POLISH PRECEDENT DEAD

Darley stallion **Polish Precedent** (Danzig--Past Example, by Buckpasser) died after suffering complications from colic surgery Tuesday night. Named the champion miler in France in 1989 for owner Sheikh Mohammed and trainer Andre Fabre, the bay won seven of his nine career starts, including the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois. He retired after his three-year-old season and stood his entire stud career at Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket. The 19-year-old stallion sired 23 stakes

winner, including six-time Group 1 winner Pilsudski (Ire), who captured the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf, G1 Japan Cup, G1 Irish Champion S. and G1 Dubai Champion S.; six-time Group 1 victor Rakti (GB); G1 Irish Oaks and G1 Yorkshire Oaks heroine Pure Grain (GB); and G1 Dubai Sheema Classic winner Polish Summer (GB). "Polish Precedent has been an excellent flagbearer for Darley and everyone at the stud is deeply saddened by his loss," said a statement released by Darley.

GIACOMO DOING WELL AFTER SURGERY

Mr. and Mrs. Jerome Moss's Kentucky Derby hero **Giacomo** (Holy Bull) came out of his surgery Tuesday in good order and is expected to make a complete recovery, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Plans call for the grey to return to the races in 2006. Chips were removed from his left front ankle and his right knee. "It was a pretty average or normal chip, very typical," Dr. Jeff Blea told *DRF* about the ankle chip. "From my experience and what we saw, I expect him to come back as good, if not better. The injury won't have any ill effects on his performance. I think it will make him a better athlete. We'll recommend 90 days off, which is conservative." Blea termed the knee chip "insignificant." The three-year-old will begin a walking program after a few days of stall rest. "We'll add a few minutes of walking a day and gradually build it up," trainer John Shirreffs added. "You want to get the joint moving pretty soon."

AMERICAN OAKS TAKING SHAPE

An international field of 14 fillies has been extended invitations for the \$750,000 G1 American Oaks, which will be contested at Hollywood Park July 3. The list includes Japanese Oaks winner **Cesario (Jpn)** (Special Week {Jpn}), as well as G2 Premio Regina Elena victress **Silver Cup (Ire)** (Almutawakel {GB}). Expected to spearhead the U.S. team is the unbeaten **Melhor Ainda** (Pulpit), along with GII Honeymoon Breeders' Cup H. heroine **Three Degrees (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}). Other invitees include **Karen's Cap** (War Chant) from England; the Irish-based pair of **Luas Line (Ire)** (Danehill) and **Silk and Scarlet (GB)** (Sadler's Wells); Honeymoon second and third **Thatswhatimean** (Belong to Me) and **Isla Cozzene** (Cozzene); **Laurafina** (Cozzene), runner-up to Melhor Ainda in the GIII Sands Point S.; G1 Hollywood Starlet winner **Splendid Blended** (Unbridled's Song); the Grade I-placed **Memorette** (Memo {Chi}); and **Grat** (A.P. Indy), a recent allowance winner at Churchill Downs.

RAPID PLAY DQ'D FROM MUNIZ WIN

The Louisiana State Racing Commission unanimously voted Monday to disqualify **Rapid Proof** (Fast Play) from his victory in the Mar. 19 \$500,000 GII Mervin Muniz Memorial H. due to a positive post-race drug test, according to *The Times-Picayune*. The five-year-old gelding, who won by a head at 31-1, tested positive for the anti-inflammatory steroid desamethasone. Trainer Hal Wiggins has been fined \$1,000. The winner's purse of \$300,000 will now be awarded to runner-up **A to the Z** (Benchmark). **America Alive** (American Chance) will be awarded the \$100,000 second-place check and **Honor in War** (Lord At War {Arg}) the \$55,000 check for third.

FALMOUTH COULD BE CLASH OF AGES Last year's renewal of the G1 Falmouth S., when **Soviet Song (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) took the unbeaten record of **Attraction (GB)** (Efisio {GB}), was a feast to behold, and a stronger cast is almost in place to provide similar fare this year. The one-mile event, held appropriately on Ladies' Day at Newmarket July 5, has attracted last year's principals as well as a host of Group 1 winners for a total entry of 24. English G1 1000 Guineas winner **Virginia Waters** (Kingmambo) may also be joined by **Airwave (GB)** (Air Express {Ire}), **Alexander Goldrun (Ire)** (Gold Away {Ire}) and **Damson (Ire)** (Entrepreneur {GB}), and the Classic-placed trio of **Vista Bella (GB)** (Diktat {GB}), **Penkenna Princess (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}) and **Luas Line (Ire)** (Danehill). However, Attraction has yet to be confirmed a definite starter after meeting with a slight setback last weekend. "She was due to canter on Sunday, but her shoe slipped off and that has bruised her foot a little bit," trainer's wife Deirdre Johnston told *PA Sport*. "We were pretty much on track, but this has knocked us back a little bit. Hopefully it will only be a day or two. All being well, we will still head to the Falmouth, but it all depends how long she takes to recover." Latecomers for the £200,000 contest can be entered at the £15,000 supplementary entry stage June 30.

IRON MAIDEN ON MEND Martin Schwartz's **Maids Causeway (Ire)** (Giant's Causeway) is making continued progress from the injuries suffered during her brave victory in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot at York last week. Immediate plans remain on hold as she recovers from a pulled hip muscle and a foot injury caused by a loose shoe. "The clip on her [near hind] shoe came loose and cut into her," trainer's son Charlie Hills told *PA Sport*, adding, "The foot is in the process of healing, and there is a lot of pus coming out. It's in a poultice and, all being well, the infection will clear up by the weekend. After that we will be able to more accurately assess her condition, although with any luck at all she will be able to carry on racing and go for races like the Champion S. and Breeders' Cup."

☆ LETTER TO THE EDITOR ☆

"Kentucky is represented by two horsemen's organizations. The KHBPA which claims as members any state licensee, whether philosophically aligned or not; and the KTA/KTOB which represents 1,000 dues-paying members. The KHBPA's recent reports concerning Kentucky's position on uniform medication rules does not represent the broader view of most Kentucky horsemen. The KTA/KTOB membership, as well as a large group of unaligned horsemen, reject the KHBPA's negative position for change in Kentucky. The KTA/KTOB continues to support the efforts of the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC). Our position has not changed and is even stronger given the professional manner with which the RMTC conducts its business. Our desire to effect change in Kentucky's rules and our further desire to seek consensus on emerging proposals, based on scientific data, clearly differs from Kentucky's current policy. The KTA/KTOB strongly believes these changes to be in the best interest of our horses and the integrity of racing in Kentucky. The proposal from the RMTC is not only about medication and testing. It also addresses backside security, penalties, as well as research on therapeutic and other medications. Kentucky's racing is only as good as its integrity."

RARE GIFT RETIRED *Rare Gift* (Unbridled's Song--Rare Blend, by Bates Motel), winner of the 2004 GIII Ladies' H. at Aqueduct, has been retired from racing after suffering an injury during her third-place finish in the GII Fleur de Lis H. last Saturday. The four-year-old filly, trained by John Kimmel for George Bolton, David di Pietro and Roger Honour, will be retired to Lane's End Farm and plans call for her to be bred to leading sire

A.P. Indy in 2006. Victorious in her lone start at two, *Rare Gift* was third in the GII Bonnie Miss S. and the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. and runner-up in the GIII Anne Arundel S. prior to her Aqueduct success. In five starts this season, the gray was third in the GIII Next Move H. and second in the GIII Sixty Sails H. before her Churchill Downs effort. *Rare Gift*, a Lane's End sales graduate, retires with a career record of 14-3-2-7 and earnings of \$292,078.

TAYLOR'S SPECIAL TO RETIREMENT HOME

Millionaire *Taylor's Special* (Hawkin's Special), who numbered the GI Blue Grass S. and GII Louisiana Derby among his 13 stakes wins, arrived at the Old Friends retirement facility June 15, the *Daily Racing Form* reports. The 24-year-old stallion was found abandoned on a farm in Washington last September. He had been standing at stud in Alberta, Canada, but his last registered foal crop was from 2002 and consists of five unraced three-year-olds. According to *DRF*, the bay was residing on a farm owned by an elderly couple, but the couple passed away and a caretaker left *Taylor's Special* unattended in a field, where he apparently survived for six weeks before someone called the rescue group Hope for Horses. His identity was discovered after his tattoo number was traced. From 14 crops to race, he sired 105 winners and two stakes winners. His progeny have earned \$3,179,483.

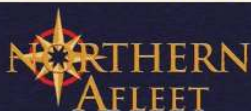
