MAKING A STATEMENT

With the European sprint scene badly in need of a boost, Princess Haya of Jordan's **Proclamation (Ire)** (King's Best) could provide the tonic in today's G1 William Hill Sprint Cup at Haydock. Four-for-five in his brief career, the three-year-old rattled off his third straight when he bested Soviet Song (Ire) in the G1 Sussex S. over Goodwood's easy mile last time July 27. The striking grey faces hardened campaigners dropping while cutting back two panels this afternoon.

"He's a big, powerful horse with a fantastic cruising speed," Frankie Dettori commented. "It

will take a pretty good horse to get him off the bridle early and there is pace guaranteed. His style of running is to come from behind, so we're not going to change it now. We'll let him find his stride and produce him when he's ready." **Cont. p2**

GIVING IT A GO

Today's GI Forego S. at Saratoga presents a rare opportunity for East Coast sprinters to earn a Grade I victory. **Forest Danger** (Forestry) gained his top-level win in the GI Carter H. in April, but has been out of action since May. Godolphin will send out **Keep the Faith (Aus)** (Sunday Silence) to make his dirt debut. The

dark bay, a stakes winner in his native Australia, set a North American record when he sped six furlongs on the grass in 1:06 4/5 at Belmont July 24 while defeating a very competitive allowance field. "He's always worked good on the dirt," said assistant trainer Rick Mettee.

"Once they go :44 and change in a race and get hit in the face with some dirt, it can be a whole different story. I expect him to run pretty good. He's got good natural speed...I think he'll be in a good stalking position. There are limited stakes opportunities for turf sprinters, so we have to try him on the dirt." The five-year-old will attempt to become the second Australian-bred graded stakes winner of the Saratoga meeting, following Alinghi (Aus)'s GIII Ballston Spa H. score last Monday.

Trainer Dandy Nicholls has earned the label of "sprint king" due to his run of success in the major handicap prizes this term. One of those came in the July 30 Stewards Cup H. at Goodwood courtesy of **Gift Horse (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}). That followed a hard-fought score in an Epsom handicap June 4, and he has the services of Kieren Fallon here. "He was always better than a handicapper and he proved that at Goodwood," his rider said. "So far, Proclamation has shown a lot of ability, but he's not home and hosed by any means and although he's a worthy favourite, you need a lot of luck in sprints. I think my fellow deserves to be there--Dandy improves his horses. He's done it with some good sprinters over the years and I think he can do it with this one. I'm going there with a live chance, and it's who gets the best run and who has the best horse at the finish that will count." Heading the supporting cast is Guy Reed's G1 Nunthorpe S. heroine **La Cucaracha (GB)** (Piccolo {GB}), whose stop-start career reached a peak when winning that five-furlong contest at York Aug. 18. She bids to provide Barry Hills with his second Sprint Cup after the exploits of Royal Applause (GB) in 1997. "She really looked very good after the race and we're very happy with her," jockey Michael Hills commented. "We always believed in her. I think she would have won the Queen Mary as a two-year-old, then she had an awful year as a three-year-old with problems really interrupting her training. This year, dad's managed to get a clean run throughout the year and she's shown what we really believe she is capable of. She loves that fast ground, has got an awful lot of speed and she's got a turn of foot--which is what you need." The conditioner can also call on Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's G2 Champagne S. winner **Etlaala (GB)** (Selkirk), who comes here off a third in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket July 7.

Mick Channon's affinity for this race was deepened by Ajigolo, who made it number six since 1995 with an authoritative score in the juvenile highlight of the Baden-Baden festival. Like many of his trainer's juveniles, he has been kept busy since breaking his maiden at Salisbury May 12. The chestnut followed a couple of unplaced efforts in stakes company with a fourth in the June 16 G3 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot at York. After a confidence boost when winning a conditions event at Doncaster

July 14, he ran a creditable third in the Listed Roses S. when returned to York last time Aug. 17. He was ranked in the early stages of this contest, but eventually settled in rear of the tightly packed field before moving up at halfway. FLAME OF TARA EUTHANIZED Kilcarn Stud's **Flame of Tara (Ire)** (Artaius--Welsh Flame {GB}, by Welsh Pageant {Fr}) was euthanized Aug. 27 due to the infirmities of old age. The 25-year-old mare had been pensioned since 2002. "It was a very sad day for all at Kilcarn Stud, as she was homebred and a wonderful mare," said Kilcarn's Patricia O'Kelly. Flame of Tara proved a solid competitor on the racecourse, compiling a record of eight wins and eight seconds in 21 starts. At three, she captured the G2 Coronation S., the G2 Pretty Polly S. and the G3 Athasi S. as well as running second in the G1 Champion S. Her second foal, sold as a yearling for 440,000gns at the 1988 Houghton Sale, proved to be Salsabil (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). That filly carried Sheikh Hamdan's colors to three Classic victories--the G1 1000 Guineas, the G1 Oaks and the G1 Irish Derby--in addition to the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac and G1 Prix Vermeille. Her next foal, the Last Tycoon (Ire) colt Marju (Ire), was also acquired by Sheikh Hamdan, for whom he landed the G1 St. James's Palace S. as well as posting a runner-up finish in the 1991 G1 Derby. He has gone on to a successful stallion career. Flame of Tara went on to produce three more stakes winners, Danse Royale (Ire) (Caerleon), Song of Tara (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Flame of Athens (Ire) (Royal Academy) as well as the Group 2-placed Spirit of Tara (Ire). Her final foal, the three-year-old Montjeu (Ire) filly Flames Last (Ire), broke her maiden July 1. In all, Flame of Tara had 13 foals, 12 of whom reached the races and won. Her daughters have gone on to become successful broodmares, headed by Salsabil, who produced three graded/group winners before her untimely death in 1996.

NTRA SETS UP "RACING TO THE RESCUE"

FUND The National Thoroughbred Racing Association has announced the creation of the Racing to the Rescue Fund in order to provide financial relief to members of the horse racing and breeding community affected by Hurricane Katrina. The fund, a special division of NTRA charities, will see 100 percent of its contributions passed through to existing charities to aid recovery efforts. New York-based Bessemer Trust, an NTRA/Breeders' Cup sponsor, has agreed to establish and maintain an account for the NTRA Charities - Racing to the Rescue Fund at no cost. The NTRA also announced that Oct. 8, a Saturday which will feature numerous Breeders' Cup prep races around the country, has been designated as "Racing to the Rescue Day." Horsemen and racetracks will participate in fund-raising drives for the fund; there will be on-site donation centers where patrons can make contributions. The NTRA also hopes that Breeders' Cup-winning owners, breeders, trainers and jockeys will contribute a portion of their winnings to the fund. "We call on every member of our industry and our fans to assist members of the Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama horse communities and their animals in their time of need," said NTRA Commissioner and Breeders' Cup President D.G. Van Clief, Jr. "We welcome the opportunity to use the October 29 Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships as a means of raising funds for Hurricane Katrina victims and, in particular, those within our own industry who have been impacted by this disaster, and endorse similar efforts at our member racetracks." Among the riders who will be participating is Hall of Famer Kent Desormeaux. "As a Louisiana native, I am particularly delighted that the horse racing industry is stepping up to do something to aid the thousands of people within the horse racing community who lost loved ones and homes to Katrina," he said. "The situation down there is one of total devastation, and help is desperately needed and valued."

Red Cross Accepting Donations at Saratoga...

The American Red Cross will set up a booth at Saratoga Race Course throughout this weekend to allow racing fans a chance to make cash contributions to aid the victims of Hurricane Katrina. The booth, which will be open Sept. 3-5 from noon to 5 p.m., will be located near the Saratoga Race Course Post Office. The track will also feature a parade appearance by **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet) this afternoon.

No Fair Grounds Meet This Year...

In the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, Fair Grounds Race Course in New Orleans will not conduct its 2005-2006 meet on site, it was announced yesterday by Churchill Downs, Inc. Instead, the meeting is likely to be held at Louisiana Downs. According to Churchill Downs President and Chief Executive Officer Tom Meeker, the barn area and the racing surfaces are currently under about four feet of water. The grandstand and clubhouse are above water, but part of the track's roof sustained damage. No horses were stabled at the track when the hurricane hit. The Fair Grounds was supposed to run from Nov. 24 through Mar. 26. Meeker said plans could be finalized as early as next week concerning a move to Louisiana Downs. It is unclear how long the relocated meet might be and whether or not it will offer the same level of purses, but expectations are that the meet will be far shorter than the one that had been scheduled for the Fair Grounds. Any profits from the meet held at Louisiana Downs will be donated to hurricane relief efforts. "There will be myriad problems in moving the meet," Meeker said. "But at a time like this, those problems look much smaller given the circumstances we face. Our primary thing is to provide an opportunity for our horsemen to have a place to run for some substantial purses and we believe that, by running a meet there, we can provide some additional funding to horsemen or employees of the track who now find themselves in need." Meeker said Churchill Downs management is concentrating much of its efforts on locating the 500 employees who work at the Fair Grounds. So far, about 150 have been contacted. Seven employees from the security department remained at the track while the hurricane hit, but were ordered to evacuate Thursday because of the unrest and violence many New Orleans neighborhoods have experienced. Meeker gave no specifics concerning the future of the Fair Grounds, which had to be rebuilt after a 1993 fire, but alluded to Churchill Downs's commitment to re-opening the racetrack. Racing was first conducted at the current location in 1852. "We invested in this community because we liked it," Meeker commented. "The nexus between that track and that community is a mirror image of what the nexus is here in Louisville, Kentucky. There is a great tradition down there in that community associated with that racetrack. We are firmly committed, with other business leaders and investors in that community, to reestablish New Orleans over the course of the next years or whatever it will take to get that city back on its feet."

CHARLES NUCKOLS JR. DIES Breeder Charles Nuckols Jr. died yesterday at his home near Midway, Kentucky of complications from congestive heart failure. The 83-year-old Kentucky native had been ailing for several years. "Charlie Nuckols unselfishly served Keeneland and the Thoroughbred industry for more than a half century," said Keeneland President Nick Nicholson. "As a racing official, owner, breeder, consignor, key architect of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund, Keeneland board member and, for 30 years, a trustee, he had vast experience and a deep understanding of the business and sport. His death is a tremendous loss to both the Thoroughbred industry and to the Keeneland Association." Longtime friend Louis Lee Haggin III served alongside Nuckols as a Keeneland trustee for more than 25 years. "Working side by side as trustees, I saw first hand his wisdom and unselfish service to Keeneland," he said. "The industry has lost a stalwart and my family and I have lost a very dear friend. We will all miss him very much." In conjunction with first his father, Charles Nuckols Sr., and later his brothers, sons and clients, Nuckols bred over 300 stakes winners. His lifelong dream of breeding a Kentucky Derby winner was realized when War Emblem, the product of a mating Nuckols planned for Russell Reineman, won the "Run for the Roses" in 2002. His association with Reineman spanned more than 40 years. The first mating Nuckols arranged for Reineman resulted in Smart Deb, the co-champion juvenile filly of 1962. Nuckols also bred Decatholon, 1956-57 champion sprinter; Typecast, the 1972 champion handicap mare; European champion Habitat; and top sire Mr. Leader. He is survived by his four children: Judy, Charles III, Hetty and Jim. Funeral arrangements have not yet been announced.
