RABBIT STEW

Saint Liam (Saint Ballado) turned the tables on GI Whitney H. winner **Commentator** (Distorted Humor) in yesterday's GI Woodward S. at Belmont Park, but he needed the help of a pair of rabbits to do it. Hounded by **Show Boot** (Storm Boot) and **Crafty Player** (Crafty Prospector) through a sizzling half in :45.40, Commentator still held a short lead after six panels, but tired down the lane. Saint Liam swept to the front and galloped to the line a handy 2 1/2-length winner over the late-running **Sir Shackleton** (Miswaki) as Commentator faded to third. "There is no question that he was double-teamed," said Nick Zito, trainer of Commentator. "But there is nothing against the rules--if you want to run rabbits, you run rabbits. That's racing. Whether it's fair or not is something people have to judge for themselves. It's a great question. But one rabbit, I think, would have been enough." **Woodward cont. p2**

ECLIPSED AGAIN IN IRISH CHAMPION STAKES

In a carbon-copy of the finish to the G1 Eclipse S., Susan Magnier's **Oratorio (Ire)** (Danehill) caught **Motivator (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) late to win the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown yesterday. On the sidelines since that Sandown success July 2, the 7-1 chance showed his customary lethargy mid-race and needed the wake-up from Kieren Fallon before the home turn to get within striking distance. Motivator was still full of run under Kevin Darley at the top of the straight, but Oratorio got to work and overwhelmed the G1 Epsom Derby hero with 150 yards remaining before asserting by a half-length. "I have a lot of confidence in this horse, despite the fact that he seems to be the under-dog all the time," Fallon said. **Irish Champion S. cont. p2**

DEADLY AT DONCASTER

Forced to do it the hard way in Doncaster's quagmire, Susan Magnier's **Scorpion (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) proved that class will win out when making every yard under Frankie Dettori to prevail in yesterday's G1 St Leger. Off the track since his exhibition of power in the July 26 G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp, the 10-11 crowd's choice led his reluctant rivals through soft early fractions before kicking at the top of the long straight. He gave the required response passing the quarter pole, but also a brief scare when jinking away from the whip inside the final eighth before holding on as **The Geezer (GB)** (Halling) bore down to win it by a length. **St Leger cont. p5**

Saint's Alive...

Saint Liam came to life at the end of his three-year-old campaign, winning an Aqueduct allowance test in December of 2003. He opened 2004 with a victory over optional claimers at Gulfstream in January, then was beaten just a head by Peace Rules when second in the Feb. 29 GII New Orleans H. The bay was sidelined after finishing third behind that rival in the Apr. 3 GII Oaklawn H., but came back to run the race of his life when second, beaten just a neck by Horse of the Year Ghostzapper at level weights, in this race last year.

The winner of the Nov. 26 GII Clark H. and the Feb. 5 GI Donn H., Saint Liam was even-money to make it three in a row in the Mar. 5 GI Santa Anita H., but never got untracked and finished sixth. He was given a break after that experience, returning to win the June 18 GI Stephen Foster H. before going down by a neck behind Commentator in the Whitney.

Commentator did have things all his own way in the Whitney, cruising along through an uncontested lead while setting serious fractions. Saint Liam came at him in the stretch, but Commentator held on gamely to win it by a neck. But things did not go as smoothly this time. No Comment...

Jockey Gary Stevens attempted to rate the four-year-old Commentator early, but was pressured by Show Boot on the rail and Crafty Player from the outside. He shook free of those two outclassed rivals after six furlongs in 1:10.34, but had nothing left for the drive. Saint Liam sailed up alongside him at the top of the lane and was under wraps as he galloped under the wire an easy winner. "It worked out to perfection," trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. said. "I never felt we needed these horses to kill the speed...I just didn't want Saint Liam to get down on his belly. Last year, he put in an unbelievable race [in the Woodward] and we didn't get to run him in the Breeders' Cup. This year looks different. So far, so good." He added, "We're living a dream right now is what we're doing. I've always been confident around this horse. He's something special." Saint Liam goes next in the Oct. 29 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Belmont Park. Commentator suffered just his second loss from nine career starts yesterday, finishing 14 1/2 lengths behind Saint Liam in third. "I don't know if things would have been any different without the rabbits," jockey Gary Stevens said. "Of course, they were keeping me company. I could just never get my horse to relax. But Saint Liam, take nothing away from him. He's a great horse."

Something To Sing About...**

Oratorio proved his wares last summer when winning the G3 Anglesey S. and G2 Futurity S. and finishing second in the G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh. He came

back stronger in the fall to land the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp on Arc day before finishing runner-up to Shamardal in the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket. He returned to that course to finish fourth in the Apr. 30 G1 2000 Guineas before chasing home Dubawi

(Ire) in the Irish equivalent at The Curragh May 21, but heads were scratched after his flop when down the field in the June 4 Epsom Derby. Bouncing back with a third in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot at York June 14, he caused an upset at 12-1 in the Eclipse, where the firm surface took its toll on 2-5 **Motivator**. Overlooked at 7-1 behind 6-4 **Azamour (Ire)** (Night Shift) and second choice **Motivator** yesterday, he once again grabbed the lead in the waning yards for the victory. "He has a lot of ability and an electric turn-of-foot, but when he got to the front today he pricked his ears again," Kieren Fallon said. "He makes my job easy because, even though he's lazy, he always gives more when you ask him." Aidan O'Brien was clear that it was the jockey who had eked the latent talent out of the colt. "He's an amazing horse and Kieren loved him all along--he has got the key to him," he said. "He's a lazy horse and only gives you what you want when you want it, but Kieren is a master jockey, as he's not an easy ride. He keeps answering all the questions himself and was very sore after Sandown, so we were surprised he came back. He's not short of pace and has an awful lot of options open to him--he will probably get further than a mile and a quarter and I don't think the trip is a problem for him."

On to the Arc...

Motivator's connections now focus on the Oct. 2 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp. "He's proved he is a very good horse over this trip, although he is possibly marginally better over a mile and a half," trainer Michael Bell said. "It was no disgrace to finish second in a proper race and we are looking forward to going to Paris." Azamour traveled ominously well in rear, but found little in the straight and could only stay on into fifth. After the race, trainer John Oxx told *Racing Post*, "Azamour did not pick up the way he usually does and Christophe [Soumillon] said the horse lost his footing turning into the straight and that he wasn't the same afterwards." As for what's next, he added, "The Arc has always been the plan, but we will wait and see how he is nearer the time."

A Hare-Raising Experience...

Setting the trend for GI Woodward S. winner Saint Liam, **Better Talk Now** also used a rabbit to ensure his victory in the GI Man o'War S. **Shake the Bank** (Sandpit {Brz}) was purchased this spring for the sole purpose of setting a solid pace for his stablemate. He was 15 lengths in front of the field as he cut out the running in the GI United Nations H. at Monmouth Park July 2, but was swallowed by the competition in the stretch, finishing eighth as Better Talk Now swooped late to win it by 3/4 of a length. Racing without his rabbit in the Aug. 13 GI Arlington Million, Better Talk Now closed to join the leaders in the stretch, but ran out of steam in the final furlong and ended up fourth. But Shake the Bank was back in the starting gate again yesterday. Feel His Sting...

Scorpion made his debut on testing ground at Leopardstown May 8, winning by a measured half length as the odds-on choice, and was narrowly denied an instant stakes score two weeks later when on the wrong side of the photo in the G3 Gallinule S. at The Curragh. The combination of fast ground and a slow pace was his undoing when trailing in the June 5 G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly, but he

got away from everything bar Hurricane Run (Ire) when second in the G1 Irish Derby when back at The Curragh June 26. He set a steady pace despite the testing ground at Doncaster yesterday and, despite shying from the whip in the final furlong, always looked a winner. "I felt that if somebody came at me I'd pull

out a bit more," Frankie Dettori told *Racing Post*. "When I asked him for a final effort he went to quicken again and lost his footing--he was trying to please me so much. He will be a better horse on better ground." Dettori had to give up the mount on Motivator (GB) in yesterday's G1 Irish Champion S. and get permission from Sheikh Mohammed to ride Scorpion in the St Leger. "I've got to say thanks to Sheikh Mohammed for letting me ride the horse and also thanks to Coolmore," Dettori continued. "I've got mixed emotions as I usually win these races for Godolphin and Sheikh Mohammed, and it feels peculiar to win for the main opposition. Hopefully, I will be back to win it for Godolphin next year." Scorpion was emulating Milan (GB) and Brian Boru (GB) in winning this for Aidan O'Brien. He may go next in the Oct. 2 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp. "We'll just wait and see how he comes out of the race before making any plans, but there will be plenty of options for him," O'Brien told *Racing Post*.

I had the [Oct. 15 GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland] in my mind and, if that's the case, we might leave her here." After all the doubts about her participation, Attraction was saved by the dry spell overnight and duly turned in a text-book display of front-running to wind back the clock. She was sent to Sha Tin in an attempt to shake up Silent Witness (Aus) on her four-year-old bow in the May 14 G1 Champions Mile, but trailed in 11th. She returned after a break to run with credit under a penalty when fourth in the G1 Hungerford S. at Newbury last time Aug. 13. Back with the old spring in her step here, she dominated the race and, despite some flashes of the tail as the cavalry closed in, had done enough to hold the charge of Chic. "Everybody that has had anything to do with her at home said how well she was doing and today she proved she is back to her old self," said winning rider Kevin Darley. Attraction will be aimed at either the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Newmarket Sept. 24 or G1 Sun Chariot S. a week later.

He was a lovely walking horse and sound, but not very big, so I couldn't not buy him."

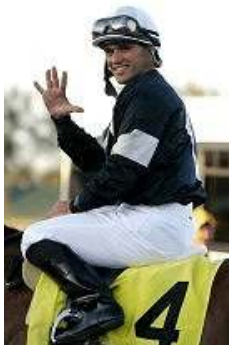

The Belmont BC H. pits a couple of lightly raced four-year-olds against a quartet of veterans. Undefeated **Shakespeare** bested Prince Arch when capturing the Caltech S. at Gulfstream in his second start, but he has made only one appearance since that Mar. 20, 2004 effort. Sidelined by a knee injury after that race, the bay finally made his return in an allowance test at Saratoga July 27 and ran his record to three-for-three. "I thought he was retired," trainer Bill Mott admitted. "I guess he's one of those horses that made a miraculous recovery." The son of GISW Lady Shirl (That's a Nice), Shakespeare is bred for graded competition, and his conditioner is optimistic that he will be up to the task. "If he improves [off his first race back], he'll be tough," Mott said. "He's going to have to step to the plate and show he belongs." **Greek Sun** also won the first three races of his career, including the Hill Rise S. in December of 2003 and the GIII Cinema BC H. in June of 2004. It took champion Kitten's Joy to end the streak, beating the dark bay by 3 1/4 lengths in the GI Secretariat S. last August. Greek Sun didn't appear to handle the yielding course in last year's edition of the GI Man o'War S., running eighth, but he rebounded to end the year with a rallying win in the Oct. 17 GII Oak Tree Derby. He has been off since, but has been working steadily and trainer Bobby Frankel scores with at a 23-percent clip off the extended layoff. The most accomplished of the elder set is **Meteor Storm**, who took the GI Manhattan H. over this course in 2004. The six-year-old adds blinkers after finishing off the board in this year's Manhattan and in the Aug. 13 GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. at Saratoga last time out.

Luca Cumani, who captured this prize with Only Royale (Ire) in 1993, is back with a genuine Arc contender in **Alkaased** this time. September 13, 1974...Trainer **D. Wayne Lukas** notched his first Thoroughbred stakes victory, saddling his own three-year-old colt **Harbor Hauler** to take the second division of the Foothill S. at Pomona. The winner's share of the purse was \$6,312.

September 13, 1989...Jockey **Pat Day** won eight of the nine races on the card at Arlington International Racecourse.

September 14, 1853...**West Australian** won the St. Leger S. by three lengths and became England's first Triple Crown winner.
