CAN ANYONE MATCH ALEX?

The 137th running of the GI Belmont S. has been billed as the rubber match between GI Kentucky Derby winner **Giacomo** (Holy Bull) and GI Preakness hero **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet). But if Afleet Alex runs back to his race in the second leg of the Triple Crown, it will be no contest. The bay colt may have bounced a bit off his eight-length romp in the GI Arkansas Derby, and ended up third on the first Saturday in May, but he was on top of his game for the Preakness, turning that one-length defeat into a 9 3/4-length drubbing of the Derby victor despite nearly falling at the top of the stretch. Now it will be up to

26-year-old jockey Jeremy Rose to get the job done in his first Belmont appearance. He believes he is up to the challenge. "I think I've matured a lot as a rider," Rose said. "I learned a lot watching the last few Belmonts. You definitely have to make sure you have something left for the last part of the stretch run." Jockey Mike Smith has attempted the final jewel in the Crown nine times in the past, but has yet to reach the winner's circle. That fact doesn't worry Giacomo's trainer, John Shirreffs. "We feel very good about Mike riding the Belmont for us," Shirreffs said. "He obviously knows the track very well and he's the only jockey who has ever ridden Giacomo." Giacomo and Smith have also gotten a vote of confidence from jockey Stewart Elliott, who had the lead at midstretch with Smarty Jones last year, only to run out of gas in the final sixteenth and finish second to 36-1 Birdstone. "It would be nice to see Afleet Alex win it, but I think Mike Smith's horse has a big chance," Elliott said. "I think the mile and a half will really suit him."

DIVINE FACES NINE

The Niarchos Family's unbeaten **Divine Proportions** (Kingmambo) will face nine rivals as she seeks her eighth career success in tomorrow's G1 Prix de Diane (French Oaks) at Chantilly. Last year's G1 Prix Morny and G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner, who recorded an impressive five-length success in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) last time May 15, will be racing beyond a mile for the first time. She pleased connections in her final serious workout on Wednesday and Racing Manager Alan Cooper told *PA Sport*, "She is in very good form and pleased [trainer] Pascal [Bary] very much." Cooper added that the Jonathan Pease-trained **Sapas** (Kingmambo) would act as a pacemaker. **Field, p6**

MOTIVATOR ECLIPSE-BOUND

The Royal Ascot Racing Club's G1 Epsom Derby hero **Motivator (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) will be aimed at the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 2. Connections had originally earmarked the G1 Irish Derby June 26, but the unbeaten colt will drop back to 10 furlongs to take on older horses. "We had a think about it all and the Eclipse is a great race," the syndicate's racing manager Harry Herbert said. "It gives him an extra week to recover from his exertions in the Derby. He's an unusual Derby winner with the amount of speed he has, so we've decided to put him in against the older horses and hope he maintains his unbeaten run. With a horse as special as this, we have to be bold and it's right to have a go at making a bit of history."

SEEKING THE PEARL DIES

Seeking the Pearl (Seeking the Gold--Page Proof, by Seattle Slew), a champion in France and winner of over \$4 million, died yesterday at Lane's End Farm near Midway, Kentucky. The cause of her death is as yet undetermined, pending the results of an autopsy. According to Lane's End farm manager Mike Cline, there were storms in the area Thursday night, but he did not think the weather played a role in her passing. **Cont. p7**

A Winning Tradition...

An allowance winner at Belmont May 8 and second in the GII Peter Pan S. May 28, **Reverberate** (Thunder Gulch) makes his third start in 34 days. "It's a lot to ask," Sal Russo admitted, but the trainer is no stranger to success in the Belmont. Russo was assistant to Hall of Famer Scotty Schulhofer when Schulhofer saddled Colonial Affair to win the 1993 Belmont, and was jockey Jose Santos's agent when he guided the Schulhofer-trained Lemon Drop Kid to victory in the race in 1999. Lemon Drop Kid was the last colt to use the Peter Pan as a stepping stone to victory in the "Test of the Champion."

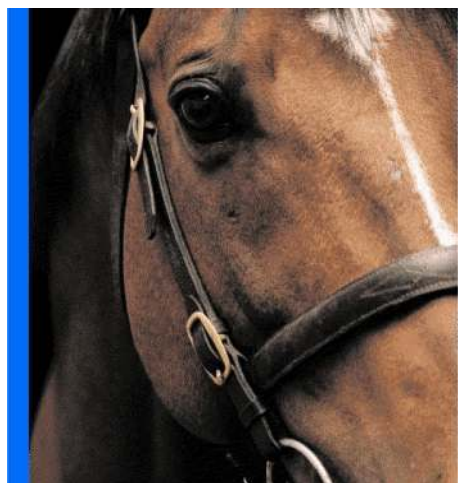
All Indy Family...

A.P. Indy (Seattle Slew), the winner of the Belmont in 1992, has two chances to notch his first score as a sire. **A.P. Arrow** (A.P. Indy) comes from the barn of trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who already has four Belmont trophies to his credit. He went gate to wire to break his maiden last time out. **Indy Storm** (A.P. Indy), who is handled by 2004 Belmont-winning trainer Nick Zito, comes off a Pimlico allowance tally on the Preakness undercard. Then there is **Chekhov** (Pulpit), a grandson of A.P. Indy who crushed a field of maidens at Belmont May 8, but was dusted when fourth as the 3-2 chalk in the Peter Pan. He has the services of Gary Stevens, who has won the Belmont three times.

Red Fort, who won a Listed stakes by eight lengths at Royal Ascot last year, ended his European stint with a second against conditions foes at Doncaster in September. The bay made his U.S. bow on St. Patrick's Day, beating Castledale (Ire) a head in an optional claimer on the turf at Santa Anita, and missed by a nose when second to King of Happiness in the Apr. 30 GIII Inglewood H. last time out. He is trained by Neil Drysdale, who served as assistant to Charlie Whittingham from 1970-74 and has already won this race five times. Drysdale also sends out **Sarafan**, who ended his 2004 campaign with seconds to the ill-fated Star Over the Bay in the Aug. 29 GII Del Mar H. and Oct. 3 GI Clement L. Hirsch H. The eight-year-old was runner-up again in his 2005 debut, an allowance at Santa Anita Mar. 27. In his lone start since, he tired to be seventh in the 12-furlong GIII Jim Murray Memorial H. May 14. Trainer Laura De Seroux, who worked as an exercise rider for Whittingham from 1975-89, saddles **Just Wonder**. The British-bred was third, beaten just 3/4 of a length, in the Grade I event last year. He went to the shelf after running eighth in the July 25 GI Eddie Read H. and was fifth in his return, a Santa Anita allowance Mar. 27, but improved to be third in the Inglewood. "He's doing good and a mile and a quarter is his best distance," De Seroux said.

Artie Schiller is a stellar four for five over the Belmont turf course, including victories in last year's GIII Hill Prince S. and the GII Jamaica H. Twelfth as the favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile in October, the bay returned to action with an impressive score in Keeneland's GII Maker's Mark Mile Apr. 15, but most recently lost a photo in the GII Dixie S. at Pimlico May 15. He spots his rivals anywhere from three to 10 pounds and must prove that he can be effective at today's distance. **Meteor Storm** won this at odds of 6-1 last year, but figures a shorter price this afternoon. Perfect in two tries at 10 furlongs, the California invader has had an ideal lead-up to this race and comes in off a runner-up finish behind **America Alive** in the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic on the Derby undercard May 7. **Relaxed Gesture**, twice Group 2-placed in Ireland, has taken a pair of allowance tests since being permanently relocated to this country, including a May 14 course-and-distance event where he lunged through the gate at the start.

The regally bred **Intercontinental** is set to defend her title against a salty field. An Eclipse Award finalist in 2004, when she finished the year with a win in the GI Matriarch S., the headstrong bay has sportingly been kept in training at five. She tugged her way to victory in the GIII Jenny Wiley S. at Keeneland Apr. 18--a race she also won last year--and will get an opportunity to hear her feet rattle over this course. Facing her are a pair of six-year-old mares who won Grade 1s last year, **Wonder Again** and **Riskaverse**. They have not raced since the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf Oct. 30, when Wonder Again ran a close third to champion Ouija Board (GB) while Riskaverse checked in eighth.

Somewhat unusually, this field features several runners who do their best work on the front end, including the graded-stakes winning duo of **Sand Springs** and **Changing World**. Sand Springs led every step of the GIII Honey Fox H. at Gulfstream Mar. 13 and settled for second in the GIII Distaff Turf Mile at Churchill on Derby Day. Changing World, the wire-to-wire winner of the GIII Violet H. last year, got swallowed up late when fifth--beaten 2 1/4 lengths--in the GIII Gallorette H. at Pimlico three weeks ago. **Asti** showed good form in France last year, finishing a neck second in the G1 Prix Saint-Alary and a close fourth in the G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein. The Irish-bred has come up short in three starts on these shores, most recently running third with first-time Lasix in the Voodoo Dancer S. over course and distance May 12.

The hard-hitting **Limehouse** makes his first start at Belmont in an attempt to achieve millionaire status. A length second to Badge of Silver in the GII New Orleans H. Mar. 12, the chestnut lost all chance with a poor start in the GII Oaklawn H. Apr. 9 and wound up fifth. He rebounded with a win in the Alysheba H. at Churchill May 6 and should give a good account of himself here. **Funny Cide** loomed boldly on the far turn in the GI Pimlico Special May 20 before flattening to be fourth in his first start since October. The chestnut owns four wins from seven trips to the post at Belmont, but could prove vulnerable if the summery weather continues.

As for his own charge, Mott said, "He's bred to be rapid, he's built that way and he is. He is a fun horse." Rey de Cafe proved best in his third-straight blanket finish. A stakes winner on the turf last year, the chestnut tried dirt in the Aventura S. Jan. 8, only to finish fifth to High Fly, and has been campaigned exclusively on grass since. He finished a neck back in third in the GIII Transylvania S. at Keeneland Apr. 8, but rebounded to take the GIII Crown Royal

American Turf S. by a nose at Churchill May 6. Breaking from the rail here, the favorite saved ground under Javier Castellano while several lengths off a soft pace. Rey de Cafe was full of run turning for home, but had nowhere to go. He angled outside of Classic Campaign in the stretch only to be joined by Prince Rahy on his right flank, and the trio hit the wire together after exchanging bumps in the final yards. "I think [Castellano] claimed foul when he pulled up because he didn't know he had won," explained winning trainer Rusty Arnold. SEEKING THE PEARL DIES, cont. "At first, I would have guessed that it was lightning, but, while it stormed, we didn't really have any [lightning]," Mike Cline explained. "Also, when we found her, she looked like she had been dead for maybe a couple of hours." Cline added that there were no signs of physical injury. Seeking the Pearl was bred in Virginia by Lazy Lane Farm, but was purchased to race in Japan, where she won seven of 16 starts, including six black-type events. Sent to Europe in the summer of 1998, she bested Jim and Tonic (Fr) in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest and was named highweight older mare at sprint distances. Acquired by Jayeff 'B' Stables at the tail end of her racing career, Seeking the Pearl produced Seeking the Dia to the cover of Storm Cat in 2001. The colt was also sent to race in Japan, where he won three stakes and earned nearly \$2 million. Seeking the Pearl is also the dam of Dive, an unraced three-year-old filly by Storm Cat, and Seeknfind, a two-year-old daughter of Giant's Causeway. Barren in 2004, the mare slipped in 2005 and was reportedly in foal to Giant's Causeway.

FINAL 2005 FRESHMEN SIRE BREEZEFIGS RANKINGS

By Robert D. Fierro, DataTrack International

This year, *TDN* asked us to provide a series of articles previewing how the progeny of freshmen sires of 2005 fared at the breeze shows of major two-year-old sales, according to DataTrack's BreezeFigs calculations. This invitation was based on a five-year study that found horses that score in our top BreezeFigs groups represent close to 80 percent of all eventual black-type earners who come out of those sales. What's more, over 50 percent of them break their maidens in their first two career starts.

Thus charged, we came up with BreezeFig Freshman Sire Index (BFSI) for each sire at each sale. This is a weighted average of the factors that go into the ultimate BreezeFig earned by each horse by each sire (see explanation of BreezeFigs at end of article). However, because the articles were published before the horses went through the ring, we didn't provide any numbers, just a ranking of which sires scores best at each sale, and why.

In this wrap-up, we have taken stock of seven major sales and come up with a cumulative BFSI average for each stallion that had a total of at least five two-year-olds breeze at all the sales combined. We're looking for stallions that breeders and pinhookers might look at more closely because of their potential to get runners fast enough to show well at sales, as well as those likely to mature early enough to provide owner-breeders a quicker return at the track. A glance at the list might surprise some observers because a few lower-ranked stallions scored very well in the sales ring. That's somewhat logical, because several got horses who consistently showed they wanted a little more time to mature, and probably a distance of ground, and our calculations are more geared toward evaluating the potential to come out early and be versatile.

We back this up with results: Of the six horses that finished 1-2-3-4 in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness, one (Giacomo) was a homebred, and one, Sun King, was a weanling purchase. The other four--Afleet Alex, Closing Argument, Don't Get Mad and Scrappy T--were among the top-rated BreezeFigs horses at the two-year-old sales at which they sold. The first three broke their maidens in their debuts and Scrappy T won his second start. They had speed and showed signs of versatility at the sales, they won early, and they went two turns in Classic races.

In addition, the record of horses that were in the sales in 2005 is just as good. For example, there have been five maiden races at Belmont or Aqueduct through June 5 in which at least one top-rated BreezeFigs horse made its debut; all five were won by one of those horses. The record at Calder is eight-for-16.

We are not projecting our personal opinions on this list as to which stallions--we think will lead the crop in earnings and winners we did that last month in *TDN*. Please note that the number of "breezes" may exceed the number of horses by each sire that went through all these sales. That's because we take the best breeze by each juvenile at each distance, even if it breezes twice at two separate distances, or on both dirt and turf. If it breezed twice at the same distance, we used only the best number for that horse. That said, here's a few notes about the way these horses stacked up.

If you look at the list closely, you will see that the indices fall into several general ranges. Rather than get specific about each horse in these ranges, we'll give you some overall impressions that seem to point out things in common.

The three highest scorers all were very fast on the track and their two-year-olds were very consistent in terms of overall balance of speed and the ability to follow through (which we call "thrust") at all the sales. Put it Back and Delaware Township, speedballs on the track, both came out with all guns blazing--virtually all of them scored over par on our figs at each sale. Freud, a modest runner, was a big surprise with a versatile bunch whose quality impressed across the board. He'll have a bright future in New York unless he is sold to Kentucky or overseas.

Vision and Verse splits the above group from the rest of those above a BFSI of 1.00. His babies were sprinkled throughout the sales, so they never really made a singular impression on many. However, cumulatively he looks like he might have something going for him, and was one of the better scoring horses whose racing career was more Classic oriented.

Then comes the bada-boom crowd--eight whose progeny all showed excellent speed and follow-through at virtually every sale, four above and four just below the BFSI 1.00 mark. You could probably get "one or two from Column A and one or two from Column B" and have a nice rounded stable. What separated the progeny of Five Star Day, El Corredor, Exchange Rate and Trippi at these sales was probably a buyer's preference for the "type" of horse thrown by each sire.

They were all quite uniform in pointing out who daddy was when they were pulled out of the shedrows.

The other four showed just a bit more versatility throughout, though with Rock and Roll there really wasn't a very large sample to comb through. On the other hand, judging by the buzz generated early by the kids by Forest Camp and Songandaprayer, and as the sales went on by those by Broken Vow, you could say that this trio had a bit more than brilliance on the hoof.

The next five had mixed results, but if you're looking for horses at different class levels that may represent a solid bet, there are one or two likely to emerge because the breed is often shaped more by the average than the extreme example. In that case, you might want to say that Monarchos and Ecton Park did not underachieve given their racing records, and that Flame Thrower and Snuck In might be useful depending on the quality they can bring to their books of mates. City Zip should do well for the next couple of years on a regional basis, as should Prime Timber, who heads up the rest of the group.

As for those left, except perhaps for Minardi and Brahms, neither of whom had any large contingent in any sale, the obvious verdict is that for the most part, Classic horses and very good handicappers often do better on the bid-board and as sires of horses whose best runners (and they will be good) might need the kind of patience that distinguishes those whose investment strategies are geared more toward T-bills rather than IPOs.

Keep your own scorecard. See you next year.

The sales covered are OBS Calder, Fasig-Tipton Calder, Barretts March, OBS March, Keeneland April, OBS April and Fasig-Tipton Midlantic.

BreezeFigs were developed by Bob Fierro and Jay Kilgore to bring objective analysis to Breeze Shows at two-year-olds in training sales. We use digital video to distill data about speed, stride and thrust (the ability to sustain power over racing distances). In our research, these and other factors separate horses that might look fast from those that are likely to be faster once they get to the races. Each horse's BreezeFig is compared to a "par" figure for each sex at each distance at each sale. Horses with BreezeFigs above par generally compete more successfully when they get to the races. Daily Racing Form will be offering an on-line BreezeFig handicapping tool soon.

Thoro-Graph Race of the Week

As we look at the Belmont, it is worthy of note that only two horses will end up having run in all three legs of the Triple Crown. As we discussed before the Met Mile, horses today are much faster. This means they are harder on themselves, and the three races are simply too close together, and take too great a toll. Good horsemen are smart enough not to sacrifice their runners' futures unless they have a very likely winner, which in general defeats the whole purpose of having the Triple Crown as a series that is definitive, and specifically favors those that skip one leg, as Empire Maker and Birdstone did. Most importantly, attrition for those that do run three times in five weeks is costing the game its stars. We have an industry whose motto is 'if it's broken, don't fix it anyway,' but the time has come for some common sense.

The last two times he ran tops, he bounced at least 4 points, and now he comes back after the best race of his life, which included a rodeo act that may have taken something out of him. This will also be his sixth start in 14 weeks, and he tries a distance he may or may not like. He is the best horse, but vulnerable.

A classic late developer that caught the dead rail on Derby day, and jumped forward last time out. But that still leaves him well short of competitive here, and another immediate jump is unlikely.

If he gets back to his top, he has a chance to get a check, but the Thoro-Pattern puts his chances of running well at only 40% or so, and the quick turnaround probably won't help. It's interesting to note that he hasn't been running on Lasix.

He captured the Elusive Quality H. over this course in October and finished the year with a fourth in the GII Knickerbocker H. Oct. 30. Fifth in the GIII Fort Marcy H. to start this season Apr. 23, the chestnut was caught late in a nine-furlong allowance May 13 and was the second choice in this competitive field. L'Oiseau d'Argent quickly opened up a lengthy advantage and was never threatened by his rivals, coasting home to win by an impressive 5 1/4 lengths.

MORE MAGIC AT GOLD COAST It was deja vu all over again at the Magic Millions National Sale on the Gold Coast, as a new record price for a yearling was established twice, for the second day in a row. A colt by Danehill briefly held the record at A\$450,000, but was topped immediately by the following lot when a filly by Redoute's Choice (Aus) was knocked down for A\$480,000. Veterinarian John Crowley signed the ticket on behalf of Sydney-based businessman Ron Crogan on the topper. She is the third foal from the Group winning Made of Gold mare Gilded Angel (Aus). "Ron liked the pedigree and was really keen on buying her, but he thought he may be able to get her closer to \$300,000," Crowley said. "But I guess in the end he was just really keen on buying her and not surprisingly there was a lot of bidding on her from around the ring." Trainer John Moloney purchased the Danehill colt out of Geordoba (SAf) on behalf of John Shannon. He represents the last Danehill yearling to be sold in the southern hemisphere. "He's a cracking colt," Moloney said. "Very well put together. And he's the last Danehill to be sold as a yearling in Australia and we're pretty happy to have bought him." A total of 262 yearlings netted over A\$7.2 million in the two-day sale, a 130-percent increase from last year's A\$3.2-million gross. The first of two sessions of the Magic Millions Weanling Sale begins today at 11 a.m. and resumes Tuesday.
