Blood-Horse

SHORTER, BUT HOPEFULLY SWEETER

Despite a catalogue of just 153 horses, the smallest since the 162 booked for the 1998 sale, officials at Fasig-Tipton are confident ahead of its Saratoga Selected Yearling Sale, which kicks off this evening at 7:30 p.m. "We are very confident in a good sale," said Fasig-Tipton Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer Boyd Browning. "I think we have a very good group of horses on the grounds, and we're very pleased with the folks we've seen on the grounds actively looking and seemingly interested in looking at horses. All the feedback we've gotten from the buyers has been very positive and we're very optimistic." The sales grounds, located just north of the racetrack, were teeming with activity yesterday afternoon, with representatives of Coolmore, Sheikh Mohammed, a gaggle of pinhookers and several other end users hard at work. And they will have a typically strong group of horses to bid on. Sires represented in the catalogue include Awesome Again, Belong to Me, Carson City, Deputy Minister, Distorted Humor, Dixieland Band, El Prado (Ire), Elusive Quality, Forestry, Forest Wildcat, Fusaichi Pegasus, Giant's Causeway, Gone West, Grand Slam, Gulch, More Than Ready, Mr. Greeley, Silver Deputy, Storm Cat, Successful Appeal, Tale of the Cat, Thunder Gulch, perennial Saratoga favorite Unbridled's Song, and Yes It's True. Also in the mix are youngsters from a formidable roster of newer stallions, including Buddha, Came Home, El Corredor, Five Star Day, Include, Officer, Orientate, Songandaprayer and Yonaguska.

Strength....But Not Necessarily in Numbers...

In stark contrast to the Fasig-Tipton July sale, where it was widely held that the supply of nearly 700 horses outweighed the demand, the Saratoga sale will be a much more compact affair. "The numbers are a reflection of the horses we thought fit into the sale this year," Browning explained. "We don't set out with a predetermined number--we take the number of horses we think fit into the marketplace and this year we came up with 153. We would have liked to have had a few more, but we are very, very comfortable and confident that the ones that are in this sale will sell very well and that's how we approach it." *Cont p2*

T.D. VANCE HOLDS ON TO FAME

T.D. Vance (Rahy), dismissed at 16-1 by the Saratoga faithful, prevailed by a determined nose in yesterday's GII National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame S. The three-year-old gelding was fourth behind the talented English Channel in the May 21 Woodlawn S. at Pimlico and was just nosed out of a win in the June 19 Restoration S. at Monmouth Park before securing a 1 1/2-length victory in the July 16 Toronto Cup S. last time out at Woodbine. The bay sat just off pacesetting **High Limit**

(Maria's Mon) through fractions of :23 2/5, :47 1/5, 1:11 1/5. He took charge in upper stretch and won the head bob over **Silver Whistle** (Alphabet Soup) as High Limit tired to fourth. "The horse is very talented," said winning trainer H. Graham Motion. "Every race has been a progression to this race to get him to settle. He showed a lot of ability." Adapting to a Dynamic Marketplace...

Typically held over the course of three sessions, this year's event will be conducted over two evenings, a reflection on current trends in the marketplace, according to Browning. "Thirty years ago, the dynamics were completely different than they are today," he explained. "This sale and a lot sales in the world were dominated by folks who had a stable of horses or who summered at Saratoga and 90 percent of your buyers had a house here and intended to stay here for a week or longer to buy horses. Today, you have a very professional buying audience, some of which is based in Saratoga, but an awful lot of which is not based in Saratoga. The buying base is from all over the United States and, frankly, all over the world; we have received some feedback in recent years that there was not enough activity to merit a longer sale, so we made a decision to shorten it from three nights to two nights to try to allow people, both consignors and buyers, but mostly buyers, to be able to get more activity done and to spend less time on the road, away from home. I think the change has been received very well and has been very positive."

The Year that Was...

In a sales atmosphere that was generally characterized by ebullience, last year's Saratoga sale failed to generate the fireworks some might have expected. While the average crossed the \$300,000 barrier for the fourth time in five years, it was off by 2.7 percent from the 2003 figure. Five horses achieved seven-figure price tags and another 19 made over \$500,000. Despite a perceived "under-performance," Browning was not overly concerned. "I thought last year we had a pretty dog-gone good horse sale," he offered. "The average declined just a little bit and the RNA rate was exceptionally low [21.4 percent]. We missed a couple of top-end horses to propel the average, but horse for horse, horses sold very well last year and they're going to sell well again this year." He continued, "That's one of the trends you try to look for--what's your long-term clearance rate and do you have any major bobbles, and we don't really consider last year a bobble."

The average declined minutely, but it's the difference in one major horse being sold for a lot of money or not. We all get too hung up in the obvious statistic, which is average and which may not completely reflect the health or strength of a sale. Last year was a great marketplace."

A Giant for Manfuso...

Robert Manfuso, who operates Chanceland Farm in West Friendship, Maryland, is set for a big evening tonight at Saratoga. The veteran horseman, along with partner Katy Voss, consign hip 25, the first foal from Manfuso's homebred Belterra. A daughter of Unbridled, Belterra defeated Take Charge Lady in the GII Golden Rod S. in 2001 and was third in the GI Ashland S. and the GII Bonnie Miss S. at three. She was retired to stud in 2003 with four wins from seven starts and earnings of \$324,859. Hopes are sky high at Barn 4 South for this son of Giant's Causeway. "He's been real popular and he's had a lot of looks," said Tom Cashman, farm manager at Chanceland. "Some people have come by two or three times, which is a good sign. He's got the breeding and all the right parts--he's a good-looking colt and we have our fingers crossed. He's a really athletic-looking colt and he's got a great walk about him, but he's really bounced up. He's a good size, he's not overly big, but he's just the right size. He's the kind they look for." Cashman also had a hand in raising the mare, but says this colt is unlike his dam. "Belterra was a little more scopey, a little more rangy than he is," he explained, but adds, "He's a very intelligent colt, he learns right away and he's very willing; I hate to see him go."

Big Gamble for Eldon Farm...

Eldon Farm Equine, owned by Mr. & Mrs. Kenneth Luke of Keswick, Virginia, have emerged on the scene in the last few years, purchasing well-related fillies to construct a broodmare band. Last September at Keeneland, the couple purchased, among others, a Capote half sister to Smoke Glacken and a Storm Cat half sister to Escena. They were also active at the Fasig-Tipton July sale, going to \$340,000 for a Gone West granddaughter of MGISW Dispute. However, it is a colt by Mr. Greeley, catalogued as hip 73, which flies the Eldon flag at tonight's opening session. Out of the Raja Baba mare Hard Knocker, the chestnut, a \$440,000 Keeneland November weanling purchase, is a three-parts brother to GSW and GISP Chimichurri (Elusive Quality) and a half to German Listed winner Huambo (Green Dancer). "He's highly athletic, he has the walk and he'll be purchased by somebody who's very serious about winning big races," commented Brian Graves, who works in the yearling sales division for consignor Gainesway. "He's very forward and very mature and a free-moving individual. Horses like that are always going to be in the top of their class and we hope he'll do well."

Powerful Updates for Glencrest...

There's nothing like well-timed catalogue updates. Just ask Glencrest Farm's David Greathouse, who, under the banner of Four Star Sales, consigns two horses with good updates. Hip 37 is a full brother to Battle Won (Honour and Glory), upset winner of the GII Churchill Downs H. on Derby Day and most recently second in the GI Bing Crosby H. at Del Mar. The similarities are striking, Greathouse says. "He's just like his brother and I expect him to sell well," he explained. "He's a very athletic and nice horse. Chuck Simon, who trains Battle Won, says if you put them in a stall next to one another, except for the fact that the one was older and a little bigger, you wouldn't know the difference between the two--they're made exactly the same." Greathouse is realistic, yet optimistic, about his colt's chances. "We don't have any million-dollar expectations, but for a good-bred Honour and Glory he'll sell well." Glencrest is also the owner of hip 81, which sells tomorrow evening. The bay daughter of Smart Strike is a half sister to Adieu (El Corredor), winner of the Astoria S. and a troubled fourth in the GII Adirondack S. at Saratoga. She is also kin to Clay's Rocket (American Chance), who since the catalogue won a Delaware allowance last month and was third in that track's Make Me Conquer S. last weekend.

Hill 'n' Dale stallion Buddha is off to a flying start in the sales ring, as a half dozen of his first crop yearlings sold for six-figure price tags at FTK July. Valiant Jewel, a dual stakes winner of nearly \$300,000, has produced five winners from six to race, including Friendly Michelle (Artax), winner of the GI Prioress S. in 2004, and MSP Abba Gold (Devil's Bag).

Hip 13, c, Forestry--Adormicol, by Gone West

 B-Brushwood Stable (PA)

Elizabeth Moran went to \$600,000 to acquire Adormicol in utero at the 1999 Keeneland November sale. Carrying a foal from the first crop of champion Vindication, that mare was resold at last year's November sale for \$475,000 to the bid of Dapple Bloodstock. Adormicol has since produced a filly. This Mar. 12 foal is very similarly bred to Adcat (Storm Cat), a Grade III winner of \$435,597.

Hip 16, f, Forest Wildcat--Alizea, by Premiership
 Consigned by Taylor Made Sales, agent
 B-Summer Wind Farm (KY)

Alizea, the dam of leading 2005 freshman sire Songandaprayer, was purchased by the Summer Wind Farm of Laura Jane and Frank Lyon for \$850,000 at Keeneland November in 2000 and has subsequently dropped three foals, which have made back most of that investment. This is the second foal from the mare by a son of Storm Cat. Expletive (Exploit), her 2001 produce, made \$350,000 at this venue the following year.

Hip 22, f, More Than Ready--Audacious, by Manila
 Consigned by Taylor Made Sales, agent

With a plethora of stakes winners in 2005, More Than Ready sits in a prominent fourth on the list of leading second-crop sires. Represented this year by the good fillies Ready's Gal, Ready and Alluring and Portsea, he is the sire of this Feb. 16 foal, who hails from the family of undefeated First Samurai. That son of Giant's Causeway took a tough allowance race this past Sunday in 1:10 1/5, just a tick slower than that afternoon's GII Amsterdam S.

Winner of the GIII Santa Ysabel S., the filly was also second in the GII Fantasy S. and GII Hollywood Oaks and third in that year's GI Kentucky Oaks. From the family of French Deputy and Princess Mitterand, she was also runner-up in the GI Vanity H. and GI Milady BC H. at age four. This is her first foal.

Another first-crop stallion who made a very favorable impression at FTK July, with five yearlings which made \$100,000-plus. The Apr. 27 foal was purchased for \$150,000 as a weanling, the top price among 23 foals to sell by his sire in 2004.

ZITO ENTERS HALL OF FAME Trainer Nick Zito was officially inducted into the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame yesterday in front of a standing-room only crowd at the Fasig-Tipton Sales Pavilion. Also inducted as members of the 50th anniversary class of the Hall of Fame were three steeplechase stars: trainer Sidney Watters Jr., rider Tommy Walsh and five-time champion Lone-some Glory. During his induction speech, Zito recalled sneaking into Aqueduct as a youngster. "What a feeling I got when I saw those owners in the walking ring," Zito said. "It was scary, looking at those great people and those great horses. I knew that was what I wanted to do, that was my life. But it was hard work and I had to find a way to get into the paddock." Zito opened his public stable in 1972 with two horses. As of yesterday, the 57-year-old

Brooklyn native had won 1,420 races with purse money of \$71,119,670. He won the 1991 Kentucky Derby with Strike the Gold and the 1994 Derby with Go For Gin. In 1996, Zito saddled Louis Quatorze to win the Preakness and he won the Belmont S. last year with Birdstone. "For all of us in this room, we're lucky to be in this game, but it's not just for us," Zito said yesterday. "It's for the fans, the racing fans. With the help of God, I say today I am the luckiest fan alive." Zito was presented the award by his son Alexander and breeder-owner John Hettinger, who has employed Zito as a trainer for 23 years. This was the first year inductees were required to receive at least 75 percent of the votes cast to qualify for induction. Previously, the leading vote-getter in each category was inducted. Zito was the only nominee in the flat racing division to receive the required percentage.

ROMAN RULER WILL STAND AT HILL 'N' DALE

Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational H. winner **Roman Ruler** (Fusaichi Pegasus) will stand stud at Hill 'n' Dale Farm at the conclusion of his racing career. Trainer Bob Baffert and owners David Shimmon and Bill Bianco have not yet determined when the three-year-old will retire. "We are excited about the prospects of this talented and royally bred racehorse," said John Sikura, president of Hill 'n' Dale Farm. "He brings all the prerequisites of a serious sire to stud with him. He was a brilliant two-year-old, he was precocious, he can carry speed a distance of ground, he is a Grade I millionaire, a great-looking horse and his half brother El Corredor is off to a brilliant start at stud." As a juvenile, Roman Ruler won the GII Norfolk S. and the GII Best Pal S. This term, he has won the GII Dwyer S. and the Haskell. To date, he has won five of eight starts for earnings of \$1,020,800.

MR. LIGHT TO MILL RIDGE **Mr. Light (Arg)**

(Numerous--Luminare {Arg}, by Forlitano {Arg}) has been purchased by Mill Ridge Farm and will take up stud duties at the Lexington farm in 2006. Mr. Light set a new world record for the mile at Gulfstream when he blitzed the distance in 1:31.41 in a Jan. 3 allowance. The six-year-old won this year's GIII Poker H. and GII Appleton H. while racing for Earle Mack. He is also a Group 2 winner in his native Argentina and is a full brother to Grade I winner Miss Loren (Arg). "We all know milers have historically made good sires and here is one with world-record speed, bred on a cross that has already worked extremely well," said Mill Ridge director of stallion marketing Bayne Welker, Jr. "Mr. Light's trainer, Hall of Famer Angel Penna, has nothing but praise for this horse and he was one of the attributing factors that led us to make the decision to stand him." On the board in nine of 14 North American races, Mr. Light won five times and earned \$244,600. He will stand for a fee of \$6,500, live foal payable Nov. 1.

The leading earning son of Carson City was a consistent runner through

three seasons, winning six of 23 starts and hitting the board 17 times. Todd Pletcher, who trained Pollard's Vision throughout his career, said, "Pollard was tough, durable and consistent--a real warrior, the type of horse everyone would want to own. He gave you everything he had every time he went over there. I would love to have a barn full of his kind." Pollard's Vision scored his biggest victory at three in the GII Illinois Derby, winning in wire-to-wire fashion. He also captured the GIII Lone Star Derby and GIII Leonard Richards S. that year and notched seconds in the GII Ohio Derby, GII Pennsylvania Derby, and GIII West Virginia Derby. His four-year-old season included a win over Badge of Silver in the GIII National Jockey Club H., a second to Eddington in the GI Pimlico Special and a third in the GI Suburban H. Pollard's Vision hails from the family of Blue Hen mare Chris Evert and multiple Grade I winner Sightseek. His dam, the Dixieland Band mare Etats Unis, is out of GI Kentucky Oaks runner-up Hometown Queen and is a full sister to millionaire and GSW Bowman's Band. Stud plans will be announced shortly.

WANDO TO LANE'S END Canada's 2003 Horse of the Year and champion three-year-old **Wando** (Langfuhr-Kathie's Colleen, by Woodman) will begin his stud career next year at Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. The five-year-old swept the Canadian Triple Crown, as well as winning the 2002 GII Grey Breeders' Cup S. and the 2003 GIII Marine S. He was on the board in 15 of 23 starts, with 11 victories and earnings of \$2,063,038 for owner and breeder Gustav Schickedanz. A stud fee has not yet been announced.

Bailey Takes Off Monday Mounts:

Hall of Fame rider Jerry Bailey took off his mounts Monday after he was hit in the face by his mount, Performing Diva, in the post parade of the fourth race. "The filly threw her head back and caught me," Bailey explained. "I don't know if my nose is broken or not, but it is pretty sore and swollen. I took several stitches [on the bridge of the nose and cheek]; fortunately, Dr. [Richard] Alfred was in the paddock and he was right there to tend me." Bailey added that he would get X-rays tomorrow. Performing Diva, a first-time two-year-old starter for trainer Bill Mott, ran loose after throwing Bailey and was collared by an outrider.

Haskell Runners Ship to Spa:

Roman Ruler (Fusaichi Pegasus), fresh from his win in Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational H., shipped to Saratoga yesterday. "He came out of the race just fine," said trainer Bob Baffert. "I'm not sure what his next race will be, maybe the Travers, maybe something else. I haven't made up my mind yet." Haskell runner-up **Sun King** (Charismatic) will also be shipping to Saratoga, but is unlikely to start in the Aug. 27 GI Travers S., according to newly inducted Hall of Fame trainer Nick Zito. "The Travers may be too long for him," Zito said. "It's also too quick to bring him back in three weeks for a race like the Travers." Zito said the Sept. 5 GII Pennsylvania Derby could be next for Sun King. Also likely for the Pennsylvania Derby is Haskell third-place finisher **Park Avenue Ball** (Citidancer).

Summerly Works for Alabama:

Summerly (Summer Squall) worked six furlongs over the Oklahoma training track Monday in preparation for the Aug. 20 GI Alabama S. With regular exercise rider Carmen Rosas in the irons, the GI Kentucky Oaks winner went six furlongs in 1:14 4/5 and galloped out seven furlongs in 1:30. "She really looked good out there," trainer Steve Asmussen said. "She has really looked good since coming to Saratoga. Her coat looks good and she really enjoys the surroundings. For now, we're going to continue with the same training pattern for her heading into the Alabama." Since winning the Oaks, Summerly was third in the June 25 GI Mother Goose S. and second in the July 23 GI Coaching Club American Oaks.

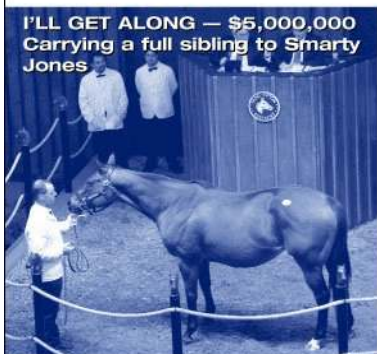
