NO MORE 'LIAM' EXCUSES

With the presence of two speedy stablemates entered in today's GI Woodward S., **Saint Liam** (Saint Ballado) won't have to worry about **Commentator** (Distorted Humor) getting loose on the lead again as he did in the GI Whitney H., where he was defeated by the latter by a neck at the Spa Aug. 6. Saint Liam will have a new pilot in the irons, as jockey Jerry Bailey replaces Edgar Prado, who was aboard the GI Donn H. and GI Stephen Foster H. victor in his last nine races. "I'm pleased with the way Edgar rode the horse," trainer Rick Dutrow, Jr. said. "Mr. Warren felt differently about it and wanted to get Jerry." The speedy Commentator has won seven of eight career starts, but must prove he can rate in today's rematch. "I have a great jockey in Gary Stevens on Commentator," trainer Nick Zito said. AZ GOOD AZ IT GETS

No horse has ever won the G1 Irish Champion S. back-to-back, but anything is possible with **Azamour (Ire)** (Night Shift). The four-year-old bids to buck the trend in a high-octane renewal at Leopardstown today. Carrying the colors of his breeder, His Highness the Aga Khan, the bay has grown in stature with each run, winning the G1 St James's Palace S. over a mile at Royal Ascot last June before swooping late to beat **Norse Dancer (Ire)** (Halling) in this 12 months ago.

This term, he bested **Ace (Ire)** (Danehill) in the June 15 G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot at York before underlining his versatility when inflicting another defeat on Norse Dancer in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. over a mile and a half at Newbury last time July 23. Mick Kinane was on board each time, but the task is left to Christophe Soumillon here. "It is a big day and a big challenge for me," the jockey said yesterday. "Azamour is a great champion, but this is a high-quality race and I need to prove that we can do a good job." **Irish Champion S. cont. p2**

FEAR HIS STING

He's so good, Frankie Dettori gave up the ride on Motivator (GB) to perform what may be no more than a steering job on Susan Magnier's **Scorpion (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) in today's G1 St Leger at Doncaster. Unraced as a juvenile, Scorpion went from a Leopardstown maiden score on debut May 8 to a tight second in the G3 Gallinule S. at The Curragh a fortnight later. He never got into the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly June 5, but showed that to be all wrong when running second by a half-length to Hurricane Run (Ire) in the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh three weeks later. He added an emphatic score in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp last time July 26. "Scorpion is a good horse," Dettori told the *Racing Post*. "He's going into unknown territory, but they all are. It's an exciting ride and let's hope he goes well."

The rains have fallen at Leopardstown, and that's welcome news for the Royal Ascot Racing Club's G1 Epsom Derby winner **Motivator** and Murry Rose Bloodstock's **Grey Swallow**, who beat Bago (Fr), Ace and Azamour under similar conditions in the May 22 G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh. It may play against Susan Magnier's **Oratorio**, who was forced to the sidelines after ending Motivator's unbeaten sequence in the July 2 G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown. "He's in good form," jockey Kieren Fallon told *PA Sport*. "He's improved a lot from the start of the year. He's just progressed. He looks great. Aidan's happy with him and that's good enough for me." Softer conditions will play to the strengths of Noel and Miriam O'Callaghan's **Alexander Goldrun**, who was re-routed from today's G1 Matron S. Last year's G1 Prix de l'Opera and G1 Hong Kong Cup heroine has looked as good as ever this term, winning the June 25 G1 Pretty Polly S. at The Curragh and G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood last time July 30. "The money didn't influence me, but Alexander Goldrun is better at 10 furlongs than she is over a mile and, if it were to get soft, Azamour would be at a disadvantage," trainer Jim Bolger told the *Racing Post*. "Oratorio might possibly be too, but it wouldn't inconvenience our filly that much. It should be a great race and I am very much looking forward to it." Racecourse Manager Tom Burke confirmed that the ground had changed to good, with heavy rain forecast today. "I think it could be yielding or even yielding-to-soft," he said yesterday.

Nine Leger winners had contested York's G2 Great Voltigeur S. since the start of the last decade and this year's renewal had a solid look, with less than a length separating the first three of **Hard Top**, **The Geezer** and **Avalon** Aug. 16. With the rain falling on Town Moor, The Geezer has similar underfoot conditions to those prevalent when runner-up to Motivator in the May 12 G2 Dante S. at York and when running away with the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood July 26. "He's improved all year and ideally he'd want a bit of cut in the ground," jockey Richard Quinn said. "He looked really good on soft ground and was unlucky to be beat in the Voltigeur, as he was up the far rail and the middle was a bit quicker. We're expecting a good show." John Dunlop saddles G3 Lingfield Derby Trial scorer **Kong**, who was four lengths adrift when fourth in the Voltigeur, and impressive Melrose H. winner **Tawqeet**, who needs to step up again on that effort at York Aug. 18.

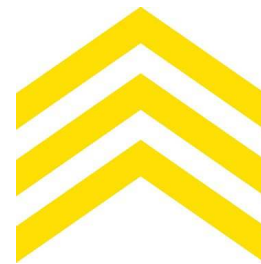
A filly and a rabbit are among the 11 entries in a wide-open running of the 47th GI Man O' War S. **Better Talk Now** enjoyed the presence of his pacesetting stablemate **Shake the Bank** in the GI United Nations S. July 2, and won that event going away by 3/4 of a length over a soft Monmouth Park turf course. The GI Breeders' Cup Turf champ returned to finish fourth in the GI Arlington Million over a yielding course last time Aug. 13. With no rain in the New York area for quite some time, it looks like Better Talk Now will not have his course of choice and is likely to get overbet. **King's Drama** was placed on the sidelines after finishing fifth in the GI Canadian International S. last October, but has been unbeatable since. The bay returned to take a \$100,000 optional claimer by six lengths at Belmont July 14 and added a game 3/4-length tally over **Relaxed Gesture** in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. Aug. 13. He should have first run on Shake the Bank, who is expected to be on the early lead. **Angara**, the lone female in the group, held her own against the boys in the GI Manhattan H. June 11, and enters off a win in the GI Beverly D. S. Aug. 13.

Virginia Oaks victress **My Typhoon** has shown plenty of promise in her brief career, including a game second-place finish in the GII Lake Placid S. Aug. 19, but will face some tough European invaders in **Asi Siempre** and **Luas Line**. Asi Siempre chased home eventual G1 Irish Oaks winner Shawanda (Ire) earlier this year, while second in the Listed Prix de la Seine S. at Longchamp May 15 and third in the G3 Prix de Royaumont S. at Chantilly June 4. She makes her U.S. debut after taking the Listed Prix Mme Jean Couturie S. most recently at Vichy July 18 and fired a :46 4/5 breeze over the Oklahoma turf training track Sept. 7. "We don't know much about her other than she's big and strong," trainer Patrick Biancone said. "She's very healthy and we're hoping she's going to make us wealthy." Luas Line made the trip across the pond earlier in the season to finish fourth in the GI American Oaks at Hollywood July 3 and returns off a pair of Listed scores in Ireland, including the Lavarack Memorial EBF S. Aug. 21.

After a dominating 7 3/4-length victory in the seven-furlong GI Test S. Aug. 6, **Leave Me Alone** figures to be very hard to down against this overmatched bunch. The chestnut took Calder's six-furlong GIII Azalea Breeders Cup S. prior to her Test victory July 10, as well as the 1 1/16-mile Melair S. at Hollywood Apr. 24. This will be her first test at the nine furlong distance. "When she came back to the winner's circle after the Test, I asked Kent [Desormeaux] how she was pulling up and he told me he had tons left," trainer Eric Kruljac commented. "If she shows up the way she did in the Test, I think she'll have no problem with the distance." **In the Gold** finished a distant second behind Leave Me Alone in Test, but has run well at today's distance in the past, finishing second in the GII Bonnie Miss S. and the GI Kentucky Oaks. "She's a quality filly and she never runs a bad race," trainer Nick Zito said. "She hit the side of the gate coming out in the Test and we've schooled her a bunch of times, so I think she'll be different." Californian invader **Dancing Edie** goes turf-to-dirt after finishing a solid third in the GI Del Mar Oaks Aug. 20.

2) Capital-gains tax relief – The capital-gains holding period for horses drops from two years to one.

3) Protection for your property and investment – A designation of horses as livestock enables horse farmers to apply for emergency relief from the U.S.D.A. in the event of farm-related disasters such as drought.

Current law enables purchasers to write off up to \$100,000 of the cost of horses, provided total purchases of all depreciable property during the year do not exceed \$400,000. The \$100,000 expensing allowance applies to purchases made January 1, 2003 through December 31, 2007.

With Alexander Goldrun (Ire) in the Champion and the heavy rain likely to wash away the chance of **Attraction** lining up, this race has an open feel and **Chic** may be able to capitalize and gain an elusive Group 1. She turned the corner last August when she won the G3 Hungerford S. at Newbury and G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood, but went down by a neck after a titanic battle with Attraction in the G1 Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket in October. Retirement looked on the cards after a poor showing in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 27, but she rebounded in sensational fashion last time when besting Majors Cast (Ire) to record back-to-back wins in the Celebration Mile Aug. 28. **Majestic Desert** is another who has knocked on the door at this level, finishing runner-up in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot last June, G1 Prix d'Astarte at Deauville in August and G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua at the San Siro in October. She returned to her winning ways in the July 29 Oak Tree S. at Goodwood and was an unlucky third in the G3 Desmond S. over course and distance last time Aug. 14. "We've got to have another go at a Group 1 and she's a good filly who travels well," trainer Mick Channon said. "She's consistent, yet frustrating because she's been beaten so many times." **Virginia Waters** looked special when running away with the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 1, but the wheels came off shortly after and she needs to bounce back from a tame sixth in the July 30 G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood.

FOREST DANGER RETIRED TO TAYLOR MADE

Aaron and Marie Jones' **Forest Danger** (Forestry--Starry Ice, by Ice Age) has been retired from racing and will stand alongside his sire at Taylor Made Farm in Kentucky. Bred by Jerry and Barbara Jean Dutton in Kentucky, Forest Danger won Aqueduct's GIII Bay Shore S. by 7 1/2 lengths at three and added that track's GI Carter H. at four. He also holds Gulfstream Park's track record for 6 1/2 furlongs. "There are amazing similarities between Forest Danger and his sire, Forestry," Ben Taylor, vice president of Taylor Made Stalions, said. "Both horses were

extremely fast and both were campaigned by Aaron and Marie Jones. Both are great looking horses who sold for a lot of money." Trainer Todd Pletcher had high hopes for the bay colt this season. "He was nothing short of brilliant," Pletcher said. "I was looking forward to the Breeders' Cup Sprint. This horse had the same kind of talent." The \$900,000 FTFEB two-year-old retires with five wins from eight starts and \$423,000 in earnings. A stud will be announced a later date.

PEBBLES DIES Pebbles (GB) (Sharpen Up {GB}--La Dolce {GB}, by Connaught {GB}), the first British-trained runner to win at a Breeders' Cup race, has died in Japan. The 24-year-old mare was euthanized due to the infirmities of old age at Darley's Fukumitsu Farm, where she had been since 1996. She had been in retirement for the last three seasons. Bred by Captain Marcos Lemos, she carried his blue-and-white silks to success for trainer Clive Brittain in the 1984 G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket before being purchased by Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum. As a four-year-old she beat Rainbow Quest in the Sandown's G1 Eclipse S. and Slip Anchor (GB) in the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket before annexing the GI Breeders' Cup Turf in course-record time at Aqueduct. "She was just unbelievable--a great character," Clive Brittain told *PA Sport* yesterday. "I knew she was special as a foal. The highlight would have to be her victory in the Breeders' Cup Turf, more so because it was over a mile and a half and she wasn't expected to stay. She was just a class above the others. When she won the Eclipse, she made the colts like Rainbow Quest look like hacks. She has to be up there among the best fillies I have trained and I've been lucky enough to have a lot of good ones in my care--User Friendly, Sayyedati and Crimplene to name three." The champion older mare and champion miler in England in 1985, Pebbles also earned the Eclipse Award as champion turf mare that year. She retired at the end of the season with a record of 15-8-5-0 and earnings of \$1,429,243. Her record at stud was fairly undistinguished, however, producing just two winners and no stakes performers from her 12 foals.

TWO DUBAI PURSES RAISED The Dubai Racing Club has announced that the G1 Dubai Duty Free S., a 1777-meter event sponsored by Dubai Duty Free, and the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, a 2400-meter test sponsored by Dubai Waterfront, will be worth \$5 million each beginning in 2006. The winner's share of the purse will be \$3 million. The increase boosts the total prize money offered during the Dubai World Cup meeting, to be held Saturday, Mar. 25, to \$21,250,000. "The Dubai Duty Free and the Dubai Sheema Classic are recognized as important international races in their own right and thus justify this increase in prize money," said Saeed H. Al-Tayer, chairman of the Dubai Racing Club. He added, "The Dubai Racing Club remains at the forefront of the development of international racing and last year we broke all records for the number of international equine stars competing at one race meeting. We will be working tirelessly to ensure that the best horses from around the world take up the challenge to race in Dubai."

RAIN COULD COUNT ATTRACTION OUT The Duke of Roxburghe's **Attraction (GB)** (Efisio {GB}) looks certain to sidestep today's G1 Matron S. if the forecast heavy rain arrives. Trainer Mark Johnston's wife Deirdre announced yesterday that last year's G1 English and Irish 1000 Guineas, G1 Coronation S. and G1 Sun Chariot S. heroine would be scratched this morning if the going worsens. "She's over there now and we're are very happy with her, but the weather may just catch us out," she told *PA Sport*. "Everyone keeps telling me they've had a lot of rain over there, but we are not going to make a decision until probably on Saturday morning. She obviously likes fast ground and we don't want to run her if conditions are not ideal." If the four-year-old misses the contest, she will tackle the G1 Atto Mile at Woodbine next Sunday. "She will come back to England from Ireland and then get a flight from Amsterdam on Thursday--she's in terrific shape and whatever race we go for, I'd expect a good run."

Fighting on gamely, the pair refused to relent and, with the riders in sync, the pair hit the line in unison. **Close to You** may run back in the G1 **Dewhurst S.** at **Newmarket** Oct. 15, while **Silent Times'** trainer **Eoghan O'Neill** revealed that he could be aimed at the G1 **Breeders' Cup Juvenile** at **Belmont** Oct. 29.

As we have pointed out before, grass horses are very consistent, running figures in tight ranges, so results in turf races are often a function of weights and trips. But the fall means weight-for-age racing, and 1 3/8 miles at Belmont means a big, roomy course where the right horses usually get there.

PP HORSE

1 Swordsman (Ger)

Has a very nice pattern, and would fit with Gill 3yos. But this ain't that, so we'll wait for his late developing pedigree to kick in, and look for him later.

SIRE

Acatenango (Ger)

2 Angara (GB)

Benefited from a great ground saving ride by Stevens to prevail in a blanket finish last time when she wasn't best, against fillies. Her pattern is solid, she draws well, and gets weight worth 1/2 Thoro-Graph point, all of which give her a good shot for a check. But she's done an awful lot of developing, making a new top unlikely, so she would need several top horses not to fire or get awful trips in order to have a shot to win.

Alzao

3 Victory Circle

Would fit well in an allowance, or a state-bred stake.

Victory Gallop

4 Shake the Bank

So they send this horse out to set a fast pace, and everybody sits 15 lengths back and does what they usually do—I don't get it. Silly wabbit.

Sandpit (Brz)

5 Better Talk Now

Has developed with age, and has been managed, and for most part ridden, very well—Velazquez charted an uncharacteristically wide journey last time, which cost him at least second in the Million. Dominguez returns today, but at the end of the day, the Million and Breeders' Cup efforts were the only ones of the horse's 29 career starts that would give him any shot here. Contender, but underlay.

Talkin Man

6 Stage Call (Ire)

Is a solid listed stakes performer that shows up and runs his race. If this were a handicap he would have a good chance for a check.

Sadler's Wells

7 Vangelis

Is a typical Frankel turf runner, meaning he came out running at the beginning of his campaign, and has neither developed nor tailed off since, just pounded out his race. In his last he had a little trouble, but on his usual effort he figures around third best here at level weights, plus or minus ground loss. It is worth noting that Dominguez gets a lot of inside trips on grass, and Prado, recently, has not.

Highest Honor (Fr)

8 Rousing Victory

Developed nicely late last year, and enough this year to be a borderline fit with these. With only two starts this year and good time into this a new top is not out of the question, and if this were a handicap he might have been our longshot key. But it's not, so even a forward move will probably only earn him a check.

Victory Gallop

9 Dreadnaught

Ran his race last time, and between spotting weight and a wide trip, it was good enough to get him beat 11 lengths. His pattern is not bad, and there is some chance for a new top here, but he would need one to get a check.

Lac Ouimet

10 Relaxed Gesture (Ire)

Jumped to a new level in June, and has come back to run that figure twice more. Turf horses do crank out a high percentage of tops, and another one would almost certainly get him a check, and give him some shot to win. But at some point a series of peak efforts will take their toll, even for grass horses, and this one is well into a campaign. Tough call.

Indian Ridge (Ire)

11 King's Drama

Is a classic late developing turf gelding, that got significantly better from three to four, and again this year at five. This is also classic Frankel—he gets an incredibly high percentage of tops (see Thoro-Graph figure-based stats in our trainer profile), and this horse has either paired his top or run a new one in 5 of his 6 starts since Frankel took over. His seasonal debut was very good; his Sword Dancer even better, and with tactical speed and a decent run to the turn, a repeat should do it.

King's Theatre (Ire)

Overview – King's Drama is the horse to beat here, and should be a strong contender for the Breeders' Cup Turf. Lots of horses could fill out the exotics.
