JACKSON IN A HUMOROUS MOOD

Sons of Distorted Humor proved popular during yesterday's fourth day of bidding at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale, but none more so than hip 1156, which realized a session-topping bid of \$900,000 from the Stonestreet Stables LLC of Jess Jackson. The action boiled down to Jackson, seated next to his advisor John Moynihan, and the Virginia-based Eldon Farm Equine of Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Luke, advised by Debbie Easter. The Eldon team, more comfortable at slightly lower levels, saw fit to bid the horse up to \$850,000. Jackson countered with what would be the final salvo, and, despite continued prodding from auctioneer Ryan Mahan, Eldon refused to see the raise and

bowed out. It was the third and most expensive purchase on the day for Jackson, who is building an imposing operation at the former Buckram Oak Farm, a stone's throw from Keeneland. "He's an athlete and he's by Distorted Humor, one of the up-and-coming sires," Jackson commented. "He's got the pedigree and the athletic body to run and that's the combination we're looking for. We want to run them to prove how good they are and, if they're good, then we want to stand them [at stud]. We've got a lot of mares to service at Stonestreet." Added Moynihan, "He's a great looking horse by a great stallion. The horse gets Classic horses, he gets fast horses. This was a stellar individual by a great stallion." The chestnut, a Jan. 24 foal, also has plenty of black type in his family--his second dam is a half sister to T.V. Countess, who produced champion Countess Diana. He was consigned by Warrendale Sales on behalf of Collier Farm, who went to \$130,000 to purchase the colt at last year's Keeneland November Sale. The colt's dam, *Barnie Fife* (Deputy Minister), failed to meet her reserve at \$80,000 when offered carrying this foal at the 2003 November sale.

A Bitter Pill to Swallow...

Speaking on behalf of Eldon, Easter admitted that defeat was difficult to admit. "We sure did like that colt," she stated. "He looked like a racehorse and looked like the kind you could lead over there for a big race at the end of the day. He really caught our eye and we were excited to have him, but unfortunately, we didn't get him."

Unbridled's Song Colt Tops Early Returns...


A son of Unbridled's Song out of 1996 GI Spinaway S. winner Oath (Known Fact) brought a final bid of \$700,000 early in yesterday's action. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, acting on behalf of the colt's breeders Racehorse Management, hip 977 was purchased by Tim Kegel, agent for an undisclosed partnership "that likes to race." Bloodstock agent Buzz Chace was the immediate underbidder. WinStar Farm purchased Oath for \$280,000 at the 2003 Keeneland November Sale carrying the Unbridled's Song foal in utero. "I thought he was probably the best physical I saw on the day," said WinStar President Doug Cauthen. "I really thought he could make a million, but there's so many nice horses here and you have to be really happy with that." Consigned by the Taylor Made agency, the colt was bred on a similar cross to champion Banshee Breeze. WinStar purchased Oath, carrying this foal, for just \$280,000 at the 2003 Keeneland November. And they had a very pointed reason for doing so. The operation had just retired Lightnin N Thunder, a homebred son of Storm Cat out of 1997 GI Spinaway S. winner Things Change, and were beginning to structure his stud career at Bridlewood Farm in Florida. "We wanted Grade I or graded-stakes mares [for Lightnin N Thunder] and we thought [the cross] would work well with the sire," Cauthen explained. WinStar supports the stallion with "about 10 to 12 of our mares," Cauthen said, adding that Bridlewood has also committed mares to the four-year-old. Lightnin N Thunder was bred to over 100 mares this year and stands for a fee of \$4,000, live foal.

Forest Wildcat, Unbridled's Song Fillies to Jackson...

A year and a day ago, a Giant's Causeway colt out of the stakes-placed Deputy Minister mare President's Girl had topped the third session at Keeneland, purchased by B. Wayne Hughes for \$750,000. A three-parts sister to that colt, a Forest Wildcat filly selling as hip 994, earned plenty of attention herself yesterday, drawing a \$440,000 bid from Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stables. Jackson outdueled Buzz Chace for the Taylor Made Sales consignee. Sitting just across a bank of seats from each other in the pavilion, Chace, advising Barry Schwartz, exchanged \$10,000 bids with Jackson before relenting at Jackson's \$440,000 offer. "She's an athlete," explained Jackson when asked about what filly's appeal. "She's balanced; good stock. The mare has produced some nice-looking horses, and it's a good line." Last year's Giant's Causeway session topper, named Presidential Cause, has been working steadily toward his debut at San Luis Rey in California. About an hour and a half after that, Jackson outlasted Chace and Schwartz once again, this time for hip 1045, an Unbridled's Song--Song to Remember (Storm Cat) filly that was knocked down for \$450,000. Produced by a half sister to MGSW Lech and GSW Savina, hip 1045 was another member of the Taylor Made draft.

Big Day For Warrendale...

Warrendale Sales' Kitty Taylor comes to Keeneland with a lot of pedigree. A veteran of the major yearling sales in Central Kentucky, Taylor has learned the business from some prominent horsemen, including Stanley Petter, Fred Seitz, Tyson Gilpin and Lee Eaton. In 1992, she took an office job with Ben P. Walden Jr. at Vinery and became so proficient and so trusted that ultimately, Walden turned over the management of the nursery's sales consignments, which she did for eight successful years. In 2002, after two years as the co-owner of Bluewater Sales, she branched off on her own, launching Warrendale Sales. Yesterday, the organization had a very profitable session at Keeneland, headlined by the sale of the \$900,000 colt by Distorted Humor. "He was awesome," she said, sporting a huge smile. "He was vetted and scoped a lot. He was a big, athletic individual. He was prepped at Fares Farm and they did a wonderful job with him. It all came together." Later in the session, Warrendale sold hip 1217, a Buddha half brother to GSW Pratella (Jade Hunter), for \$235,000 to Leonard Riggio's My Meadowview Farm. Taylor said that she made a conscious decision to be a bigger fish in a somewhat smaller pond and consign from Book 2. "I think in Book 1 you need to have an A.P. Indy or a Kingmambo or a Storm Cat," she offered. "I have really good individuals. I have a lot of loyal clients, but they don't breed to those sires, so we fit better here."

Fox Hill Remains on the Prowl...

John Porter's Fox Hill Farm snapped up the first horse through the ring on Wednesday--a \$410,000 full brother to Grade I winner Tarlow (Stormin Fever)--and kept up his spending spree during yesterday's early activity, going to \$375,000 for a chestnut son of Distorted Humor, selling as hip [969](#). Consigned by True North Farm, agent, the Mar. 23 foal was previously purchased by James Lane Stables for \$140,000 during last year's Keeneland November Sale. "We like the conformation. [Trainer] John [Servis] liked that horse a lot," Porter commented. "Conformation-wise, he rated him about as high as he rates a horse. We like the pedigree and we like the way he looks. We thought he was a stand-out looking horse." Produced by Music House (Sadler's Wells), the colt is bred on a cross that has worked well in the past. The mare has already produced graded stakes winner Allspice to the cover of Coronado's Quest, another son of Forty Niner. With yesterday's purchase, Porter has acquired seven horses worth over \$2.8 million during the first four days of the sale.

Keeneland Keeps on Rolling...

Figures for yesterday's fourth session of the September sale couldn't quite keep pace with 2004's numbers, but Keeneland officials were happy with yesterday's solid round of bidding. "It might have been a little softer in spots today than I anticipated, but I feel very good," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "It's strong and rolling along. The numbers are slightly off, but overall I'm very pleased." The average for the session dipped 4.1 percent, from \$136,172 to \$130,586, but the median remained constant at an even \$100,000. Despite yesterday's slight dip, the sale continued on a record pace with cumulative average up 14.9 percent and the median up 13.3 percent. "The first two days were unbelievable," said Russell. "Now, we take a day off and we come back with a group we think is a very strong physical group of horses, and the start of the middle market. So we have to see how that will be."

LEROIDESANIMAUX TO STONEWALL

Leroidesanimaux (Brz) (Candy Stripes--Dissemble {GB}, by Ahonoora {GB}), a winner of his last seven starts, including the GI Citation H. and the GI Frank E Kilroe Mile H., will enter stud at Stonewall Farm in Versailles, Kentucky, upon the completion of his racing career. The five-year-old is slated to make his next start in Sunday's GI Atto Mile S. at Woodbine, which will serve as a prep for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile S. at Belmont Park Oct. 29. "Leroidesanimaux fits the profile of a Stonewall Stallion," said farm owner Audrey Haisfield. "He is battle tested and has consistently proven himself against the very best competition." Bred by Haras Bage Do Sul in Brazil and owned by TNT Stud, Leroidesanimaux will join Doneraile Court, Marquetry and Medaglia d'Oro at Stonewall.

EUROSILVER TO DROMOLAND Eurosilver (Unbridled's Song--Russian Tango, by Nijinsky II), winner of the GII Breeders' Futurity S. at two and the GIII Skip Away H. at four, will help launch the stallion division of Dromoland Farm in Lexington, Ky. "I am delighted to enter the stallion market with a horse of this quality," said Gerry Dilger, owner of Dromoland Farm. "Eurosilver was brilliant as a two-year-old, he was a graded stakes performer at both three and four, while overcoming illness and injury. Eurosilver has all the ingredients necessary to become a premier stallion." Bred and owned by Buckram Oak Farm, the dark bay retires with four wins from 12 starts and \$622,310 in earnings. A stud fee will be announced at a later date.

GULFSTREAM STAKES WORTH \$8 MILLION Gulfstream Park's 2006 stakes schedule, headlined by the \$1-million GI Florida Derby, is worth \$8,045,000. The Florida Derby will be run Apr. 1 and is one of 31 graded stakes on tap for the track's 87-day meeting. Triple Crown hopefuls can prep for the Florida Derby with a series of stakes races, beginning with the Jan. 7 Aventura S. and followed by the Feb. 4 \$150,000 GII Hutcheson S. and \$150,000 GIII Holy Bull S. and the Mar. 4 \$300,000 GII Fountain of Youth S. and \$150,000 GII Swale S. The fourth annual Sunshine Millions will be held Jan. 28, with Gulfstream hosting the \$500,000 Sunshine Millions Distaff, \$500,000 Sunshine Millions Turf, \$300,000 Sunshine Millions Sprint and the \$250,000 Sunshine Millions Oaks. "The Gulfstream stakes schedule offers outstanding opportunities in every division," said Scott Savin, Gulfstream president and general manager. "We're very excited about the upcoming season." Other highlights of the schedule are the Feb. 4 \$500,000 GI Donn H. and the Feb. 25 GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. The 2006 Gulfstream meet runs from Jan. 4 through Apr. 23.
