The legacy of Serena's Song continued yesterday at Keeneland as her foal of 2004, a colt by Storm Cat, topped yesterday's strong opening session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington with a bid of \$3.5 million. Consigned by Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud on behalf of Bob and Beverly

Lewis, the full brother to Group 1 winner Sophisticat and Grade II hero Grand Reward was purchased by John Ferguson, bidding for Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum. "Obviously, an exceptional pedigree," Ferguson commented. "The mare's done it with Sophisticat, who won the

G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot; you've got Grand Reward--he's got an awful lot going for him as well. He was an outstanding horse to boot." The bloodstock advisor indicated that a decision as to where the colt, one of a record 21 to bring seven figures yesterday, might race is forthcoming. "He's a horse that could go either way [to Europe or America]. That's a decision we always make next week." As for the price, Ferguson said, "Just like any other September Sale, when you want to buy those horses that have the conformation, the athleticism, and the pedigree, you have to go high."

Same Old Song...

Serena's Song, an 11-time Grade I winner of over \$3.2 million on the racetrack, has been equally successful as a producer of seven-figure yearlings. In addition to \$3.4 million Keeneland July yearling Sophisticat and \$1 million Keeneland July graduate Serena's Tune, she has also been represented by Harlington, a \$2.8 million September 2003 graduate. Bob Lewis admitted to some mixed emotions following the sale. "We wish the buyers all the success in the world," he stated. "We can't really tell you that we're overjoyed with having sold the horse, because we really believe in him. We think he's a magnificent young colt, he's maturing magnificently and we believe we may have sold one of the best horses in the sale. It's a stab in the dark. You hope you're right, but sometimes you find yourself wrong."

Stonerside Does it Again with Storm Cat Colt...

Robert and Janice McNair's Stonerside Stable has been on a roll. The operation bred the \$3.1 million Storm Cat-Rings a Chime sales topper at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale, then outdid themselves when they sold, through agent Lane's End, the A.P. Indy--Sahara Gold colt that brought \$3.4 million as hip 67 yesterday. Just 69 hips after that, the Stonerside crew was at it again. Through Taylor

Made Sales Agency, a muscular son of Storm Cat out of Stonerside's Ajina (Strawberry Road {Aus}) attracted a bid of \$3 million from familiar faces--John Ferguson and Sheikh Mohammed. "He was just an awesome Storm Cat," said Taylor Made's Frank Taylor of hip 136. "Just a very good body--he looks like a runner. He had a great walk, very athletic. Great conformation. And he's out of a great mare, too. He had it all, just a super horse." Taylor said the steep price tag wasn't unexpected. "Everybody that wanted a top stallion prospect was basically on him," he said, adding, "It's a guess [after the million-dollar mark]. We were thinking, for sure, he'd bring over two million, and thought he could bring as much as four or five [million]--so he brought a reasonable, fair price for everybody."

Ajina, a seven-length winner of the GII Demoiselle S. at two, was named champion three-year-old filly in 1997 on the basis of wins in the GI Mother Goose S., GI CCA Oaks and GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. The mare, who resides at Stonerside's farm near Paris, KY, did not have a foal in 2005 and is currently believed to be in foal to the cover of A.P. Indy.

The Sheikh's Own Private Idaho...Again...

The 2004 opening session was highlighted by an A.P. Indy--Sahara Gold (Storm Cat) colt, later named Idaho, that Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum landed with a \$3.1 million bid. He had to go a bit further this year and the colt wasn't quite the session topper, but Sheikh Mohammed walked away with another son of A.P. Indy out of Sahara Gold with an offer of \$3.4

million. Flanked by his wife, Princess Haya bint Al Hussain of Jordan, and advisor John Ferguson, Sheikh Mohammed did the bidding himself while standing in the lead-in area behind the auctioneers' stand. Consulting with Princess Haya and Ferguson several times, he saw off a persistent rival to secure hip 67, a member of the consignment from Lane's End, which was acting as agent for breeder Stonerside Stable. A laughing Princess Haya said, "I'll sign for that!" as the runner brought over the ticket, printing Ferguson's name on the slip. Explaining the colt's appeal, Ferguson said, "He's a very, very athletic horse, a horse we've seen through the year. We own his full brother, who we like. Obviously, A.P. Indy is a great sire for America, and I would suspect he's a horse that Sheikh Mohammed might decide to leave here in America." Stonerside bloodstock advisor John Adger added, "We love A.P. Indy, we breed two or three mares to him every year. This has been an exceptional cross. The full brother and this horse are very much alike. Darley seem to think a lot of [Idaho] and I think that's one reason they were interested in buying this one as well. We wish them the best, and we wouldn't be surprised if he turns out to be a top, top colt." Stonerside have a weanling full sister that they are going to keep and race.

Mr. Greeley Filly Hits the Mark...

A yearling by Mr. Greeley became the fourth-highest-priced filly to go through the ring at Keeneland September when Bob and Beverly Lewis battled to land hip 84. With a thumbs-up sign to the bid spotter, Bob Lewis, sitting with his wife and trainers Bob Baffert and D. Wayne Lukas, upped his offer to \$2.7 million, which secured the full to El Corredor and half to Roman Ruler. Baffert, sitting behind the Lewises, signed the ticket and will train the dark bay filly. Baffert conditioned El Corredor, winner of the GI Cigar Mile, and currently trains Roman Ruler, who won the GI Haskell Invitational H. before running third in the GI Travers S. "She looks a lot like El Corredor," commented Baffert. "The mare throws them like the sire. The family is so remarkable. They're all runners, and there's no limit to the residual value." Bob Lewis pointed to the filly's catalog page and her "outstanding conformation" as the reasons he went after the daughter of the Silver Deputy mare Silvery Swan. "You know, everybody says it, but we believe she's the best filly in the sale," he said. "Now, I'm sure there are a lot of consignors that would shoot me down on that, and that's understandable. But it's nice as a buyer to have bought what we thought to be the very best. And that's what we're doing here."

Another Live Prospect for Live Oak...

Basking in the afterglow of In the Gold's victory in Saturday's GI Gazelle H. at Belmont Park, Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Stud was in a spending mood yesterday at Keeneland, going to \$2.7 million for a filly by Kingmambo out of champion older mare Escena (Strawberry Road {Aus}). The seven-figure price tag made her the co-highest priced September filly. The dark bay was yet another consigning success for Denali Stud, who sold the Mar. 27 foal for the Falls Creek Farm of Guy and Diane Snowden. "I think we got ourselves a really nice filly," commented Live Oak General Manager John Rasmussen. "She's real scopy and she's got a real good family. It's a nice buy." Commenting on the price, Rasmussen added, "It was a little more than I expected." Live Oak has also been represented at the races this season by the stakes winners My Typhoon (Ire) (Giant's Causeway) and Hide and Chic (Seeking the Gold). "She got a wonderful, wonderful home and we couldn't be happier with that," Diane Snowden said. "We're extremely pleased. We knew she was special." The Snowdens purchased Escena for \$3.25 million at the 1999 Keeneland January Sale. The only other foal to sell from the mare was a filly, later named Virtuosa, who made \$3.7 million at the 2001 Keeneland July sale.

Where Potential Meets Passion

The Keeneland September Yearling Sale continues through Monday, September 26

‘Drop’ It Like It’s Hot...

Stepping into the ring as Hip 28, a sleek dark bay son of sophomore sire Lemon Drop Kid got the action going at the Keeneland sales pavilion, becoming the first of the session to eclipse the seven-figure mark. Bidding on behalf of Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid Al Maktoum’s Gainsborough Farm from in front of the ring, Michael Goodbody went to \$1.4 million for the Apr. 21 foal. Lane’s End, agent, consigned the well-related individual, who’s a 3/4 brother to a pair of European stars: Divine Proportions (Kingmambo) and Whipper (Miesque’s Son). The latter was the heavyweight three-year-old in France at 7-9 ½ furlongs in 2004, while the filly Divine Proportions established herself as one of the better distaffers in Europe in recent years, winning nine of 10 starts, including five Group-1 events. Divine Proportions was retired recently after emerging from her lone loss--a fourth against males in the Aug. 14, G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard Jacques le Marois--with a tendon injury. “He’s got such a nice female line,” said Goodbody when asked about the appeal of the colt. “He’s got a stallion’s pedigree.” The sale was a major score for breeder Gary Middlebrook, who, along with his wife, purchased the dam of hip 28, the Sadler’s Wells mare Myth to Reality (Fr), for \$125,000 at the 2003 Keeneland January Sale in foal to Mt. Livermore.

Lucky 98 for Einsidler...

For the second time in a month, Lee Einsidler is leaving a select yearling sale with a half sibling to a champion which bore hip number 98. The vice president of the Sidney Frank Import Company, the founder of Grey Goose vodka, made a splash at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale when he purchased a Fusaichi Pegasus half brother to champion sprinter Squirtle Squirt for \$1.1 million. Seated alongside trainer and advisor John Kimmel, Einsidler jumped into the fray yesterday, signing the ticket on a Storm Cat half sister to 2002 champion juvenile colt Vindication from the Taylor Made consignment. “She’s a Storm Cat filly with a world-class pedigree,” Kimmel commented.

“You know this kind of filly doesn’t come around that much. She’s got the physical, passed her vet inspection with flying colors and I thought she was the filly with the most upside in the sale. On the downside, she’s worth \$1 million if she never sets a foot on the race-track.” Einsidler is having the time of his life. “If you’re not having a good time, you shouldn’t do it,” he commented. “If you’re spending \$1.7 million, you should enjoy it. I’m having fun.” Asked about the final bid, he added, “For that filly I had pretty deep pockets.” The dark bay is also a half sister to Scipion (A.P. Indy), winner of the GIII Risen Star S. in February.

Chiefswood Adds to Broodmare Band...

Chiefswood Stables, the Toronto-based operation of Robert and Brad Krembil, went to an even \$1 million for hip 172, a daughter of Gone West--Candleinthedark (Cox’s Ridge). Bred by Sea Horse Breeders and Peter Bradley, the bay was consigned to the sale by Greenfield Farm (B.D. Gibbs Farm LLC), acting as agent. Bob Krembil explained his purchase and how the filly fits their fledgling program. “She’s a very athletic animal,” he commented. “We breed to race, so when we buy, we tend to focus on fillies. We like to buy [fillies] as yearlings that have pedigrees we like. Hopefully she’ll have a race career with us, but when she’s finished, she’ll go into our broodmare band.” Krembil has amassed 21 broodmares and aims to keep it at around that number. Later in the session, the outfit went to \$425,000 for a Taylor Made-consigned daughter of A.P. Indy--Debit Account (Mr. Prospector). Chiefswood campaigns Niigon (Unbridled), winner of the 2004 Queen’s Plate, as well as Fifth Overture (Pulpit), a filly they acquired for \$240,000 at the 2002 September sale who won last weekend’s GIII Seaway S. at Woodbine.

First Session a Record Breaker...

During yesterday's frenzied day of bidding, 21 horses sold for over \$1 million. That is a single-session record for Keeneland September, besting the 19 sold on day two of the 2000 sale. The record number of \$1-million plus horses for an entire sale is 27 set in 2000, 2001 and 2003. In total, 188 yearlings sold yesterday for \$88,712,000, making it the second highest grossing session for September. The record is the \$94,590,000 set on Sept. 12, 2000. The opening session average rose 27 percent from a year ago, to \$471,872. The median increased 14.3 percent to \$300,000. The buy-back rate was 24.5 percent. "The feeling all week has been that the quality of horses on the grounds is the highest level in the last five years and I think that's reflected in the prices," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. When asked if he expected the sale to post such strong results, he admitted that, "The numbers were higher than I thought they would be." Russell was also pleased that of the 21 horses that made a million dollars or more, they were spread across several buyers. "We had buyers from North America and Europe--Live Oak, Betty Moran, B. Wayne Hughes--there was a wide swath of them."

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland Director of Sales

"I would doubt it would ever come back in its formal form. July is always under discussion with our consignors. The format of July--I don't think we'll ever see a July of the 1980s ever again."
 --*Asked about the likelihood of a return of the July sale*

Dr. Demi O'Byrne, bloodstock advisor for Coolmore:

"It seems like a good sale. I'm very happy with what I've got."

Bloodstock agent Buzz Chace:

The sale today has blown way up; there's a lot of real nice horses to sell and there's a lot of people here to buy them. It's made it tough for me to buy. I bought a couple of real nice horses I thought fell through the cracks, and I'm really happy with the ones I got. It'll be the same [Tuesday]--it will be strong again. I think there's some even better horses in [today]. It's a real good catalog.

Hughes Tries Hand as a Seller....

Prominent California owner B. Wayne Hughes is accustomed to coming to Keeneland as a buyer, playing at the mid- to upper levels. But the founder of the Public Storage chain of stores is wearing another hat this time around. Hughes, who finalized a deal to purchase Spendthrift Farm last year, has several horses consigned to today's second round of bidding, including hips [315](#) and [385](#). The former, consigned by Spendthrift, is the second foal from Poetically (Silver Deputy), the champion two-year-old filly in Canada in 2000. Hughes saw fit to go all the way to \$2.05 million to acquire the mare at the 2003 Keeneland November sale carrying a colt by A.P. Indy. The dark bay is a grandson of Primarily, herself a \$2.2 million graduate of the November sale. Hip 385, consigned by Taylor Made Sales, is also a son of A.P. Indy out of Tricky Game (Majestic Light). He is a half brother to MGSW King Cugat, GISP Western Expression and Commodities, the dam of MGSW Rey de Café. Hughes acquired the mare carrying a Unbridled colt for \$575,000 at the 2001 November sale.

2004 Topper in Steady Training...

Trainer Bob Baffert reported yesterday that the \$8-million sales-topper at the September sale is currently up to half-mile workouts at Santa Anita. Still unnamed, but referred to around the barn as "Big Bucks," the son of Storm Cat--Welcome Surprise has been a little slow to come around, Baffert explained. "He was very immature," he commented. "You've got to take your time with these kinds of horses. You have to train them a little bit differently. We like him so far, and when he shows us he's ready to run, that's when he'll run." Baffert said that the colt's first start could come during the fall meet at Santa Anita or Hollywood.

SALE BLASTS OFF

You know all those chats we've been having about the size of the stallion books, all that stuff about over-production ... basically, about how some of the fundamentals are out of kilter? Forget it. Monday's opening session of Keeneland's September Yearling Sale made all previous Mondays of all previous September sales look like practice sessions. The gross was up \$25 million from Monday last year, the average was up \$100,000: that's a 40-percent jump in the gross, and 27 percent in average. Those are massive gains.

It's hard to believe today will be up another 40 percent. Last year, Monday grossed \$63 million, and Tuesday grossed \$87 million--almost exactly yesterday's total of \$88 million. It seems more likely that today will continue on in much the same vein as yesterday, rather than jump again; in other words, that Monday and Tuesday are more level than in previous years. In fact, yesterday's average of \$471,872 was not a September sale record; Tuesday last year averaged \$488,620. If today's average is up another quarter from that, this really will be the sale to end all sales.

One very positive indicator is that, in all of Book 1 last year, 26 yearlings brought final bids of \$1 million or more. Yesterday there were 21, so if that number is just matched today, the number of seven-figure Book 1 yearlings will be up by nearly 60 percent over last year. Here's another positive indicator: for the first time in years, Sheikh Maktoum, Sheikh Hamdan, and Sheikh Mohammed were at the sale. Among them, the three bought 20 yearlings for a total of \$22,975,000, including nine seven-figure yearlings. Demi O'Byrne, the Coolmore buyer, signed for six totalling \$5,800,000, including three seven-figure yearlings. Probably the most telling statistic of all is that the Maktoums and Coolmore combined only accounted for a third of yesterday's gross, and more seven-figure yearlings were bought by other operations than were bought by them combined. **Contact Bill Oppenheim at bopp@erb.com.**

"The King Is Dead, Long Live The King!"

Actually, he's not dead, but hale and hearty...and no, I'm not referring to Elvis, but to Sadler's Wells, the marvellous Coolmore stallion. While the son of Northern Dancer is still going strong at the age of 24, the perennial champion sire now looks certain to be dethroned as the King of the British and Irish stallions after a reign lasting 13 consecutive years.

There is still some doubt, though, as to which stallion will take his crown. The only certainty is that it will be another Coolmore star (just as it was a Coolmore stallion, Caerleon, who interrupted Sadler's Wells' long reign back in 1991).

The hot favourite has to be Danehill, who went into the weekend holding an advantage of less than £200,000 over the rookie Montjeu. Bearing in mind that Montjeu promptly collected his third classic of the season, thanks to Scorpion's decisive success in the St Leger, and then collected second prize, via Motivator, in the rich Irish Champion S., he could have been expected to make serious inroads into Danehill's lead.

However, Motivator's conqueror was Danehill's tough son Oratorio and Danehill then collected another valuable prize when Dylan Thomas helped extend his sire's unassailable lead on the juvenile table to more than £500,000. The end result was that Danehill (who also struck with Luas Line in a Grade I at Belmont) actually increased his advantage over Montjeu on the Anglo-Irish list. With such strength in depth among his juveniles, he seems unlikely to relinquish that lead over the next two months.

Montjeu, of course, also scored with another of his classic winners, the Arc contender Hurricane Run, in the G2 Prix Niel on Sunday, while his daughter Dash To The Top ran creditably after a very slow start in the G1 Prix Vermeille. This nine-year-old son of Sadler's Wells has left absolutely no doubt that he is capable of dominating the middle-distance classic scene, in much the same way that his sire has been a wonderfully fertile source of Derby, Oaks and St Leger winners.

Montjeu's total of first-crop stakes winners now stands at 10, from 115 live foals, and one of his non-stakes winners is the Derby runner-up Walk In The Park. Incidentally, he had only one stakes winner at this stage last year and we are still awaiting his first stakes winner from his second crop, which is only two thirds the size of its predecessor. **Cont. p11**

It is hardly surprising that a son of Sadler's Wells was selected for Scorpion's dam Ardmelody, an unraced daughter of the Irish Derby winner Law Society. Sadler's Wells had sired the Prix Vermeille third Larrocha from Ardmelody's second dam Le Melody, plus the Group 2 winners Modhish and Russian Snows from Le Melody's Classic-winning half sister Arctique Royale. He also sired another Group 2 winner, Wareed, from a daughter of Arctique Royale.

Another incentive for selecting a Sadler's Wells line stallion was Ardmelody's sire line. Mares by Law Society and his sire Alleged have struck up a successful partnership with the Sadler's Wells male line, notably producing the Group 1 winners Brian Boru, Dream Well and Endless Hall. You'll hardly need reminding that Brian Buru also won the St Leger, two years before Scorpion.

Scorpion is one of two major winners of 2005 which have Le Melody as their third dam, the other being Electrocutationist, the Red Ransom colt who triumphed in the Gran Premio di Milano and Juddmonte International. Electrocutationist's branch of the family is also responsible for Royal Highness, who closed strongly to be a good second in the G1 Prix Vermeille two days ago.

This family has also done very well with Danehill, the sire of Ardmelody's group-placed Listed winners Danish Rhapsody and Garuda. Other representatives of this cross are the smart German horses Eagle Rise (by Danehill) and Elopa (by Danehill's son Tiger Hill) and the French 2000 Guineas second Catcher In The Rye. Even so, Ardmelody's best previous winner had nothing to do with Sadler's Wells or Danehill, this being her Don't Forget Me filly Memories, winner of the GII Orchid H.

Scorpion's immediate female line therefore represents four generations of solid achievement at a high level. For good measure, his fourth dam Arctic Melody was a sister to Modern Lady, the third dam of that top-notch French filly Magic Night (Prix Vermeille and second in the Arc). However, the purists will never forget that Arctic Melody and Modern Lady were sired by Arctic Slave, a versatile horse who won on the flat, over hurdles and over fences before becoming one of the dominant stallions in British and Irish jump racing.

This link to the jumping world has since been considerably strengthened by the progeny of Le Melody's outstanding son Ardross (twice a winner of the Ascot Gold Cup) and her accomplished grandson Alflora. The latter now ranks as one of the most popular sires of jumpers in Britain.

One can only speculate about the effect these links will eventually have on Scorpion's prospects as a stallion. Sue Magnier's last two winners of the St Leger--the Sadler's Wells colts Milan and Brian Boru--both retired directly to the jumping sector of Coolmore's Irish operation.

It is hard to envision Scorpion escaping a similar fate, as his best efforts have come over 1 1/2 miles and 1 3/4 miles. The fact that Kieren Fallon--who needs only the St Leger to complete his set of British Classics --was drafted to partner Oratorio in the Irish Champion S. rather than the odds-on Scorpion in the St Leger shows where Coolmore's priorities lie. They fully understand that further Group 1 glory for Oratorio--who also scored at Group 1 level over seven furlongs as a two-year-old--is going to make him a very attractive stallion proposition.

Scorpion, on the other hand, faces an uphill struggle if he's to earn a chance of passing on his considerable talents to the flat sector. He is going to have to match some of Montjeu's achievements, such as his victories in the Arc and King George, and he would also benefit from a victory in a major 10-furlong event. I, for one, would like to see him do it.
