**KEENELAND GONE 'WILD'**

A colt by Wild Wonder earned top honors at Keeneland yesterday when John Brocklebank went to \$270,000 for the gray, who was originally a \$10,000 purchase by agent Chad Johnson at last year's Keeneland November sale. Hailing from the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment, hip 3076 is out of the winning Talinum mare Susie Do, a half sister to stakes winner Milligan. Wild Wonder, who stood the 2005 breeding season at Spendthrift Farm

for \$5,000, has been represented by two graded winners this year: siblings Fusaichi Rock Star and Wild Fit, who captured the GI San Vicente S. and GI Del Mar Debutante S., respectively. The sale, which set a new world standard Monday when gross sales receipts passed the \$324,904,300 mark, continued to roll on impressively yesterday, with average up more than 25 percent from last year, from \$28,779 to \$36,078. Median also enjoyed a solid boost, from \$23,000 to \$27,000--an increase of 17.4 percent--while gross soared from \$8,230,700 to \$10,642,900. Keeneland September's ninth session saw 16 yearlings sell for \$100,000 or more, compared with nine in 2004. The sale continues today at 10:00 a.m.

**U.S. SENATE VOTE ENDS HORSE SLAUGHTER**

Following the example of their colleagues in the U.S. House of Representatives, the U.S. Senate voted 68 to 29 in favor of an amendment to bar federal funds from being used to facilitate the slaughter of horses on Tuesday, according to a release from the Society for Animal Protective Legislation. Because the Food and Drug Administration requires that all meat to be consumed by humans be inspected by FDA inspectors, thus using federal funds, the measure effectively stops the slaughter of horses for human consumption, at least for the following year. The amendment was introduced by Sen. John Ensign (R-Nev.) and Sen. Robert C. Byrd (D-W.Va.). The House approved a companion measure on June 8, which also stops American horses from being exported for slaughter abroad. The measure will now be presented before a conference committee, and supporters anticipate that Congress will approve the initiative. Because the amendment is attached to an annual spending bill, it will only halt horse slaughter for the next fiscal year, which begins Oct. 1. "To say we are thrilled is putting it mildly," said Diana Pikulski, the Executive Director of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, the oldest and largest equine rescue organization in the world, which currently provides lifetime homes to over 1,100 retired Thoroughbreds.

"With the killer-buyers out of business, the various horse industries will be forced to take action to fund humane retirement for their horses," Pikulski continued. "We know that the Thoroughbred industry feels the moral obligation to do so, as they supported an end to slaughter, and we are confident we will be able to work together to produce a means for the institutional funding of Thoroughbred retirement so that all racehorses may lead dignified lives when their on-track careers come to a close. It is clearly critical, however, that those discussions begin now." Supporters hope the vote in both the Senate and the House demonstrates the public and congressional support for a permanent ban which could be achieved through the passage of the American Horse Slaughter Prevention Act. "The time has come to put an end to the practice of slaughtering horses in America," Sen. Ensign said. "Horses have an important role in the history of our country, particularly in the West, and they deserve protection. As a senator and a veterinarian I am committed to doing what I can for these magnificent animals." The American Horse Slaughter Prevention Act is sponsored in the House by Reps. John Sweeney (R-N.Y.), John Spratt (D-S.C.) and Ed Whitfield (R-Ky.) and is expected to be introduced shortly in the Senate by Sens. Ensign and Mary Landrieu (D-La.). The Act would prohibit the transport, purchase, selling or donation of both wild and domestic horses to be slaughtered for human consumption here and abroad.

**MIDWAY ROAD RETIRED TO LANE'S END** Multiple graded stakes winner **Midway Road** (Jade Hunter--Fleet Road, by Magesterial) has been retired from racing and will begin his stud career next season at Lane's End Farm near Versailles, Kentucky.

He will stand for \$5,000 live foal. A Lane's End homebred, the five-year-old won last year's GIII Fayette S. and set a Keeneland track record for nine furlongs in 1:46 3/5 while winning the GIII Ben Ali H. He was second in the 2003 GI Preakness S. and in the 2004 GI Pimlico Special H. "He's a horse we intended to stand all

along," said Will Farish. "We're very excited to have him return." On the board in 11 of 17 races, Midway Road retires with seven victories and earnings of \$695,060. The bay, produced by the stakes-winning Fleet Road is a half brother to three stakes winners: the good sprinter Tanja (Allen's Prospect), the Grade I-placed Tuzia (Blushing John), and Shanghied (A.P. Indy). "He's a grand-looking colt," Farish added. "He's got good conformation, and he's very correct in front."

**PURGE TO STAND AT VINERY** Multiple graded stakes winner **Purge** (Pulpit--Copelan's Bid Gal, by Copelan) will stand at Vinery in Lexington, Kentucky, for the 2006 breeding season.

Breeding interests in the four-year-old have been purchased by a group of breeders, including Vinery, in a deal brokered by agent Mike Ryan. Purge will continue to race for the partnership of Jack Wolf's Starlight Stables, Paul Saylor and Johns Martin before being retired at the end of

the current racing season. Under the tutelage of conditioner Todd Pletcher, Purge won the 2004 GII Peter Pan S. by 6 3/4 lengths and collected the GII Jim Dandy S. later that summer. "Purge's performances in the Jim Dandy and Peter Pan are as good as any three-year-old I have ever trained," said Pletcher. "He is well-balanced, good looking and a very athletic individual." Purge most recently romped by 12 lengths in a Monmouth allowance Aug. 7 before running third in the GIII Iselin Breeders' Cup H. Aug. 28.

## **FORMER NYRA CLERK OF THE SCALES INDICTED**

Former New York Racing Association racing officials Mario Sclafani and Braulio Baeza were indicted yesterday for allegedly misreporting the weights carried by jockeys in 67 races, including the GI Cigar Mile won by Lion Tamer, at Aqueduct, Belmont and Saratoga in 2004. Sclafani was the clerk of scales and Baeza was his assistant. The indictments, which were announced yesterday by the office of New York State Attorney General Eliot Spitzer, were unsealed in Saratoga County Court. On Jan. 12, Sclafani and Baeza were suspended indefinitely and have not worked at the NYRA tracks since. Yesterday, they were fired. In the statement released by Spitzer's office, it was alleged that the jockeys were carrying anywhere from 7 to 15 pounds more than the weights reported to the public. "These two officials basically had one job to do and that was to ensure that the weight of the jockeys was recorded accurately and then disclosed to bettors," Spitzer said in a statement. "Instead, they misled the public and compromised the integrity of races run by the NYRA." The scheme allegedly involved five jockeys --Robby Albarado, Heberto Castillo Jr., Jose Santos, Ariel Smith and Cornelio Velasquez. The jockeys will not face criminal charges, but the matter has been turned over to the New York State Racing and Wagering Board, which could assess penalties or fines against those involved. According to the indictment, 10 different stakes races were involved. Santos won the \$350,000 Cigar Mile aboard Lion Tamer, who was reportedly carrying 115 pounds. The indictment does not reveal exactly what weight Santos actually carried, but it says that he was at least five pounds overweight. Santos denied any wrongdoing yesterday. "If I can't do 115 pounds I ought to retire as a jockey," he said. "If I were going to cheat, I would go down in weight so I'd have a better chance of winning. What they're saying is impossible. I know weight is important and I know I need to be light. I take good care of myself and my weight is not a problem." According to a law enforcement source, there is no evidence that Baeza or Sclafani were attempting to personally benefit from misreporting weights or were placing bets on races based on their knowledge of the actual weights the jockeys were carrying. Rather, it may have been a case of them simply doing a favor for the riders involved.

In New York, jockeys must be taken off a mount if they are more than five pounds above the weight their mount has been assigned. Neither Sclafani nor Baeza returned phone calls seeking comment. The investigation was launched after NYRA officials tipped off the Attorney General's office. After the tip, law enforcement officials placed surveillance cameras in the jockey's room at the three New York tracks. The cameras recorded the actual weights of the jockeys when they stepped on the scales prior to the race. "NYRA initiated the investigation into these alleged improprieties two years ago and we have cooperated fully with all government and law enforcement agencies," said NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward said in a statement. "While we would certainly be disappointed if these allegations are true, we have clearly demonstrated that good conduct is good business throughout our entire organization. This is especially important in the racing department to protect all of our stakeholders and the integrity of Thoroughbred racing."

**Sam Houston Closes Facility Due to Hurricane Rita:**

Sam Houston Race Park in Houston, Texas, announced yesterday its simulcast facilities will be closed Thursday, Sept. 22, Friday Sept. 23 and Saturday, Sept. 24 because of the threat of Hurricane Rita, which yesterday reached Category 5 status as it built up momentum crossing the Gulf of Mexico. **Arlington Park 2006 Dates Announced:**

The Illinois Racing Board (IRB) has awarded Arlington Park near Chicago a total of 95 racing dates for the 2006 season, to run from Friday, May 5 through Thursday, Sept. 14. In addition, the IRB designated Arlington Park as the host track for simulcasting during dark days, when there is no racing in Illinois, from Jan. 3 to Feb. 8, 2006. Arlington officials were somewhat critical of the Racing Board's allotment of dates, which were announced Tuesday. "While licensees seldom receive what they request, we are disappointed not to be allotted more host time when there is no Thoroughbred racing in Illinois," said track president Cliff Goodrich. "Also, given our unmatched growth in average daily attendance, we would like to have seen more live days in September. Nevertheless, we are happy that the Racing Board awarded us an opening weekend that coincides with the Kentucky Oaks and Kentucky Derby."

**Declan's Moon to Miss Perryville:**

Last year's champion juvenile **Declan's Moon** (Malibu Moon), who has been sidelined since running his record to a perfect five-for-five in the Mar. 5 GII Santa Catalina S., will not make a scheduled start in the Oct. 14 GIII Perryville S. at Keeneland, trainer Ron Ellis revealed yesterday. The three-year-old gelding underwent knee surgery after the Santa Catalina. He worked four times over the Santa Anita main track in August, but has suffered a minor setback that will delay his return. "I worked him a couple easy half-miles and he came up a little body sore," trainer Ron Ellis told *The Blood-Horse*. "I've been gone for two weeks [while attending the Keeneland sale] and decided to just back off on him. He's been jogging every day, but I decided it was best to wait until I got back to [resume full training]." He added, "Right now I have no plans for him. If everything had gone OK, we were pointing to the Perryville, but now things are just on hold."

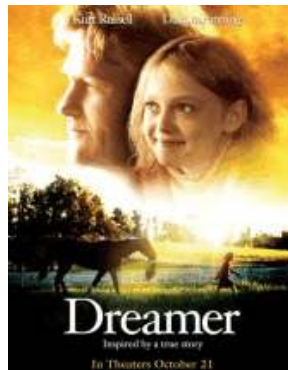
