race, my immediate reaction is to question the value of the form. When a 50-1 shot wins from a 71-1 chance in the Kentucky Derby--as happened three days ago--my gut reaction is to question the quality of a whole year-group, especially when the worthy winner, Giacomo, was scoring for only the second time in eight attempts.

I first had doubts about this particular year-group when the then-English-trained Wilko triumphed over Afleet Alex and Sun King in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Wilko, after all, had managed only two wins from 10 starts in Europe, and Timeform considered his turf form to be worth a rating of only 107, compared to the 126 allotted to Shamardal.

Naturally the possibility existed that this American-bred son of Awesome Again was much more at home on dirt, but Timeform's handicappers rated him no higher than 118 on his first two American efforts. In fact, they considered the filly Sweet Catomine (122) to be the clear leader of America's 2004 two-year-old generation, rating none of the American males higher than Declan's Moon's 120. Wilko shared second place with none other than Giacomo in Timeform's assessment of the colts and geldings, with Proud Accolade and Afleet Alex next in order on 117 and 116, respectively.

How significant is it that Timeform had 12 individual European juveniles rated 118 or higher, compared to only four in the USA (with Wilko appearing on both lists)? It is essential to mention that as many as five of those 12 leading European-based juveniles were conceived in the USA.

It would be foolish to underestimate the effect that the constant exodus of so many high-priced American yearlings is going to have on the domestic scene in the U.S. Remember, the table of buyers at the 2003 North American yearling sales was headed by John Ferguson and Demi O'Byrne, their joint total being 47 yearlings purchased for a total of \$39 million. Could this be why several of the trials were won by horses with unfashionable pedigrees?

Of course, it is still early days to be judging this year's three-year-olds, especially as some of the leading fancies for the Kentucky Derby appeared to pay the price of trying to lie up with the excessive early pace. And it would be foolish to underestimate Giacomo, who was beaten just a length by Declan's Moon in the GI Hollywood Futurity at a time when his trainer, John Shirreffs, insisted that the colt was still growing a lot and very immature.

Giacomo's Kentucky Derby victory at least provided compensation for the unexpected defeat suffered by his sire Holy Bull in the 1994 contest. Holy Bull started a clear favourite ahead of Brocco and Tabasco Cat on the strength of his record of seven wins from eight starts. His slowish start at Churchill Downs wasn't enough to explain his lackluster performance and a high liver enzyme count surfaced to rule him out of the Preakness.

Whatever the problem was, Holy Bull soon got over it and his brilliance was on display once again at the end of May, when he crushed Cherokee Run and Devil His Due in the Metropolitan H. By the end of the year he had added victories in the Gil Dwyer, GI Haskell Invitational, GI Travers and GI Woodward S., to secure Horse of the Year honors. His game display in the Travers--in which he just held Concern's late charge--suggested that a mile and a quarter was stretching his stamina to the limit. This was certainly in line with his pedigree. Holy Bull's sire Great Above had the distinction of being the first foal of the fabulously fast Ta Wee. One of Ta Wee's greatest achievements was to carry 140 lbs to victory in the six-furlong Fall Highweight Handicap in 1970, when she was voted champion sprinter for the second successive time. Ta Wee's versatile half brother Dr. Fager had preceded her as the champion sprinter of 1967 and '68. However, Dr. Fager's tally of 18 wins featured three victories over a mile and a quarter and his collection of titles in 1968 also included champion handicap horse, champion grass horse and Horse of the Year.

As Dr. Fager was by Rough'n Tumble, it made sense to select Rough'n Tumble's son Minnesota Mac as Ta Wee's first mate, with Great Above being the outcome. Although Great Above didn't become a stakes winner until he was five, he did so in style in the Toboggan H., lowering the track record to 1:09.40, and he also took the GIII Paumonok H. the following year. These wins suggested he was best at six furlongs, even though he won several times over 1 1/16 miles, and speed was generally the main asset of Great Above's best progeny. One of his daughters produced the champion sprinter Housebuster.

Although there was no questioning Holy Bull's brilliance as a racehorse, it wasn't encouraging for his prospects as a stallion that he was the only Grade I winner among Great Above's 603 named foals. Indeed, there were only four American graded winners among them.

Holy Bull's prospects weren't helped when an injury to his near-fore led to his being pulled up in the Donn H. on February 11, 1995. **Cont. p5**

It was a tremendous shame that his career was ended prematurely as his connections had given him every chance of continuing his outstanding exploits. Ignoring the lure of the Breeders' Cup, they had given him a thoroughly deserved rest after the 1994 Woodward S. (in which he thrashed the Kentucky Derby winner Go For Gin).

The lateness of Holy Bull's forced retirement to stud must have had an effect on the quality of his first book of mares at Jonabell, but he made a promising start, with Confessional (GI Frizette S.) and the GIII winners Crash Course and Holywood Picture among the 42 named foals in his first crop.

But would he be able to maintain this encouraging start? It has been my experience that these phenomenal horses who outrun their pedigrees are usually capable of siring top-class performers, but not in the same quantities as their rivals with outstanding bloodlines. I would say that Holy Bull fits this description. His first full-sized crop produced two more graded winners, and there can be no complaints about his third crop. In addition to producing the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Macho Uno, this 1998 crop came up with another Grade I winner last year when Pohave took the Triple Bend H. Thunder Blitz, another member of this crop, was a creditable fourth in the 2001 Derby.

Since then, though, Holy Bull has struggled. There were no stakes winners in his fourth or sixth crops and none of the four stakes winners in his fifth crop has so far won a graded stake. Giacomo is his first stakes winner from his seventh crop, and his fourth Grade I winner.

Nine graded winners, from a total of around 440 foals in his first seven crops, must be considered a somewhat disappointing tally for a horse of Holy Bull's undoubted brilliance. However, in his defence, I should point out that he has never stood for more than \$25,000, in recognition of his workmanlike pedigree. His fee is now \$15,000, and how many stallions at that sort of price can claim to have sired winners of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile and Kentucky Derby?

Giacomo's dam Set Them Free gained all of her four stakes successes at up to six furlongs, but her sire Stop The Music was by Hail To Reason and sired a Belmont S. winner, Temperance Hill. Giacomo's second dam Valseuse was a half sister to River Rose, a very good broodmare who produced the fast Tenue de Soiree to Lyphard and the champion French juvenile filly Baiser Vole to Foolish Pleasure. Baiser Vole trained on to win the French 1,000 Guineas.

River Rose also visited Stop The Music, and her son, Squill, stayed better than his three-parts-sister Set Them Free. Winner of the G2 Prix Dollar over 9.7 furlongs, Squill was also beaten less than a length when third in the Budweiser International at Laurel.

Finally, I find it strange that Giacomo follows Monarchos, Silver Charm, Winning Colors, Gato del Sol, Spectacular Bid, Decidedly and Determine as the eighth gray winner of Kentucky Derby in the space of little more than 50 years. Yet there has been no grey winner of the Epsom Derby since Airborne in 1946. Why the difference? Part of the explanation is that the genes of Mahmoud, a gray winner of the Derby, are still widespread in America's horse population. It was Mahmoud's grandson, Al Hattab, who sired Holy Bull's gray dam, Sharon Brown. In fact both of Sharon Brown's parents were gray or roan and three of her four grandparents were gray. Al Hattab was inbred 4x4 to Mumtaz Mahal, one of the most famous grays of all time.

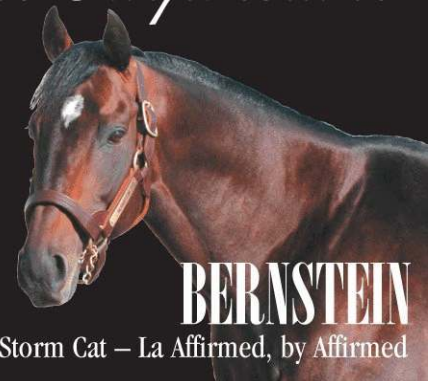
