DAY CALLS IT A CAREER

Hall of Fame rider Pat Day officially announced his retirement from the saddle yesterday at Churchill Downs. The veteran reinsman retires as the all-time leader in career earnings with \$297,912,019 and is currently ranked fourth on the victories list with 8,803 wins. He has seen limited action this year after undergoing hip surgery in March. "The major factor was just a loss of enthusiasm," Day explained yesterday. "In early March we discovered the problem with my hip and it was correctable and that kind of pumped new blood in me. Then there was the challenge to get through the operation and rehab and it was followed by the challenge to get back to

riding, and that was decidedly rewarding. But I've discovered that the challenge to get back was more enjoyable than getting back. It became apparent to me that the joy of participating and the thrill of victory had sort of lost its luster." During his 32-year career, Day won the 1992 Kentucky Derby aboard Lil E. Tee, as well as five Preakness S. and three Belmont S. He rode in a record 21 consecutive Kentucky Derbys, won 12 Breeders' Cup races and was a four-time Eclipse Award winner as the country's top jockey. Asked for the personal highlights of his storied career, Day said, "Obviously the first win of my career back in 1973 on Forblunged at Prescott Downs and Dan's Woof Woof in '82 when I secured the national riding title on races won. Wild Again in 1984 in the inaugural Breeders' Cup Classic. I think that victory really took my career to the next level and opened doors of opportunity to participate in races at that level. And certainly Lil E. Tee in the Derby stands out above them all." The 52-year-old Colorado native will now refocus his energy on his work with the Racetrack Chaplaincy of America. "At this juncture, I'm not being called to leave the industry--I'm merely giving up my tack," Day said. "I'm no longer participating as a jockey, but I will still be involved in the racing industry that's been so incredibly good to me and my family for 32 years. Though I might not be seen and as visible as I once was, I'm still hopefully going to be a positive contributing part of the community."

EIGHT ENTERED FOR HASKELL

The sophomore division, on hiatus since the Belmont S., heats up again Sunday at Monmouth Park with the \$1-million GI Haskell Invitational H. A field of eight three-year-olds was entered yesterday for the nine-furlong event and GII Dwyer S. winner **Roman Ruler** (Fusaichi Pegasus) was promptly installed the 9-5 morning-line favorite. "He's doing really well right now," trainer Bob Baffert said of the early Haskell choice. "He showed his brilliance last year. He's coming back to that form. His Dwyer race was fantastic off a layoff, he beat a really nice horse [in subsequent GII Jim Dandy S. winner Flower Alley]. That horse came back and won. He's doing better now than he was for that race, so we're really excited." Baffert has already won two Hasskells: he captured Monmouth's signature race with Point Given in 2001 and with War Emblem in 2002. Roman Ruler will break from post four Sunday. **Sun King** (Charismatic), who drew post five yesterday, is the 5-2 second choice on the morning line. The Tracy Farmer colorbearer is coming off a front-running 5 3/4-length victory in the GIII Leonard Richards S. at Delaware Park July 17 and he also was on the lead when he captured the Mar. 19 GIII Tampa Bay Derby, but Farmer's racing manager Lincoln Collins does not think the colt needs to be at the head of affairs to win. "I think in both cases where he went to the lead, he went to the lead because that's just the way the race happened more than any specific plan," Collins commented. "But I think he'll lie within striking distance and then we'll see where we go." **Full field p2**

BANK AUDIT HEADLINES HONORABLE MISS

Bank Audit (Wild Rush), looking for her third graded win of the year, is the likely favorite in today's GII Honorable Miss H. at Saratoga. The filly won the GII Distaff Breeders' Cup H. at Aqueduct in March and added a narrow victory over Sensibly Chic in the GII Genuine Risk H. two starts later at Belmont May 14. She is coming off a runner-up finish behind Sensibly Chic in the June 12 GII Vagrancy H. The Honorable Miss will be Bank Audit's first start at the Spa, but that isn't worrying trainer Frank LaBocchetta Jr. "She loves it up here," LaBocchetta said. "She is training real good. We freshened her up after last race and she is a nice, fresh horse right now." **Cont. p2**

DAYDREAMING RETIRED Ogden Mills Phipps' **Daydreaming** (A.P. Indy-Get Lucky, by Mr. Prospector) has been retired from racing, trainer Shug McGaughey confirmed yesterday. "She has the start of medial condylar fracture in her back cannon bone," the conditioner explained. "We don't have to do anything but give her four weeks stall rest and four weeks of walking, but by then it will be too late [to make a significant stakes race]," he added. Produced by the Mr. Prospector mare Get Lucky, Daydreaming came to hand late last year, with a victory against her own sex in the GIII Indiana Breeders' Cup Oaks in October and versus her elders in the GII Top Flight H. the following month. She was also the runner-up to Stellar Jayne in the GI Gazelle H. last fall. The bay had one win from five starts this season, a one-length tally in the GIII Next Move H. in March. Daydreaming, a full sister to the late GSW Accelerator, retires with a record of 16-7-2-2 and earnings of \$696,680.

ROMAN RULER TO BE RETIRED AT YEAR'S END

Fog City Stable principal Bill Bianco confirmed yesterday that **Roman Ruler** (Fusaichi Pegasus), the morning-line favorite for Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park, will be retired at the end of the year to stand stud in 2006. Bianco indicated a farm has been chosen for the flashy son of leading second-crop sire Fusaichi Pegasus, but declined to say where Roman Ruler would stand. "We've already made plans to have him picked up on Dec. 31st," Bianco commented. Roman Ruler made an immediate impact as a juvenile, romping to wins in the GII Best Pal S. and GII Norfolk S. for trainer Bob Baffert. Foot bruises compromised his chances when fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and eventually forced him off the Triple Crown trail, but he returned with verve with a game tally over GII Jim Dandy S. winner Flower Alley in the GII Dwyer S. at Belmont July 4. Fog City Stable, made up of Bianco and David Shimmon, announced it was disbanding earlier this year and has sold off many of its horses, including GISW Buzzards Bay, who was knocked down for \$725,000 at last month's Fasig-Tipton July sale. Bianco said that he would retain 16 shares in Roman Ruler, though he was unsure what Shimmon had planned. After last year's Breeders' Cup, Roman Ruler had an undescended testicle removed, which veterinarians said at the time would not compromise his ability to stand as a stallion. Roman Ruler, out of the Silver Deputy mare Silvery Swan, is a half brother to freshman sire El Corredor. To date, he has won four of seven starts and earned \$420,800.

Spa Handle Streak Ends:

Saratoga Race Course's streak of consecutive days where commingled handle reached at least \$10 million ended at 82 on Wednesday afternoon when the figure was \$9,338,636. Two steeplechase races and an afternoon thunderstorm that briefly knocked out power and knocked the seventh race off the turf were two factors that contributed to the decline, according to New York Racing Association officials. Patrick Mahony, NYRA's vice president of mutuel operations, estimated that the power outage likely resulted in a loss in handle of between \$60-70,000 for the fifth race. But one Spa streak did continue Wednesday. On-track attendance was over 10,000 for the 227th consecutive day when 16,921 fans turned out at the historic oval.

A hard-fought nose was all that separated the three-year-old daughters of A. P Jet Karakorum Splendor and Avery Hall at the line here. The former, victress of the restricted Fifth Avenue S. last year, won by five lengths over statebred NW2X foes at Belmont May 11, ran second in an open NW2X June 4 and romped by 5 1/4 in a similar test in the slop July 8. Under jockey John Velazquez, the bay, rank early, attended the pace of New Jersey-bred Avery Hall through a half in :48.44 and three-quarters in 1:14.11. 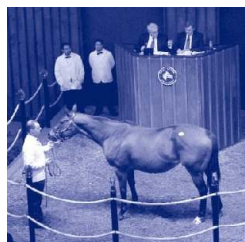

YORKSHIRE OAKS BUBBLING UP

His Highness The Aga Khan's **Shawanda (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}), impressive winner of the G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh July 17, will point to an eagerly awaited renewal of the G1 Yorkshire Oaks at York Aug. 17, but she must have ground no faster than good, according to trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre. "Shawanda came out of her race in Ireland very well but I must have good ground for her," he told the *Racing Post*, adding, "I heard they put sand on the track for the [Royal] Ascot meeting in June, so I shall be keeping a very close watch on the going. It won't be easy for Shawanda as she will be meeting older fillies for the first time." The filly and mare showpiece will take on added luster with G1 Epsom Oaks winner **Eswarah (GB)** (Unfuwain) and Irish Oaks runner-up **Playful Act (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) also mooted as possibles for the line up. "[Playful Act] goes to York, touch wood. I don't think John [Gosden] has done a lot with her since The Curragh, but she's come out of the race fine and we are looking at the Yorkshire Oaks," Ben Sangster told *PA Sport*, adding, "There aren't many opportunities for her, if you've got a mile-and-a-half filly then that's the race to go for. We would be worried about taking on Shawanda again, but that would not stop us running. If Shawanda turns up then so be it. It would also be interesting to see Eswarah back after the King George." A decision on Eswarah's participation will not be confirmed until nearer the race, but she looks set to bypass the G1 Juddmonte International a day earlier according to racing manager Angus Gold.

ORATORIO TO MISS YORK PERFORMANCE

Aidan O'Brien's G1 Eclipse S. winner **Oratorio (Ire)** (Danehill) will miss the G1 Juddmonte International, at York Aug. 16, as he has endured a troubled preparation for the extended 10-furlong contest, but the Ballydoyle stable may send in **Ace (Ire)** (Danehill) as substitute. "[Oratorio] will start off cantering later this week, but York is going to come too soon for him," the conditioner told *Racing Post*. "We'll see how he comes along before making plans for later in the season. [Ace] is in good form and we'll certainly be having a look at the Juddmonte for him," he added.

"We are excited to be standing Danroad in 2006," Hedgeholme Stud owner Andrew Spalding commented. "He is one of Danehill's best-looking sons out of a mare by the great international campaigner Strawberry Road and he has been well received by breeders in New Zealand."
