PLAY IT AGAIN

She was the belle of the ball when besting the colts in the G1 Sussex S. at Glorious Goodwood last year and the Elite Racing Club's **Soviet Song (Ire)** (Marju

{Ire}) has everything in place for a repeat today. Devastating as ever when ripping up the Newmarket turf in the July 5 G1 Falmouth S. on her last start, the five-year-old brings the same credentials into the race as she did when besting Abdulla al Khalifa's **Nayyir (GB)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) 12 months ago. "So far Soviet's preparation has gone nicely and she seems well in herself," commented trainer

James Fanshawe. "Things went pretty well for her at Newmarket and I hope that she has come on for that race--she seems pretty well in herself." Soviet Song needs no introduction, having bagged the G1 Fillies' Mile at two and she emerged from Russian Rhythm's shadow to take this in between two defeats of Attraction (GB) in the Falmouth and G1 Matron S. at Leopardstown in September. Nayyir comes alive on these slopes, having won two renewals of the seven-furlong Lennox S., run as a Group 3 and Group 2 and finished runner-up in last year's Sussex and G2 Celebration Mile. He was beaten a head when third in his warm-up in the June 25 G3 Criterion S. at Newmarket last time and owes conditioner Gerard Butler nothing. "Nayyir is the admiral or captain of the team," he said. "We tried for the Juddmonte Lockinge with him, but he just wasn't ready, we tried for the Queen Anne S. and he just wasn't ready but now at last things have changed for the better--his blood profile and his physical well-being. I was pleased with his run at Newmarket--in his work and physically, he is as good as ever but he is an older and wiser guy."

THE AUGUST PLACE TO BE

August is just around the corner, and that can only mean one thing. Racing at the Spa. Saratoga Race Course, in Saratoga Springs, New York, kicks off its 36-day meet this afternoon with what promises to be an action-packed stand. On offer are 45 stakes races, 30 of which are graded and 13 of which are Grade-I events. Total stakes purses will exceed \$10 million. The opening day feature is the 89th running of the GII Adirondack S. for two-year-old fillies. Both **Adieu** (El Corredor), winner of the July 3 Astoria S., and **Fifth Avenue** (Monarchos), heroine of the June 9 Fashion

S., will attempt to take their records to three-for-three. Both have plenty of gas--and plenty of heart--and should be tough. "They didn't hand it to her," trainer Todd Pletcher said of Adieu after the Astoria. "From the inside post, she had to establish position. She worked hard the whole way, fought it out and was good enough to get it done." Astoria runner-up **Folklore** (Tiznow) is likely better coming from a bit off the pace, as she did when she won her maiden by four lengths at Belmont June 3, but an inside draw might force the hand of jockey Cornelio Velasquez. She represents the barn of D. Wayne Lukas, who's won the Adirondack five times.

Court Masterpiece has attained a consistent level of form at the age of five and secured a career-best in this to deny Jack Sullivan in a driving finish. A wide-margin winner of the Listed On The House S. here June 3, he was undone by Vortex (GB) (Danehill) in the G3 Criterion S. at Newmarket June 25 and again by Autumn Glory (Ire) (Charnwood Forest {Ire}) in the G3 Silver Trophy S. at Lingfield July 9, but gained revenge on those two rivals with a third course stakes win. "I'm delighted," said winning trainer Ed Dunlop. "Philip [Robinson] gave him a great ride and I'm also delighted they came across [to the stands' rail]. Otherwise he might have been boxed in." Positioned behind the early speed in fourth, Robinson bided his time aboard the eventual winner as the field swept to the wide outside into the straight. Making progress from the quarter pole to join issue at the distance, he came under maximum force once in front to repel the rallying Jack Sullivan. "I'm really pleased for the horse--he's won a group race now and it will mean a lot for him in the future," Dunlop added. "He seems to be getting better with age and he liked this ground. The Geezer received a timely confidence boost when taking the Listed July Trophy at Haydock July 2 on his latest start, and the benefit was plain to see here as he powered into the G1 St Leger reckoning with a run-away first group-race win. Chasing the tail of Motivator (GB) was the vogue in early summer and he was nearest in the G2 Dante S. at York May 12. He allowed others a closer look when only eighth in the G1 Derby at Epsom June 4 and was a troubled third in Royal Ascot's G2 King Edward VII S. at York June 17, his penultimate start. Settled behind a modest early pace here, the eventual winner secured second as Unfurled led into the straight and was pushed to the fore upon passing the quarter pole. He surged ever forward from there and Richard Quinn needed minimum pressure inside the final furlong to dismiss the game Unfurled.

"I'm sure the ground helped him, he has run on ground that wasn't ideal and I was impressed," trainer David Elsworth said. "He saw the mile-and-a-half out very well and another furlong or two shouldn't be a problem. It will be tougher in the St Leger [at Doncaster Sept. 10], but we might take in the [G2] Great Voltigeur S. at York [Aug. 16] first." [Click for the Racing Post race chart.](#)

Showing an early aptitude for speed, Strike Up The Band tore the Listed Aubigny S. apart on his first visit to this track May 18. Tardy exits were to blame when attempting an audacious Royal Ascot double, as he occupied the runner-up berth in both the June 16 G3 Norfolk S. and the Listed Windsor Castle S. two days later at York, but he gained compensation with a decisive first group victory here. Lumbered with stall 15 in the car park, he was better away this time, observed the furious early pace from a wide midfield, seized the initiative inside the final quarter and was ridden out from the eighth pole as Pickett gave vain chase. "He's a nice horse and I'm sure he'll get stronger," said trainer David Nicholls. "He's in the G2 Richmond S. [here] on Friday, the G1 Nunthorpe S. at York [Aug. 18]--which might be a bit optimistic--and the G2 Gimcrack S. at York [Aug. 17]." [Click for the Racing Post race chart.](#)

Sophomores have a fine recent record, dominating the race between 1999 and 2002. Abdullah Saeed Belhab's **Proclamation (Ire)** (King's Best) has invaluable course experience, having won the May 28 Listed Heron S. and looked to have a bright future when overcoming a poor draw to annex the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot at York June 15. Aidan O'Brien took this in 2000 with Giant's Causeway and two years later with Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), but Susan Magnier's **Ad Valorem** (Danzig) has yet to prove he stays this far. Last year's G1 Middle Park S. winner was running on when second in the June 14 G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot at York, but never got into the argument when only fifth in the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly July 3.

Aidan O'Brien has a 30 percent strike-rate with his juveniles in Britain this term and saddles another live-wire in **Aussie Rules** in this contest. He looked to have the right attitude when winning a six-furlong Curragh maiden on debut June 25 and should relish this extra panel. **Black Charmer** races for the third time against a Ballydoyle favorite, having chased home Ivan Denisovich (Ire) when third in the G2 July S. at Newmarket July 6 before finding Amigoni (Ire) a half-length too strong in the July 17 G3 Anglesey S. at The Curragh. He represents the Mark Johnston stable responsible for the 2001 scorer Mister Cosmi (GB). "On the form of his run in Ireland, they have him to beat," Johnston told *PA Sport*. "He is in very good form and this will be the first time he has encountered easier ground, which I think he will appreciate. The extra half-furlong will suit him, too, so it is fair to say I'd be confident he'll run a big race."

Last year's G1 Epsom and Irish Oaks and GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf winner has been sidelined since trailing in the June 15 G1 Princess of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot at York, after which she was found to have sustained a fracture to her near-fore cannon bone. "I'm pleased to say she has been back cantering for the last couple of weeks and we're very happy with her," trainer Ed Dunlop said yesterday. "Fingers crossed, she'll be back for the G3 September S., which is over a mile-and-a-half and she has no penalty. That is a good start."

A couple of weeks ago, we featured a runner by one inexpensive New York stallion, Abaginone, and now it is the turn of a graded stakes winner by another who fits that description, Gold Fever.

Unlike Abaginone, Gold Fever didn't start his career in New York. The son of Forty Niner--Lead Kindly Light, by Majestic Light, initially retired to Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky, as a hot prospect. At two, he'd won three of six starts, gaining a black-type win in the Perpetuate S. He'd built on that sound beginning the following year, progressing through the season to end up with a trio of graded stakes wins--the GIII Riva Ridge S., GIII Discovery H., and GI NYRA Mile H. He only had two juvenile winners in his first crop, but that was generally overlooked, since one of these was Gold Mover, who took the GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup S., GIII Debutante S. and GII Schuylerville S., and the other was black-type winner Golden Hurricane. This pair both went on to add to their laurels: Golden Hurricane collected two more stakes events at three, and Gold Mover eventually took her earnings to over \$1.5 million, capturing eight more black-type events, including two runnings of the GII Princess Rooney H. and the GIII Forward Gal S., and along the way became one of a very few fillies ever to defeat the redoubtable Xtra Heat.

Unfortunately, there was not a Gold Mover, or even a Golden Hurricane, among the 50 named foals in Gold Fever's second crop, which has still yet to produce a stakes winner. *Porter cont. p6*

Gold Mover's third crop contained Arco's Gold, winner of one of Canada's premier two-year-old events, the Coronation Futurity, but for Kentucky this was too little, too late, and by the time of that win, Gold Fever was headed north to New York's Questroyal Stud. He stood there for 2003, and for 2004 and 2005 has been managed by Questroyal Stables, Inc., but standing at Metropolitan Stud, Pine Plains, New York.

Since his move, Gold Fever has added two more North American stakes winners (he also has two Australian-sired black-type winners), both from his fourth crop. They are Journey Fever, winner of the Pat Whitworth Illinois Debutante S., and A Bit O'Gold, who took his earnings to nearing \$1.6 million with a win in the GII Chinese Cultural Centre S. at Woodbine over the weekend.

Last year's champion three-year-old in Canada, A Bit O'Gold won the final two legs of the Canadian Triple Crown--the Prince of Wales S. and the Breeders' S.--and this year had taken the GIII Dominion Day H. July 1. A Bit O'Gold is out of Annasan, a minor winner by Corporate Report. Annasan was very successfully "married" to Gold Fever for the first three years of her stud career, producing, in succession, Adjahal, a stakes-placed winner of over \$290,000, the previously mentioned stakes winner Arco's Gold, and A Bit O'Gold. A \$15,000 Keeneland January Yearling, Annasan was Broodmare of the Year in Canada for 2004, and was sold for \$400,000 in foal to Sky Mesa at the most recent Keeneland November Sales.

Although Annasan was only a modest winner, she has quite a useful pedigree, as she is half sister to the GIII Churchill Downs H. victor Goldseeker Bud, and to Ashboro, a multiple stakes winner who also took second in the Ballerina H. Her dam, Amber Ryder, won the Illinois Oaks, and was half sister to the dam of the tough Coyote Lakes, winner of three renewals of the GIII Gallant Fox H., two at age seven (when it was run in January and December of the same year) and another at age eight.

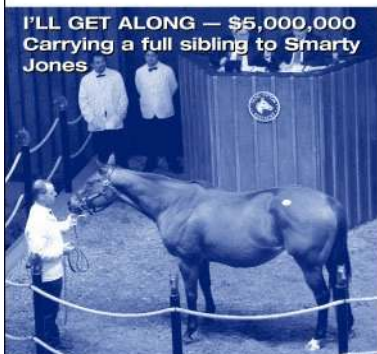
A Bit O'Gold owns about as clever a pedigree pattern as one could want to find, and since his breeders, Beclawat Stable, tried the mating three times in a row, it's a fair conclusion that it didn't come about by accident. We can start with the top and bottom of the pedigree, which shows that A Bit O'Gold's sire is a grandson of Mr. Prospector, while his second dam is by Red Ryder, a brother to Mr. Prospector, thus giving him the siblings 3x3. If we turn to the center of the pedigree, we can note that Gold Fever's granddam, Arabian Dancer, is by Damascus out of a mare by Buckpasser. That makes her a three-quarters relative to Private Account, and that horse also appears in the third generation of the pedigree, as sire of A Bit O'Gold's broodmare sire, Corporate Report.

Finally, Gold Fever's broodmare sire is Majestic Light, who is by Majestic Prince (out of a daughter of the mare Your Hostess) out of a mare by Ribot. This gives him a very similar background to Graustark (by Ribot out of Flower Bowl, a three-parts sister to Your Hostess). Graustark is here as grandsire of the dam of Corporate Report. Given that, from three matings with Gold Fever, Annasan has produced two of Gold Fever's five North American stakes horses, including his highest earner, and another stakes-placed runner, on this occasion we have to tip our hat to the power of the pattern.

River Downs Apprentice Jockey Injured in Monday Spill:

Elizabel Navarro, a 19-year-old apprentice jockey, was hospitalized Monday after being thrown from her mount in the final race at Ohio's River Downs Monday. Navarro was transported to University Hospital in Cincinnati, where she'll remain for an undetermined time. The nature of Navarro's injuries wasn't immediately clear. "I'm better than [Monday], but I don't know my exact situation," said Navarro, a Panamanian native, through an interpreter. "The doctors haven't told me much. I'm in a little bit of pain, my hips hurt and the bottom of my spine [hurts]." Navarro said that she had a headache but no other head trauma, and added that, except for the discomfort it caused her hips, she had no problem moving her legs and arms. The incident occurred as Navarro and her mount, Bibi, turned for home with a clear lead in the one-mile turf race. Navarro hit the five-year-old mare once right-handed, causing Bibi to duck in suddenly and sending the pair through the inside hedge. Bibi was dead by the time track personnel reached her.
