KITTEN'S JOY SIDELINED

Last year's champion turf horse **Kitten's Joy** (El Prado {Ire}) will be evaluated by Dr. Larry Bramlage at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington after turning in a pair of subpar workouts, according to *The Blood-Horse*. Bramlage will examine the four-year-old's left knee, which was surgically repaired last fall. Owned by Ken and Sarah Ramsey, Kitten's Joy has raced twice this year, winning the GII Firecracker Breeders' Cup H. and finishing second in the GI Arlington Million. "After

his last work [five furlongs in 1:02.45 Sept. 12 at Belmont], we had Dr. Steve Allday examine him at Belmont and he didn't like what he saw in the knee," Ken Ramsey told *Blood-Horse*. "He didn't say 100 percent the horse was finished, but he did say he didn't think we could get him in shape for the [Oct. 1 GI] Joe Hirsch Turf Classic. So we're going to send him to Rood and Riddle to have him evaluated and a complete set of digital radiographs taken on the knee, and then we'll have Dr. Bramlage determine what the course of action should be. We should know something Sunday night or Monday morning." If the decision is made to retire Kitten's Joy, Ramsey said, "I'm 99 percent sure I'll stand him at my farm next year." To date, Kitten's Joy has finished on the board in 13 of 14 starts, with nine victories and earnings of \$2,075,791.

A daughter of Horse of the Year Tiznow attracted a session-high bid of \$375,000 as the marathon

Keeneland September Yearling Sale marched on yesterday in Lexington. The dark bay filly is the first foal out of the unraced Storm Cat mare Queen's Lady. Queen's Lady is a full sister to Contrive, the dam of Saturday's impressive GI Matron S. winner Folklore, who is also by Tiznow.

The yearling was consigned by Paramount Sales and Ben Glass was the winning bidder. Through 10 sessions, Keeneland has sold 2640 yearlings for \$371,287,200. The cumulative average is up 14.6 percent, to \$140,639, from a year ago, while the median is up 9.1 percent to \$60,000.

PICO CENTRAL RETIRED TO PADUA Pico Central

(Brz) (Spend a Buck--Sheila Purple {Brz}, by Purple Mountain) has been retired from racing and will begin his stud career next season at Padua Stables in Florida. The six-year-old, champion sprinter in Brazil and multiple Grade I winner in the U.S., will stand as the property of

a syndicate that includes Three Chimneys and Padua. Pico Central had been expected to start in the Oct. 1 GI Vosburgh H. and the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but was found to have inflammation in his left carpal sheath. "It's a minor injury, but this will prevent him from participating in the Vosburgh and he would not be 100 percent for the Breeders' Cup Sprint," explained trainer Paulo Lobo. "He's been a grand horse to train, but retirement is

the best thing." A five-time Grade I winner, Pico Central won last season's GI Metropolitan H., GI Vosburgh, GI Carter H. and GII San Carlos H. "We would have loved to see him run in the Breeders' Cup Sprint," said Padua's Satish Sanan. "But we are thrilled to have him coming to Padua. Pico Central will be the first Metropolitan Mile winner since Fappiano and In Reality to stand in Florida, and that makes him a tremendous opportunity for Florida breeders. His stud fee will be \$10,000 live foal, stands and nurse." Pico Central won five of eight North American starts for earnings of \$1,139,000.

WILD WONDER TO BUCK POND Wild Wonder (Wild Again--Carol's Wonder, by Pass the Tab), the sire of GI Del Mar Debutante winner Wild Fit as well as a session topper at the Keeneland September sale this week, has been purchased by Doug Arnold's Buck Pond Farm. The 11-year-old stallion had previously stood at Spendthrift Farm as the property of Winchell Thoroughbreds. The sire of 60 percent winners to starters, Wild Wonder has also been represented this year by GII San Vicente S. winner Fusaichi Rock Star, an \$825,000 two-year-old-in-training purchase who is a full brother to Wild Fit. Both horses were produced by Grannies Feather (At Full Feather). Wild Fit is scheduled to make her next start in the GII Oak Leaf S. at Santa Anita and is expected to be a top contender for the GI Alberto VO5 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Oct. 29. Wild Wonder, who set an Emerald Downs track record in winning the 1998 GIII Longacres Mile, was represented by a colt out of the Talinum mare Susie Do, which brought \$270,000 to top the Wednesday session at Keeneland. A stud fee will be announced at a later date.

Michael Watral, Prominent Owner/Breeder, Dies:

Michael Watral, who late in life became an influential owner, breeder and stallion owner, predominantly in New York, died Saturday, Sept. 17. He was 87. A native of the Empire State who grew up on the East Side of Manhattan before moving to Queens during the Great Depression, Watral spent time as a dairy farm owner in the 1930s and '40s. He later went into the construction business, eventually founding Watral & Sons Excavating. A member of the Central Islip Fire Department in Long Island for some 40 years, he rose to the positions of Chief and Commissioner of the department before retiring. In the mid-'80s, Watral, nearing his 70th birthday, began racing horses. Despite his late arrival on the racing scene, Watral made an immediate impact. His most notable runner was Dixie Brass, a \$40,000 OBSMAR purchase who went on to become the only three-year-old ever to win Belmont's GI Metropolitan H. and GII Withers S. The son of Dixieland Band stood five seasons in Kentucky and another four in New York before his untimely death in January of 2002. Watral is survived by sons Michael P., Paul, John, and Thomas and by daughters Anne Bedard, Mary Amico, and Jean, plus 16 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren.

Bill Would Make Horses Eligible for Emergency Funds:

Language making horses eligible for federal disaster assistance is now included in the USDA FY 2006 appropriations bill. The provision, added as an amendment offered by Senator Mitch McConnell (R-Ky), would be effective July 28 in order to cover losses suffered during Hurricane Katrina. The full bill still has to be passed by the Senate. The legislation would also repeal an outdated definition of livestock, which only includes "equine animals used for food or in the production of food." According to Jay Hickey, president of the American Horse Council, "This legislation would end the unfair discrimination of horses and make horse breeders and owners eligible for emergency assistance that producers of other crops and livestock have enjoyed. Broadening the current emergency assistance programs to include horses will rectify the unfair economic situation now facing horse owners and breeders versus other livestock producers in the aftermath of disasters."
