SWEET AS 'HONEY' AS SPA WRAPS UP

With the conclusion of the 2005 season at Saratoga Race Course yesterday, trainer Todd Pletcher wrapped up yet another training title at the track--his fifth--and highlighted the feat by sending out **Honey Ryder** (Lasting Approval) to a mild upset in the GIII Glens Falls H. The four-year-old Honey Ryder captured the GIII The Very One H. and GII Orchid H. this spring and was searching for her third graded tally up against a tough foe in **Film Maker** (Dynaformer). A patient John Velazquez kept Honey Ryder to the inside as Film Maker took the overland route, and that proved the difference as Honey Ryder found the wire a neck in front of the crowd's even-money pick. "I was bidding my time and decided not to go around everybody," explained Velazquez. "I sat and waited and it worked out perfectly. You have to have the horse to do that." *Glens Falls cont. p3*

WILLOW O WISP TAKES DEL MAR DERBY

On paper it looked like a race with plenty of pace. But in yesterday's GII Del Mar Derby, the only one who was feeling frisky for the front end was **Willow O Wisp** (Misnomer), and the rising turf star made his rivals pay as he cruised around Del Mar's sod on an uncontested lead that led right to the winner's circle. The grandson of Miswaki has been nearly unbeatable since joining Vladimir Cerin's barn this spring. Coming off consecutive victories in the GIII Cinema BC H. June 26 and GII La Jolla H. over this course Aug. 13, Willow O Wisp jumped out under Garrett Gomez and set sensible fractions before running on gamely for the win. The final time of 1:45 4/5 equaled the nine-furlong course record. *Del Mar Derby cont. p2*

Sun King put himself squarely on the GI Kentucky Derby trail with a victory in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby in March, but a flat effort in the GI Blue Grass S. was followed by a dismal showing in the Run for the Roses, when he ran 15th to upsetter Giacomo. An improved fourth in the GI Preakness S. but no threat to winner Afleet Alex, Sun King finally returned to form in the GIII Leonard Richards S. at Delaware July 17, winning by 5 3/4 lengths. He lost little when a game runner-up to Roman Ruler in the Haskell at Monmouth Aug. 7 and, along with stablemate Indy Storm (A.P. Indy), was part of the favored entry here. Relaxed in third as United (Dixie Union) and then Tani Maru (Cherokee Run) cut out the running, Sun King made the lead with a strong move two furlongs out and leveled out nicely down the lane. Moved to Vladimir Cerin's barn after an eighth in a Calder allowance in December, he made an immediate impact on the West Coast, prevailing in an entry-level allowance at Hollywood Apr. 23 before just missing by a head to Osidy in the GIII Will Rogers S. at that course May 28. Turning the tables next time, he bested Osidy in the Hollywood's

Cinema June 26 and made it three-for-four in California in the La Jolla last out. Here, the public's choice was sent to the head of affairs, turned back the challenge of Eastern Sand (Line in the Sand) on the turn and was never in danger down the lane as his rider kept busy.

Revved Up ran his record on the year to four-for-five with this effort. The gray gelding had a win and a second in two stakes starts at Tampa Bay Downs this spring, then shipped north. Back in the winner's circle after the June 11 Battlefield S. at Monmouth, he headed to Arlington Park for his next engagement and made it two straight in the GIII Stars and Stripes Breeders' Cup Turf H. The veteran traveler was on the road again here, and proved once again he could handle any course. Settled in seventh through an opening mile in 1:36.24, he shot to the front on the final bend and held longshot Strut the Stage at bay to the wire. It was a reversal of the 2003 edition of the race, where Strut the Stage beat Revved Up by 1 1/4 lengths. "It looked like a ton of pace on paper," said jockey Brice Blanc. "I was happy where I was at. He was traveling very comfortably all the way around. In the turn, when I found an opening, he really responded and picked it up. He really finished up strongly for me. He's definitely getting better with age, like fine wine." Added Nicholas Bachalard, assistant to trainer Christophe Clement, "He's a very nice horse, he's just getting better as he goes." A Bit O'Gold, the odds-on chalk, was third a half-mile from home, but couldn't improve his position.

Trainer Todd Pletcher has been patient with Honey Ryder and she's rewarded him by becoming a rock-solid turf distaffer. Honey Ryder won her first stakes last fall, collecting Calder's Princess Mora S. in November, and continued her success in Florida with tallies in The Very One H. in March and the Orchid H. a month later. Sent off the favorite for just the second time in her career in the GII Sheepshead Bay H. at Belmont May 22, she faltered against a good group and could do no better than fifth, but returned freshened off a two-month respite and won the Robert G. Dick Memorial BC H. at Delaware July 16 by a commanding 5 1/4 lengths. The second choice in the Glens Falls, the gray sat chilly in fourth and came running hard when given her head by John Velazquez. "She's a filly we thought that when she got older, she would get better and when the distances got longer, she would get better," said Pletcher afterward. "She had a beautiful trip, but she was game. Film Maker came to her and she dug in." Sent off the crowd's choice, Film Maker got on track late, but couldn't catch the winner. "Obviously, we're disappointed, but we didn't lose by much," said her trainer, H. Graham Motion. "The winner is a nice filly. A competitive horse that just couldn't seem to find the winner's circle, Bob's Proud Moment took advantage of Southern Cal's quick pace and rallied to his first stakes triumph. Bob's Proud Moment hadn't tasted victory since last October, when he won a Calder allowance, but ran with merit when second in the nine-furlong Mecke H. over Calder's sod July 4 and again when runner-up in The Vid S. at a flat mile July 31. Closer to the pace than usual in the Aug. 20 Absent Russian S., he failed to keep up late and had to settle for fourth, beaten 3 1/2 lengths. Here, the four-year-old was content to sit well off the free-running favorite Southern Cal, who bounded through uncontested fractions of :22 3/5, :46 and 1:11. Forced to take up a bit nearing the quarter pole, Bob's Proud Moment recovered and came with his run in the final furlong, catching the tiring Southern Cal and holding longshot Dancing Master safe. "I've won stakes with horses before him, but this is my first graded stakes win in 13 years training," said conditioner Doug Potter. From the first crop by Agnes Tachyon (Sunday Silence), who won all four career starts, including the Japanese 2000 Guineas, Shonan Tachyon remained unbeaten in his stakes debut. The chestnut broke his maiden in his July 31 debut, and was the slight choice to make it two-for-two. At the back of the pack early after getting away a step slowly, he flew through his final three furlongs in :33.90 over the yielding course to win as much the best. "He is really a super horse, but he always misses the break," jockey Katsuhara Tanaka said. "I think he can handle the longer distances, so I am looking forward to the Classics next year."

Making his first start in six months, Personal Rush successfully defended his title in this event. The bay colt captured the G1 Derby Grand Prix last year, then traveled to Lone Star for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, where he finished sixth. Off the board in his first two starts after returning to Japan, he rebounded to take the Mar. 16 Diolite Kinen, but had not been out since. The four-year-old was well back early, but kicked it into gear for the stretch drive and got up to take the tight three-way photo for the win. "He didn't have a lot of enthusiasm early, so I had to push him," jockey Shinji Fujita said. "But, even though he was carrying 130 pounds, he showed his impressive late kick in the stretch." *Results cont. p10*

In an American industry which has seen the distance of the Jockey Club Gold Cup slashed from two miles to a mile and a half in 1976 and then to a mile and a quarter in 1990, the Belmont S. arguably represents one of the nation's sternest tests of stamina. So how come Touch Gold, the 1997 Belmont winner, is proving a highly effective sire of sprinters?

The bare facts are that the Adena Springs stallion has sired 10 stakes winners from the 229 named foals aged three and up in his first three crops. None of the 10 has so far won over a distance longer than 1 1/16 miles and his five graded winners include Midas Eyes and Mass Media, both winners of the GI Forego H. over seven furlongs, and Medallist, who lowered the track record in winning the GIII Deputy Minister S. over six-and-a-half furlongs.

There was no suggestion at the time of Touch Gold's Belmont victory that he was anything but a true stayer. Indeed he rallied strongly to wear down Silver Charm and Free House in a final quarter clocked at :24.80, after leading through the first quarter in :23.74 and the half mile in :49.22.

A devastated Gary Stevens, who had been bidding for Triple Crown honors on Silver Charm, paid tribute to Touch Gold's effort.

"I've never seen a horse make the pace, drop back, and then come home going a mile and a half in :24 4/5," he said. "They're not supposed to be able to do that. It's just amazing."

Touch Gold's pedigree could be interpreted to support the view that he would be at home over a mile and a half. For a start, he is a half-brother to With Approval, a winner of the Canadian Triple Crown. Their dam Passing Mood is by Buckpasser, a winner of the Jockey Club Gold Cup in its two-mile days and also of the Lawrence Realization over 1 5/8 miles. Then there's the fact that

Touch Gold is inbred 3x3 to Northern Dancer, a horse who numbered two major 10-furlong events--the Kentucky Derby and Queen's Plate--among his victories.

Even though Touch Gold's sire Deputy Minister is associated more with speed than stamina, he failed by only a neck to land the GI Meadowlands Cup over a mile and a quarter.

On the other hand, Touch Gold could just as easily have been a sprinter-miler. Deputy Minister had been fast enough to win eight of his nine starts as a juvenile and to collect the GII Tom Fool S. and the Gulfstream Sprint Championship over seven furlongs at four. Add in the fact that Passing Mood gained her only stakes success in the Shady Well S. over 5 1/2 furlongs as a two-year-old and it is clear that Touch Gold's parents weren't short of precocious speed. Their first mating produced that fast Canadian filly Daijin, winner as a three-year-old of the Star Shoot S. over six furlongs and the Selene S. over 8 1/2. Touch Gold himself gained allowance wins over six furlongs at three and a mile at four.

Moving on to Buckpasser and Northern Dancer, it's certainly possible to argue that Buckpasser owed his long-distance successes more to his tremendous class than to sheer staying power. As a two-year-old he had gained eight of his nine victories over distances from five to seven furlongs and he continued to show plenty of speed at three. Indeed, his next start after his Jockey Club Gold Cup victory came in the Malibu S. over seven furlongs and he won again.

Versatility was also the theme of Northern Dancer's stallion career. In addition to siring several winners of the Derby and/or Irish Derby, his muscular frame allowed him to sire top two-year-olds and sprinters. Two of his best winners out of Buckpasser mares were the brothers El Gran Senor (sire of the champion sprinter Lit de Justice) and Try My Best (sire of the top sprinter-miler Last Tycoon and plenty of other fast performers). It is perhaps significant that Northern Dancer's sire, Nearctic, set or equalled numerous track records at five, six, six-and-a-half, eight and eight-and-a-half furlongs.

Another factor to take into account in Touch Gold's stallion career is that his status as a Belmont S. winner will have encouraged breeders to send him mares with plenty of speed in their pedigrees.

For example, the broodmare sire of Midas Eyes--a horse who will make his debut at Mill Ridge in 2006--is Bayou Hebert, whose only stakes success came over seven furlongs at four, while Medallist--destined to stand at Three Chimneys--is out of a daughter of the champion sprinter Star de Naskra.

Predictably, the Mr. Prospector line is also working with Touch Gold and Buzzy's Gold, winner of the Gilded Time S. over five furlongs, is out of a daughter of Mr Prospector. Sons of Mr. Prospector figure as the broodmare sires of three of the nine other stakes winners, with Region of Merit (GIII Tampa Bay Derby) being out of a Gone West mare and Mass Media out of a Forty Niner mare. *Caulfield cont. p8*

It would suit my argument if this Forty Niner mare - the Live Oak-bred Sultry Allure--had a background packed with speed, but that isn't strictly true. Certainly her grandsires are those fast horses Mr. Prospector and Buckfinder (who filled the place spot in the Fall Highweight H. and Metropolitan H.), but her dam, the Molly Pitcher winner Sultry Sun, also produced Solar Splendor (Turf Classic and Man o'War S.) and Sultry Song (Hollywood Gold Cup). When bred to Mr. Prospector, Sultry Sun produced the very useful miler Strategic Mission.

There is stamina in this female line, though, with Mass Media's third and fourth dams, the Damascus mare Sunny Dame and Princequillo's daughter Sunny Morn, both being by three-year-old winners of the two-mile Jockey Club Gold Cup. Which reminds me that Mass Media is inbred 3x4 to Buckpasser, winner of the Cup in 1966.

Little of this stamina has been transmitted to Mass Media judging by his record, which includes a six-furlong win in 1:08.8, a Grade III seven-furlong success in 1:20.10 and now a Grade I victory in a race formerly won by the likes of Aldebaran, Rubiano, Housebuster, Groovy and Fappiano.

Of course, Mass Media may now have earned himself a prime place at stud, to add to America's growing team of fast grandsons of Deputy Minister which also features another Frankel star, Ghostzapper.

MOTIVATOR GROUND FEARS The Royal Ascot Racing Club's **Motivator (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) may side-step a clash with His Highness the Aga Khan's four-time Group 1 winner **Azamour (Ire)** (Night Shift) in Saturday's G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, for which 12 remained at the five-day stage yesterday. Despite confirming his entry alongside stable companion **Temple Place (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), connections of the G1 Epsom Derby winner warned that he will not race on a firm surface. "The big question is the ground," the syndicate's Racing Manager Harry Herbert told *PA Sport* yesterday. "He won't run unless the ground is good or easier and I would have to say at this point he is a highly unlikely starter unless there is some rain or suitable watering. If he doesn't run in Ireland, we will probably go straight for the Arc. He has other options, but I'm not sure we will take up any of those as he doesn't need a lot of work. [Trainer] Michael [Bell] is due to go over on Wednesday to take a look at the ground and we could make a decision there and then. If it's good to firm that would offer some hope, but if it's firm we wouldn't be prepared to risk him." Aidan O'Brien has left in a team of three, but the G1 Eclipse S. hero **Oratorio (Ire)** (Danehill) is also not certain to make the 10-furlong contest. "Things are going well with Oratorio so far," he said on Sunday. "We're getting there, but he has a couple of bits of work to do before we make a final decision."

HKBC BUY INTO RAKTI The Hong Kong Breeders' Club has purchased a 10-percent shareholding in Gary Tanaka's six-time Group 1 winner **Rakti (GB)** (Polish Precedent), who is set to retire to Huma Park Stud in Ireland for the 2006 breeding season. The six-year-old, who is being prepared for the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Newmarket Sept. 24 and GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Belmont Oct. 29, will end his career in the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Mile at Sha Tin Dec. 12. The Hong Kong Breeders' Club is set to be officially launched today and Racing Manager John McGrath was looking forward to the operation's first major venture. "Rakti is an exceptional good looker and mover in the traditional mould and has received his highest British Horseracing Board rating of 124 this year," he said. "We have firm plans to support Rakti in Ireland and G2 Wakefield S. winner **Danroad (Aus)** (Danehill--Strawberry Girl {Aus}, by Strawberry Road {Aus}) at Hedgeholme Stud in County Durham next year as well as sending them some of our best mares in the Southern Hemisphere." The Hong Kong Breeders Club is donating a nomination to Danroad Wednesday at Doncaster Racecourse. The nomination will be auctioned to benefit the Chris Kinane Trust Fund. Kinane, an assistant to Ian Williams, suffered serious head injuries when kicked by a horse in the paddock at Wolverhampton Apr. 2. The HKBC will match the sum raised at the auction.

**DRUG-RULE CHANGES SAID TO IMPACT

"The people we spoke to who had horses to enter but didn't enter cited the change in medication rules as the reason," Elliston said. "We appreciate the horses we got from Keeneland and Turfway, but to my knowledge we received no entries [from horsemen based] at the Churchill Downs Training Center or Ellis Park."

Thanks to the high-profile exploits of recent graduates, this auction has metamorphosed from its previous niche as a market for early types into an outlet for class performers. Following the change brought about by cheap buys Somnus (GB), Airwave (GB), Kyllachy (GB), Reel Buddy and Fayr Jag (Ire), the 2003 sale attracted some major purchasers and witnessed a record price when 250,000gns was dished out for a son of Xaar (GB). All the above-mentioned won Group 1 races at distances up to a mile and it is the quick types who still dominate the make-up of this market, which is bolstered by the formidable £300,000 purse of the St Leger Yearling S. run across the road tomorrow. That is not to say that middle-distance performers are not on offer, as the 2001 graduate Phoenix Reach (Ire) has proved. First-season sires are particularly popular here and among the 520 lots catalogued, one of the sale's celebrity alumni Kyllachy has the largest representation at 34. Also prominent are Tobougg (Ire), Fath, Invincible Spirit (Ire) and Redback (GB), while luminaries Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), Johannesburg, Act One (GB) and Street Cry (Ire) each have a sole entry. Of the established sires, Danehill has one yearling on offer, to accompany the 18 from his son Danehill Dancer (Ire), while Cape Cross (Ire), Efisio (GB), Fasliyev, Grand Lodge, King's Best, Night Shift, Pivotal (GB) and Royal Applause (GB) assume their regular slots. Danehill's sole lot is [hip 164](#), consigned by Klaus Jacobs' Newsells Park Stud. She is an undoubted highlight as a March-born daughter of multiple stakes-winner Gleefully from the family of Roses in May. Jaber Abdullah's unbeaten Flashy Wings (GB) has carried all before her in this year's juvenile fillies' division and her half sister by Fraam is offered by Peter Molony's Rathmore Stud as [hip 125](#). Another related to black-type performers is Hedsor Stud's [hip 437](#), a Tobougg half sister to last year's G2 Diadem S. winner and former Leger graduate Pivotal Point (GB). Rock of Gibraltar made a major impact at Deauville and his sole entry is Camas Park Stud's [hip 115](#), a colt out of a half sister to the South African champion sophomore filly Kundalini. Of those sold as foals, Goldford Stud consign the highest-priced at 90,000gns in the shape of [hip 234](#), a Danehill Dancer colt out of the group scorer Venize (Ire) from the family of this year's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches runner-up Toupie (GB).

Tried and Proven..

In recent years David Powell's Catridge Farm and Gay O'Callaghan's Yeomanstown Stud have led the way among the vendors and both drafts include eye-catching yearlings this time. Catridge's highlight may be [hip 335](#), a Danehill Dancer half sister to the G2 Prix Robert Papin scorer Never a Doubt (GB) out of a winning half sister to the high-class sprinter and sire Acclamation (GB). Yeomanstown offer [hip 340](#), a Black Minnaloushe colt out of the multiple stakes-scorer Southern Tradition, herself a producer of winners. It is a measure of Pivotal's success that he has only two lots in a sale he helped to turn around. Most of his yearlings make it to the major sales houses now, but both the offerings here are from his Cheveley Park Stud home. Selling begins at 10 a.m. today and continues at 5 p.m. after racing tomorrow. Thursday and Friday's sessions begin at 5:30 p.m. Full catalogue and results can be viewed on www.dbsauctions.com.

SCORPION HEADS LEGER SEVEN Susan Magnier's **Scorpion (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) will face a maximum of six rivals in Saturday's G1 St Leger at Doncaster. While jockey bookings have yet to be finalised, Kieren Fallon looks set to ride the impressive G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner at Doncaster instead of staying at Leopardstown for the G1 Irish Champion S. Jamie Spencer will be called up to partner Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's **Avalon (GB)** (Kingmambo), third in the Aug. 16 G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York. "Everything has gone well so far with Scorpion and Avalon, who may join Scorpion in the line-up," trainer Aidan O'Brien said on Sunday. Belmont would hold no fears for him as he loves a turning track and his best performances have been on a left-handed track. This is more than likely his last season, so the Far East is a possibility later in the year."

ELECTROCUTIONIST BEGINS ARC BUILD-UP

Earle Mack's G1 International S. hero **Electrocutionist** (Red Ransom) will head straight to the Oct. 2 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp. Conditioner Valfredo Valiani was on hand to oversee the four-year-old's first serious work since defeating Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn) at York Aug. 16. "The horse is very well," Valiani told *PA Sport*. "He had a couple of days rest, but now is the right time to begin again. He worked over seven furlongs on Saturday without really being tested. Our first target is still the Arc de Triomphe, but we will have to see what happens. We want to see how some of the others go in the Irish Champion and we would need the conditions to be right at Longchamp--it must be good ground. We also need a top jockey. If Mick Kinane were free, it would be perfect for us. Whether he runs or not in the Arc, we could send him for the GI Canadian International [at Woodbine Oct. 23] or GI Breeders' Cup Turf six days later. He is fresh and he can run two or three times more before the end of the year. Our last target is the G1 Japan Cup [in Tokyo Nov. 27] which is a month after the Breeders' Cup, but if the ground were heavy for any, he will not run."
