HILL 'N' DALE BUYS INTEREST IN LADY TAK

Hill 'n' Dale Farm announced yesterday it had purchased a majority interest in multiple Grade I winner

Lady Tak (Mutakddim) from Bill and Corinne Heiligbrodt. A price was not disclosed. The five-year-old mare, who is now under the tutelage of trainer Steve Asmussen, is expected to race until the end of the year before being retired to the breeding shed at Hill 'n' Dale. "This is one special filly," said John

Sikura, president of the Kentucky nursery.

"As a two-year-old, Lady Tak posted the second highest Beyer Speed Figure of any two-year-old, colt or filly, in North America in 2002. She went on to become one of only a handful of distaffers, which includes Lady's Secret, to have won both the GI Ballerina H. and the GI Test S. at Saratoga. Her stakes-record-setting performance in the Test was unbelievable. Hill 'n' Dale is pleased to be involved in a partnership with such outstanding horsemen as Bill and Corinne Heiligbrodt. I hope Lady Tak will have the same success in the breeding shed as she did on the racetrack." To date, Lady Tak has won 10 of 19 starts for earnings of over \$1.1 million. Out of the Lucky North mare Star of My Eye, Lady Tak was a \$7,500 KEESEP yearling who went on to realize \$75,000 as a KEEAPR juvenile. The chestnut last finished third in a Churchill allowance May 5. Hill 'n' Dale stands Lady Tak's sire Mutakddim.

MAGIC TOUCH

The well-traveled **Touch of Land** (Fr) (Lando {Ger}) was the model of professionalism yesterday when capturing the G3 Grand Prix De Vichy in France. The five-year-old failed to build upon his successes in last year's G2 Grosser Mercedes-Benz-Preis and G2 Prix Dollar, but performed with credit nonetheless when third in the G1 Hong Kong Cup in December. Fourth in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan May 22, he ran fourth again in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot at York June 15. Impressive under the floodlights in front of packed enclosures here, he broke smartly from the gate, but was restrained while under cover before making his move 500 meters out. Taking control from the pacesetter at the furlong marker, he received two reminders of Christophe Lemaire's whip and surged ever forward to dismiss favored **Apsis** (GB) (Barathea {Ire}) with plenty in hand. Conditioner Alex Pantall indicated the winner may seek to improve on his 11th placing in 2003 by pointing at this year's GI Arlington Million Aug. 13. **Click for the racingpost.co.uk chart.**

OAK TREE KICKS OFF SEPT. 28; CAL CUP

MOVED Oak Tree at Santa Anita will commence its 37th season Wednesday, Sept. 28 and will average nearly one stakes race a day during its 31-day campaign. The meet concludes Sunday, Nov. 6 with California Cup XVI, an 11-race program worth \$1,325,000 that's restricted to horses bred in the Golden State. The Cal Cup was previously held in mid-October, but has been moved to a week after the Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships. "The decision was made in an effort to boost Cal Cup attendance, which had decreased the last few years," explained Sherwood C. Chillingworth, director and vice president of Oak Tree. "We hope this move will enhance attendance and bring Cal Cup day up to speed. We selected the last Sunday because we will have a \$1-million guaranteed Pick Six pool and there has to be a mandatory payout. We'll also be offering an attractive giveaway item, so we anticipate a large crowd." In all, 29 stakes worth more than \$4.7 million will be held at the Arcadia track during the Oak Tree meet.

Finger Lakes Jockey Camejo Seriously Injured in Spill:

Omar Camejo, a leading jockey at Finger Lakes Race Track, was seriously injured Tuesday when he was

thrown from his mount in the seventh race at the upstate New York oval. Camejo's mount, One El of a Lady, was bothered by Nola Jean nearing the seven-eighths pole and propped, unseating Camejo. The Cuban-born Camejo was then struck by a trailing rival. Nola Jean, with Carlos Dominguez aboard, was disqualified for interference and

placed last. Transported by helicopter to Strong Memorial Hospital in Rochester, Camejo was diagnosed with three broken ribs and a punctured lung, according to his agent, Pedro Carrasquel. As of yesterday afternoon, Camejo was still in the intensive care unit and was on a respirator because of fluid in his injured lung. The final two races on Tuesday's card were canceled. Live racing is scheduled to resume on Friday with a 12:35 p.m. post time.

Frankel Division Arrives at Monmouth Park:

The competition just got tougher at Monmouth Park with the arrival of 14 horses from the string of Bobby Frankel, who will be represented for the first time at the Oceanport oval. Under the care of Chad Brown, assistant to Frankel over the past three years, the horses were previously stabled at Churchill Downs for the meeting which concluded July 10. "We brought four nice two-year-olds and 10 older horses," said Brown. "One of the older horses is Ay Caramba (Brz), who won on the grass at Churchill Downs [July 10]. I know there are races here for them as the summer goes along."
