DIVINE PROPORTIONS RETIRED

The Niarchos Family's **Divine Proportions** (Kingmambo--Myth to Reality {Fr}, by Sadler's Wells) has been retired to stud after suffering a tendon injury, the *Racing Post* revealed yesterday. Having suffered her first defeat

when fourth in the Aug. 14 G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville, the sophomore was found to have damaged a tendon in her off foreleg. Connections were preparing the filly for the Oct. 29 G1 Breeders' Cup Mile at Belmont. "The news is very brutal for me as she'd never

had a training problem and was in brilliant form before the Marois, but I did suspect something might be amiss four or five days after she returned to Chantilly," trainer Pascal Bary told the *Post*. "Since returning to my yard, she has undergone extensive tests and the vets have found tendon damage in her off foreleg. They have recommended that such a brilliant filly should not race again, so a decision has been made to send her to stud." Divine Proportions was successful in her first nine starts before her Deauville eclipse, registering successes in the G2 Prix Robert Papin, G1 Prix Morny and G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at two. After a facile score in the Apr. 24 G3 Prix de la Grotte at Longchamp, she returned to that track three weeks later to take the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches before stretching out in the G1 Prix de Diane over 1 5/16 miles at Chantilly June 12. She warmed up for the Jacques le Marois with a smooth success in the July 31 G1 Prix d'Astarte at Deauville and retires as the winner of €1,262,770. "Divine Proportions was the best horse I've ever trained and she had all the qualities of a great champion," Bary added. The Niarchos Family's Racing Manager Alan Cooper paid his own tribute. "She was an absolutely fantastic filly, a superb race mare," he said. "It's so unfortunate that she has had to be retired on veterinary advice. We got the news yesterday afternoon and it's so sad, but at least she is in good shape. It is a big blow to all the team, the owners and Pascal Bary's stable. She also had built up a great fan club." Divine Proportions will be bred to Giant's Causeway next year.

PLETCHER DUO HEADS PERSONAL ENSIGN

Fresh off an impressive 9 1/2-length score in the GI Go For Wand S. July 31, **Ashado** (Saint Ballado) will try to collect her third straight Grade I victory this season in today's GI Personal Ensign H. Originally slated to bypass this event in favor of Belmont's GI Ruffian H. Sept. 11, trainer Todd Pletcher opted to give the four-year-old one more try at Saratoga before a tilt at the GI Beldame S. Oct. 1. "After we won the Go For Wand, Ashado's schedule wasn't really set in stone," he explained. "Once we looked at the Personal Ensign, Ruffian and Beldame, we thought coming back here in four weeks would be better, which would set up perfectly for the Beldame." As if last year's champion trainer needed to add more fire power to his Personal Ensign arsenal, Pletcher will also saddle Chilean champion **Isola Piu Bella (Chi)** (Rich Man's Gold). A winner of four Group 1 events in her native land, the five-year-old won the GIII Sabin H. and GIII Sixty Sails H. earlier this season before finishing an uninspired eighth in her latest in the GII Delaware H. July 17. "She really didn't behave well in the paddock and the gate that day," said Pletcher, explaining the mare's uncharacteristically poor performance. "Once that happened, she didn't fire. She's better since that race." The only other filly in the field with a Grade I victory is **Island Sand** (Tabasco Cat), who won last summer's GI Acorn S. before undergoing surgery to correct an entrapped epiglottis. The filly didn't visit the winner's circle in eight subsequent starts, but returned to her winning ways last time out in the GII Delaware H. "It has taken a couple of races to get her back," said trainer Larry Jones. "I was really impressed with her race in the Delaware H. That race proved she could handle [10 furlongs] and win again."

A case can be made for just about any filly in this seven-strong affair, but **Folklore** rates a long look coming off her victory in the July 27 GII Adirondack S. over this surface. Drawn inside in that race as well, she bobbed at the break before rallying for the 3/4-length tally. She's fired consecutive bullets since--including a very sharp :48 four-furlong breeze over the training track Aug. 14--and should be a square price. **Fifth Avenue** was the runner-up in the Adirondack and, with a bit more real estate, would likely have won. The winner of Belmont's June 9 Fashion S. will try to turn the tables with the additional panel today. The speedster **Effectual** has been installed as the 5-2 morning-line pick. She has been off since moving her record to a perfect two-for-two in the GIII Debutante S. at Churchill July 9, but returns in a tough spot. The 93 Beyer **Sensation** earned in her debut at Belmont July 13 is easily best in here. The bay came back with a 76 Beyer winning a Saratoga NW1X last out Aug. 5 and is looking for her third straight.

QUIFF TO THE PADDOCKS Khalid Abdullah's impressive G1 Yorkshire Oaks heroine **Quiff (GB)** (Sadler's Wells--Wince {GB}, by Selkirk) has been retired. Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe announced that the Sir Michael Stoute-trained four-year-old had been sent to stud after a disappointing seasonal bow when fourth in the Apr. 23 G3 Gordon Richards S. at Sandown. That was her first start since finishing runner-up to Rule of Law in the G1 St Leger last September, having previously won the Yorkshire Oaks by 11 lengths. "Quiff has been retired to stud where she will make a lovely broodmare," Grimthorpe told the *Racing Post*. "She was a great filly and her performance in the Yorkshire Oaks was utterly devastating."

LUCKY LUCKY LUCKY DIES Lucky Lucky Lucky (Chieftain--Just One More Time, by Raise a Native), winner of the 1984 GI Kentucky Oaks, was euthanized yesterday at Shadwell Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, suffering the infirmities of old age. The 24-year-old had been pensioned since 2002. In addition to her win in the Oaks, Lucky Lucky Lucky won the GI Matron S., the GI Alcibiades S. and the GI Black-Eyed Susan S. She was second behind Life's Magic in the GI Alabama S. and again behind Princess Rooney in the GI Spinster S. Lucky Lucky Lucky, in foal to Northern Dancer, was purchased by Shadwell for a then-record \$3-million at the 1986 Keeneland January Sale, but had only limited success as a broodmare.

YONAGUSKA COLT TOPS AT OBS A dark bay colt by GI Hopeful S. winner Yonaguska out of the unraced Miswaki mare Penguin Parade brought a final bid of \$95,000 to top Thursday's third open session of the OBS August Yearling Sale held at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Complex in Ocala, Florida. Purchased by Vinery Stables, the Apr. 23 foal was consigned by Francis and Barbara Vanlangendonck's Summerfield, acting as agent. A half sibling to stakes-placed Tuesday Prayer, the Florida-bred colt is from the family of Group winner and Group 1 placed Heart of Groom. For the session, 190 yearlings brought a total of \$1,587,200, compared with 240 yearlings grossing \$2,914,100 in the corresponding session a year ago. The average price was \$8,354 compared with \$12,142 in 2004, while the median price was \$5,000, down from \$6,250 last year. The buyback percentage was 29.9 percent, up from 17.5 percent a year ago. The sale's final session kicks off today at 11:00 a.m.

A daughter of Dixie Union was supposed to win this event, but not necessarily Nothing But Fun. The dark bay filly capitalized on a blistering early fractions, however, and rallied to the mild upset over pacesetter Maddalena and odds-on Reunited. A first-out winner in a six-furlong Belmont maiden May 21, Nothing But Fun made it two in a row adding a furlong against allowance foes June 22. Returning to six panels here as Reunited took the lion's share of the public's money, she sat off the pace as Maddalena and Megascap (Cape Canaveral) vied for the lead through a half in :44.85 and was angled out for the drive to the wire. Responding to jockey Richard Migliore's urging, she reeled in the game Maddalena and was drawing clear as they crossed under the wire. "She's always been the high-hopes filly around the barn," said winning trainer Michael Hushion. "I'm not sure where her future is going to take us. We'll shop around for her next race, but we'll look at something longer." Reunited, coming off an impressive allowance victory at the Spa, lacked her typical closing kick and had to settle for third in her stakes bow. [Video, sponsored by Taylor Made.](#)

Mar. 20. She rebounded with an allowance score at Churchill May 1 and was a solid third to Society Selection in the May 21 Gil Shuvee H. at Belmont. Sent off at 7-1 in his return to the green stuff, Ball Four opened up a lengthy advantage soon after the start and turned back a challenge from Ground Hero (Dynaformer) in the stretch to score by two lengths. The winner, a \$140,000 KEENOV weanling and \$125,000 FTSAUG yearling, changed hands again at FTNNOV for \$110,000 last fall. Lifetime Record: 11-3-0-3, \$107,770.
