NOW HEAR THIS

Proclamation (Ire) (King's Best), running for the first time in the silks of Princess Haya of Jordan, staked his claim for the crown of Europe's champion miler with an impressive burst of speed which carried him to a premier Group 1 victory in yesterday's Cantor Spreadfair Sussex S. at a not-so-glorious Goodwood. Shrouded in mist, the grey emerged to the front with one furlong remaining and had enough left in the tank to hold the late-closing **Soviet Song (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) by a half length in the one-mile contest. Sheikh Mohammed commented, "He was always within our group, but Princess Haya liked him when he won last time. She saw something in him, a baby that will improve, and I think he will still improve." Winning trainer Jeremy Noseda threw light on likely targets, telling *PA Sport*, "I hope he could run in the Queen Elizabeth II S. and the Breeders' Cup, but I will have to talk to Sheikh Mohammed about that." *Cont, p2*

FOLKLORE TAKES OPENING DAY FEATURE

Folklore (Tiznow) turned in a nice late turn of foot to notch the GII Adirondack S. by 3/4 of a length before a crowd of 25,818 at Saratoga on opening day. The bay began her career with a second-place finish behind **Fifth Avenue** (Monarchos) in a Belmont maiden May 18, then earned her diploma at Big Sandy over **Truart** (Yes It's True) June 3. Stepped up to stakes competi-

tion in her next start, she finished a game second behind **Adieu** (El Corredor) after dueling throughout in the Astoria S. July 3. Backed as the third choice here, she settled in fifth after bobbling at the start while longshot **Truart** set :22.62 and :46.94 fractions. Swung out for the stretch drive by Cornelio Velasquez, **Folklore** fought her way passed the pacesetter and had enough left to hold off a fast-closing **Fifth Avenue**.

Rise to Fame...

Gaining invaluable experience of the course's undulations when winning the Listed Heron S. here May 28, Proclamation overcame a nightmare draw in posting a highly impressive win in the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot at York last time June 15. The only blot on an otherwise unspoilt portfolio was a hard-pulling last of six behind Motivator (GB) in the G2 Dante S. at York May 12, but this victory has confined that slip to memory. Mirroring his slow exit in the Jersey S., the eventual victor was restrained last behind Ad Valorem's pace until inching closer down the hill into the straight. Michael Kinane made the tactically decisive move when pressing the button at the two pole, and the sophomore's immediate acceleration opened a gap on the field approaching the final furlong. That three-length buffer proved enough as the slipstreaming Soviet Song flew all too late, with Ad Valorem keeping on in game fashion for third. "I went a bit sooner than I anticipated because I was going to be the last to play my cards," enthused Kinane. "But the opportunity arose for me to get Johnny [Murtagh on Soviet Song] as he was moving through and I decided to make my move thinking if he could catch me, well and good."

The Song Remains The Same...

James Fanshawe was far from downcast with Soviet Song's runner-up finish and claimed, "She's still the queen, but it looks like Proclamation was the king today. On this holding ground you can't quicken up as well as you can on the quicker ground, but she's run a hell of a race. We wanted to hold her up, which we did, and she settled really well. Proclamation just sprinted clear and then she stayed on again." Of future plans, the trainer indicated the bar will remain at the same height. "I'll see how she comes out of this as we've got the Breeders' Cup in mind for her at the back end [of the season]," he said. "Whether we go for the [G1] Queen Elizabeth II S. [Newmarket Sept. 24], the [G1] Sun Chariot S. [at Newmarket] a week later or the [G1] Matron S. [Leopardstown Sept. 10] on the way, I don't know, but that's the rough plan."

Sir Percy gave indication of higher goals when scoring here on debut May 28 and following up in a conditions event at Salisbury June 23. Upped one panel for this stakes debut, he handled the transition in determined style to retain his unbeaten record, despite connections' concerns about the rain-soaked turf. "It was an unknown thing going into the race, with the ground and I think he is more of a three-year-old than a two-year-old," trainer Marcus Tregoning explained. Breaking smartly from an unfavorable draw, the bay colt was able to cut across and track Black Charmer into the straight and, following instructions to the letter, Dwyer guided Sir Percy down the centre to challenge at the quarter-mile marker. He relinquished his slender advantage when hanging left inside the final furlong, handing the initiative to Black Charmer and Cool Creek, but found his balance just in time to deny that pair in the photo. Of future plans, Tregoning continued, "I don't want to overtax him this year and he'll be getting a break now. 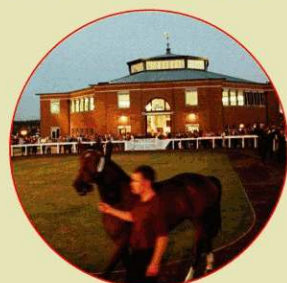
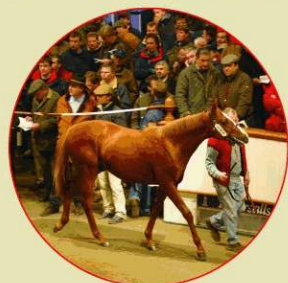

This race does not appear high on Sir Michael Stoute's wish list, but he did win it back in the early days 30 years ago with Girandole (Ger). **Distinction** has the ball firmly in his court this time after his outstanding latest second to Westerner (GB) in the June 16 G1 Ascot Gold Cup at the Royal meeting at York. He has vastly improved since upped to these marathon trips, but his connections were left wondering what could have been after the gelding had suffered a troubled trip when sixth in the G1 Melbourne Cup at Flemington in November. He met trouble again when trailing in the May 6 G3 Ormonde S. on his return at Chester, but rebounded for the career best in the stayers' championship last time. "We were thrilled to bits with his run in the Gold Cup, especially as he had been held up in his preparation with one or two little problems," Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's Racing Manager Harry Herbert told *PA Sport* yesterday. "He's in very good form. The big question is the ground. He ran well on good to soft ground in the Melbourne Cup last year, but this looks like being genuine soft ground. He is a top-of-the-ground performer and he did fail on soft ground when he was younger. He is an older, more mature and much stronger horse now so he may be able to handle it, but we are going into uncharted territory." John Dunlop has two wins on the board and relies on old-stager **Millenary**, who reinvented himself as one of his country's premier stayers last term when completing a hat-trick in the G2 Yorkshire Cup, G2 Doncaster Cup and G3 Jockey Club Cup. While he was below-par when last on his comeback in this year's renewal Yorkshire Cup at York May 13, he showed more to finish fourth last time over an inadequate trip in the July 6 G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket. Mark Johnston, who has won this five times since 1995, saddles a trio in **Winged d'Argent**, **Golden Quest** and **Hearthstead Wings**. The former has stronger claims on his fifth in the Ascot Gold Cup, but has to bounce back from his poor effort when last behind **Lost Soldier Three** in the Listed Silver Cup back at York last time July 9.

MADCAP ESCAPADE RETIRED Bruce Lunsford's Madcap Escapade (Hennessy--Sassy Pants, by Saratoga Six) has suffered a leg injury and has been retired. She will begin her career as a broodmare at Claiborne Farm, according to trainer Frank Brothers. The four-year-old exited her victory in the July 10 GII Princess Rooney H. "a shade off" and was sent to Dr. Larry Bramlage at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, Ky. "She's got just a slight tear of the middle distal sesamoidian ligament," Brothers commented.

"That [MRI test] is the only way that they detected it. It's an injury that can heal somewhat with a lot of time off, but it has a history of re-occurring. It's just not worth the chance with her." Madcap Escapade began her career with four straight victories, including Keeneland's GI Ashland S. She suffered her first career defeat behind Ashado in the GI Kentucky Oaks, and was placed on the sidelines with a hairline fracture of her hip thereafter. The bay returned from the shelf in fine fashion, adding wins in the GII Shirley Jones H. and the GIII Vinery Madison S., before finishing fifth in the GI Humana Distaff H. A winner of seven of nine career starts, Madcap Escapade retires with \$1,052,852 in earnings.

BAGO STRAIGHT TO ARC The Niarchos Family's Bago (Fr) (Nashwan) will head straight to Longchamp for the Oct. 2 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe following his third behind Azamour (Ire) in Saturday's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. Conditioner Jonathan Pease told the *Racing Post* that the four-year-old had come out of the Newbury contest well before revealing that he will not prep for his defence of the autumn showpiece. "He's come home in very good order," he said. "The idea now is to go straight for the Arc without a prep race. If all goes well, he will then go on to the Breeders' Cup [Belmont Park Oct. 29]. SURF CAT TO PACIFIC CLASSIC Trainer Bruce Headley said Tuesday that **Surf Cat** (Sir Cat), the top three-year-old on the West Coast, will not be heading east to take on Afleet Alex in the \$1-million GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park Aug. 7. Headley will instead run the colt in the \$1-million GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar Aug. 21. "The Haskell is a long ways to go and it has been pretty hot out there," the 71-year-old horseman explained. "The Pacific Classic is on our home court--and it is Del Mar, after all." First or second in all six career starts, Surf Cat cruised to a five-length victory in the GII Swaps S. going the Haskell distance of nine panels at Hollywood Park July 9. He stretches out to a mile and a quarter while facing older horses for the first time in the Pacific Classic, but those two factors weren't enough to convince Headley to pack his bags for Monmouth. SAN SIRO UNDER FIRE

Milan, the "Scala" of the Italian tracks, brought the curtain down on its spring-summer meeting July 17 in the face of criticism about the state of the track. With scrutiny most fierce during the week of the G1 Gran Premio di Milano and G1 Oaks d'Italia in June, when a handful of horses suffered lameness and two broke down on the track, officials have moved to defend the San Siro. According to the racing paper *Lo Sportsman*, the hugely influential brothers Alduino and Giuseppe Botti are keen to leave their Milan base and move all operations to their private training center in Tuscany. Dr. Francesco Ruffo della Scaletta of Trenno Spa, which owns the track, was playing down the fears. "When a horse breaks down, it is sad for everybody and we always take care of our grass track," he said. "The incidents were accidental, as checked and then confirmed by the stewards acting on those days and we are trying to keep Milan at the best standard possible. I can understand the Botti brothers' disappointment at losing one horse, but I'm sure they'll keep their base here." Ruffo is positive about the first part of the season, which reconvenes after a 52-day break Sept. 3. "We lost nine percent in the outside betting pool and five percent on the track, but we had to host six percent less racing due to the Unire cut in prize money," he added. "Its not an easy time for racing in the country and these numbers are similar to other tracks in Italy. The Oaks was a success in attracting foreign raiders, considering that 20 percent of prizemoney was cut for all group races. We have to remember that the Derby in Rome didn't have any foreign runners. I like to be positive--our autumn meet will be good, and in October, we'll host the high-class racing that this track deserves."

LIVORNO TO CLOSE

Livorno's 6½-furlong turf track looks set to close in a year's time, bringing an end to 111 years of history. The seaside venue has suffered from Unire's cuts in prize money of €500,000 representing 20 percent of the gross and cuts of €600,000 against the management of the training center, making it impossible to maintain the track, half of which is owned by Livorno Town Council. "We are a no-profit company and have always reinvested any income, but with this cut we would be forced into major debts within a few years and we can't do that," commented the Labronica Course President Avvocato Andrea Ghezzi. "I simply don't understand Unire's decision. Apart from the cuts, they obliged us to host three afternoon meetings in June, which cost us 90 percent of our business." Livorno, renowned for its evening races under floodlights, hosts the Handicap Principale Coppa del Mare and Listed Criterium Labronico for juveniles in August 14, won two years ago by the subsequent G2 Premio Regina Elena (Italian 1000 Guineas) winner Rumba Loca (Ire).
