OLDER STARS FACE OFF IN SPECIAL

With Pimlico's showcase for three-year-olds only one day away, the seasoned pros take center stage for Friday's card in the GI Pimlico Special H. A strong case can be made for each of the eight entries in this year's 9 1/2-furlong race. The morning-line favorite at 5-2, **Badge of Silver** (Silver Deputy), who won his first two starts of the year, including the GII New Orleans H. at the Fair Grounds Mar. 12, will try to return to winning ways here following a second-place finish to **Pollard's Vision** (Carson City) in the Apr. 23 GIII National Jockey Club H. at Hawthorne. Winner of last year's GIII Lone Star and GIII Illinois Derbies, the Todd Pletcher trainee is 6-1 on the early line. Kentucky Derby hero **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor), who has been idle since a 10th-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Lone Star last October, will attempt to kick off his 2005 campaign with a victory as the 5-1 third choice, while **Presidentialaffair** (Not For Love), representing the home team, will try to keep his undefeated record intact at Pimlico following consecutive victories in the Maryland Million Classic Oct. 9 and the nine-furlong Jim McKay Breeders' Cup H. Apr. 23. **Second of June** (Louis Quatorze), winner of the GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream last year, is forced to miss the race after being placed under quarantine at Churchill Downs following an outbreak of the Equine Herpes Virus.

Aidan O'Brien maintains a numerical stranglehold on tomorrow's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh despite scratching the Newmarket Guineas hero Footstepsinthesand (GB), with four of the nine declared runners emanating from Ballydoyle. Susan Magnier's **Oratorio (Ire)** (Danehill), fourth in that Newmarket Classic last time May 1, will be ridden by stable number one Kieren Fallon in his bid to provide O'Brien with his fifth renewal since 1997. "Oratorio came out of the Guineas well and we've been pleased with him since," the trainer said. Johnny

Murtagh has chosen to partner **Showdance** (Kingmambo), a half-brother to U.S. champion Fiji (GB) who has not been seen since beating subsequent impressive winner Aragorn (GB) by 4 1/2 lengths in a six-furlong Cork maiden last June. Godolphin will saddle **Dubawi (Ire)** (Dubai Millennium {GB}), who returns to the scene of his finest hour when winning the G1 National S. last September. He bids to bury the disappointment of his fifth placing when sent off the 11-8 favorite for the 2000 Guineas. Trainer Saeed bin Suroor is hopeful he can bounce back. "He looked very well in his last piece of work," he told *PA Sport*. "We hope the ground there will be softer than at Newmarket, as that will suit him better." Six Star Racing's 2000 Guineas shock runner-up **Rebel Rebel (Ire)** (Revoque {Ire}), supplemented for this contest, will again be ridden by Oscar Urbina. "We think the track will suit him better than Newmarket because it is more of a testing mile," Urbina said earlier this week. "We are hoping the ground stays good and we'll have a go again. We've always had confidence in the horse."

GIACOMO STRETCHES HIS LEGS AT PIMLICO

Ketucky Derby hero **Giacomo** (Holy Bull) got his first look at Pimlico's track yesterday, galloping a mile and a half under the watchful eye of trainer John Shirreffs. "He was comfortable on the racetrack," said Shirreffs. He wasn't looking at all the tents in the infield. When he jogged on the backside and got into his gallop, he got into a nice, easy, long gallop, a nice stride. He wasn't going short. He looked like his normal self, pretty comfortable." Giacomo, who arrived from Churchill Downs Wednesday, galloped under exercise rider Frankie Herrarte. "Frankie said he likes the surface a lot," added Shirreffs. "That was one of the comments he made when he first went to Churchill--that he liked the track. I think that's very encouraging."

IMPLEMENTATION OF KENTUCKY BREEDERS' INCENTIVE PROGRAM DISCUSSED

What to do with an estimated \$12 million in Kentucky Breeders' Incentives money was the topic of discussion during a May 18 meeting of Central Kentucky breeders at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky's Newtown Paddocks near Lexington.

The discussion quickly centered on one issue: should breeders of Kentucky-bred horses racing outside of the state receive any form of incentive money or should the money remain in the state and be restricted to Kentucky-bred horses winning at only in-state tracks.

Catherine Parke, owner of Valkyre Stud near Georgetown, Ky., was in favor of rewarding breeders for horses winning outside Kentucky. Citing a 2003 study by The Jockey Club that was commissioned by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association showing 17.8% of Kentucky-bred horses break their maidens in the state, Parke said the majority of clients who board mares at her farm live outside of Kentucky and chose to race their horses at racetracks closer to their homes. 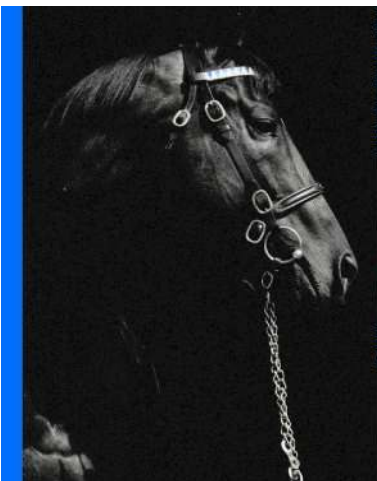

EQUINE HERPES VIRUS CONFIRMED The Kentucky Department of Agriculture announced that tests results have confirmed the presence of the equine herpes virus in three barns at Churchill Downs. "We know definitely what we're dealing with and now we can move on," said Dr. Robert Stout, State Veterinarian. Necropsies were performed on two horses which were euthanized after exhibiting neurologic symptoms of the disease and the results confirmed the presence of the virus. Barns 6, 38, and 39, which involves horses trained by Ronny Werner, Steve Asmussen, Paul McGee and Bill Cesare, have been placed under quarantine. Cesare's charge, Grade III winner **Second of June** (Louis Quatorze), was slated to run in today's GI Pimlico Special H., but will miss the race because of the ban. Kentucky Oaks heroine **Summerly** (Summer Squall), who is among the horses in Asmussen's barn, is expected to make her next start in the GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont Park June 25. In related news, the EHV outbreak has forced Churchill Downs to halt pre-race 'milkshake' testing. Because of the contagious nature of the virus, which is spread from horse to horse by close direct contact, or contact with infected nasal discharge, officials have decided to temporarily suspend pre-race testing rather than place all of the entrants in a confined space before each race. Churchill Downs will continue, however, to perform post-race milkshake tests on randomly selected horses at the track.

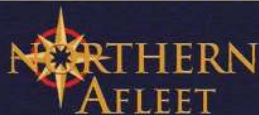

When was your first win as a trainer? 1987--that's when I went out on my own. A mare named Green Again, who's the dam of A to the Z (MSW & GISP earner of \$529,165).

Do you still keep in contact with Richard Mandella, for whom you worked for 10 years? Oh yeah, we're good friends. We talk every day. He asks me all the time what to do with his horses [laughs]. No, no, but we'll ask about each other's horses, or I'll point out one of my horses to him.

Since your accident (Hendricks was in a motorcycle accident last July that left him paralyzed from the waist down), what has been the hardest part about training? The hardest part has been the hands-on stuff. I used to go out and gallop horses myself a little bit. Riding the pony out, saddling the horses. But other than that, it's like managing a baseball team. You could never rub every horse and gallop every horse, so that was never part of training. Training is managing. Since the accident, the *easiest* part of my life has been training horses. And I've had good success since then, winning stakes, buying good horses.

What's your favorite California track? Del Mar. I grew up five miles away.

Who were your idols growing up? Two people in general: [Bill] Shoemaker and [Charlie] Whittingham. They were humble in a sense that they'd walk down the shedrow and talk to grooms, hotwalkers--whoever they ran into, and weren't above themselves. I always thought that was something to look up to.

Best place to grab a burger in L.A.? In-N-Out Burger.

What's most rewarding about training? Seeing owners so satisfied and happy after a race, and knowing you did your job.

MOTIVATOR HEADS DERBY 27

The Royal Ascot Racing Club's **Motivator (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) heads the 27 remaining entries in the £1.25 million G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom June 4 after yesterday's forfeit stage. The unbeaten colt, who followed up last year's success in the G1 Racing Post Trophy with an impressive return in the G2 Dante S. at York May 12, looks likely to start favorite for the Classic. Jeff Smith's **The Geezer (GB)** (Halling), who finished 1 ½ lengths adrift of Motivator at York, is on course to renew rivalry, according to his conditioner David Elsworth. "We're pleased with him--he has come out of York very well," he said. "He's progressing well--he's a bit of a playboy, but he is a great character and wants to please. He's in good form and at this stage of the season, it's going very well." Aidan O'Brien withdrew just the G1 2000 Guineas winner Footstepsinthesand (GB) and Dante S. disappointment Albert Hall (GB), leaving a possible team of seven including Susan Magnier's G3 Dee S. hero **Gypsy King (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), tomorrow's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas contender **Oratorio (Ire)** (Danehill) and **Grand Central (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), who finished third behind Joseph Joyce's unbeaten **Fracas (Ire)** (In the Wings {GB}) in the G2 Derby Trial at Leopardstown last time May 8.
