It has been an anxious wait for all concerned, but it will be up to the Royal Ascot Racing Club's **Motivator (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) to take that last leap towards his Classic destination in today's G2 Dante S. on York's Knavesmire. His record is flawless so far, and he showed enough in winning a Newmarket maiden by six lengths in August and the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster by 2 1/2 lengths in October to suggest he deserves his place at the head of the market for the G1 Epsom Derby June 4. For the syndicate's Managing Director Harry Herbert, this race will answer many questions. "He is in terrific form," he said. "We are

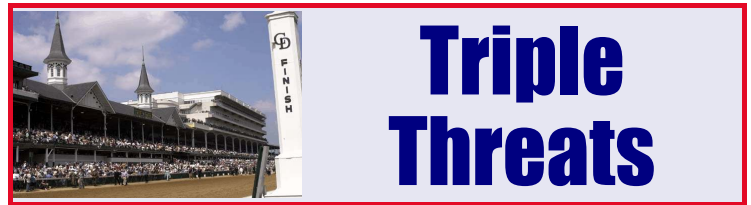

just desperate for [today] to come and the horse can do the talking--one way or the other." Underfoot conditions this afternoon will not concern connections, as both his successes last term came on soft going. "We are not overly concerned about the ground," he added. "Good ground is probably what we are hoping for, but good-to-soft is fine. If the ground got very quick we would be concerned, but it appears the ground is going to be ideal for him." Heading the opposition in a select line-up is Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G2 Beresford S. scorer **Albert Hall (GB)** (Danehill), last seen when chasing Motivator's tail at Doncaster. Trainer Aidan O'Brien is hoping he can make up the deficit. "He's forward in fitness and hasn't had any hold-ups," he commented. "We've been happy with his work, but we'd expect he'll come on nicely for the run."

Triple Threats

SURGERY FOR BANDINI

The GI Toyota Blue Grass S. winner **Bandini** (Fusaichi Pegasus) may have had an excuse for his disappointing 19th-place finish in Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby. "He's got a little chip in his right front ankle," trainer Todd Pletcher said yesterday. "He's going to have surgery." The three-year-old is expected to be back later this season. "Hopefully we'll have him back in the fall of the year," Pletcher said. Bandini has won three of his six career starts and was second by 3/4 of a length in the GII Fountain of Youth S. A \$500,000 KEESEP yearling, he has earned \$564,180.

Preakness Takes Shape...

The GIII Withers S. winner **Scrappy T** (Fit to Fight) has been confirmed a starter for the May 21 GI Preakness S. "We've given the mount to Ramon Dominguez," trainer Robbie Bailes said yesterday. "Our plan remains to ship Scrappy T [from Aqueduct] on Sunday morning and have his final workout at Pimlico." Bailes also tipped his hand regarding tactics for the second leg of the Triple Crown. "This horse has a good deal of speed," he said. "In the Preakness we're going to send him and see how far he can go." Also pointing for the Preakness is local hopeful **Malibu Moonshine** (Malibu Moon), who has won six of his 10 starts, including the Mar. 26 Private Terms S. and the Apr. 23 Federico Tesio S. in his last two starts; and Calder shipper **Hal's Image** (Halo's Image), winner of the Apr. 30 Unbridled S. **Golden Man** (Suave Prospect), who was claimed for \$60,000 at Gulfstream in January and came back to win an Aqueduct allowance test Apr. 2, will be supplemented to the race for \$100,000. The gelding worked five furlongs in :59.65 at the Big A yesterday morning. "We're going to try and get Edgar Prado to ride him back," trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. said. Out of the running for the Preakness are **Flower Alley** (Distorted Humor) and **First Word** (Chester House).

Shamardal Books Poulains Slot

Godolphin's **Shamardal** (Giant's Causeway) pleased connections yesterday in his final workout before Sunday's G1 Gainsborough Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp. In company with last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe runner-up **Cherry Mix** (Fr) on the Limekilns gallop in Newmarket, the champion juvenile of 2004 finished in front under Kerrin McEvoy. The G1 Dewhurst S. winner finished down the field in the G2 UAE Derby Mar. 26, but Racing Manager Simon Crisford told *Racing Post*, "He is doing really well now. Unfortunately, things didn't work out in the UAE Derby. He had a little bit of shin-soreness, but that corrected itself very quickly." Sunday's mile Classic, which featured a large overseas representation at yesterday's stage, may also include Michael Nolan's G3 Greenham S. and G3 Tetrarch S. victor **Indesatchel (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) if connections decide to supplement today, although the decision depends on the ground easing from the current description of good. Aidan O'Brien has left a trio in the race, headed by Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G1 2000 Guineas fourth **Oratorio (Ire)** (Danehill), while last year's G1 Criterium International hero **Helios Quercos (Fr)** (Diableneyev) heads the home defense alongside Khalid Abdullah's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere runner-up **Early March (GB)** (Dansili {GB}).

The Kiddykid, one of the hardest working horses in training, was rewarded for his efforts as he sprung a surprise in the testing conditions here. A horse on the improve last term, he bested Arakan in the G3 Greenlands S. at The Curragh in May and was runner-up behind One Cool Cat in the G3 Phoenix Sprint S. in August. He returned with a second to La Cucaracha (GB) in Doncaster's Listed Cammidge Trophy Apr. 2 before filling third spot behind Quito (Ire) in the Listed Abernant S. at Newmarket 12 days later. Spearheading the main group here while trailing tearaway early leaders Striking Ambition (GB) (Makbul {Ire}) and Welsh Emperor, he slowly ate into their advantage past half-way under Jamie Spencer's drive. His industry got him past Welsh Emperor with 75 yards remaining and he clung grimly to his lead as Steenberg staged a late rally. "He deserves to win a race like that, but it's hard to say I thought he would win beforehand," commented trainer David Evans. "He's always shown a lot and he's tough and consistent and tries. He's had two easy years really and we've not overdone it, but he's going to have more of a campaign this year--he's in at The Curragh [for the G3 Greenlands S. May 21] and he'll definitely be back for Royal Ascot at York next month."

With the easy ground putting a premium on fitness and stamina, it was the enterprisingly ridden Secret History with ticks in the right boxes who wired this contest to cause the upset. Untried in stakes company last term, she returned from a six-month absence to win a mile handicap in heavy ground at Ripon Apr. 14 before following up in similar company over seven furlongs on the soft at Beverley a week later. The bay filly found only the veteran Aldora (GB) two lengths too strong in the Listed Conqueror S. at Goodwood last time Apr. 30, but had things her own way here when gifted a soft early advantage. Trying this distance for the first time, she was steadily wound up by Joe Fanning in the straight and had all rivals bar Quickfire off the bridle with three furlongs remaining. When she turned the screw she soon had that filly's measure before keeping up a relentless gallop for a clear-cut win. "She is straightforward and loves that ground, which is the key to her," her rider explained. "She quickened up well when I asked her and I always felt I had something in hand--she has done nothing wrong and is improving all the time." Secret History may be supplemented for the G1 Epsom Oaks June 3, while Quickfire and Play Me look likely to bypass that Classic.

Gold Sound finished runner-up to Ozone Bere (Fr) in the Listed Prix Delahante at Marseille Boreley in November before returning to win the Listed Prix Maurice Caillault at Saint-Cloud Mar. 19. 'FOREST' A DANGER IN MET MILE? Trainer Todd Pletcher said yesterday that his **Forest Danger** (Forestry) is ready to take on reigning Horse of the Year **Ghostzapper** (Awesome Again) in the May 30 GI Met Mile at Belmont Park. "I've got the utmost respect for Ghostzapper, but Forest Danger is an awfully good horse and both his races this year have been super," Pletcher said. "It'll be a good test for our horse and we'll see what happens." Five-for-six lifetime, Forest Danger opened 2005 with a 9 1/2-length victory in an optional claimer at Gulfstream on Valentine's Day and came back to take the Apr. 9 GI Carter H. The four-year-old worked yesterday on the Belmont main track, going five furlongs in 1:00 3/5.

FLORIDA TRACKS CONSIDERING SUIT OVER SLOTS

Broward County voters have twice voiced their approval for slot machines at four county racetracks, including Gulfstream Park, but slots are still far from becoming a reality. The March referendum on the issue required that legislation outlining regulations for installation, operation and taxation be passed by July 1, but that bill was stalled when the state's House and Senate failed to agree on the terms of the regulations. Congress adjourned for the summer Friday, with no plans to call a special session. According to the *Daily Racing Form*, a coalition of Florida tracks is now weighing its options in the case. Calder President Ken Dunn is a member of the group, despite the fact that a slots referendum failed to pass in Miami-Dade County, where Calder is located. "The attorneys right now are meeting, and they are going to make a recommendation on which way to go soon," Dunn told *DRF*. One option is to sue on the grounds that the Broward referendum alone legalized slots, and that the tracks don't require legislative approval. But Broward county commissioners are concerned that, if the tracks are successful, the slots would operate without regulations. They are investigating whether they have the authority to draft the necessary regulations themselves. County Commissioner Irene Lieberman, who is leading the effort to draw up slots ordinances, was quoted in the *Harness Tracks of America Executive Newsletter* as saying, "If [the tracks] are successful in a lawsuit because the state did nothing, there will need to be regulations. I don't want to see it operate unregulated."

Congress Passes Legislation to Aid Foreign Workers:

Congress has passed a bill that includes legislation which will aid foreign workers who receive their visas under the H-2B program. Many workers in the horse industry fall into this category, but were unable to get the necessary paperwork this year because a cap of 66,000 had been set for this type of visa. That quota was met on Jan. 3 of this year. The new legislation, which was sponsored by Sen. Barbara Mikulski (D-MD) and supported by members of the horse industry, will exempt foreign workers who have received H-2B visas in the last three years from the cap. President George W. Bush is expected to sign the bill immediately, and the U.S. Citizenship and Immigrations Service will then begin processing the visas for those who qualify. The American Horse Council has advised members of the industry who use the H-2B program to contact an attorney or consultant to determine how the new legislation will affect them, and how best to prepare for next year.

Alex's Lemonade Stand Raises \$11,000:

The Alex's Lemonade Stand that was set up at Churchill Downs on Kentucky Derby Day raised nearly \$11,000 for research into finding a cure for childhood cancer. Alex's Lemonade Stand is a charity that was founded by Alexandra "Alex" Scott. Alex died last summer of neuroblastoma, an aggressive form of childhood cancer, but her family has continued the project she started with her first lemonade stand back in 2000. The Churchill stand was run by Alex's mother, Liz Scott, who wrote to thank the track's publicity department for their help in making the event a success. "It was an incredible experience for me and my children and a tremendous boost to the fund-raising efforts of Alex's Lemonade Stand," she said. "We collected almost \$11,000 in donations at our stand at the paddock and received countless phone calls and e-mails after people saw the Derby coverage on *NBC* and *ESPN*. We already have an invitation to set up at the Preakness, and the Belmont is a possibility as well. Once the Kentucky Derby says 'yes,' who can say 'no'?" OWNERS' PREMIUMS TO RETURN

Owners' Premiums have been reinstated by the British Horseracing Board after the Levy Board agreed to allocate funding for the next two years. Following a European Court of Justice judgment in November, the BHB had decided to suspend the scheme, which was forecast to reach £3.2 million in 2005, but the Levy Board cash injection has breathed life back into the process. Despite the payments being at a lower rate than in 2004, retroactive awards will be made for cases which fell within the suspension period. "Given that the creation of the owners' premium scheme was BHB's own initiative, it was disheartening that the board had no alternative to suspension just as the scheme had really begun to show its worth," BHB Chief Executive Greg Nichols said yesterday. "However, we were determined to ensure everything possible was done to lift the suspension as soon as possible. In response to our request, the Levy Board's commitment to allocate funds to the scheme in both 2005 and 2006 will be widely welcomed and provides important stability and continuity. We will continue to work closely with the TBA, ROA and sales houses to promote the scheme and its support of British-bred horses."
