ROSES IN MAY GETS BACK TO WORK

After a well-deserved vacation following his victory in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 26, Ken and Sarah

Ramsey's **Roses in May** (Devil His Due) got back to work earlier this week. Trainer Dale Romans sent out the five-year-old for a leisurely four-furlong breeze in :49 4/5 at Churchill Downs Tuesday, resuming a 2005 campaign that's likely to conclude overseas. "He came out of the work good," said Romans.

"He'll probably have four starts this year, ending with the G1 Japan Cup Dirt [at Tokyo in November]." Romans said he hadn't decided on an immediate goal for Roses in May, who will begin his stud career in Japan next season. "We're still not sure where we're going with him," Romans commented. "The G1 Whitney H. [Aug. 6 at Saratoga] would be the first choice, but if that one comes up too quick, and it probably will, maybe the GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. [Aug. 21]." Romans said Roses in May would then have another start before tackling the Oct. 29 G1 Breeders' Cup Classic at Belmont, a race in which he ran second to Ghostzapper last year. "It would make sense to keep him in the East and go to something like the Hawthorne race [GII Hawthorne Gold Cup], or maybe the G1 Jockey Club Gold Cup [Oct. 1 at Belmont]," Romans explained. Roses in May came into last year's Breeders' Cup off an unblemished five-for-five season before falling short to Ghostzapper at Lone Star. That foe has since been retired, leaving Roses and May, Saint Liam and Rock Hard Ten vying for older-horse supremacy. "I think it's easier on the whole division, because I think he was a real stand-out horse," said Romans of Ghostzapper. "But you hate to have a horse like that retire prematurely. I think Frank [Stronach, Ghostzapper's owner] did a lot for racing keeping him around, so it's really too bad Ghostzapper was able to race only once this year."

ESWARAH FACES CHALLENGE

Tomorrow's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., which has been temporarily switched from Ascot to Newbury, has a lop-sided feel as 11 older horses take on the sole sophomore and sole filly **Eswarah (GB)** (Unfuwain). However, connections are confident that Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's unbeaten G1 Epsom Oaks winner can uphold her generation's reputation.

She will bid to end a long drought for the fairer sex that stretches back to Time Charter (GB) in 1983; the last three-year-old filly to best the colts was Pawneese (Ire) in 1976. "It was a big decision, but we've been very pleased with her over the last 10 days," jockey Richard Hills commented. "She worked very well on Saturday morning and I think she's going to go extremely well. She's only run three times and we get a great weight allowance--I know a filly hasn't won it for a long time, but it can be done. She's by Unfuwain and they are very versatile in that they go on firm and soft ground, but I'd like a bit of give."

Ace in the Hole...

Most of the big names were confirmed as King George starters yesterday, but there was one notable absentee in Susan Magnier's G1 Coronation Cup winner Yeats (Ire). His absence leaves trainer Aidan O'Brien with a sole representative in **Ace (Ire)** (Danehill), who finished runner-up to His Highness the Aga Khan's **Azamour (Ire)** (Night Shift) in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot at York last time June 15. **Phoenix Reach (Ire)** (Alhaarth {Ire}) has conquered overseas, taking last year's G1 Canadian International and G1 Hong Kong Vase and returning to win the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad al Sheba Mar. 26, but he is still looking for his first major prize on home shores. Winterbeck Manor Stud's colorbearer has the toughness for this test, however, after overcoming a recurrent leg injury, an eye infection picked up in Singapore after finishing second in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup at Kranji in his most recent outing May 15 and a bout of colic a fortnight ago. "This horse has had four general anaesthetics," trainer Andrew Balding said. "He's amazingly resilient and seems to thrive on adversity; he's a remarkable horse and hopefully there's something more to come. I think the track will suit him--we might have to fly him around in an aeroplane for two hours first."

SAINT LIAM TO LANE'S END Grade I winner **Saint Liam** (Saint Ballado--Quiet Dance, by Quiet American) will be retired after the Oct. 29 GI Breeders' Cup at Belmont Park and will stand the 2006 breeding season at William S. Farish's Lane's End Farm near Versailles, Kentucky. Bred by Edward Evans, Saint Liam was purchased for \$130,000 by agent Mike Ryan for Mr. and Mrs. William Warren at the 2001 Saratoga Selected Yearlings Sale. He was unraced at two, but finished first or second in six of his nine starts at three. The five-year-old blossomed last season, falling just a neck short when beaten by Horse of the Year Ghostzapper in the GI Woodward S. last September and ending the campaign with a win in the GII Clark H. He returned to best Roses in May by 3 3/4 lengths in the GI Donn H. in February. After a disappointing sixth-place effort as the even-money chalk in the GI Santa Anita H. in March, Saint Liam rebounded to capture the June 18 GI Stephen Foster H. last time out. To date, the bay has seven wins, five seconds and a third from his 17 starts for earnings of \$1,573,395.

AFLEET ALEX PREPS FOR HASKELL **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet), who makes his next start in the Aug. 7 GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth, worked a mile at Belmont Park yesterday morning. With regular rider Jeremy Rose in the saddle, the three-year-old was timed in a handy 1:36.74 over the fast main track. It was the second breeze for the colt since his win in the June 11 GI Belmont S. "The Triple Crown is such a grueling schedule that we needed to let Alex down a bit after the Belmont," trainer Tim Ritchey said. "About 10 days ago, we breezed him five furlongs just to stretch his legs. Today we wanted to get a stiffer work into him to check his fitness." Ritchey was pleased with the results of the test. "He looks terrific," he remarked. "I would say he's put on at least 75 pounds. But when a horse gains weight, you want to make sure it hasn't affected his fitness. I was very happy with his work. Now we're ready for the second half of the year."

WHYWHYWHY AND CUVEE TO GAINESWAY Grade I stakes winners **Whywhywhy** (Mr. Greeley--Thorough Fair, by Quiet American) and **Cuvee** (Carson City--Christmas Star, by Star de Naskra), who both stood at Spendthrift Farm in 2005, will join the Gainesway stallion roster for the 2006 season. Stud fees for both stallions will be announced in October. At two, Whywhywhy broke his maiden in Belmont's GIII Flash S. before taking the GII Sanford S. at Saratoga and the GI Futurity S. later that year. Third in the GIII Swale S. during his sophomore campaign, he retired with three victories from nine starts and earnings of \$315,015. "We are excited about this Grade I-winning son of Mr. Greeley joining his sire here at Gainesway," said Michael Hernon. "It's especially noteworthy that Mr. Greeley is already emerging as a sire of sires himself, having produced a leading freshman sire in El Corredor." Cuvee, also a winner of the GI Futurity S. at two, added the GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup and GII Saratoga Special that year before returning in his three-year-old season to run second in the GIII Kentucky Cup Sprint. He retired in 2004 with four wins from nine starts and earnings of \$402,043. "He is an excellent physical specimen, and will be a wonderful addition to our stallion roster," commented Gainesway President Antony Beck.

SECRET GROUP CALLS FOR NYRA PROSECUTION

A secret group interested in bidding for the racetrack franchise now held by the New York Racing Association is urging the U.S. Attorney's office to prosecute the racing entity. The group, whose identity is not being disclosed, said in a letter sent by its lawyer July 21 that NYRA has continued to operate in questionable and suspect ways--despite being under the terms of a strict deferred prosecution arrangement for more than a year. A federal judge agreed that if NYRA kept its operations clean during the period, the prosecution against it would come to an end. But Donald Kinsella, an Albany lawyer and former federal prosecutor, said NYRA has violated the terms of the deal and should now be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. In his letter to the U.S. Attorney's office in Brooklyn, Kinsella said he represented a client in the racing industry that is "interested in obtaining the franchise" held by NYRA. Saratoga to Preview New Tote Equipment:

The new United Tote wagering system, installed at Aqueduct last October and at Belmont Park earlier this year, will be introduced at the Saratoga Race Course meeting that begins July 27. The state-of-the-art equipment will be previewed during the Open House at Saratoga from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday, July 24. It includes United Tote's new interactive touch-screen wagering terminal, which was named one of the Top 20 most innovative wagering products by the *Casino Journal*. The terminals can be funded by using vouchers or the NYRA Cash Card. "The new equipment...has undergone a series of improvements this year and it figures to be an exciting addition to the wagering experience at America's most popular track," said NYRA Senior Vice President Bill Nader.

Broken Collarbone for Joe Bravo:

Jockey Joe Bravo suffered a broken collarbone in a spill at Monmouth Park yesterday afternoon. Bravo was aboard a tiring Maid of Sunlight at the top of the stretch in the seventh race when N' Bearsohmy bore out sharply, forcing Dice in a Vice to veer out as well. Maid of Sunlight clipped heels with Dice in a Vice and fell. Bravo was taken to Monmouth Medical Center after the accident. "They are doing X-rays and an MRI," said his agent, Danny Mellul. "We know he has a broken collarbone, but we'll have to wait until all the test results are back before we know what else might be wrong, and how long he will be out." A 10-time Monmouth riding champion, Bravo missed half the 2001 meet after breaking his leg in four places, and was out for most of the 2002 season with a fractured wrist. The 33-year-old currently leads the Monmouth standings with 76 winners, 27 more than Stewart Elliott in second. The collarbone injury alone could sideline him for 4-to-6 weeks. Maid of Sunlight was not hurt in the incident.

Joey P. in Haskell Prep?

Undefeated **Joey P.** (Close Up), a candidate for the Aug. 7 GI Haskell Invitational H., will try two turns for the first time at Monmouth Park this afternoon. The New Jersey-bred takes on five rivals in the fifth race, a \$47,000 optional claimer at a flat mile. Joey P. made his stakes debut in the six-furlong GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S. July 4 and drove to a 1 3/4-length victory. Impressed with that performance, his connections decided that the nine-furlong Haskell might just be within the gelding's scope. "At the start of the meet, it looked like we would keep him sprinting, so we didn't train him long," trainer Frank Costa said. "Then he won the stakes and [owner/breeder John Petrini] started thinking about the Haskell." How does the veteran horseman think his charge will fare in first route race? "He should win," Costa said, "but who knows?"

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a **@** will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a **▲** will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a **+** will first-time starters, an **(S)** will be used for state-bred races, a **(C)** will be used for maiden-claiming races and an **(R)** will be used for other restricted races. Purses for Canadian races are in Canadian dollars.

FTBOA Honors Point-Based in '05:

The Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association will determine year-end champions using its new "FTBOA Chase to the Championship" point system, which awards points for success in stakes races. In the past, Florida-bred champions were decided by a panel of five racing secretaries from around the country. The new system allocates points for stakes wins in graded races, open-company stakes and on Florida's signature racing days, with the number of points awarded based upon the classification of the race. Earnings will be used to break any year-end ties. Horse of the Year, Broodmare of the Year and Breeder of the Year will be voted on by the FTBOA Board of Directors and announced at FTBOA's annual awards dinner.
