TAKING FLIGHT

If the forecast rain is not too heavy, Jaber Abdullah's **Flashy Wings (GB)** (Zafonic) will head to post as the standard bearer for today's G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket. After a successful debut at the Craven meeting Apr. 13, she followed up at Newbury May 13 before recording her third straight in the June 15 G2 Queen Mary S. at York's Royal Ascot meet. Her steep five-pound penalty for those exploits did not stop her from adding to her tally in the G2 Lowther S. at York Aug. 18, but she lost her unbeaten status in the Watership Down Stud Sales Race back at Newbury Sept. 17. Caught in the final

strides there, she was beaten just a neck, but connections are looking firmly ahead. "She got beat and that's horse racing," reflected trainer Mick Channon, who took this with Seazun (Ire) in 1999 and with Queen's Logic (Ire) in the Abdullah colors four years ago. "I'm not going to try and analyse it--she's perfect and has held her coat and is in good form. The only thing is the ground and it depends how much rain they get overnight, so we'll look at that in the morning. I'm very happy with her, so I'll let her do the talking."

ORBY CONCLUDES SUCCESSFULLY

Goffs Orby Million Sale maintained its solidity to the very end yesterday, turning the tide for a fixture that had seemed to be on the slide in recent years. Eimear Mulhern's new team achieved the results they hoped for with a blend of hard work and the creation of the sales races due to be run for the first time next September. For most buyers, the prospect of scooping some of the €2.4 million in prize money on offer in the Goffs Million and Fillies Five Hundred loomed large on the horizon. For Managing Director Matt Mitchell, this played a big part in achieving a cumulative average of €99,455 and median of €65,000 for the new Orby Million. "The sale has exceeded our wildest dreams," he said at the end of a third ground-breaking session. "Vendors have been rewarded by coming to us and 166 horses sold for more than €100,000, which is an unbelievable result. The sales races played a big part and have excited people who aren't normally into flat racing to take part." **Goffs coverage cont. p2-3**

Coolmore Dominate...

After the huge part played by Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum over the first two days, the final day belonged to some of Coolmore's finest stallions, past and present, who accounted for the top eight colts. Head and shoulders above the rest was hip 578, the Galileo (Ire) 3/4-brother to the G1 Phoenix S. heroine Damson (Ire) from Denis Brosnan's Croom House Stud. Introduced by Nick Nugent as "one of the nicest--if not the nicest--horse in the sale," the bidding opened at €200,000 and Matt Mitchell provided the opposition to John Magnier and Demi O'Byrne as he took instructions by phone. Nevertheless, it was O'Byrne who won the day with a deciding bid of €950,000. "He is very special and his sister was very good," O'Byrne said of the colt, who is also a 3/4-brother to the G3 Prestige S. winner Geminiani (Ire) and whose family includes this year's G2 Flying Childers S. winner Godfrey Street (GB) and last year's G3 Norfolk S. victor Blue Dakota (Ire). "He was probably the best horse in the sale," added O'Byrne.

O'Byrne Buys Marju Filly...

Tuesday's second session of the Goffs sale found Dr. Demi O'Byrne going to €75,000 for hip 343, a Marju (Ire) filly hailing from Derrygrath Stud's draft. It was the first time during the sale that the Coolmore team purchased a youngster by a stallion standing at a farm owned by a Maktoum brother. Marju stands at Derrinstown Stud in Co. Kildare, Ireland, which is owned by Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum.

The Danehill Factor...

Trainer Tom Taaffe had already been delving deep during the second session when he went to €325,000 for a filly by Danehill Dancer (Ire), and he was in for the kill again yesterday securing the top-priced filly of the sale. By Danehill out of Peach Out of Reach (Ire), a Listed-winning half sister to Pilsudski (Ire) and Fine Motion (Ire), hip 444 was knocked down for €660,000. The Irish-bred yearling had received a significant update on Saturday when Briolette (Ire), another half to her dam, chased home Ouija Board (GB) when runner-up in the G3 Princess Royal S. at Newmarket. "She has a collector's item pedigree and is one of the last of the Danehills," Taaffe explained. "Briolette has come up in the pedigree since the weekend and she was bought with a view to her residual value. It's a hard page to get and she is a smashing individual." Danehill was dominant throughout the trading and hip 500 was one of several of the Camas Park Stud draft in demand. Out of the G3 Princess Margaret S. winner Sainly Speech, he is a full-sibling to the smart juvenile Pure Illusion (Ire) and was acquired by Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock for €620,000. "He is for an existing American client, but I can't say for whom, or where he'll be trained," he said. "He is a gorgeous horse with a great page and he is one of the last of the Danehills." Coolmore's much lamented sire was also responsible for Huma Park Stud's hip 536, a March-foaled half-brother to Dehere who sold to the Hong Kong Jockey Club for €360,000; and hip 434, out of a half-sister to the G1 Epsom Derby hero Erhaab who has produced GSW Haami. Consigned by Paul Shanahan's Ashtown House Stud, she was purchased by Bobby O'Ryan for €320,000.

Bubbling Under...

It was a strong session for the sale's leading vendor, Camas Park Stud, and their Johannesburg offering, hip 606, was snapped up by Bobby O'Ryan on behalf of Howard Johnson. The half-brother to GSW Tour of the Cat from the family of Editor's Note and Hold that Tiger realised €475,000. Timmy Hyde's nursery was also responsible for the second highest-priced filly when Hugo Merry went to €340,000 for hip 465, a Grand Lodge half-sister to two stakes performers. Her second dam is the G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine Pass the Peace (Ire), producer of the champion juvenile Embassy (GB) and G2 Pretty Polly S. winner Tarfshi (GB). Rachel Bennett consigned hip 539, a Sadler's Wells half-brother to the G2 Dante S. runner-up Celtic Silence (GB) from a smart American family, who achieved a final bid of €380,000 from James Delahooke. Two lots later it was the in-demand freshman Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) who was back in the spotlight when his February-foaled half-brother to the G2 Pretty Polly S. runner-up Snippets (Ire) appeared in the ring. Demi O'Byrne was pushed to €370,000 to collect the offering from Eddie O'Leary's Lynn Lodge Stud, whose dam is a half to the G1 Prix Vermeille heroine Pearly Shells (GB).

Killybegs, third in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster last time Sept. 9, faces a host of unexposed types including **Stepping Up**, who opened up and ran away with a Newcastle maiden on debut Sept. 5; and **Araafa**, who finished second in a strong renewal of the Listed Acomb S. when last seen at York Aug. 16.

Cheveley Park S. cont.

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's **Nidhaal (Ire)** (Observatory) followed an impressive July 7 debut success on the July course with a fine second in the G3 Princess Margaret S. at Newbury July 23, having raced away from the winner **Mixed Blessing (Ire)**. She took the Listed Dick Poole Fillies' S. in facile fashion last time Sept. 1 and conditioner Ed Dunlop is hopeful of her chances in this spot. "She's in good form and I think she's unlucky to be beaten," he commented. "There is a lot of rain coming in, but she's a small, powerful filly and handled tacky ground at Newmarket first time. She needs to improve, but seems well and deserves to be there." Though John Lambton's **Wake up Maggie (Ire)** (Xaar {GB}) has not been tried at stakes level, her form holds up the closest inspection. Having chased the subsequent G2 Flying Childers S. winner Godfrey Street (GB) in a conditions race on Lingfield's polytrack Aug. 5, she bested the eventual G2 Mill Reef S. winner Cool Creek (Ire) and G1 Moyglare Stud S. runner-up Ugo Fire (Ire) in the Tattersalls Ireland Sale S. at The Curragh on her latest start Aug. 20. "The form's pretty solid and, hopefully, she'll repeat her best," trainer Chris Wall said yesterday. "Unfortunately, she picked up a throat infection after Ireland and we had to wait for it to clear up, but I'm fairly confident that she's close to her best even though I'd like to have given her one more gallop. She seems in good heart and on good terms with herself and is giving all the right vibes."

Saratoga and three other graded stakes, emerged from a Sept. 27 workout with a torn tendon in her right foreleg and has been retired. The four-year-old breezed four furlongs in :49 2/5 at Belmont in advance of Saturday's G1 Beldame S., but was found to have suffered the injury after taking a few bad steps pulling up after the move.

"She's got a couple of tears in the upper third of the tendon, which spells retirement," trainer Neil Howard told *Daily Racing Form*. "It's not horrible, but a filly like this, the way she's come around as of late, there's not even a question." A threat on both turf and dirt, Shadow Cast had put together a sterling 2005 campaign, winning the GIII Bayou Breeders' Cup H. on the sod and the GII Louisville Breeders' Cup H. over the main track, then took her biggest prize upsetting Ashado in the Personal Ensign. Shadow Cast concludes her career with a record of 21-9-1-6, and earnings of \$923,751. According to published reports, she may be bred to Lane's End's leading sire A.P. Indy.

KINANE BOOKED FOR SCORPION Michael Kinane will partner Susan Magnier's **Scorpion (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp, just three days after returning to the saddle from injury. Forced onto the sidelines with a fractured right wrist after a fall at The Curragh last month, he will be back at Newmarket tomorrow before heading off to Paris for the ride on the G1 Grand Prix de Paris and G1 St Leger winner. "The plan is to run Scorpion in the Arc, subject to everything being okay with him later in the week," trainer Aidan O'Brien told *Racing Post*. "We've been happy with him since his win in the St Leger and he's in good form." Kinane will have an action-packed Saturday, as he is booked to ride His Highness the Aga Khan's G3 Minstrel S. and G3 Desmond S. winner **Caradak (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}) in the G1 Prix de la Foret, G2 Park Hill S. runner-up **Kastoria (Ire)** (Selkirk) in the G2 Prix de Royallieu and Listed Kilternan S. scorer **Alayan (Ire)** (Sri Pekan) in the G2 Prix Dollar.

OUIJA BOARD HAS HONG KONG OPTION Lord Derby's **Ouija Board (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), who remains on course for the Oct. 29 G1 Breeders' Cup F/M Turf at Belmont, may tackle the Hong Kong Invitational meeting at Sha Tin Dec. 12. Trainer Ed Dunlop revealed that last year's dual Oaks heroine had been nominated to the G1 Hong Kong Cup and G1 Hong Kong Vase yesterday. "Japan and Hong Kong are options later on, but I'd be leaning towards Hong Kong," Dunlop commented. "She's proven she has trained on and is a fresh filly." Having made a successful return from injury to win Saturday's G3 Princess Royal S. at Newmarket, the four-year-old will be prepared for a bid to win back-to-back renewals of the Breeders' Cup event after the possibility of a weekend outing at Longchamp was shelved. "I was particularly pleased that she won so impressively and, hopefully, all her problems are over," Dunlop added. "She's come out of the race incredibly well and didn't lose a huge amount of weight. She cantered this morning and looks fantastic. She has a phenomenal amount of speed for a staying filly and her great skill is her tactical speed, but she's much lazier than she was and when she hits the front she thinks she doesn't need to do anymore. With only eight days between races, we decided not to go to Longchamp and take any risks, so she'll probably ship to America a week before and we'll mimic what we did last year. The ground is a concern, as it can be on the slow side, but she seemed to handle it at Texas after the rain last year and we'd only not run if it was like a road, which it won't be."

SONG OVER FOR THE SEASON The Elite Racing Club's **Soviet Song (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) will miss the Breeders' Cup after connections revealed that a foot problem will rule her out for the year. James Fanshawe and representatives from the syndicate are set to discuss the future of the five-year-old at the weekend. "She won't run again this year," Elite's Racing Manager Matthew Budden told *PA Sport* yesterday. "She's had a sore foot which has held her up. The bruising's been slow to come out, so James has been unable to get her ready in time. There is no decision on her future as yet. James and I will chat about it over the weekend." Soviet Song, who recorded her fifth Group 1 success in the July 5 G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket, has not raced since finishing runner-up in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 27. "It's a pity as she looked as good, if not better than ever, when winning the Falmouth S. for a second time and then she was unlucky in the Sussex," Budden added.
