ESWARAH HEADS OAKS DOZEN

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's unbeaten **Eswarah (GB)** (Unfuwain) will face 11 rivals as she bids to justify favoritism in tomorrow's G1 Vodafone Oaks at Epsom. Despite the ease of her two successes, including her two-length victory in the Listed Swettenham Stud Fillies' Trial at Newbury May 13, and some stellar work on the home gallops, trainer Michael Jarvis is cautiously optimistic. "She won her two races well and has always worked brilliantly at home," he said. "She's got a terrific turn of foot and, on pedigree, should certainly stay, but she's got to act on the track which is always the imponderable. I'd like to see a few showers because most of the family have wanted to get their toe in, but it was extremely firm at Newbury and I don't think Epsom will be anything like as fast as that, so we go there full of hope." Heading the opposition is Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G1 1000 Guineas winner **Virginia Waters** (Kingmambo), who needs to bounce back from her disappointing effort when eighth as the

favorite in the Irish equivalent at The Curragh last time May 22. She will be partnered by Kieren Fallon, while Mick Kinane has been called on to ride G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) fourth **Silk and Scarlet (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) and Johnny Murtagh takes the mount on **Mona Lisa (GB)** (Giant's Causeway), fourth in last year's G1 Fillies' Mile. That rider is hoping that Aidan O'Brien's third string can bounce back from two below-par efforts this term, including an 11th-place effort in the May 22 Irish 1000 Guineas last time, though she was beaten just three lengths. "I'm hoping the step up to a mile and a half will see her improve," he said. "Aidan says she's come on for her two runs, which she needed, but she's going to have to." *Field, p2*

'ALEX' BREEZES AT PIMLICO

Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet) hit the track at Pimlico yesterday morning, breezing five furlongs in 1:01 3/5 under jockey Jeremy Rose. Clockers caught the G1 Preakness S. winner through fractions of :14, :26 2/5, :38 and :49 4/5. 'Alex' galloped out three-quarters in 1:14 2/5. "I think he did everything well," said his conditioner, Tim Ritchey. "Our plan was to start out easy and let him finish strong. It

was a maintenance breeze to make sure everything's good with him. After watching that and how he came back, I think we are in good shape." Ritchey balked at shipping the June 5 G1 Belmont S. hopeful to New York last Saturday after a suspected case of strangles popped up at Belmont Park. Alex is instead likely to ship this Saturday after a light workout at Pimlico.

MURTAGH BACK ON MOTIVATOR

Johnny Murtagh had his appeal to reduce his three-day suspension upheld yesterday, which frees him for the ride on Saturday's G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom favorite **Motivator (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}). Originally banned for three days by the Lingfield stewards due to a careless riding offense last Tuesday, Murtagh emerged from a hearing of the Jockey Club's disciplinary panel yesterday with the news that he will serve only two days on the sidelines. Under the rules, a suspension of that duration is automatically deferred if clashing with a Group 1 race in Britain. "It's great news and a big relief," the rider commented. "Its been a tricky week and it has been there hanging over me. It would have been disastrous to miss the ride on the Derby favorite and this is a great result." Connections had booked Darryll Holland as a reserve for the G1 Racing Post Trophy and G2 Dante S. hero, but trainer Michael Bell echoed Murtagh's sentiments after the hearing yesterday. "It's a big relief," he said. "No disrespect to Darryll, as he's a top-class jockey, but Johnny's got a very good association with the horse and has done a lot of work with him."

Hesmonds Stud's Listed Lingfield Oaks Trial winner **Cassydora (GB)** (Darshaan {GB}) will be the mount of Seb Sanders, who is chasing his first success in a British Classic. "She won very impressively and stayed very well last time and I couldn't have been more pleased with her," he commented. "She did nothing but quicken when she straightened up and could only beat what was in front of her. She was behind a horse hanging off the rail there, so did well to get around that turn. It's going to be a very interesting race and Eswarah and Virginia Waters are the main threats. Eswarah won well at Newbury and, if Virginia Waters runs like she did in the Guineas, she's going to take all the beating." Setsquare Recruitment's **Something Exciting (GB)** (Halling) looked just that when winning the Listed Lupe S. at Goodwood last time May 18 and bids to emulate Love Divine (GB) in following up here. Richard Quinn, who partnered that filly to win five years ago, will be in the saddle on Friday. "She is a progressive filly and came out and won quite nicely in the Lupe, so hopefully she has progressed again," he said. Of the outsiders, the DGH Partnership's Listed Cheshire Oaks runner-up **Higher Love (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) received an upbeat bulletin from conditioner Michael Bell yesterday. "I think she's guaranteed to stay and is progressive," he commented. "While realistically I don't think she's a threat to Cassydora and Eswarah, who look high-class, middle-distance fillies, I think she's got prospects of being third or fourth. If we got a couple of downpours, she could spring a surprise."

Injury denied La Cucaracha the top juvenile prize she appeared destined for after two easy scores to begin her career and she failed to truly get back on track during another stop-start campaign last term. Everything finally fell into place when she returned from a 10-month absence to beat The Kiddykid (Ire) in the Listed Cammidge Trophy at Doncaster Apr. 2, but testing ground was against her when she was ninth behind that rival in the G2 Duke of York S. at York last time May 11. Reserved in mid-division off this strong early tempo by Michael Hills, she was kept wide throughout and was able to deliver a sustained run down the outside in the straight. The enigmatic **Salselon** has earned the reputation of a rogue, despite his exploits in some of the best company in Europe over the past three seasons. Twice a winner of the G3 Premio Chiusura at this track and also successful in the G3 Prix Edmond Blanc at Saint-Cloud two years ago, he also had a third placing in the G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua here in October 2003 on his resume when joining Luca Cumani last spring. If he looked to be turning a corner when runner-up to Russian Rhythm in the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury in May and third in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot the following month, he soon returned to his uncooperative best. He comes here off a fourth in the G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica at that track May 15 and faces a solid field, including last year's G1 Derby Italiano fourth **Distant Way**. He has looked sharp this term when winning the Listed Premio Natale di Roma in Rome Apr. 17 and Listed Premio Bereguardo over course and distance last time May 14. *Previews cont. p4*

PROPORTIONS OPTIONS The Niarchos Family's unbeaten G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winner **Divine Proportions** (Kingmambo) looks likely to make her next start in the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes (French Oaks) at Chantilly June 12. The superstar filly has garnered three Group 1 prizes to date and has the one-mile G1 Coronation S., at Royal Ascot at York June 17, as an alternative engagement to the 1 5/16-mile Classic. "Divine Proportions will most probably run next in the Prix de Diane at Chantilly," Racing Manager Alan Cooper revealed yesterday. "A final decision between this race and the Coronation S. will only be made next week."

JRHA CATALOGUES 315 FOALS FOR JULY The Japanese Racing Horse Association has catalogued 315 lots for the Select Foal Sale, which will be conducted July 11 and 12 at Northern Horse Park on Hokkaido, Japan. Recent graduates of the sale include this year's unbeaten Japanese Derby hero **Deep Impact (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence), 2004 Japanese Derby winner **King Kamehameha (Jpn)** (Kingmambo), 2004 Japanese Horse of the Year **Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence) and **Sundrop (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence), runner-up in last year's G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket. At last year's auction, Dance in the Dark (Jpn) took the baton from his deceased sire Sunday Silence by siring a record-priced foal, a ¥490,000,000 foal out of Air Groove (Jpn). That price is the highest ever for a foal in Japan and second worldwide only to Padua's Pride (Ire), who sold at Tattersalls in 1997 for 2.5-million guineas. A number of stallions proven on the international stage will be represented this July, including Belong to Me, Cape Cross (Ire), Dehere, Forty Niner, French Deputy, Fusaichi Pegasus, Giant's Causeway, Maria's Mon, Seeking the Gold, Singspiel (Ire), Silver Deputy, Smoke Glacken, Special Week (Jpn), Tale of the Cat and Wild Rush. There will also be foals from the first few crops of top international performers Alamshar (Ire), Empire Maker, Falbrav (Ire), Grandera (Ire), High Chaparral (Ire), Johannesburg, Kurofune, Moon Ballad (Ire), Street Cry (Ire), Symboli Kris S., Vindication and War Emblem. Catalogues will be available on-line at www.irha.or.jp from Friday, June 17. Printed catalogues will be available from June 24.

JOCKEY-CLUB PICTURE UNCLEAR Gestut Ammerland's impressive G2 Prix Hocquart winner **Hurricane Run (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) yesterday headed the 23 remaining entries in Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly, but the nature of the opposition is still uncertain. The unbeaten Andre Fabre-trained colt came through his final serious workout over a mile and a quarter of the *Les Aigles* gallop at Chantilly on Tuesday under regular exercise rider Pascal Bodin and is likely to start a warm order. Also in the mix is Ecurie Bader's G2 Prix Greffulhe winner **Vatori (Fr)** (Vettori {Ire}) and Robert Bousquet's G2 Prix Noailles scorer **Ruwi (GB)** (Unfuwain), but there are several doubts surrounding the foreign contingent. While Godolphin's **Dubawi (Ire)** (Dubai Millennium {GB}) looks likely to contest the Epsom Derby, the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) winner **Shamardal** (Giant's Causeway) is still engaged in that Classic as a precaution. Trainer Saeed bin Suroor reiterated the intention to send the latter to Chantilly, telling *Racing Post*, "Shamardal worked very well and he's in great form. He was really relaxed in his work over seven furlongs and, although he's still in at Epsom, the French Derby would be more likely. It's a new distance for him, but he has the class to finish the race well." The Royal Ascot Racing Club's G2 Dante S. hero **Motivator (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) has also been left in the Jockey-Club in case the ground at Epsom rides fast, but conditioner Michael Bell stated yesterday that it was "unlikely" that he would be sent to Chantilly. "I'm just about to leave to walk the track at Epsom and we're definitely keen to run," he said. "If the ground is not satisfactory he won't go there, as he has a big future. It's an unlikely scenario and the last resort is to go to France, but it is a possibility if the ground isn't right at Epsom."

Funny Cide Nominated to Brooklyn H., Manhattan H.:

A disappointing fourth in his 2005 comeback in the May 20 GI Pimlico Special H., **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) was yesterday nominated by trainer Barclay Tagg to the GI Brooklyn H. and the GI Manhattan H. Both races are on the Belmont S. undercard at Belmont Park June 11. Should he appear in the Manhattan, the 2003 Kentucky Derby winner would be making his grass debut. The race is carded for a mile and a quarter on the inner turf course. Funny Cide worked a half mile in :46 4/5 over Belmont's main track Monday.

Alex's Lemonade Stand at Belmont and Beyond:

Following the success of stands on Kentucky Derby day and Preakness S. day, a number of Alex's Lemonade Stands will be set up around the country for the third leg of the Triple Crown, the June 11 Belmont S. In conjunction with the Thoroughbred Racing Association, Alex's Lemonade Stand, the charity begun by Alexandra "Alex" Scott to help raise money to support childhood cancer research, will be represented at Belmont Park, Churchill, Pimlico, Finger Lakes, Delaware, Philadelphia, Penn National, the Meadowlands, and Monmouth Park. Other tracks that plan on having stands are Arlington, Hawthorne, Lone Star and Del Mar. Alexandra Scott succumbed to neuroblastoma last August at the age of eight, but the charity has lived on and has raised more than \$1.8 million for research and hospitals facilities. Effective June 1, the company now marks a sealed track with a superscript 's' immediately after the track condition. An all-weather track is indicated by a capital 'A' inside a diamond. A sealed track has been floated (packed down) and not subsequently harrowed, which reduces the amount of water a dry track will absorb while providing a safe and even racing surface on wet tracks. An all-weather track, popular in Europe, was installed on the Keeneland training track last September and is slated to be installed over Turfway Park's main oval later this year. "With sealed tracks becoming more common and all-weather surfaces gaining a foothold here in America, it is important that we provide the industry with this information," said Chuck Scaravilli, Equibase vice president, track and field.
