FIELDS OF GOLD

The last three Kentucky Derby winners--Smarty Jones (2004), Funny Cide (2003) and War Emblem (2002)--all added a victory in the GI Preakness S. on their way to earning Eclipse Awards as the nation's top three-year-old.

Today at Pimlico, **Giacomo** (Holy Bull) will get an opportunity to continue on the same path as his predecessors. He was 50-1 at Churchill Downs, and the blanket of roses has earned him a modicum of respect here at Old Hilltop. Odds maker Frank

Carulli tabbed the iron grey colt at 6-1, fourth choice on the morning line. "The horse doesn't know what his odds are," owner Jerry Moss said at Wednesday's draw. "We're okay. Whatever happens, happens." The boxcar Derby odds were a reflection on the consensus that the Southern California three-year-olds weren't highly regarded, but Giacomo had flashed ability with seconds in both the GI Hollywood Futurity and the GI San Felipe S. prior to running a close fourth in the GI Santa Anita Derby. He has emerged from his surprise Derby triumph in good order, and trainer John Shirreffs is pleased with the colt's attitude and condition. "I like that he came out of the Kentucky Derby in very good shape," he said. "His coat's still good. He's carrying good flesh. He looks good on the track. He's not nervous. It's the way he's been in the past. Nothing's changed that way."

EDDINGTON GETS HIS GRADE I

Third to Smarty Jones in the GI Preakness S. a year ago, **Eddington** (Unbridled) returned to Maryland with an authoritative score in the GI Pimlico Special. The big chestnut had also placed third in the GI Travers S., the GI Donn H. and the GI Wood Memorial. "We all felt some frustration with this horse because he wouldn't show

his true potential," said winning owner Peter Willmott, "and it wasn't as much fun being frustrated all the time. Of course, I'm not frustrated tonight, and it's a lot of fun." Champion **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor), making his first start of the year, loomed boldly on the turn before flattening out to finish fourth. **Cont. p2**

Hope Springs Eternal...

Despite the recent spate of Derby winners doubling up in the Preakness, it's not unheard of for three-year-olds to successfully rebound from a poor performance on the first Saturday in May. Point Given (2001) and Hansel (1991) were both unplaced as the favorite at Churchill, but surged to the head of their respective crops with wins in both the Preakness and the Belmont. In 1996, Louis Quatorze ran 16th in the Derby prior to his stakes-record equalling Preakness victory. He was trained by Nick Zito, who hopes that one of his trio--**High Fly** (Atticus), **Noble Causeway** (Giant's Causeway) and **Sun King** (Charismatic)--can mirror that achievement today. "Louis Quatorze, we thought he'd run much better in the Kentucky Derby," Zito reflected. "He was a quality horse who ran his race every time, but we couldn't find him in the Derby. He had an incredible Preakness. It was unique. He was the last horse to run that bad and come back with such a tremendous race."

Galaxy Ready...

Greeley's Galaxy (Mr. Greeley), winner of the GII Illinois Derby but 11th at Churchill, blew out three panels in a bullet :34.80 at Pimlico yesterday morning. "The time wasn't as important as how he came out of it," said Gary Stute. "He went that fast, came back and wasn't blowing a puff. And he's feeling his oats, boy! He really think's he's something."

Second by a neck to Pies Prospect in the GIII Pegasus S. at the Meadowlands, Eddington closed out his three-year-old season with a win on the grass in the GIII Calder Derby. He started 2005 with an emphatic optional claimer score at Gulfstream Jan. 16 prior to running third to Saint Liam and Roses in May in the Donn. The chestnut rebounded successfully in the GII Gulfstream Park H. and followed that with a close third as the favorite in the GII Oaklawn H. Apr. 9. Jockey Eibar Coa allowed the growthy four-year-old to settle near the back of the pack in the early stages, but the pair reached contention with a sweeping move on the far turn. Eddington hit the front in midstretch and opened up daylight. "This is a very tough horse to ride," Coa admitted. "He just wants to be happy. He handled the dirt well doing his own thing. In the stretch, he just had another gear."

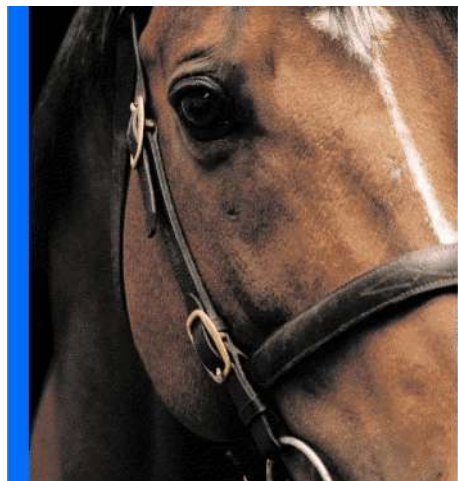

New Shooters...

Four Preakness entrants will bid to be just the fourth three-year-old since 1980 to land the black-eyed susans without running in the Derby. Red Bullet (2000), Aloma's Ruler (1982) and Codex (1980) each accomplished that feat. The locally based **Malibu Moonshine** (Malibu Moon), winner of four of his last five starts, has drawn the rail in his chance to give his 72-year-old trainer King Leatherbury a win in the Preakness.

"The favorite [**Afleet Alex** {Northern Afleet}, 12] is going to be a little bit handicapped by the outside post," he said. "Of course, the Derby winner [Giacomo, 13] is even more so. They have to overcome that and I don't. The worst thing about me is I could be trapped down on the inside. On the other hand, I'm not going to lose any ground. Not on the first turn anyway. The second turn is a different story." Malibu Moonshine will seek to emulate Marylanders Magic Weisner and Oliver's Twist, who were second in 2002 and 1995, respectively.

LAWN CHORUS When it comes to Irish Classic heroes in the last 10 years, it is Aidan O'Brien who has done the casting. O'Brien will be hoping for more operatics from Susan Magnier's **Oratorio (Ire)** (Danehill) in today's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh. Even without the presence of 2000 Guineas hero

Footstepsinthesand (GB), he appears to have a formidable substitute in last year's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere winner, who caught the eye late when finishing fourth in the Newmarket Classic Apr. 30.

Godolphin's Bachir (Ire) upset Ballydoyle's Giant's Causeway in 2000. Today they rely on **Dubawi (Ire)** (Dubai Millennium {GB}), who came unstuck on a quick surface when fifth in the 2000 Guineas. That was his first run since winning the G1 National S. at this venue last September and trainer Saeed bin Suroor thinks this easier ground will bring him back to his best. "Dubawi has been working very well," he said yesterday. "Softer ground will suit Dubawi much better and I am looking forward to him running in Ireland." Six Star Racing's **Rebel Rebel (Ire)** (Revoque {Ire}) caused a stir when chasing home Footstepsinthesand at odds of 100-1 at Newmarket last time. He bids to emulate Barathea (Ire), who went one better in this contest in 1993. "We were disappointed with his previous run at Newmarket when he finished fourth in a Listed race over a mile and one," explained Rebel Rebel's jockey Oscar Urbina. "So we thought he doesn't want further than a mile. He ran so well last time that we had to take a chance again over a mile at the Curragh." Harry Dobson's G3 Craven S. victor **Democratic Deficit (Ire)** (Soviet Star) will be bidding to better his sixth in the 2000 Guineas. O'Brien's trio of second-string sophomores in this race include Susan Magnier's longshot **Showdance** (Kingmambo). The colt has untapped potential, but returns from a lengthy absence after an impressive Cork maiden score last June.

this determined effort. The Stronach colorbearer began her career with a runner-up finish at Saratoga last July, but didn't run again until Feb. 16, rallying to win a Gulfstream maiden. She added a comfortable allowance victory at Keeneland two months later and was favored here in her stakes debut despite her inexperience.

Breaking from the outside, the bay was carried very wide on the first turn when Merrill Gold (Gold Fever)'s rein broke to her inside. She settled into an easy rhythm before taking command on the far turn. R Lady Joy put in a sustained run, but the favorite found another gear and pulled away in deep stretch. "I was concerned with what was taking place on the first turn," said winning trainer Todd Pletcher, whose Ashado and Maddalena each faltered earlier on the card. "I didn't know what was happening to Edgar [Prado]'s horse [Merrill Gold], but my filly looked like she got through it okay, and it was fortunate the way it all worked out."

The Bowie-based Silmaril wore down heavily favored Ashado for her first stakes win at graded level. The Maryland-bred, with three wins in four previous starts at Old Hilltop, kicked off 2005 with a victory in Laurel's one-mile Nellie Morse H. Jan. 29. She stepped up in class afterwards in a pair of seven-furlong races, finishing third in the GII Barbara Fritchie H. Feb. 19 and fourth in the GII Distaff Breeders' Cup H. Mar. 26. Stretched out to nine panels last out, the dark bay bested her rivals in the Northview Stallion Station S. Apr. 23. The longest shot on the board in this four-horse field, Silmaril skimmed the rail in third as Ashado showed the way down the backstretch. The favorite looked home free at the top of the stretch, but Silmaril bulled her way past Pleasant Home (Seeking the Gold) and set her sights on Ashado. "It was an outstanding performance," said winning trainer Christopher Grove. "I knew she loved the slop." That slop proved Ashado's undoing. "It's kind of a sticky, goeey surface, probably not her favorite," commented trainer Todd Pletcher.

It wasn't hard to come up with figures for this year's Derby, but between a dead rail, a fierce pace, and possibly the deterrent effect of supertesting and heightened backstretch security, it is hard to assess what the figures mean for the many horses that did not run back to their good efforts. Looking now at the Preakness, there is reason to believe that Afleet Alex and Giacomo won't fire their best shots this time, and the wide draws make them very vulnerable. Closing Argument is solid, and High Fly was helped greatly by the draw. The interesting longshots are Greeley's Galaxy, Sun King, and High Limit, all of whom figure to run much better here than in Louisville.

Ran a new top while most of the faster ones failed to fire. While there are quite a few that are as fast or faster, he is still fresh and probably the most likely horse to run his best race.

Came out running, and has had his moments, but hasn't really developed since his debut.

Awesome Again

Had a decent pattern going into his last, but didn't fire and returns quickly after reportedly bleeding through Lasix, not a good situation when you need to run several lengths faster than ever before.

Charismatic

Was cycling around, and his off race at the Derby could be attributable to the dead rail. A tricky call, but as with High Limit, if you excuse his last he is very playable at a price.

11 High Limit

A horse we liked in the Derby, and he was on a dead rail on both turns. Frankel doesn't like running horses on two weeks' rest and has plenty of excuses not to run here—which makes us think he expects a big effort.

12 Afleet Alex

One of the few who got a good trip in the Derby; effort looked better than it was. May be over the top in his fifth start in 11 weeks, and ran badly on 2 weeks' rest before.

13 Giacomo

Holy Bull

Even his big jump in the Derby was only good enough because many others did not run their best race, and a bounce here is likely.

Golden Missile

Not competitive with these on best, and last three have been horrible.

Limited Training for Horses in Equine Herpes Quarantine:

Officials with the Kentucky Department of Agriculture have developed a protocol that could allow a return to limited training for horses in the three Churchill Downs barns that have been placed under quarantine because of the discovery of equine herpes virus. Horses in quarantined barns which have displayed no symptoms of the virus and test negative in a blood test will be able to return to limited training. However, those horses would still remain under quarantine and would have a special training session, most likely in the early evening.

State Assembly Passes Drug Testing Bill:

The California State Assembly has passed legislation allowing the California Horse Racing Board to conduct total carbon dioxide (TCO2) testing and to designate the University of California at Davis as the main testing facility. The bill, known as AB 52, deals with two separate issues pertaining to equine drug testing, including the practice known as "milkshaking." AB 52 sets forth a maximum level of TCO2 at 37.0 millimoles per liter of blood serum or plasma. Any excessive level of TCO2 will be considered a class 3 violation in the CHRB classification system and will result in disqualification and a forfeiture of any purse money. Additional penalties could include fines and suspensions. "AB 52 will not only ensure a level playing field for the owners and trainers of racehorses, but will protect the integrity of this great sport and the fans who support it," said Assembly Member Jerome Horton of Inglewood. MINIMUM WEIGHTS RAISED IN NEW ZEALAND

The minimum riding weights in New Zealand have been increased for the upcoming season that begins Aug. 1. Under the new rules, the minimum weight that jockeys carry in Group 1 and Group 2 handicaps will be raised from 50 kilos to 51 kilos; weights for Group 3 handicap races will rise from 51 kilos to 52 kilos; and the minimum weight for all other handicap races will be increased from 52 kilos to 53 kilos. In addition, the minimum highweight in all handicap races, bar those for two-year-olds and three-year-olds, will go from 57 kilos to 58 kilos; and the highweight for handicaps restricted to two- and three-year-olds will be raised from 56 kilos to 57 kilos.
