## A RINGING ENDORSEMENT

Coolmore representative Dr. Demi O'Byrne, in typically understated fashion, said after signing the ticket on the topper at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected

Yearlings Sale, "Well, I suppose he was the best colt in the sale." But his winning bid of \$3.1 million spoke volumes. O'Byrne saw off John Ferguson and Shadwell's Rick Nichols to secure the colt, a son of super sire Storm Cat consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Stonerside Stable. The dark

bay is the second foal of 2000 GI Ashland S. winner Rings a Chime (Metfield), who was also runner-up in the GI Kentucky Oaks and earned \$606,315. "The dam [won] a very important race in the spring and she beat a very good filly of ours in there, too, Circle of Life," O'Byrne said. "I'd rate this colt a very good Storm Cat. He's an exceptional mover. He had a great walk. He just looked good...sometimes we're right about that and sometimes we're wrong." O'Byrne added that,

while the \$1.1-million Giant's Causeway colt he purchased during Tuesday's opening session of the auction would likely stay in America, yesterday's seven-figure acquisition would be joining Aidan O'Brien in Ballydoyle. Taylor Made's Frank Taylor was pleased by the sale of the colt, but not surprised. "I thought he was a colt that could bring in that range," he said. "He's one of the nicest colts we've sold. He's very athletic and sound looking and had a great walk, and all the vets were commenting on was that he had one of the best Storm Cat throats they've ever seen. He had everything they were looking for." Saratoga proved a big sale for Taylor Made, which also consigned Tuesday's \$2-million Fusaichi Pegasus filly.

**Kimmel Gets His Colt...**

Trainer John Kimmel got shut out on Tuesday's top-priced yearling, the filly by Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus, but he got his Fusaichi Pegasus on Wednesday night, going to \$1.1 million for hip 98 on behalf of Lee Einsidler's Circle E Racing LLC. "Obviously, we tried real hard to buy the FuPeg filly yesterday," Kimmel said. "We think [Fusaichi Pegasus] is going to be the preeminent sire here in North America, so we looked at the colt. We think he's hard to beat because he's by a top racehorse and he's got tremendous value as a stallion prospect, being a half to a champion already." The yearling, consigned by Highclere Sales, agent, is out of Lost the Code (Lost Code), the dam of

champion sprinter Squirtle Squirt (Marquetry). "We think the horse has a lot presence," Kimmel added. "He's got a great walk. Physically you couldn't knock him. He passed his vet exam. We thought he was a special horse in the sale." Kimmel currently has five horses for Circle E Racing--three yearlings and two two-year-olds. And, while Einsidler did not want to outline his racing goals, Kimmel admitted the million-dollar baby has great potential stud value. "When you spend that kind of money, that provides you an avenue where you have a chance for a tremendous return on your investment," he explained. "You just spent a million dollars and it could be \$30 or \$40 million if the horse is a Grade I horse. And that is quite a return." Einsidler added, "We're proud to own him and I'm even more proud to give him to a great trainer and a great friend." Einsidler, a vice president with Sidney Frank Import Co., founder of Grey Goose Vodka, is focusing on high-end horses, according to Kimmel. "He's not into big numbers, but is trying to concentrate on quality stock," he remarked.

**Flying High...**

Jeff and Stewart Morris of Highclere Sales were feeling pretty good heading into Wednesday's session, with good reason, and they were feeling even better after watching the star of their consignment bring seven figures. "He was very popular," explained Stewart Morris. "He has fantastic physical mechanics, a lot of bone. But probably his greatest attribute is his mind. He was vetted so many time, and just handled it in stride. He just never got rattled. He seemed to thrive being up here, just getting better every day."

**Still Rolling Late...**

Things continued to roll as the final session drew to a close when hip 142, a bay colt by Gone West out of the stakes-winning mare Star of Goshen (Lord At War {Arg}), brought the tidy sum of \$680,000. Consigned by Bluewater Sales, the February foal was purchased by Egyptian entrepreneur Ahmed Zayat, founder of Pyramids Brewery. "It was right in the range we predicted," said Bluewater's Meg Levy. "I think it could have gone on a little bit, but some of the big buyers filled their orders early and there is only room for so many." From the family of GII Malibu S. winner Powis Castle, the bay was the third highest-priced yearling of the session. "He is a magnificent physical," Levy explained. "A great mind, great body and very athletic. He is really special."

**The Sky's The Limit?**

Marylanders Robert Manfuso and Katie Voss, who make up Chanceland Farm, were flying high after selling a colt by Giant's Causeway out of GSW Belterra for a healthy \$775,000 during the initial session of the Saratoga sale. Although pleased by the healthy bidding, Voss expressed concern about the current course of the market. "The market is strong," said Voss, "But I think things have gotten out of sync. Things have just become crazy at the top, and as prices go higher, people's expectations get higher, too. There is a disconnect with reality in terms of the business end of the deal." With short fields and shrinking purses in some jurisdictions, Voss thinks that while things are good in the sales arena at the moment, something has to give for the success and growth to continue. "I look at it from the standpoint of what percentage of horses are going to be worth what people paid for them," she said. "Unfortunately, if they don't win on the racetrack, then they weren't worth it, now were they?"

**Thomas Looking For a Deal..**

Becky Thomas of Sequel Bloodstock was impressed by the action at the opening session of the Saratoga sale. "I thought it felt really good in there," Thomas said. "I thought we got strong down here, better than we did the first day at July." Thomas signed the tickets for three colts during Tuesday's opener. She purchased a Two Punch for \$110,000, a Forestry for \$80,000 and a Silver Deputy for \$155,000, but she admitted she's never quite satisfied. "We always see if we can get a horse at a price, or at least the best we can afford," she explained. "As a pinhooker, you rarely get what you want and when you do get a horse, you wonder what's wrong."

**New Format Gets Rave Reviews...**

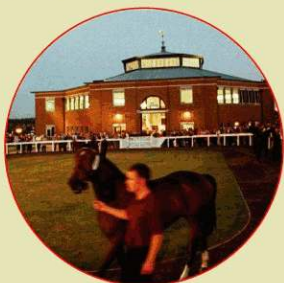
The Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale was shortened from three sessions to two this year and the new schedule received good reviews from sales officials. "I think we learned one or two things this evening and we confirmed one or two others," Fasig-Tipton Chairman D.G. Van Clief, Jr. said at the close of business last night. "We learned that the new two-day format works and works well. We think that by condensing the sale, we have increased the energy level and increased the efficiency of the sale without sacrificing any of the elegance." Of what the sale says of the overall strength of the market, Van Clief remarked, "What we've confirmed, or perhaps reconfirmed would be a better word, is that the market is still selective, but that the demand at the top for the best is urgent. There is very strong demand at the top. The sale also demonstrated, in my opinion, that in this format, good athletic physical horses, well-selected and properly presented, sell very well. And there was demand, I think fairly deep demand, on most horses and I think our buy-back numbers are going to show that tonight. Overall, we're very pleased."

Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robinson added, "I have repeatedly complimented our selection committee, because they kept this thing at a higher standard and I think it paid off." Echoing Van Clief's thoughts on the subject of the condensed version of the sale, Robertson said, "We'll have two nights next year and we'll have to keep up the quality, but I think we proved tonight that we need to hold the line."

Motion, the six-year-old is likely to skip the race. "We're going to enter the Arlington Million because we've already paid the entry fee--it's not going to cost anything more to get a post position," Motion said. "But we're also going to enter him for the Sword Dancer. All of us want to run him in the Sword Dancer, but there's that 20-percent window we're leaving open if we decide to make a late change. The biggest factor is going to be weather and post position. I know there is a chance of rain in Chicago, and he's a superior horse on a soft turf course. If you combine that with an inside post position, we really need to consider our plan." Better Talk Now drew post 6 in the 10-horse Million field. He is the defending champ in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. at Saratoga, which will also be run Saturday. **Kitten's Joy** (El Prado {Ire}), the 6-5 morning-line favorite for the 10-panel event, worked five furlongs in 1:04 1/5 over the Oklahoma turf course at Saratoga Tuesday. He flew to Chicago yesterday. "He worked much better than the time showed," trainer Dale Romans said. "There were birds on the turf course that got in his way. Because of that, he was forced to check several times. Perhaps it was better that he went slower than fast--he can bring his saved energy into the Million." The Eclipse Award winner won the GI Secretariat S. at Arlington last year.

**STARS OUT OF ALABAMA** Both **Smuggler** (Unbridled), winner of the GI Mother Goose S. and GI Coaching Club American Oaks, and GI Kentucky Oaks heroine **Summerly** (Summer Squall) will miss the Aug. 20 GI Alabama S. Ronald Winchell's Summerly is out indefinitely after sustaining a splint bone injury, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The chestnut had breezed six furlongs in 1:14.89 Monday at Saratoga; the injury was detected afterwards. Trainer Steve Asmussen told *DRF* that X-rays had been sent for review to Dr. Larry Bramlage in Lexington, Kentucky. Summerly was coming off a second to Smuggler in the Coaching Club American Oaks July 23. Smuggler's condition is not as serious. The filly spiked a fever last week and had an elevated temperature again Monday afternoon. "Her temperature has been normal the last 48 hours," trainer Shug McGaughey said yesterday. "Hopefully it stays that way after we wean her off medication." If she recovers quickly, the three-year-old will be pointed for the Sept. 10 GI Gazelle S.
