Blood-Horse

ZAPPED IN

Reigning Horse of the Year **Ghostzapper** (Awesome Again) had been away from the races since winning the GI Breeders' Cup Classic last October, but the five-year-old didn't look rusty with a dominating 6 1/4-length victory in yesterday's GI Metropolitan H. at Belmont Park. The only anxious moments for backers of the 3-5 favorite came when he refused to load and had to be encouraged into the gate by several NYRA starters. Once the gates opened, the champion was content to track the early

pacesetters **Love of Money** (Not for Love) and **Forest Danger** (Forestry). He inhaled the leaders leaving the backstretch and powered clear under a motionless Javier Castellano. "I'm very emotional right now," said the usually stoic winning trainer Bobby Frankel. "He's a great horse, let's just put it that way." **Cont. p2**

CASTLEDALE BACK ON TOP

Castledale (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) gained instant fame with a narrow victory on the main track in last year's GI Santa Anita Derby, but his racing career got back on track with the return to the turf this spring. The Irish-bred colt enjoyed success at the top level again yesterday with a late-running victory in the GI Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile at Hollywood Park. Castledale settled in the second tier of horses while saving ground along the rail. He moved forward on the inside on the final bend, angled to the outside for the drive and forged to the lead late to outfinish **King of Happiness** (Spinning World) for a half-length victory. "I don't see too many horses like this horse," said winning rider Rene Douglas. "You can communicate with this horse. He should be human. He's unbelievable." GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner **Singleetary** (Sultry Song), the 9-5 favorite, pressed the quick pace before tiring to fourth, but scared connections when stumbling and throwing jockey David Flores as the pair was galloping back to be unsaddled. He was apparently uninjured and Flores returned to ride the next race. "He's good. He came back good," reported trainer Don Chatlos.

MCANALLY ONE-TWO IN GAMELY

Mea Domina (Dance Brightly) set a pressured pace and gamely held off the late surge of stablemate **Solar Echo** (Spinning World) to lead home a one-two finish for Hall of Fame trainer Ron McAnally in yesterday's GI Gamely Breeders' Cup H. at Hollywood Park. The four-year-old filly, looking for her first graded stakes tally, had not started since finishing fourth in the Apr. 23 GIII Wilshire H. She set fractions of :23.39, :46.60, 1:09.86 and 1:34.14 while pressed by **Miss Terrible (Arg)** (Numerous) and had just enough to hold off Solar Echo by a neck. Solar Echo was making her third start of the year after being sidelined for 17 months after a narrow loss in the August 2003 GI Del Mar Oaks. "They're very good horses, and I give a lot of credit to both of them," McAnally said after winning his first Gamely. "We thought they were both capable."

Win Streak Continues for Ghostzapper...

Ghostzapper, unbeaten since finishing third in the 2003 GI King's Bishop S., started his win streak with the 2003 GI Vosburgh S. During his championship 2004 season, the bay won the GII Tom Fool H., GIII Iselin Breeders' Cup H., GI Woodward and GI Breeders' Cup Classic. His 2005 return was delayed by a sinus infection, but he proved worth the wait yesterday. "He broke sharp, but I didn't think he would show that much speed, to be honest with you," said Bobby Frankel. "[Jockey] Javier [Castellano] took a little hold of him, and I felt pretty good when he moved up inside of Forest Danger. I thought the race was over then." Castellano was always confident aboard Ghostzapper. "In the race, he broke good and I could have gone to the lead, but I wanted to prove today that he could come from behind, too," he commented. "He can do anything. I came through between horses on the turn. The rest he did so easy. I didn't do anything with him at the top of the stretch because I wanted to take it easy on him."

At the Gate...

Ghostzapper looked like he wanted to delay his 2005 debut for just a little longer when he was reluctant to load, but that didn't concern Castellano or Frankel. "He messes around all the time, so I wasn't worried about that," Frankel said. Explaining what happened, Castellano said, "At the start, [the assistant starters] wanted me to jump off. I didn't want to do that; I thought I could handle the situation."

Mark Your Calendars...

Mapping out Ghostzapper's campaign, Frankel listed the GI July 2 Suburban, the Aug. 6 GI Whitney, the Sept. 10 GI Woodward and Oct. 29 Breeders' Cup. "You want to see this horse keep on winning for the game," he remarked. Frankel also gave credit to owner Frank Stronach. "[Stronach] brought [Ghostzapper] back to the races, where he could make at best, what five or six million dollars," he said. "I know people rip him for this and that, but give him credit for this one. If it was someone else, they would have retired him. He wanted to bring him back so the fans could watch him for another year."

Castledale earned a trip to last year's Kentucky Derby with a win in the GI Santa Anita Derby. After running 14th in the Run for the Roses, he was sidelined for eight months and returned to run fifth in the Jan. 15 GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup H. and again in the Feb. 5 GII Strub S. He returned to the turf, where he had won the GIII Generous S. as a two-year-old, and was a narrowly beaten runner-up in a Mar. 17 optional claimer at Santa Anita. He made it back to the winner's circle for the first time since the Santa Anita Derby with a half-length tally in the Apr. 23 GII San Francisco Breeders' Cup H. at Bay Meadows last time out and rallied to make it two in a row here. "He's had his foot problems, nothing major, but the grass is a little easier for him," said the winner's co-owner Frank Lyons. "He's not Breeders' Cup nominated, but obviously when the Breeders' Cup comes around and he's still healthy and sound and everything, we'd think about supplementing." Fight Your Corner entered the 2002 G1 Epsom Derby as one of the leading fancies after winning the G3 Chester Vase that May, but the six-year-old has spent a long time in the shadows since then. Injured when fifth in the Derby, he was transferred from the yard of Mark Johnston to Godolphin and offered hope of a return to his best when second to Gamut (Ire) in the Listed Aston Park S. at Newbury the following May. That expectation was dented by a subsequent disappointment in the G1 Ascot Gold Cup, and it took him another 20 months to get back on the scoresheet in a handicap at Nad al Sheba Feb. 10, but he offered another flat effort when last in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at that venue Mar. 26. Bouncing back here, he was reserved in rear by Kerrin McEvoy and was short of room when making his move approaching the final quarter. Switched wide for his run soon after, he swallowed up Alcazar and Lochbuie in the final 75 yards of the uphill climb to assert. "I thought I'd stuffed up as I was too far back and it was not a quick pace," McEvoy said. "To his credit he came through with a nice run. There was a doubt about his stamina today, but he switches off well enough and he's progressive. He has a little bit of quirkiness as well, but hopefully he can go on to better things from today." Elopa only set foot on a racetrack for the first time seven months ago, but the giant filly has made great strides since and battled her way to a career best here. Having opened her account on debut at Mulheim in early October, she was pitched straight into the deep end later that month in the G3 Prix de Flore at this track and justified her connections' faith when finishing runner-up. After returning here to win the Listed Prix Petite Etoile on her next start in November, she carried on where she left off when taking the G3 Prix Allez France at Chantilly May 2. She raced eagerly in a stalking second off the moderate early tempo here and was sent to the front before halfway by Andrasch Starke. Driven out as Russian Hill loomed large in the closing stages, she answered every call to cling grimly to her advantage. "I'm delighted, as she would have been better with more pace in the race," winning trainer Andreas Schutz commented. "She also had to go on a bit too early and a mile and a quarter suits her best. She is in the G1 Pretty Polly S. [at The Curragh June 25] and I'd be very keen to go there." Supah Blitz had visited the Lone Star State twice before, running second in the GIII Texas Mile in 2004 and in the 2005 edition of that event in his most recent outing Apr. 30. The dark bay boasted five stakes wins coming into this race, including a nose score in the GII Del Mar Breeders' Cup H. last summer and a one-length success in the Carl G. Rose Classic H. at Calder in November. He went through a rough patch when off the board in three straight, but bounced back to take the Apr. 2 GIII Tokyo City H. at Santa Anita and was closing on High Strike Zone (Smart Strike) last time out. The second choice behind Lion Tamer (Will's Way) here, he tracked a fast pace from third. The Florida-bred gained ground on the final bend, grabbed the lead at the head of the lane and had a little daylight at midstretch, but had to use every ounce of energy to keep his nose in front as four horses hit the wire together. Lion Tamer broke slowly and was caught in traffic on the far turn. The even-money chalk, he finished willingly up the rail, but came out on the bottom in the four-way photo for the win.

Silverfoot came into the GIII Louisville H. with a two-for-two record on the turf at Churchill Downs and remained perfect on the course with this determined

effort. The gray first stepped onto the Churchill grass for an optional claimer last May and came home a neck winner. He came back to take the 2004 edition of this race by a nose over Rochester, then headed to Arlington Park and was second in the July 4 GIII Stars and Stripes Breeders' Cup H. A lackluster fifth in the Aug.

14 GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. at Saratoga, Silverfoot was shelved for the remainder of the year. The five-year-old made his return as the 4-5 chalk in a Keeneland allowance test and closed for a 1 1/2-length tally. No one seemed to want the lead in the Louisville, so jockey Robby Albarado changed tactics with Silverfoot, sending him right to the front. He was joined on the lead by Rapid Proof (Fast Play) and Gottabeachboy (Mister Baileys {GB}), and the trio crawled along through six furlongs in 1:18.37 and a mile in 1:43.07. Silverfoot shook off his fellow pacesetters at the top of the stretch, then had to contend with the late run of Rochester, but had enough in reserve to hit the wire as the winner. "He came by and he was on the lead down the stretch the first time around," said winning trainer Dallas Stewart. "They went the first half in something crazy [1:52.60], and [owner Stephanie Clark] said, 'Are we supposed to be on the lead?' Fawkes expected a good race from his charge on the gelding's favorite track. "He ran a big race in Texas, but the stretch doesn't fit his style as well as this track," the trainer said. "He just loves it at Calder--the hot weather and all." As for what is next for Twilight Road, Fawkes said, "We'll see what comes up for him--turf or dirt--and definitely would like to see him win the [Sept. 5] Miami Mile again."

Unbeaten Deep Impact maintained his Japanese Triple Crown hopes with an imperious display in the Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby). Since breaking his maiden by four lengths at Hanshin Dec. 19, the bay added a five-length win at Kyoto Jan. 22 before stepping up to stakes company. He duly won the G2-Jpn Hoshi Hai Yayoi Sho at Nakayama Mar. 6 before annexing the G1-Jpn Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) Apr. 17 at the same track. Deep Impact was a handful in the paddock here, but went postward as the heavy favorite and lived up to the billing. Deep Impact was the shortest-priced winner in the history of the race. "At around the 600-meter sign, I gave him the green light," Take told *Daily Yomiuri*. "When we hit the stretch, he slipped into another gear." The Makoto Kaneko colorbearer could become the first Japanese Triple Crown winner since Narita Brian (Jpn) in 1994 if he can add a victory in the 3000-meter G1-Jpn Kikka Sho at Kyoto Oct. 23.

His flop in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden in September was the first time he had finished out of the first two in his career, and he was an unconvincing fourth in the G1 Canadian International at Woodbine in October last out. "He is in very good form and seems fresh and well," conditioner Marcus Tregoning told *PA Sport*. "He is running over a mile and a quarter because he tends to run very fresh first time out, but he is very effective over this trip--he won over it a couple of years ago and he has plenty of pace. He is an eight-year-old, but he still seems very enthusiastic and we hope he runs well."

Sophomores have beaten the older brigade only six times since 1982, but the duo of **Etlaala** and **Nota Bene** offer a stern challenge this time. The former is dropping back in trip after flopping when favorite for the G3 Craven S. over a mile at Newmarket on his return Apr. 14. That was the second occasion he failed to perform at that track, having disappointed when trailing in the G1 Dewhurst S. there in October. He had previously looked top class when collaring Iceman (GB) to win the G2 Champagne S. over seven furlongs at Doncaster in September, and connections are hoping that he will be back at his best again. "As everyone knows he scoped dirty after Newmarket and was given a bit of time off," owner Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's Racing Manager Angus Gold told *PA Sport*. "But I saw him last week and he looked fantastic and was moving well. It is not ideal to run him over five furlongs, but [trainer] Barry [Hills] feels he ought to have a run before Royal Ascot, and with his Group 2 penalty it is difficult to find where to run him. We feel that he is a six- or possibly seven-furlong horse, but the race will tell us more and give us other options." Nota Bene turned in one of the smartest performances of the season so far when breaking Newbury's track record in the Listed Carnarvon S. last time May 13. That was his first step into stakes company, having won competitive sprint handicaps at Newmarket in October and on his return Apr. 12, and his trainer holds him in the highest regard. Of the veterans, **Var** and **Fayr Jag** set the standard as Group 1 winners last term. While the former showed brutal speed over Longchamp's five furlongs in the Prix de l'Abbaye in October, Fayr Jag needed all of the stiff six at Royal Ascot to grab the glory in the Golden Jubilee S. in June. He has been unplaced in every subsequent start, while Var disappointed when down the field in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint on his latest start in December.



Giacomo Works

Kentucky Derby winner **Giacomo** (Holy Bull), who finished third in the GI Preakness S. May 21, worked seven furlongs in 1:27 at Hollywood Park Monday morning. The sophomore, who worked in company with five-year-old Bullistic, is expected to make his next appearance in the June 11 GI Belmont S. "He went nice," said trainer John Shirreffs. "It's always good to work with another horse to get some competition and a target." According to Shirreffs, the grey will be shipped from California to New York June 6. "Normally, I wouldn't work him this soon after a race [Preakness], but with the flight schedule, I thought this was the best option," he said. Another West Coast sophomore, Santa Anita Derby winner **Buzzards Bay** (Marco Bay), covered six panels in 1:12 3/5 at Hollywood yesterday. According to trainer Jeff Mullins, the chestnut has yet to be confirmed for the 1 1/2-mile Classic, but appears to be good shape. "The horse worked fine and he's going fine," Mullins said. Buzzards Bay finished fifth, 6 1/4 lengths behind Giacomo, in his most recent start in the Kentucky Derby.

Motivator Heads Derby 15...

The Royal Ascot Racing Club's **Motivator** (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) heads the 15 remaining colts in line to contest Saturday's G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom. Last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy winner returned to win the G2 Dante S. at York last time May 12 and is the likely favorite for the £1.25-million contest. "I spoke to [trainer] Michael [Bell] this morning and everything is AOK and Motivator is ready to roll," the syndicate's Racing Manager Harry Herbert said yesterday. "Michael is absolutely delighted with the way Motivator is and it is now just a matter of keeping him ticking over. It is very exciting and I hope everything goes smoothly beforehand. The smaller the field the better as far as we are concerned because there is then less chance of getting into trouble during the race." Extra spice was added to the story last week when jockey Johnny Murtagh picked up a three-day ban which would rule him out of Saturday's race. The rider will find out on Wednesday whether he can reduce the sentence and ride the likely favorite. "I hope Johnny gets a reduction in his ban so he can ride Motivator," Herbert added. "He has put so much effort into helping prepare the horse for the Derby that it would be pretty desperate to miss the Classic because of a minor riding infringement."

As expected, Aidan O'Brien left in a team of four owned by Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor, headed by the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas runner-up **Oratorio** (Ire) (Danehill) and G3 Dee S. victor **Gypsy King** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Michael Kinane will be in the saddle for whichever colt is rejected by Kieren Fallon, while Jimmy Fortune has been named as the partner of the G2 Leopardstown Derby Trial third **Grand Central** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Godolphin's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas hero **Dubawi** (Ire) (Dubai Millennium {GB}) is one of two entries from the operation, but G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) winner **Shamardal** (Giant's Causeway) is more likely to run in Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly. Racing Manager Simon Crisford revealed yesterday that the ground is the key factor to running plans. "Dubawi is in tremendous form and is really well," he said.

"Shamardal is in there as a precaution and the plan is to go for the Prix du Jockey-Club. At the moment the ground is good, but there's not really much rain forecast for the rest of the week and we will probably walk the track tomorrow and talk to the Clerk of the Course."

Epsom's Director of Racing Andrew Cooper explained that the track would be watered in light of the dry forecast. "We began watering again this morning and will put about a quarter of an inch of water on today and tomorrow," he said yesterday. "We had a small amount of rain overnight and virtually missed the showers this morning which is why we are watering. The going should be good after the watering program has been completed and we will then see what happens. There is the possibility of rain, but it could easily miss Epsom and if we sat back and did nothing it would be proper good to firm ground in two days' time. We have heard what the various camps are saying, but we have made it clear we are aiming that, assuming it is dry, on Friday the ground will be around good."

Others whose entries were confirmed include Jeff Smith's Dante S. runner-up **The Geezer** (GB) (Halling), Joseph Joyce's Leopardstown Derby Trial winner **Fracas** (Ire) (In the Wings {GB}) and Neil Jones's G3 Lingfield Derby Trial hero **Kong** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells).

Establishing a thriving stallion station isn't easy in an industry as competitive as Kentucky's, yet that is what Castleton Lyons has achieved in a relatively short time.

Having recruited Malibu Moon from Maryland in September 2003, the Iron Works Pike farm made its next move for an established stallion when Bernstein arrived from Buck Pond Farm towards the end of last year. In addition, the team has been strengthened by the arrival of two highly accomplished juveniles in Action This Day, the co-champion two-year-old of 2003, and Toccet, the second-best juvenile of 2002. Toccet cost \$3.35 million at auction last November.

Castleton Lyons so far has every reason to be pleased with its acquisitions. Declan's Moon has helped boost Malibu Moon's fee from \$10,000 to \$17,500, while Bernstein's fee has gone from \$7,500 in 2004 to \$15,000 this year.

Bernstein has been the focus of a lot of attention ever since he made his first public appearance as a weanling at Keeneland's 1997 November Sale. With Demi O'Byrne being pushed to \$925,000, the young son of Storm Cat was the highest-priced foal of 1997 by a margin of \$250,000.

His price reflected his magnificent pedigree. Not only was he a brother to the Grade III-winning fillies Caress and Country Cat, but he had a three-parts sister to the champion juvenile filly Outstandingly as his dam.

This was La Affirmed, who had been carrying Bernstein when she was bought by Betty Moran's Brushwood Stable for \$1,900,000--the second-highest price for an American broodmare in 1996. For good measure, the colt's third dam, Finance, was a half sister to the celebrated Buckpasser.

Naturally there was tremendous interest in Bernstein when he made his racecourse debut in a six-furlong maiden at the Curragh in May 1999. Starting at 1-3, he didn't disappoint. Asked for his reaction to his colt's 5 1/2-length victory, Aidan O'Brien described Bernstein as "very special."

"Even to get horses to lead him in a canter at home is a big problem. We have to use a four-year-old.," he added. "I'm not ruling out Royal Ascot for him but it is a long year and he is a big colt, so we might take things slowly with him in the immediate future."

Instead of taking the colt to Royal Ascot (where he relied on Fasliyev to win the Coventry S.), O'Brien targeted the G3 Railway S. on June 27 with Bernstein. An even hotter favourite this time, Bernstein was again soon in front and cruised to another wide-margin success. **Cont. p. 12**

When Michael Tabor, a part-owner of both Bernstein and Fasliyev, was asked which colt he would be tempted to back for the following year's 2,000 Guineas, Tabor opted for Bernstein. The bookmakers reacted by making Bernstein a clear favourite for the Classic, at odds as short as 7-1.

So far, so good. Unfortunately the dreams of Bernstein developing into a star received a setback when he was next seen in public, nearly three months later, in the G1 National S. His reputation was so high at this stage that he started at 4-11 to land this major prize, but two things had changed--the distance, up from six furlongs to a mile, and the ground, which was much softer than on Bernstein's previous appearances. Although he again attempted to lead all the way, racing too freely for his own good, he tired badly in the closing stages and finished only fifth behind the excellent Sinnidar.

Bernstein's three-year-old career proved something of a conundrum. When tackling distances short of a mile, he ran as though he would be suited by further, getting up only close home to win a valuable sprint over six furlongs and the G3 Concorde S. over seven furlongs. Yet he ran really badly when last in the 2,000 Guineas on his three-year-old debut and he could finish only fifth in the River City H. over a mile and an eighth on his only start in the U.S. (the Breeders' Cup Mile had been his preferred objective, but he failed to make the cut).

So Bernstein never rose to the heights suggested by his first two starts, for whatever reason. Perhaps his headstrong temperament was partly to blame (nothing new in a son of Storm Cat), or perhaps there was a physical problem--he was twice off the course for periods of around three months. Or perhaps he simply wasn't as good as all the hype suggested.

I am beginning to rule out the last hypothesis, now that Bernstein is shaping up so encouragingly as a stallion, both in the Northern and Southern Hemisphere.

Although American breeders are well aware of the quality of Bernstein's bloodlines, they could initially be forgiven for preferring instead to use one of the many well-bred sons of Storm Cat who had done well on dirt, rather than turf. Consequently, his first crop--sired at \$10,000--contained only 38 live foals, of which 36 have been named.

Of these 36, two have become graded winners, with Toll Taker landing the GIII Astarita S. and the downgraded Boiling Springs S., while Berbatim has won the GIII Providentia S. In addition to these two, this first crop has also produced the graded-placed fillies Sweet Solairo and Rugula and the stakes-winning geldings Claymont and Bernie Blue. A pretty good collection for so small a crop!

Unfortunately there were only 28 live foals reported in Bernstein's second crop. With 43 yearlings, his total output in his first three years amounts to only 109 live foals, which will have to be taken into account in assessing his potential.

Bernstein also has a good proportion of winners to runners among his first Argentine two-year-olds, including two fillies who finished first and second in the G1 Gran Premio Saturnino J. Unzue. That race was on dirt and Bernstein has shown he can sire good winners on both surfaces.

Toll Taker is comfortably the best performer from the first six foals out of Tappanee, who earned \$160,000 during a 42-race career. Similarly, Berbatim is comfortably the best winner among the first nine foals out of another stakes-placed mare, Word Harvest.

Cast your eyes down a list of Bernstein's stakes horses and you will find that they are out of mares by such as Bet Big, Crusader Sword, Skywalker, Verbatim, Cryptoclearance, Fleet Mel and Criminal Type--none of them exactly the height of fashion. This suggests that he will very much be one to keep an eye on, especially from 2008 onwards, when the progeny from his higher stud fee start to race.
