**ELVSTROEM RETIRED**

**Elvstroem (Aus)** (Danehill--Circles of Gold {Aus}, by Marscay {Aus}) has been retired from racing and will take up stud duty at Blue Gum Stud in Euroa, Victoria, Australia. The bay will stand for A\$38,500. The four-year-old recorded four victories at the highest level in his native Australia: the 2003 G1 Victoria Derby; the G1 Underwood S. and G1 Caulfield Cup last year; and the G1 C.F. Orr S. earlier this season. Elvstroem took his show on the road this past March, when he won the G1 Dubai Duty Free at Nad al Sheba before finishing in the money in two of four subsequent starts in Europe, including a second-place finish in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan May 22. Elvstroem, who finished fourth in his most recent start in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud June 26, retires with 10 wins from 32 starts and earnings of \$4,231,468.

**LIMEHOUSE TO HOLLYWOOD GOLD CUP**

Dogwood Stable's **Limehouse** (Grand Slam) will bypass Saturday's G1 Suburban H. at Belmont Park in favor of the 10-furlong G1 Hollywood Gold Cup July 9. "[Trainer] Todd Pletcher and I felt it was a close call between the Hollywood Gold Cup and the Suburban H. in New York Saturday," said Dogwood President Cot Campbell. "However, Limehouse could use the extra week." Limehouse, winner of the GII Brooklyn H. June 11, finished fourth in his only other start at 10 furlongs, and that was in the 2004 Kentucky Derby won by Smarty Jones. The four-year-old, who is expected to ship to California the middle of next week, will be ridden by John Velazquez.

The victory of Smuggler in this weekend's GI Mother Goose S. was a reminder of the magnitude of the loss suffered by the breeding industry when Smuggler's sire Unbridled died at the early age of 14.

Three-year-old Smuggler is a member of the last crop of foals sired by Unbridled, and so far is the only one of Unbridled's foals of 2002 to win a stakes event. That, in a way, is something of a microcosm of Unbridled's stud career. He was never the most prolific sire of stakes winners--although his score of 43 black-type winners for 582 foals (seven percent) is more than respectable by current standards--but what made him a standout was the quality of his best performers, as no less 12 of those 43 (27 percent) were Grade I winners.

Unbridled's chances of continuing his branch of the Fappiano line has also met with some hiccups. His champion two-year-old son Anees died before his first offspring even reached the track, and his GI Travers S. winner Unshaded was a gelding.

However, he has left a legitimate heir in the shape of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile victor Unbridled's Song and he has another Grade I-siring son in his Kentucky Derby winner Grindstone (responsible for the 2004 GI Belmont S. hero Birdstone). There are also several notable Unbridled sons who have yet to have runners. The GI Preakness S. winner Red Bullet (out of a Caro mare, and bred on the same cross as Unbridled's Song) has first yearlings in 2005; GI Belmont S. winner Empire Maker's first foals arrived this spring; and this year's GI Pimlico Special hero Eddington will retire to stud for 2006. We can also note other graded-stakes winning Unbridled sons Malabar Gold (a close relative to Unbridled's Song, who has first yearlings 2005); Broken Vow (first runners 2005); Saarland (first foals 2006); and Wheelaway (first yearlings in 2005), as well as Navesink River and Mustanfar, who are both still at the track.

As for Smuggler, we can note that she joins a string of outstanding Unbridled daughters, which includes champion three-year-old filly Banshee Breeze; champion two-year-old filly Halfbridled; Manistique and Exogenous.

The distaff side of Smuggler's pedigree is equally impressive, although she has already outperformed her dam Inside Information on one score, winning the GI Mother Goose, a race in which Inside Information could only finish third. Still, Smuggler has a way to go to match Inside Information's overall record. Winner of the GI Acorn, GI Ashland and GII Bonnie Miss S. at three, Inside Information was even better at four when she captured the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, GI Spinster S., GI Ruffian H., GI Shuvee H., GII Molly Pitcher H. and GIII Monmouth Park Breeders' Cup H., and earned honors as champion older mare. Overall, she boasted a record of 14 wins, one second and two thirds in 17 starts, for earnings of \$1,641,805. **Cont. p4**

Inside Information is half sister to another very accomplished filly in Educated Risk (by Unbridled's grand-sire Mr. Prospector), whose victories included the GI Frizette S. and GI Top Flight H. Diamond, a brother to Educated Risk, was a minor stakes winner and is now a sire in Maryland, where his first crop includes Silmaril, who earlier this year defeated champion Ashado in the GIII Pimlico Breeders' Cup Distaff H.

Hidden Reserve, a multiple graded-stakes placed sister to Educated Risk and Diamond, is the dam of last year's GIII Laurel Futurity victor Defer, a stable companion to Smuggler.

There are more notable fillies in the next generation of this pedigree as Smuggler's dam, the Key to the Mint mare Pure Profit, is half sister to the G1 English 1000 Guineas heroine Quick as Lightning; the English juvenile group winner Stratospheric, and the stakes-winning and Grade I placed Infinite (also a stakes producer). Another half sister to Pure Profit, How High the Moon, was only a modest runner and producer, but when her daughter Double Sunrise was bred to Java Gold (a son of Pure Profit's sire Key to the Mint), the result was champion sprinter Kona Gold. Smuggler's third dam Clear Ceiling is by Bold Ruler out of the great tap-root mare Grey Flight. She also is a sister to twice champion sire What a Pleasure and two other stakes winners, and three-parts sister to champion two-year-old colt Bold Lad.

Smuggler, GIII Tampa Bay Derby victor Wheelaway and listed scorer Greed is Good, are the only unrestricted stakes winners by Unbridled and his sons out of Damascus line mares, and overall the Fappiano/Damascus cross has produced just eight unrestricted stakes winners, four graded. Of these, Smuggler is the only one out of a mare by Private Account or one of his sons. That said, there is plenty about Inside Information's pedigree to fit with Unbridled. To start with, Unbridled's third dam Magic is by Buckpasser, who also appears as broodmare sire of Private Account. Private Account's dam Numbered Account (another champion filly) has Buckpasser's dam Busanda and her

three-parts sister Striking, 2x3. This pair is both by War Admiral out of daughters of La Troienne. If we look at Unbridled's pedigree, we see he has a double of the great Tartan Farm mare Aspidistra. She was a daughter of Better Self, who was by La Troienne's only son, Bimelech, out of a War Admiral mare, and therefore had a very similar background to Busanda and Striking. So, Smuggler has five crosses of La Troienne, all through related strains.

Incidentally, with Unbridled as her sire and Private Account and Key to the Mint as the sires of her dam and granddam, Smuggler has a pedigree which promises improvement with time and distance. It'll be interesting, therefore, to see if she eventually develops into as formidable filly as her dam. **Alan Porter may be contacted at [portpedigree@msn.com](mailto:portpedigree@msn.com). **ROOM AT THE TOP**

"It's a Monslaught," I wrote last month, then just noticing all the Montjeus showing up in the Classic trials. And how. If you take the two Exacta/Quinella/Jumele spots in the three big Derbies--that's the English (Epsom) Derby, the so-called (2100m) French Derby, and the Irish Derby--well, that's six top-two slots available. It surely can't have ever happened before that one horse in his first crop sired four different colts who between them filled five of the six available European 'Derby Exacta' slots. So it really is a Monslaught. Ironically slot number six, the French Derby winner Shamardal, is by Coolmore's other new World Top 12 sire Giant's Causeway--one of two Classic winners, and three Group 1 winners, in his first crop. The superlatives are flooding in, and rightly so.

Montjeu is now Europe's Leading Sire of 2005, with a current margin of almost €900,000 over second-placed Danehill. Giant's Causeway is currently third, with 14-time British-Irish champion sire Sadler's Wells only fourth. Coolmore will no doubt be consoled by the fact that the three ahead of him at this stage are also Coolmore sires. As for Montjeu, it's not just his four Derby Exacta colts. He has 22 winners this year, of which 14 have won or placed in stakes. Maybe he's helped by there being a paucity of top 'middle-distance' (or, in American terms, 'two-turn') sires...but who cares?

This Saturday's storied G1 Eclipse S., run over 10 furlongs at Sandown, features easy Epsom Derby winner Motivator (Montjeu) matched up against dual French Classic and easy G1 St. James's Palace S. winner Shamardal (Giant's Causeway). There will very likely be just one winner of the race, but the fact that Coolmore has produced two new, hands-down, World Top 12 sires, is of course good news for Coolmore. But it's also good news for premier-league, or major-league,

breeders, too. On many levels, horse racing is fired by top-level exhibitions of class, and when top young sires do emerge, it raises the excitement level that little bit higher. Or maybe that's just me.

What has gone a little bit unnoticed in all the excitement over, first, Giant's Causeway in the mile Guineas races, and now Montjeu in the Derbies, is the phenomenal season Coolmore's late, lamented Danehill's two-year-olds are having. I first noticed this when I looked at the five-day declarations for the G2 Coventry S. at Ascot-at-York. Aidan O'Brien had three colts nominated, and all three were by Danehill. Further investigation reveals that Ballydoyle has already sent out seven individual two-year-old winners by Danehill this season, including stakes winner and G3 Albany S. third Rumpleskilt and last weekend's G2 Railway S. one-two, George Washington and Amigoni. There sounds like a few future black-type winners among his other four Ballydoyle winners, too: Horatio Nelson and Aussie Rules last weekend, Ivan Denisovich and G2 Coventry S. fifth Marcus Andronicus previously. Second favorite in the Railway was another Danehill, the Dermot Weld-trained Golden Arrow, a listed stakes winner who was off the board in the Railway.

Danehill is the leading sire of two-year-olds in Europe so far this year (he's been the GB/Ire leading sire of two-year-olds five times already) but by quite a narrow margin over his son, Danehill Dancer. The latter has proved this year, with these two-year-olds and the likes of Indesatchel, that he's no flash in the pan.

Fast-ground-loving Zafonic is having a great year with his last crop of two-year-olds, ranking third, with nine two-year-old winners, including impressive G3 Queen Mary S. winner Flashy Wings. He's the only non-Danzig line stallion in the top five, though, as current leading freshman sire Bertolini (by Danzig) ranks fourth, ahead of the much-travelled Foxhound, a Danzig three-quarter brother to the disappointing Wolfhound. Foxhound only ever had a following of about one--me--but here he is again. He ranks fifth on the European two-year-old sire list, from his first English crop. **Cont. p.6**

Foxhound stood in Ireland first, then Kentucky, then back to Ireland before Coolmore leased him to England. But he's now been sold to Australia, I believe, and he should make a good sire of two-year-olds there, too.

Coolmore's charmed run even extended to the heretofore average Stravinsky, who has looked capable of siring some pretty good horses, but not consistently. Three four-year-olds, from his first crop, have sure all been 'on beam,' sprinting in Europe lately.

It started with Balmont running third in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. on the Saturday of Ascot-at-York. Then, last weekend, the lightly raced Soldier's Tale won the G3 Chipchase S. over six furlongs at Haydock, followed by Benbaun winning a listed race over five furlongs at The Curragh. The first two are both conditioned by Jeremy Nosedá. **For the Leading Sires in Europe see p7**

**ELLIOTT WALDEN ENDS TRAINING CAREER FOR WINSTAR VP POST** Elliott Walden, who has been WinStar Farm's semi-private trainer for the past three years, has decided to end his training career to act as the farm's vice president in charge of racing and bloodstock services. Trainer of 1998 GI Belmont S. winner Victory Gallop, Walden enjoyed his most successful year as a trainer in 1999. With year-end earnings over \$7.2 million, Walden's runners that season included GI Haskell winner Menifee, GI Whitney H. winner Victory Gallop and GI Super Derby winner Ecton Park. He also trained Grade I winners Plenty of Light, Brahms and Awesome Humor. "Leaving behind a 21-year career of training horses seems hard to do, however I am extremely excited about helping WinStar continue towards its goal of becoming a top five destination for stallions," Walden said. WinStar President Doug Cauthen added, "With the transition of the farm's primary focus from the racetrack to the sale's ring, we feel that Elliott is more valuable to our operation as a trusted advisor, racing manager, general public relations person and liaison to both trainers and prospective stallion owners." Walden will continue training through the current Churchill Downs meet, which concludes July 10.

**Roman Ruler Returns:**

Fog City Stable's **Roman Ruler** (Fusaichi Pegasus) makes his much-anticipated return to the races in this afternoon's third race at Belmont Park, a \$75,000 optional claimer. The dark bay colt won last year's GI Best Pal S. and the GI Norfolk S., but was fifth as the 2-1 favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He has made just one start this season, a last-of-eight finish in the GI San Felipe S. Mar. 19, but has been training tremendously for the comebacker, with four consecutive bullet works. Trainer Bob Baffert considered sending the half brother to El Corredor to either the six-furlong GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S. or the GI Dwyer S. over 8 1/2 panels, but opted instead for this seven-furlong test. In facing older horses for the first time, Roman Ruler hooks a tough customer in **Commentator** (Distorted Humor), who won the first five starts of his career by a combined 42 1/4 lengths before finishing a disappointing seventh in the Jan. 8 GIII Hal's Hope H.

**Tiznow Colt Tops Midlantic Sale:**

A colt from the first crop of dual Breeders' Cup Classic winner Tiznow brought a final bid of \$74,000 to top yesterday's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic June Two-Year-Olds in Training and Horses of Racing Age Sale at Timonium. Catalogued as hip 75, the Florida-bred was consigned to the sale by Wavertree Stables (Ciaran Dunne), agent, and was purchased by EQB Inc. The Apr. 4 foal, who breezed an eighth of a mile in :10.2 during Monday's under-tack preview, is a son of 1995 GIII Aksarben Oaks winner Scratch Paper (Notebook). A total of 57 horses were reported as sold for gross receipts of \$811,100. The average was \$14,230 and the median \$10,000. Some 28 horses were not sold for an RNA percentage of 32.9. The one-day sale was added to the Fasig-Tipton calendar due to overwhelming demand at its May sale at Timonium.

### NOSEDA READYING FOR JULY

Jeremy Nosedá's **Soldier's Tale** (Stravinsky) will join stablemate **Balmont** (Stravinsky) in the £250,000 G1 Darley July Cup July 7. The Newmarket-based conditioner reported last Saturday's G3 Chipchase S. winner to be on target for the headline event at Headquarters' July festival, reporting, "[Soldier's Tale] is in good form and, touch-wood, will now head for the July Cup next week. He's definitely worth his place in the field, I believe he's a pretty serious horse." Balmont, third in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot at York last time June 18, will seek to improve on last year's third placing and the trainer added, "Balmont runs as well. I don't want to go into comparisons between the two, but both will go there with serious chances. All I hope is that both stay in good nick until next week." Nosedá also boasts a strong hand for the G2 Cherry Hinton, with either G3 Albany S. winner **La Chunga** (More Than Ready) or G2 Queen Mary S. runner-up **Salut d'Amour (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) set to represent the stable. "[La Chunga and Salut d'Amour] will work later this week and then I'll decide which one runs," Nosedá said. "I've only worked them together once, after which my conclusion was that La Chunga was five lengths better, but that was a few weeks ago and they won't be working together again. Salut d'Amour will definitely be a better filly over six furlongs than she's been over five so far."
