WHERE WILL YOU BE THIS JULY?

While the weather outside remains cloudy and gray, officials at Fasig-Tipton are confident that there will be different atmospheric conditions over the Newtown Pad-docks when the company kicks off its annual July Se-lected Yearling Sale this morn-ing in Lexington. A mammoth catalogue of 679 youngsters will be offered during the two-day event, which, in the ab-sence for the third consecu-tive year of the Keeneland July sale, serves as the first dip of the toe into the yearling market. Despite empha-sizing the physical as opposed to flashy pedigrees, the sale has become a source of solid horseflesh. In 2005 alone, the company can boast of the graded-stakes winning graduates Effectual, Hollywood Story, La Chunga, Storm Wolf and Surf Cat. Boyd Browning, executive vice president and chief operating officer at Fasig-Tipton, tells buyers to expect more of the same. "We've got a very strong catalogue, both in terms of the number of horses and the quality of horses," he said. "The activity on the grounds has been good and that generally bodes well. I would hope that we would have a marketplace fairly similar to last year."

The Bar is Set High...

The 2004 edition of the July sale exceeded every expectation, with gross receipts approaching \$39 million, a 23-percent increase in the average (\$114,260) and a 19-percent jump in the median (\$80,000). Last year's sales-topper was a colt by Elusive Quality, purchased by John Ferguson for \$950,000 for Sheikh Mohammed. Browning is nothing if not realistic in his approach to this year's auction. "I would not expect any dramatic or unbelievable changes," he commented. "There's no real dramatic upward pressure, and I would hope there isn't a whole lot of significant downward pressure either." He added, "If the average and the median would be down five percent and the RNA rate would be similar, I would say we would have had a successful sale, particularly with the expansion in the catalogue." **FTKJUL Preview cont. p7-10**

"WANDA" WOMAN

His Highness the Aga Khan paid the supplementary fee for **Shawanda (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}) earlier this week and The Curragh crowd found out why yesterday as the 9-2 second favorite simply blew away her rivals to take the G1 Darley Irish Oaks by five lengths. Jockey Christophe Soumillon will have few Classic rides as easy. He reined back the homebred after breaking smartly, and his confidence was rewarded as the filly's devastating turn of acceleration down the outside carried the pair past toiling rivals at the quarter pole. Hand-ridden to dispose of the top-class **Playful Act (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), Shawanda was easily in front as she reached the line, breaking the stakes record by 3/10 of a second. "That was very straightforward for her," the Aga Khan's Stud Manager Pat Downes said. "We could put our binoculars down and enjoy it. **Irish Oaks cont. p2**

The connections of **Shawanda** were concerned about a lack of pace in the Irish Oaks, but those worries proved unfounded. "Luckily, there were enough up there wanting to be handy," Pat Downes continued.

"[Shawanda] has had to make her own running in France, which is not easy to do, so we were happy to get a lead here. She just traveled so well and looked the winner from a long way out." Runner-up on debut at Maisons-Laffitte Apr. 1, Shawanda learned quickly and was unthreatened as she reeled off victories in a Chantilly conditions race Apr. 29, the Listed Prix de la Seine at Longchamp May 15 and the G3 Prix de Royaumont back at Chantilly June 4. As to what's next, Downes pointed to two dates at Longchamp in the fall. "There are a lot of options for her now, but more than likely she will run in the G1 Prix Vermeille [Sept. 11] and we'll have a peep at the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [Oct. 2]," he said.

"Two furlongs out, we quickened up and I thought we were going to win, but in a matter of strides the winner had taken three lengths out of her," he said. "It was a very good performance, as she has beaten the rest by some way." Helena Springfield Ltd's 4-1 pick **Dash To The Top (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) could only stay on into fifth late on after being forced wide in the straight. The winning owner's other contender, **Hazariya (Ire)** (Xaar {GB}), was pulled up by Michael Kinane on the turn into the straight. Pat Downes remarked that the filly had suffered a setback Saturday morning. "She did improve a lot to today and we hoped she would be okay, but if you're ever not going to get away with it it will be on ground that fast," he said.

Smokume took advantage of a patient Chantal Sutherland ride and provided an initial graded stakes win for both himself and his young jockey. After a solid sophomore campaign that included a pair of minor stakes wins, Smokume returned from an eight-month break and began 2005 with a tally in the May 14 Decathlon S. at Monmouth. Fourth in the June 11 GII True North BC H., he won a 6 1/2-furlong Belmont handicap June 29. Away alertly from post two here, he relaxed along the rail as longshot Gadace's Khamseh (Piccolino) set the pace to his outside, but he came and got that foe in upper stretch and powered away from the pack. English emigre Always First isn't, of course, but showed he had the goods in yesterday's stakes finale of Hollywood's spring/summer meet to be competitive against America's best turf marathoners. The four-year-old began his career in Britain, where he broke his maiden in a Sandown Park allowance at two before running fourth to Rule of Law in the G2 Great Voltigeur S. last season for trainer Michael Stoute. Shipped state-side off a poor showing in September's G3 Arc Trial S. at Newbury, Always First made a good first impression, winning a 10-furlong Hollywood NW2X Apr. 22. He failed to build off that one when fourth at the same level May 29, and had traffic problems in his latest June 23, earning a promotion from fourth to third after having to steady late. Here, jockey Victor Espinoza allowed Always First to relax near the back of the pack through the initial mile, but the pair came flying along the rail in deep stretch and got up in time. Sun King failed to live up to expectations on the Triple Crown trail, but the sophomore flashed yesterday the form that saw him atop many Derby Top 10 lists during the spring. The dark bay, third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile in October, kicked off the year with an impressive victory in a Gulfstream allowance in February before annexing the GIII Tampa Bay Derby the following month. He entered the GI Kentucky Derby off a flat fourth in the GI Blue Grass S. and did nothing to show that was a fluke, running 15th in the Run for the Roses. Tried in the GI Preakness S. two weeks later, Sun King managed a fourth behind Afleet Alex and was given a bit of time off by trainer Nick Zito. Looking refreshed while adding blinkers here, he took advantage of the rail draw and sped out to lead the way. Odds-on High Limit, who broke slowly, rushed up to press Sun King, and the two sprinted away from the pack on the far turn. Showing plenty of heart, Sun King let it out a notch at the furlong grounds and edged away for the daylight score. This important prize lost a major contributor with the late scratch of likely odds-on favorite Aussie Rules, but still ended up in the possession of Aidan O'Brien for the seventh time thanks to Amigoni. Like past Ballydoyle luminaries Landseer (GB), Spartacus (Ire) and Antonius Pius, Amigoni opened his account in a seven-furlong Gowran Park maiden May 29. He failed to land a blow when eighth in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot at York June 14, but got to within 3/4 of a length of stable companion George Washington (Ire) when second in the G3 Railway S. at this track last time June 26. Content to stalk the early leader Black Charmer, Kieren Fallon sent Amigoni into pursuit passing halfway. His mount responded to edge out the long-time leader with 150 yards remaining despite drifting towards that rival in the drive to the line. "With every run he's getting better," O'Brien told *Racing Post*. "He's a very tough horse. Racing is really improving him and we'll keep him going. He's in at Goodwood over six and seven furlongs. I don't think seven would be a problem, but I might just be more inclined to keep him to six for the time being and go for the [July 29, G2 Richmond S.]." Caradak took the Listed Platinum S. at Cork last August, but failed to add to that stakes score despite running with credit when sixth in the G2 Challenge S. at Newmarket in October. He put a dismal comeback effort in the Listed Glencairn S. at Leopardstown June 1 behind him when winning the Listed Celebration S. over a mile of this circuit last time June 26, but faced a drop in distance against proven performers at this specialist trip. Making light of his task, he shadowed the habitual frontrunner Brunel early before brushing him aside passing the quarter pole and pulling away for an impressive score. "It was a good performance and he's definitely on the improve," jockey Michael Kinane said. "It would have taken a solid horse to beat him today and he's a beautiful horse with a great attitude. He picked up really good and put it beyond doubt quickly, but a mile is his best trip and we'll be looking at making a better entry now."

Sire Firepower...

This year's catalogue is replete with offspring by some of the worlds pre-eminent stallions, including A.P. Indy, Awesome Again, Carson City, Devil His Due, Distorted Humor, Dixieland Band, Dynaformer, Forestry, Fusaichi Pegasus, Giant's Causeway, Gone West, Gulch, Holy Bull, Maria's Mon, More Than Ready, Mr. Greeley, Northern Afleet, Pulpit, Quiet American, Silver Deputy, Smart Strike, Successful Appeal, Tale of the Cat and Unbridled's Song. The New Sire Showcase, now in its 18th year, remains very popular among yearling seekers and comprises the first 305 lots of today's opening session. Browning explains the appeal. "The market wants new," he submits. "The very nature of our business is such that people like the mystique, the unknown, the element of remembering the horses from their racing days and what kind of sire they might make." Young stallions represented by their first or second crop of foals include Buddha, Came Home, Cat's At Home, El Corredor, Include, Malabar Gold, Mizzen Mast, Monarchos, Officer, Orientate, Pure Prize, Snow Ridge, Songandaprayer, Yes It's True and Yonaguska. Adds Browning, "We've got a nice group [of freshman sires] this year. It's a very solid, representative group and the nice thing is that a lot of those horses were represented by very solid, outstanding looking weanlings in the market last November. We've seen a bunch of nice, well-conformed yearlings by those sires, which give us a lot of enthusiasm and optimism that they're going to sell very well."

Fundamental Economics...

With nearly 700 horses set to go through the ring over the next two days, buyers should easily be able to fill their orders. The 2005 edition of the sale (before outs) is over 37 percent larger than last year's catalogue of 495 and over 10 percent greater than the 604 horses that were booked for 2003. Is it possible that supply will outweigh demand? Unlikely, according to Browning. "We don't set out with a goal and say 'we're going to have a July sale with 'x' number of head,'" he explained. "The size of the catalogue, as elementary as it sounds, is a function of the number of horses we were offered that we thought met the pedigree and physical criteria to cover the horse sale. There was no intentional plan to increase numbers and there's no great fear of the expansion in numbers. There were just more horses of that quality being offered to us that we thought would work. We take what we can get that makes sense for that particular sale."


Barometric Pressure?

With Keeneland's decision to forego its July sale in favor of an expanded September, Fasig-Tipton necessarily becomes the barometer and sets something of a tone for the sales for the balance of the year. Do the higher-ups at Fasig-Tipton feel any undue stress in trying to get the year off on a high note? Well, yes and no. "Anytime you have a significant horse sale, whether you're the only one in town or whatever it is, most all of us pose pressure on ourselves," Browning says. "We do feel some responsibility to make sure we do a good job to get the sales cycle off on a positive note, but we worry mostly about ourselves. You hope you've done things right, you hope you have the right product, the right buyers."

Blue Skies Ahead for Hill 'n' Dale...

One catalogue update in a consignment can make an entire sale profitable. For John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, today's first 75 hips feature three major catalogue page boosts. Hip [7](#) could get things off to a flying start for the agency. By first-crop sire Malabar Gold (Unbridled), the dark bay filly is the first foal from Warsaw Girl (Ire) (Polish Precedent), a half sister to G1 Epsom Derby hero Motivator (GB), who has career earnings of \$1.8 million. Less than 20 horses later comes hip [26](#), a colt by Snow Ridge--Annasan (Corporate Report). The Feb. 13 foal is also the recipient of an important update as his half brother, Sovereign Award winner A Bit O Gold (Gold Fever) has since gone on to win the GIII Dominion Day H. at Woodbine. Finally, hip [75](#) is a Cat's At Home (Tabasco Cat) half brother to Wild Desert (Wild Rush), who won the first leg of Canada's Triple Crown, the Queen's Plate, and finished third in the second, Sunday's Prince of Wales S. at Fort Erie. The significance of those performances is not lost on Sikura. "It's obviously a great thing when you have an important update right before a sale," he said. "Sometimes you wish that these things happened four months ago so they're already on the page, but those who follow racing closely know the good horses. It's tough to meet the scrutiny of the buyer, but those updates help for sure." On the breeding side of the operation, Hill 'n' Dale stallions have been well represented over the past several weeks. Adieu, a daughter of first-crop sire El Corredor, won the July 3 Astoria S. while a weanling colt by Vindication topped a session of the Japanese foal sale at Hokkaido. "When it all fits into place, you build momentum," Sikura explained. "You've seen it initially with El Corredor and there's a buzz around Vindication. Those are good things to happen."

Just Trying to Get Along...

The headlines in the three-year-old division for the first half of 2004 belonged to Smarty Jones, who came within a length winning the Triple Crown and won the collective heart of America. The headlines during last year's November breeding stock sales in Central Kentucky was I'll Get Along, the dam of the subsequent Eclipse Award winner who sold for \$5 million carrying a full sibling to Smarty Jones. Brent Fernung, general manager of CloverLeaf Farm in Florida, brought the mare to last year's sale and is back with one of her foals, a colt by champion sprinter Orientate, who sells today as hip [133](#). "I had two babies out of the mare," Fernung related. "The first one

looked more like what I expected Hennessy to look like--big, long, kind of rangy colt. This colt reminds me more of an In Reality kind of horse and really reminds me of Smile quite a bit. He's not a very big horse, he's got that body shape you saw in the In Reality lines and he looks like he ought to be quick." Orientate was off to a tremendous start in the ring last year, his 20 sons and daughters selling for an average of nearly \$90,000. Fernung explained his choice of the Gainesway stallion. "The mare was fast, she was by Smile," he offered. "Her half brother, Cowboy Cop, was a very fast horse and Orientate was a champion sprinter, so I was just going speed to speed. That's usually my philosophy is to try to figure out how to put more speed into the family."

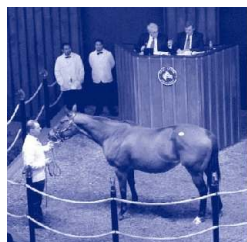

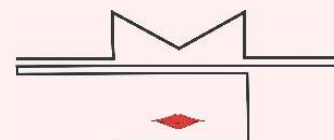
