**REVERBERATE JOINS BELMONT FRAY**

**Reverberate** (Thunder Gulch) has officially joined the cast for Saturday's GI Belmont S. The chestnut colt, owned by Centennial Farms and trained by Sal Russo, was second behind Oratory in the May 28 GII Peter Pan S. He captured a 1 1/16-mile allowance at Belmont Park May 8. "Reverberate has shown improvement throughout his career and we feel his fine performance in the Peter Pan and the stamina in his pedigree warrants his participation," commented Centennial President Donald Little, Jr. Centennial Farms-owned Colonial Affair won the Belmont S. in 1993.

Meine Sorceress led a string of longshots to bag her first Japanese graded stakes success in Sunday's Aichi Hai at Chukyo. Breaking from the outside draw in the field of 18, the 32-1 shot came from off the pace to best 29-1 chance Cheerful Smile by a neck. Favored Meisho Oscar (Jpn) (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}) finished 12th. "She is a very good horse and very smart," said winning jockey Yukio Abe. "She traveled well and was very responsive." Never worse than fourth, the four-year-old kicked off her 2005 campaign with a third in a middle-class stakes race Mar. 20 before scoring most recently in the Murasakino Tokubetsu Apr. 30.

With the same owner, breeder and jockey as last weekend's G1 Japanese Derby hero Deep Impact (Jpn), Kane Hekili provided his connections with another group success here. The three-year-old was up the track in his debut over the turf last August and went to the sidelines for the winter. Put on the dirt in his seasonal debut, he captured a novice event Feb. 13 and picked up a victory in a lower-plate race two weeks later. Seventh when tried in the grassy G3 Mainichi Hai S. Mar. 26, he returned to the dirt--and the winner's circle--in the Tango S. last time Apr. 13. The crowd's pick raced prominently in a field of 16, gained command easily down the lane and edged away for the victory. "It was a good race," said winning jockey Yutake Take. "I pushed him into a forward position, and he was full of run turning for home." Kane Hekili will likely appear next in the July 13 G1 Japan Dirt Derby at Oi Racecourse.

Sadler's Wells' record-breaking reign as champion sire in Britain and Ireland now extends to an astonishing 13 years (and to 14 titles in the last 15 years). Not even the multi-talented Danehill was able to wrest the championship from his fellow Coolmore stallion, although he once failed by less than €10,000. But last weekend's Classics in Europe raised the intriguing prospect that Sadler's Wells' epoch may be about to end, with his crown fittingly passing to his son Montjeu.

With Montjeu's sons Motivator and Walk in the Park adding exactly €1 million to his bankroll for their terrific one-two in the Vodafone Derby, the nine-year-old stallion is now over €400,000 clear on the leading sires' list. Sadler's Wells holds a clear second place, thanks partly to his four-year-old sons Day Flight and Yeats, with the latter adding €145,000 to his sire's bankroll with his unchallenged victory in the G1 Coronation Cup.

Incidentally, Yeats represents the same Sadler's Wells--Top Ville cross which produced Montjeu, so he looks a ready-made addition to the Coolmore stallion team. It is going to be fascinating to see Yeats cross

swords with Motivator in the richest middle-distance races, which help decide the sires' championship. Further sparkle will be added to the mix if these potential stars clash with Hurricane Run. This son of Montjeu was arguably unlucky to be defeated for the first time in Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club, in which he didn't receive nearly as inspired a ride as Shamardal, the deserving winner. One thing is certain: Hurricane Run will improve further when he steps up to a mile and a half. If Montjeu does succeed in taking the sires' championship away from Sadler's Wells--and that won't be easy, as Sadler's Wells currently has more ammunition to draw on--there could be no more fitting replacement. Montjeu is, after all, still recognized as the best son of Sadler's Wells, having achieved an International Classification of 135 and a Timeform rating of 137 during a career which featured six Group 1 victories.

I am almost hoping that Montjeu will maintain his lead, so that Sadler's Wells will have sired a champion sire in Britain and Ireland to add to El Prado, the champion North American stallion of 2002 (and runner-up in 2003 and 2004). That would surely finally silence the critics who have insisted that Sadler's Wells is a disappointing sire of sires. **Cont. p4**

Of course, there have been some failures, but Montjeu and El Prado are by no means the only successful stallion sons of Sadler's Wells. The very much underrated In the Wings sired 10 percent stakes winners and over five percent group winners, including Singspiel (who featured over the weekend as the sire of the Group 1-winning Japanese horse Asakusa Den'en and the Grade II-winning American filly Three Degrees). Barathea has also proved an effective stallion in his price range, with two Group 1 winners last year.

In the Wings and Barathea--both Breeders' Cup winners--achieved International Classifications of 127 to put themselves among the nine highest-rated sons of Sadler's Wells, along with Montjeu. Three of the other six still haven't had a chance to prove themselves, these being the young dual Derby winners Galileo (129) and High Chaparral (127), who are also members of the Coolmore brigade, and the 2004 King George winner Doyen (127), who is still in training.

Sadler's Wells' top nine are completed by Old Vic (134), a sizeable disappointment as a flat sire, but doing very well with his jumpers; Opera House (129), sire of the Japanese Horse of the Year T. M. Opera O; and Northern Spur (129), the Breeders' Cup Turf winner who was ignored to such an extent in Kentucky that his chances of success were virtually negligible.

Northern Spur is by no means the only top-class son of Sadler's Wells who has been in the wrong place at the wrong time. Nor has he been the only son of Sadler's Wells to have been penalized by breeders for being a mile-and-a-half horse. The danger of ignoring this type of horse was amply demonstrated by In the Wings, whose fee fell as low as \$8,000 for part of his career. A triple mile-and-a-half Group 1 winner, In the Wings was out of a very good mare who won twice at around a mile and three-quarters, yet that didn't prevent him building up some highly impressive statistics. When Montjeu retired at the end of 2000, he certainly wasn't guaranteed to be entrusted with the very best mares. Although, like In the Wings, he had been unbeaten in two juvenile starts including a Listed race, he had gained seven of his nine subsequent successes over a mile and a half. He had clearly inherited a good measure of the stamina, which had helped his dam Floripedes shine at around 1 7/8 miles--roughly the distance of her win in the G3 Prix de Lutece and her second in the G1 Prix Royal Oak.

Another factor which could have gone against Montjeu was that he doesn't look anything like Sadler's Wells, probably having more in common with his broodmare sire Top Ville (a possible source of Montjeu's highly strung, tantrum-prone temperament, which was evident to a degree in several members of Montjeu's team of six runners in the Derby and Prix du Jockey-Club).

The Coolmore team clearly took these possible prejudices into account in setting Montjeu's opening fee at \$30,000, compared to the \$100,000 they were charging for Giant's Causeway (who completed a magnificent first-crop classic treble when Shamardal held off Hurricane Run). Montjeu's fee was also considerably less than Dubai Millennium's and only around \$5,000 more than that charged for the 2000 Guineas winner King's Best, a winner of only one group race.

Even so, Montjeu's managers felt it necessary to reduce his fee slightly in his second season, to \$27,500, because he was then in competition with Galileo. That reduction didn't stop his book falling from 139 mares in his first season to 113 in his second (with a consequence that his second crop numbers only around 75 two-year-olds, compared to the 115 foals in his first crop). By the time Montjeu's third season came around, breeders had had a chance to see his impressive first foals, which proved very popular at the sales, and demand for his services revived in his third and fourth seasons. **Cont. p5**

Then his first crop--headed by Motivator--produced 20 juvenile winners to cast Montjeu in a different light in the eyes of many breeders. This widespread success also helped boost Montjeu's fee--from €30,000 to €45,000--and you can be sure that there will be a more substantial rise now that this crop is proving such a rich source of stakes horses.

He may even attract some top-flight mares away from his ageing sire, now that he has sired Motivator from a Listed winner, Hurricane Run from a Listed-placed German mare and the UAE 2000 Guineas winner Stagelight from another Listed winner.

Motivator's dam, Out West, could hardly come from a better female line, even if her dam Chellingoua failed to win and her second dam Uncommitted won only one of her eight starts. Her fourth dam is the celebrated Lady Be Good, who numbers the top European milers Zilzal, Polish Precedent, Posse and Intikhab among her numerous high-class descendants.

Uncommitted played her part in maintaining the family's reputation, notably becoming the dam of the high-class Wavering Monarch. Two off Uncommitted's daughters bred stakes winners to Gone West, one producing the smart American sprinter Western Borders while the other, Chellingoua, produced Out West, a Listed winner over a mile at three.

Motivator's breeders, Deerfield Farm, received only 75,000gns for Motivator, from the bid of John Warren. However, the farm has a yearling full brother which should redress the balance.

**LAWMAKERS MOVE TO END HORSE SLAUGHTER**

Following a three-year effort, the House of Representatives will vote on a measure to prevent the slaughter of horses for human consumption in foreign markets. Approximately 65,000 American horses are killed each year in one of the three foreign-owned horse slaughter plants that operate in the United States. The flesh is then shipped overseas. A diverse coalition of equine industry professionals, humane groups and veterinarians support the amendment to the 2006 Agricultural Appropriations Bill, scheduled for consideration this week. "It is unconscionable that for decades, we have been using federal taxpayer dollars to support a practice that the American public is overwhelmingly opposed to," said New York Representative John Sweeney. "The amendment I'll introduce, along with my colleagues John Spratt (D-SC), Nick Rahall (D-WV) and Ed Whitfield (R-KY), will prohibit federal taxpayer dollars from being spent on facilitating the export of horsemeat from the United States for sale to countries abroad. We do not eat our horses in the United States and it makes good fiscal sense to prohibit any further waste of the American people's hard-earned money for an industry that offers absolutely no economic value to the United States. Even more importantly, it is our moral responsibility as a humane nation to protect our equine pets, companions and athletes from the cruelty of horse slaughter." Remarked Chris Heyde, policy analyst for the Society of Protective Animal Legislation, "The vast majority of Americans are appalled that our horses continue to suffer such horrible cruelty during both long grueling journeys to slaughter plants and at the plants themselves. Horses can be hauled without food, water, rest or medical care for over 24 hours. Often the easily frightened animals are not properly rendered unconscious, so many horses are fully aware and sensitive to pain while proceeding through the slaughter process."
