DERBY WINNER BREEZES

Giacomo (Holy Bull) worked four furlongs in :51.80 at Churchill Downs yesterday. The move was the 39th fastest of 41 works at the distance. "I was kind of debating whether to breeze him, but he's doing so good, I went ahead and breezed him," trainer John Shirreffs said of the Kentucky Derby winner. "I trained him very hard for the Derby, so I didn't want to do too much with him." Giacomo, who won the Derby at odds of 50-1, is likely to get overlooked again in the second Jewel of the Triple Crown. "I understand what the press is saying and some people are saying, I guess," Shirreffs added. "But, that being said, they were all in the gate, and Giacomo won the race." The Jerry and Ann Moss colorbearer is scheduled to board a Baltimore-bound plane this morning.

Flyin High to the Preakness...

High Fly (Atticus) is headed to Saturday's GI Preakness S. after working four furlongs in :50.20 at Churchill Downs yesterday. "That's all he needed after running a mile and a quarter two weeks ago," Nick Zito assistant trainer Tim Poole said of the move which was 27th fastest of 41 at the distance. The GI Florida Derby victor could only manage 10th in the Derby, but did have the lead after one mile

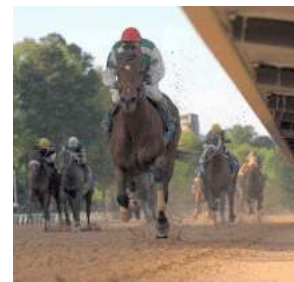

Afleet Alex Taking it Easy...

Arkansas Derby winner **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet) will make a start in the Preakness without registering a workout since finishing third in the Derby. "A lot of times you can run a horse back in two weeks if he's only run once or twice off a layoff," trainer Tim Ritchey commented. "But when a horse has run as much as most of these horses have, my feeling is you want them to come into this race off two weeks fresh. That's why I'm not going to breeze him." Afleet Alex will look to follow in the footsteps of Smarty Jones who won the Preakness without posting a work following the Derby.

CONSISTENT FORM

It has surely been a lot of years since one horse sired the winners of both the English and French 2000 Guineas (for colts), and another horse sired the winners of both the English and French 1000 Guineas (for fillies)--two different winners in both cases. There are other interesting points about each sire, too. The two colts are now among five stakes winners from Giant's Causeway's first crop, the latest being Live Oak Stud's 1.8-million guineas foal My Typhoon, winner of the Hilltop S. at Pimlico last weekend. She's a half sister to Galileo, Black Sam Bellamy and All Too Beautiful; this means his first crop is now edging up toward 4 percent stakes winners/foals. His percentages may not be brilliant, but Footstepsinthesand, Shamardal, Maid's Causeway, and Noble Causeway are all household names to people in the business, and, as we were discussing last week, that's what sells seasons. And truthfully, however we contend with the percentages, he sired two 2000 Guineas winners from two tries, in his first crop. That really does tell you all you need to know: he's the business.

Kingmambo has looked the business for quite a while now. Divine Proportions is his seventh individual Classic winner in eight crops, following Lemon Drop Kid (1999), King's Best and Bluemamba (2000), Russian Rhythm (2003), Rule of Law (2004) and Virginia Waters earlier this month. Five of the seven have been in Guineas races, but the other two were a Belmont S. winner and a St. Leger winner, so he's certainly proved he can get horses who stay further in top company. He is proving too that a sire can still stand in America and be a star in Europe, just as the likes of Lyphard, Riverman and Blushing Groom proved it in the heyday of the late, great John Gaines.

Moreover, in the case of this year's two 1000 Guineas-winning fillies, there are very striking pedigree similarities on the dam's side: Virginia Waters is by Kingmambo out of a Sadler's Wells mare, out of a Shirley Heights mare, while Divine Proportions is out of a Sadler's Wells mare, out of a full sister to Shirley Heights, by Mill Reef. You could hardly get two more similar pedigrees.

In fact, with four individual stakes winners in Europe already this year--the other two, you'll remember, were on that eventful English 1000 card at Newmarket--Kingmambo is in fact second on the European leading sire table (progeny earnings) thus far in 2005, as supplied to us by Hyperion Promotions. Giant's Causeway, Europe's leading second-crop sire, is fourth and the truth is that Kingmambo is the only one of the top seven stallions who did not begin his stud career at Coolmore. Sadler's Wells is, of course, first (eight individual stakes winners already this year), followed by Kingmambo, Danehill, and Giant's Causeway. Numbers 5-6-7 are the three leaders in individual 2005 winners and among the top five in number of runners. These horses have an incredible number of runners, considering the flat season has really only been in full swing for the last two months or so: Spectrum, for example, has 156 runners already this year. Six of the seven sires with 110 or more runners in Europe already this year are, or were, Coolmore sires (Big Shuffle, in Germany, is the exception). The three sires who are 5-6-7 on the 2005 Euro earnings table--Spectrum (now in South Africa), Sri Pekan (now in Turkey) and Night Shift--lead all European sires so far this year, with 43, 39, and 42 individual winners, respectively. Even when sires are not particularly successful, they certainly get an ample road test under the Coolmore banner.

French sires Linamix and Highest Honor occupy the next two places, and the current European Top 10 2005 progeny earnings is rounded off by Zafonic, the brilliant 1993 English 2000 Guineas winner. After a slow start, which was complicated by the fact his early runners, at least, were much better on fast ground, Zafonic emerged as a consistently potent two-year-old sire: one year he had four individual two-year-old Group winners. **Cont p3**

THE CLASS LEADERS

Using Bill Oppenheim's APEX ratings, TBH MarketWatch reports the leading sires of 2004 by their 'ABC' Index. In deriving the APEX rating, a stallion's (minimum of 150 runners) success is determined by dividing his sire's progeny into three categories. 'A' runners represent the top 2% of his earners; 'B' represents the next 2% and 'C' runners are the next 4%. Those earnings are then compared to all sires' A, B and C runners.

Last Friday he had three individual two-year-old winners on the same day--and a new three-year-old stakes winner to boot! Unfortunately, he died in Australia in 2002, and those three mid-May two-year-old winners are from his final crop.

Among European 'second-crop' (meaning first-crop three-year-olds) sires besides Giant's Causeway, Montjeu solidified his position in second spot, with Motivator's impressive win in the G2 Dante, and he is now a very solid 5-2 favorite for the June 4 Epsom Derby. Ex-Coolmore (now Ashford) Monashee Mountain, whose 19 winners in 2005 tops that category, is a clear third among second-crop sires (2005 earnings only). Almutawakel moved up the ladder with Silver Cup's win in last Sunday's G2 Italian 1000 Guineas (Premio Regina Elena), in which Josr Algharoud had the runner-up; and Sinndar continued his march up the ladder when Shawanda became his second stakes-winning filly at Longchamp last Sunday. He could get an even bigger boost this weekend at The Curragh when his impressive, once-raced seven-length winner Ehsan will be hot favorite for the G3 Gallinule S. The Curragh has a cracking weekend of racing, with the two Irish Guineas and the Tattersalls' Rogers Gold Cup as well, in which Bago, North Light, Grey Swallow and perhaps Azamour are slated to line up. Then there's Pimlico, of course, where we may have a bit more light shed on events in Kentucky just two short weeks ago. **Bill Oppenheim may be contacted at bopp@erb.com. WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

With the most recent weekend being a relatively quite one for North American graded stakes, the focus for top-class racing was in France. There, the first classics of the year for colts and fillies--the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches--were contested Sunday.

In a strange example of synchronicity, the results--as far as the sires are concerned--identically reflected the English Guineas one week earlier, with Giant's Causeway, sire of the G1 2000 Guineas winner Footstepsinthesand, being represented by Poulains victor Shamardal; and Kingmambo, the sire of the G1 1000 Guineas heroine Virginia Waters, following up with the brilliant Divine Proportions in the Pouliches.

Needless to say, both Giant's Causeway and Kingmambo are currently on top of the world. Giant's Causeway, who added another stakes winner when My Typhoon captured the Hilltop Breeders' Cup S. at Pimlico, now has five stakes winners: classic winners Shamardal and Footstepsinthesand; Group 2 winner Maids Causeway, runner-up in the G1 1000 Guineas and entrant in G1 Irish 1000 Guineas; My Typhoon; and Italian listed winner Aischa. **Porter cont.**

The chestnut Storm Cat stallion is also responsible for the GI Florida Derby runner-up Noble Causeway, who runs in this weekend's GI Preakness S.

Kingmambo has been in remarkable form of late. On the same day that Virginia Waters won the 1000 Guineas, he also sired the winners of the two other group events on that day's card: Tarfah, who took the G3 Dahlia S.; and Alkaased, who was successful in the G2 Jockey Club S. In the U.S. this year, Kingmambo is represented by the Gill Count Fleet Sprint H. winner Top Commander and the Gill Crown Royal American Turf S. victor, Rey de Cafe. Last year, he was represented by classic winners King Kahehameha (G1 Japanese Derby) and Rule of Law (G1 St. Leger). Overall, from his first eight crops, he is the sire of 56 stakes winners and 32 group or graded winners.

Besides those previously mentioned, the most notable include GI Belmont S. winner and champion older horse, Lemon Drop Kid; El Condor Pasa, a champion in France and Japan; Russian Rhythm and King's Best, winners respectively of the G1 1000 Guineas and G1 2000 Guineas; the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine Bluemamba; and champion French two-year-old colt Okawango.

Divine Proportion's dam Myth to Reality was a three-time Listed winner who also took second in the G3 Prix de Minerve. Myth to Reality is about as well-bred a mare as one could wish to find, as she is by Sadler's Wells out of Millieme, a sister to G1 Epsom Derby winner Shirley Heights. Despite her own ability and the class of her pedigree, Myth to Reality was actually a little slow to make her mark as a producer.

Although her first two matings, to the U.S. dirt horses Ogygian and Lord Avie, were probably less than ideal (the Lord Avie filly Magic Spin did subsequently produce minor U.S. stakes winner Real Doll). Myth to Reality's third foal--the result of a more conventional mating--the Alleged colt Assos, ran second in the G3 Prix du Lys at three and won a minor stakes at four.

Then came Mambo Jambo, a filly who came about from the first of Myth to Reality's matings with Kingmambo. She was only a very minor winner, but is dam of Ocean Silk, winner of the Lupe S. and runner-up in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks in England, and graded stakes placed in the U.S. After producing a non-winner by Alleged, it was back to Kingmambo for a mating which resulted in the colt Indigo Myth, runner-up in black-type events in France and the U.S.

The following year, Myth to Reality visited Miesque's Son, a brother to Kingmambo who was a Group 3 winner in France, but who never found much commercial favor during his time at stud in Kentucky. One suspects that by now, Myth to Reality was regarded as a little disappointing, and Miesque's Son offered the chance to try a mating which appealed on pedigree without committing a valuable Kingmambo season. This mating resulted in a colt who fetched \$20,000 when consigned as a weanling to the 1998 Keeneland November Sales. Named Meteorite Sun, he managed just one minor victory in France.

Myth to Reality failed to produce in the next two years, but in 2001 foaled a colt by Miesque's Son. He too was consigned to the Keeneland November Sales as a weanling, and realized just \$4,000, the least expensive of the four weanlings by his sire offered at the sale.

Named Whipper, this bargain-basement yearling proved to be the horse which Myth to Reality's background suggested she was capable of producing. At two, Whipper caused an upset with his win in the G1 Prix Morny, but then franked the form by adding the G3 Criterium de Maisons-Laffite. Last year, at three, he added the Prix Djebel and G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois to prove himself among Europe's best milers.

After two visits to Miesque's Son interspersed with two non-productive years, Myth to Reality was given another shot with Kingmambo, presumably because of the promise shown by Indigo Myth. From that union has sprung Divine Proportions, whose brilliance is now beginning to evoke memories of her "aunt," Kingmambo's dam, the wonderful mare Miesque.

At the start of this article, we mentioned the synchronicity of both sets of English and French Guineas winners being by the same sires. In case of Virginia Waters and Divine Proportions, that synchronicity extends even further. For while Divine Proportions is by Kingmambo out of a mare by Sadler's Wells, out of a sister to Shirley Heights, Virginia Waters is by Kingmambo out of a mare by Sadler's Wells out of a mare by Shirley Heights, giving the pair virtually identical pedigree patterns. Indeed, one has to wonder if two so similarly bred horses have ever previously won classics in the same year.

Of course, breeding a Sadler's Wells mare to Kingmambo gives the 3/4-brothers Nureyev (broodmare sire of Kingmambo) and Sadler's Wells 2x3. With 49 foals bred on this cross and three stakes winners, it actually has a stakes winners/foals percentage slightly below that of Kingmambo as a whole, but given the class of the stakes winners it has produced (Divine Proportions, Virginia Waters and El Condor Pasa), one would hardly want to caution against it. Overall, the combination of Nureyev and Sadler's Wells (and the reverse) is beginning to become quite a big thing. There are at least nine stakes winners with Nureyev in the sire and Sadler's Wells in the dam, and in addition to Kingmambo's trio, they include Group 1 winners Whipper and Carry On Katie as well as Laverock, winner this year of the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau. Laverock is bred on a very similar cross to Virginia Waters since his sire Octagonal is out of a mare by Nureyev, and his dam is bred on a Sadler's Wells/Shirley Heights cross.

The reverse cross of stallions carrying Sadler's Wells over mares carrying Nureyev has produced at least five stakes winners, all group or graded, and since one of these, Trumbaka, is by In the Wings, and another, Puppeter, is by In the Wings' son Singspiel, they have a very similar background to Virginia Waters and Divine Perfection).
