AFLEET ALEX INJURED

Cash Is King's **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet) has been injured and will miss the Aug. 7 GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park, but he is expected to return to the races this fall. The GI Preakness and GI Belmont S. winner suffered a condylar fracture of the left front cannon bone and underwent surgery Wednesday.

"[Trainer Tim Ritchey] took him to the track Tuesday morning and, when he got back to the barn, he wasn't quite right," said Cash Is King's managing partner Chuck Zacney. "They did preliminary X-rays at Belmont Park and saw a shadow. He was taken to New Jersey Equine Clinic Wednesday morning and Dr. Patty Hogan saw a slight fracture on the X-ray. The surgery took about 35 minutes." Hogan inserted a single screw into the colt's cannon bone. If all goes well, Afleet Alex will be training again in four-to-six weeks, and will be readied for the Oct. 29 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Belmont Park. "He's doing good and the prognosis is good," Zacney said. "This really is just a minor setback. From what we are hearing so far, he has an excellent chance to return to the races. Our intention is to get one prep race into him this fall and then run in the Classic. That's the plan in a perfect world." Afleet Alex was scheduled to return to Belmont Park yesterday. "I look forward to Alex's return to the races," Tim Ritchey added. "The book isn't over...there are still more chapters to be written to this story. I believe he will overcome this bump in the road. With the expertise of Dr. Hogan and the New Jersey Equine Clinic, as well as the consultation with one of the most elite vets in the world, Dr. Larry Bramlage, I believe we can formulate a plan that will have Alex back racing at his previous level."

SPECIAL VICTORY FOR HENNY HUGHES

Henny Hughes (Hennessy) proved that a six-length romp at Monmouth June 17 and a 15-length procession in the July 4 Tremont S. was no fluke when he strode away to an impressive victory in Thursday's GII Saratoga Special S. at Saratoga Racecourse. Sent off the well-backed 4-5 choice over the much-hyped **Master of Disaster** (Dance Master), who wowed Delaware patrons with a 13 1/4-length victory in a July 23 maiden May 10, Henny Hughes made it to the front early, maintained a comfortable lead throughout and galloped home an easy 3 3/4-length winner. According to Biancone, the chestnut is likely to make his next start in the GI Hopeful S. Aug. 27. (cont. p2)

"He was just playing around in the paddock," said trainer Patrick Biancone, explaining Henny Hughes antics prior to yesterday's Special. "But he wasn't sweating or nervous. He just wanted to be the boss-- and he was the boss on the racetrack." Not quite as calm as the colt's trainer during the lead up to the race, Gary Stevens' worries were laid to rest in the race. "I think the most nerve-racking part was in the paddock," he said. "But he was very professional once they got the saddle on him and he got on the track."

ROSE IN MAY READIES FOR SARATOGA BC

Dubai World Cup hero **Roses in May** (Devil His Due) breezed five furlongs in 1:00 flat at Saratoga Thursday in preparation for his next start in the GI Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. Aug. 21. Retired Hall of Fame jockey Angel Cordero Jr. was aboard for the work. "I wanted to give him a little bit more time to recover from the Dubai trip," said owner Ken Ramsey, explaining the decision to pass on trying for a repeat victory in the GI Whitney H. "He knows when he is out there for a gallop and when he's out there for a work," said Cordero. "Once he knew he was out there for a work, he really wanted to go. I really had to pull him up afterwards. He's very strong and sound."

STELLAR JAYNE TO BYPASS GO FOR WAND

Godolphin's **Stellar Jayne** (Wild Rush), impressive winner of the Misty Galore S. at Belmont July 2, will not participate in the GI Go For Wand H. at Saratoga as previously planned. "She didn't finish as well as we would have liked in her last work [going six furlongs in 1:17 at Belmont July 27]," said Rick Mettee, who oversees the Godolphin operation in New York for trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "She was a little stiff behind the next day." The four-year-old, third in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff Oct. 29, will likely make her next appearance in the GI Ruffian H. Sept. 11 before another tilt at the Distaff at Belmont Park Oct. 29.

Distinction booked his ticket for another attempt at the G1 Melbourne Cup Nov. 1 in securing this stayers' prize. After winning the Listed Silver Cup H. at York and Listed Troy S. at Doncaster, he was sent down under to contest last year's Australian showpiece, where he ran a creditable sixth after a troubled trip. He returned to Chester and found more trouble in the May 6 G3 Ormonde S. when sixth before recording a career-best when runner up to Westerner (GB) last time in the June 16 G1 Ascot Gold Cup at the Royal meeting. Keeping the leaders in his sights this time, Michael Kinane positioned Distinction in fourth before allowing his mount to commit with a full half-mile to go. "I was traveling really good, although we were worried about the ground and I didn't want to break his rhythm so I let him flow," he explained. Pushed along to maintain a searching gallop approaching the final quarter-mile, he dug deep under a maximum drive to repel the determined runner-up. "You have to have a lot of confidence and conviction to do what [Adrian] did," the conditioner commented. "One of my ex-owners rang me to suggest digging right, so we dug right and got lucky."

Tartouche's last-time third to Gonbarda (Ger) in the G3 Alice-Cup at Hamburg July 1 took on added luster when the latter annexed last Sunday's G1 Deutschlandpreis at Dusseldorf. Any worries about the softened turf for the lightly raced four-year-old proved unfounded as she bounded clear before knuckling down to hold Without a Trace for a first stakes success.

"Lady Herries asked me about the ground and I said it wouldn't be a problem so she told me 'On your head be it then,'" explained her relieved jockey Seb Sanders. Settled off the pace in third as Bowstring (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) set a testing gallop, she made a rapid move to swoop past that rival at the quarter-mile marker. Daylight was soon established, but Sanders worked hard to grind out the victory inside the final furlong as Without a Trace reduced the gap and last year's winner Astrocharm ran on from rear. "[Tartouche] got the trip extremely well and handled the conditions well," her rider added. "I was in front soon enough, but when the hare dropped down in front of me I had to get on."

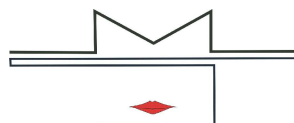

"Nobody knows how he is going to handle the ground, because he's never run in soft ground, but the trip shouldn't be a problem," conditioner Tim Easterby told *PA Sport*. "I think he'll handle it and if he does I'd be very hopeful, but you never know until you try." **Green Pride** and **Mutawajid** represent the connections successful in 1992 and the latter recorded a highly respectable time when winning a July 6 conditions event at Newmarket.

RECORD KEENELAND SEPTEMBER CATALOG

Keeneland will catalog a record 5,110 horses for its annual September Yearling, which runs from Sept. 12 through Sept. 26. There will be no selling Sept. 16, but sessions will begin daily at 10 a.m. The catalog includes 2,668 colts, 2,440 fillies and two geldings. It is 219 more horses than the previous record 4,891, cataloged for last year's auction. "The September Yearling Sale continues to gain in popularity because buyers can find depth in all price ranges," said Keeneland director of sales Geoffrey Russell. "The record number of horses this year can be attributed to the ever-expanding number of horses in the middle market." While print catalogs will not be available until Aug. 22, the on-line version will be available Aug. 8 and Keeneland will be distributing a booklet preview of the sale late next week.

RETIRED THOROUGHBREDS FIND NEW

CAREERS Two retired racehorses from the Maker's Mark Secretariat Center, operated by the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, have been adopted by the Atlanta Police Department's Mounted Patrol Unit and have begun their retraining in Georgia for their new careers. The unit, disbanded in 2002 due to budget cuts, reached out to the horse industry to find owners and breeders willing to donate horses in an attempt to reestablish a mounted police force in the city, and currently has a goal of ultimately creating a team of 16 geldings. Representatives from the group visited the Secretariat Center in Lexington July 19 and selected Harbor the Dream (Boston Harbor), a six-year-old gelding who went winless in 14 starts; and the eight-year-old gelding Walinsky (Two Punch), who won four races in his two-year career. The horses left Kentucky the following day to begin their training in Atlanta. Steven Sansone, Volunteer Chair of the Mounted Patrol Unit Initiative and President of Long Grove Bloodstock, LLC in Atlanta, spearheaded the charge to find suitable donated horses. "As an advocate of both the Thoroughbred and Standardbred Retirement Foundations, I have access to great animals who deserve a second career," said Sansone. "I am genuinely pleased to take an active role in this incredibly worthwhile program that responds to the needs of our community, the horse industry, and all animal lovers everywhere."

YORK OPTION FOR ESWARAH Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's **Eswarah (GB)** (Unfuwain) may be aimed at the Aug. 17 G1 Yorkshire Oaks at York, connections revealed yesterday. The G1 Epsom Oaks heroine was a disappointing eighth in Saturday's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Newbury, but trainer Michael Jarvis believes there may have been excuses.
