**NO FLASH IN THE PAN**

**Master of Disaster** (Dance Master), a \$600,000 OBSFEB purchase earlier this year, appears to be the overwhelming choice in today's GIII Flash S. at Belmont Park. He wasn't much of a secret in his debut at Delaware, winning by 13 1/4 lengths in :51 4/5 as the 2-5 pick May 10. The chestnut

earned a 97 Beyer Speed Figure for that effort, which equaled the track record for 4 1/2 furlongs. "His time is even more impressive when you take into account he debuted on a day when the track was very deep," trainer Steve Klesaris said. "Older horses were running six furlongs

in 1:15." Master of Disaster is coupled with **Speed of Sound** (Phone Trick), but Klesaris said he only entered the latter "as insurance" and will scratch. **Tompest** (Storm Cat) overcame a rough start to break his maiden by a nose at Keeneland Apr. 21. The Todd Pletcher trainee gains the services of Mike Smith. Kinsman Stable's **Beacon Shine** (Montbrook) reported home an 8 3/4-length victor in his Keeneland debut Apr. 24, then ran third behind Half Ours and Five Star Holding in the Juvenile S. at Churchill on Derby Day. With only two races under his belt, the \$200,000 OBSFEB graduate is the most experienced runner in the field.

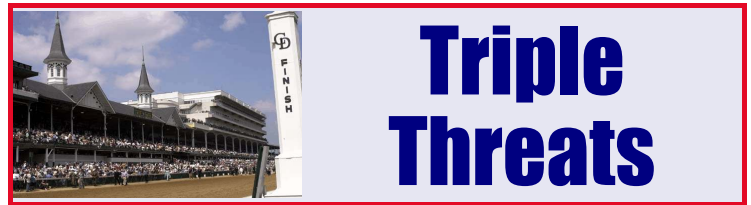

**Change of Scenery for Afleet Alex...**

**Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet), who had been stabled in Belmont's barn 14 since arriving in New York Sunday afternoon, was moved to barn 5 yesterday. Trainer Tim Ritchey did not specify the reason behind the move, but, according to published reports, it was prompted by the arrival of fellow Belmont starter **Nolan's Cat** (Catienus) in barn 14 Wednesday. That colt is trained by Dale Romans, who had five horses test positive for strangles in Florida in March. In a statement released yesterday, Ritchey said, "There are a number of reasons why I'd prefer him to be in barn 5. The barn provides a better situation for media access...Smarty Jones was stabled there last year and, from what I understand it worked very well. The bottom line is that, since barn 14 is no longer a security barn and he would have to be moved on race day anyhow, I thought it would be a better situation in barn 5." The morning-line favorite for Saturday's Belmont, Afleet Alex is now hitting the track just once a day, but the change in his training regiment was not a result of the current heat wave. "Keeping him relaxed and keeping his energy level up is key all the time, not just in the heat," Ritchey said.

**Derby Winner Gets Settled...**

Kentucky Derby winner **Giacomo** (Holy Bull), who shipped in from California Wednesday, has been bedded down with trainer Shug McGaughey's string in barn 20. "He's settled in great," trainer John Shirreffs said. "He galloped once around the main track this morning. We didn't take him through the paddock or anything--we didn't want him to get lost." Shirreffs added that he believes the gray will relish the mile and a half of the Belmont. "He doesn't have a real big engine behind--he doesn't have a big kick," he explained. "He's steady, which is why I think the farther he goes, the stronger he gets."

**PRADO GETS MOUNT ON LOST IN THE FOG**

Trainer Greg Gilchrist has enlisted the services of Edgar Prado for the undefeated **Lost in the Fog** (Lost Soldier) in Saturday's GII Riva Ridge S. The colt's regular rider Russell Baze broke his collarbone in a spill at Golden Gate Wednesday. "Naturally we'd like to have Russell for all obvious reasons," Gilchrist said. "I don't know Edgar personally, but his work speaks for itself." Baze is the only rider Lost in the Fog has ever seen in his six career starts, but Gilchrist doesn't think Prado should have any problems. "Edgar is no stranger to big races and this horse is pretty easy to ride," the trainer added. "With the two post, he'll probably have to send him away from the gate."

**SLAUGHTER BAN MOVES ONE STEP CLOSER**

The end of the practice of slaughtering horses, including retired race horses, for human consumption, moved closer to reality Wednesday. The United States House of Representatives voted 269-158 to pass an amendment to an appropriations bill which calls for the removal of federal funding for the three slaughterhouses currently operating in the U.S. Under the amendment, the slaughterhouses would no longer have government-paid workers, including inspectors, on site, which would force them to shut down. The legislation was the result of efforts by, among others, Rep. John Sweeney, a New York Republican from the district that includes Saratoga Springs. The bill will now go to the Senate, where Nevada Republican John Ensign, who is also a veterinarian, has been leading the fight to ban horse slaughter in this country. If the Senate approves the measure, it will become effective Oct. 1 and last for one year. During that period, anti-slaughter lawmakers will continue to work for passage of the American Horse Slaughter Prevention Act, which would permanently ban the slaughter of horses in the U.S. for human consumption. More than 65,000 horses were slaughtered in the U.S. in 2004, many of them retired Thoroughbreds. "I am not surprised by the outcome," said prominent Thoroughbred owner and breeder John Hettinger, who has been a leading figure in the anti-slaughter fight.

"I am surprised by the margin of victory--111 votes--which shows clearly that, despite the best efforts of the American Association of Equine Practitioners, the American Veterinary Medical Association, the American Quarter Horse Association and the Cattleman's Association, the will of the Congress is known and the will of the Congress reflects the will of the people on this dirty `convenience.' I believe groups espousing it will lose credibility at a rate they cannot even imagine." Said Wayne Pacelle, the president of the United States Humane Society, "This is the beginning of the end of horse slaughter for human consumption in the United States. We knew it had tremendous support. It was always just a question of getting a vote." The slaughter problem has received more attention in recent years, in part because of news reports that Hall of Fame horse Exceller and 1986 Kentucky Derby winner Ferdinand were slaughtered in overseas meat plants.

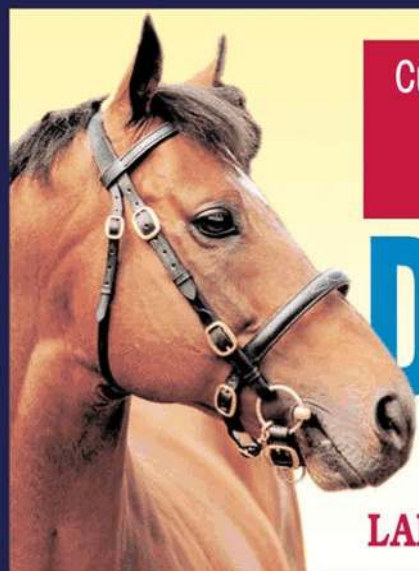

**Request for Parole (Judge T C)**, winner of last summer's GI United Nations S., makes his seasonal debut in a \$100,000 optional claimer at Belmont Park today. He was last seen finishing sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf last October. The six-year-old exited that race with a temperature that eventually turned into pneumonia. "We were lucky we didn't lose him," trainer Stan Hough told *Daily Racing Form*. "Since he's come back, we've taken our time with him. He seems to be doing fine."

Apprentice jockey Anna Rosie Napravnik won her first-ever start yesterday at Pimlico, booting home Ringofdiamonds in a \$7,500 claimer in the first race on the card. The 17-year-old Napravnik had worked as an exercise rider for conditioner Richard Small, who trains Ringofdiamonds, since early 2004. Napravnik was clearly elated after the victory. "That was so much fun!" she said. "Since I was about seven years old, I've dreamed of becoming a jockey. I started riding a 12-hand pony in pony races. To be riding here today is pretty major." Despite being her first race, Napravnik said she was able to keep her composure. "I don't get nervous. I rode this horse every day in the morning. This is what I came here for. "She went great," assistant trainer Scott Blasi said after the 1:14.40 work. "She couldn't have gone any better." Asmussen's Barn 38 is the only one that remains under quarantine after seven horses tested positive for the equine herpes virus. The seven horses were separated from the rest of Asmussen's stable and another round of blood scans was performed on all of the stable's horses Monday. The results are expected Friday and, if there are no further positive results, those horses will be allowed to return to racing and to train with the general horse population. Summerly was not entered for Saturday's GIII Dogwood Breeders' Cup S.

**Lord of the Game to Try Turf:**

**Lord of the Game** (Saint Ballado), most recently victorious in the GIII Hanshin Cup H., will try the turf in a \$14,000 starter allowance at Arlington Park today. Standing in the winner's enclosure after this year's Derby. It would have to be the ultimate dream for any groom.

**What circuit's fans are most knowledgeable?** I have always enjoyed talking to punters at The Curragh, as they ask the right questions.

**Most fascinating backstretch character you've met?** Sir Alex Ferguson, head coach of the world's greatest soccer team – Manchester United. I've always wanted to meet him and got to do so just a few weeks ago, when he autographed one of my Manchester United shirts.

**If you could have a conversation with one horse, who would it be, and what would you ask him?** Shergar, definitely. His (1981) Derby was the first I remember watching and I suppose I'd have to ask him where he's been all this time.

**Biggest accomplishment in racing?** Winning the Stable Lads' Boxing Championship twice. The second time was the last occasion the championships were held, so I guess I'm still the reigning champion. I was the underdog then, which made the win even better – even more so for those who bet on me.

**Who was your biggest racing idol growing up?** Steve Cauthen, a genius and a nice person too. At the moment I'd definitely pick another jockey, Kieren Fallon, who is a class above the rest.

**Who was your biggest idol growing up?** Muhammad Ali, the greatest sportsman ever.

**If you could have dinner with one historical figure, who would it be, and why?** Napoleon. I'd ask him why he didn't become a jockey rather than trying to conquer Europe.

**What would you be doing if you weren't in horse racing?** If it weren't racing, I'd have given boxing a shot. I could have been a contender.

**Patriot Act Eyes Comeback:**

**Patriot Act** (A.P. Indy), second behind Consolidator in last year's GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity, worked three furlongs Monday at Churchill in :38.80 in his first serious drill since suffering a knee injury earlier in the year. The dark bay colt ended his juvenile campaign with a disappointing fifth-place effort in an October maiden race at Churchill and was training at Fair Grounds towards his three-year-old debut and a possible tilt at the Kentucky Derby when he was injured. "He always had a little bit of a spur on his knee and it still seemed okay after he ran his dull race [at Churchill], but we had to give him some time," explained trainer Neil Howard. "The plan was to restart with him in New Orleans and hopefully he was going to be a three-year-old for the Classics. Then he was acting funny for a couple of days and we found that the spur had kind of broke." Patriot Act underwent surgery and, with the time to recover, Howard thinks the colt has a bright future. "I think he's a nice kind of horse and I think he's showed that," the conditioner said. "I always felt that he was a little light on constitution. He's filled out a little bit and he's carrying good weight now, so the time off helped him develop a little bit." Howard has no firm timetable for Patriot Act's return to the races.

**Randy Romero Galloping Horses at Churchill:**

Retired jockey Randy Romero, who has battled kidney and liver ailments in recent years, has returned to the saddle to gallop horses for trainer Dallas Stewart at Churchill Downs. "It feels good," the 47-year-old said of his return. "It helps you forget about all your problems." Romero said he would gallop horses for Stewart for the remainder of the Churchill meet and travel with the stable when it moves to Saratoga this summer.

**Fusaichi Samurai Returns Saturday:**

Fusao Sekiguchi's **Fusaichi Samurai** (Fusaichi Pegasus), the \$4.5 million two-year-old who became an early favorite for the Kentucky Derby with a rousing maiden victory in December, is set to return to the track Saturday. The Neil Drysdale trainee has been entered in the seventh race at Hollywood, a six-furlong sprint over the main track for three-year-olds and up. Fusaichi Samurai won his debut in wire-to-wire fashion at Hollywood Dec. 11, but was taken off the Triple Crown trail in late January after suffering a minor injury. He's been working steadily since early April, most recently breezing five panels in 1:00 flat at Hollywood June 5.

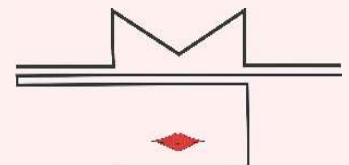

**NO PALACE FOR FOOTSTEPS**

Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's **Footstepsinthesand** (GB) (Giant's Causeway) was yesterday taken out of Tuesday's G1 St James's Palace S. at the Royal Ascot meeting at York. He has been on the sidelines since suffering a stone bruise after winning the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket Apr. 30 and will not make it to next week's mile contest, for which 13 stood their ground yesterday. Heading the list is Godolphin's Irish 2000 Guineas winner **Dubawi** (Ire) (Dubai Millennium {GB}), who will be making a quick return after chasing home Motivator (GB) in Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby. He is joined by the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) and G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) hero **Shamardal** (Giant's Causeway), although Racing Manager Simon Crisford told the *Racing Post* that Dubawi is the most likely representative. "It's quite likely that Dubawi will run, provided the ground is not too fast," he told the *Post*. "Shamardal has other options later in the season and is entered in the G1 Eclipse S. [at Sandown July 2] and G1 Sussex S. [at Goodwood July 27]."

**DUO ADDED TO QUEEN ANNE**

Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S. received a boost yesterday when Gestut Hony-Hof's G2 Prix du Muguet winner **Martillo** (Ger) (Anabaa) and His Highness the Aga Khan's G1 Prix d'Ispahan hero **Valixir** (Ire) (Tremolino) were supplemented at a cost of £20,000. They swelled the field for the mile contest to 18 at yesterday's five-day stage. Gary Tanaka's **Rakti** (GB) (Polish Precedent) will head to post a warm order after his stirring success in the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury May 14. "He's in good form and came out of the Lockinge in better shape than he's been after any race that he's run for me," trainer Michael Jarvis commented. The Elite Racing Club's multiple Group 1 scorer **Soviet Song** (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) has been left in the race, but connections are eyeing Wednesday's G2 Windsor Forest S. as an alternative for her eagerly awaited comeback. "She will have her first run of the season in either the Queen Anne or the Windsor Forest," the syndicate's Racing Manager Matthew Budden told *PA Sport*. "We may start her off in the Windsor Forest, as we will be looking for the easier of the two races. Although at Royal Ascot, it is never easy. She had a couple of little respiratory infections in the last two or three months. She's over these now and is coming to herself."

**RECORD FILLY AT NATIONAL SALE** The sale record price for a yearling was broken twice at yesterday's opening session of the Magic Millions National Sale on the Gold Coast. Heading the action was a filly by champion Giant's Causeway, who topped the sale with a final bid of A\$400,000. The filly, offered by Raheen Stud, attracted a bevy of bidders, but it was Sydney-based bloodstock agent James Bester who walked away with the well-bred youngster. The chestnut filly, catalogued as lot 154, is out of the multiple Group 1 winner Showella (NZ) (Lord Ballina {Aus}). "She's a quality filly," Bester commented after the winning bid. "She was a very good mover and she has an outstanding pedigree." Bester said the filly will remain in Australia. Lot 89, a daughter of Danehill out of Passing Hope (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), briefly held the sale record price when she brought a final bid of A\$320,000. Champion trainer Gai Waterhouse made the winning bid. "She's the nicest filly at the sale," Waterhouse said. "She carries herself like a real galloper. And I think she was pretty cheap at her price." The filly, consigned by Freemans Reach-based Reavill Farm, is one of four of the last group of Danehills to be sold at the sale and the last of her sire's yearlings to sell in the Southern Hemisphere. "This is one of the last chances to buy a yearling by Danehill," Waterhouse added. "Danehill has been the best sire in the Southern Hemisphere in the last 20 years." During yesterday's session, 127 horses sold for A\$3,496,750 and an average of A\$27,533. The average was up 64.9 percent from a year ago. The second session of the auction begins today at 11 a.m.
