WEST MEETS EAST IN GOLD CUP

A trio of California-based four-year-olds square off against five runners stabled on the other side of the country in this afternoon's \$1-million GI Jockey Club Gold Cup S. at Belmont Park. With pro-tem divisional leader Saint Liam just training up to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in four weeks' time, favoritism in today's 10-furlong event could fall to Melnyk Racing Stable's **Flower Alley** (Distorted Humor), who looks to give his sire a second consecutive victory in this. The progressive colt has emerged from the pack with victories against his peers in the GI Jim Dandy S. July 30 and the GI Travers S. Aug. 27, but tries older horses for the first time in the Gold Cup. **Cont. p2**

QUINZE YOU FEEL IT?

A field of 15 of Europe's best middle-distance runners was drawn yesterday for Sunday's €1.8-million G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp. His Highness the Aga Khan's G1 Irish Oaks heroine **Shawanda (Ire)**

(Sinndar {Ire}), breaking from the fence in one, will bid to become the first filly to triumph since Urban Sea in 1993. No sophomore of that sex has won since her owner-breeder's Akiyda (GB) scored in 1982, but Shawanda looked special during her five-length Curragh romp and warmed

up with a facile score in the G1 Prix Vermeille over course and distance last time Sept. 11. The famous emerald green silks have been carried to success three times, including by Shawanda's sire Sinndar in 2000, and he sees similarities between them. "First of all, she looks like him and she has a way of galloping that makes me think of Sinndar," he said. "He had a remarkable stride and although you didn't see him accelerate, he did." **Cont. p4-5**

Respect for Your Elders?...

Having acquitted himself quite successfully against his classmates, it's time to see whether **Flower Alley** can take his game to the next level. "When you get to October, it's generally the right time of year to try three-year-olds against older horses," said Pletcher, who has yet to win the Gold Cup. "That part of it we're not overly concerned about. The kind of races he ran in the Jim Dandy and Travers--we don't necessarily need to improve." A berth in the Classic lies in the balance for some of today's entrants, but not Flower Alley. "As far as I'm concerned, he's going to the Classic as long as he comes out of the Gold Cup in good shape," Pletcher added. "He already deserves a chance in there, so we're not looking at the Gold Cup as a place to earn the right to go into the Breeders' Cup." Sophomore colts have won four of the last 16 runnings of the Gold Cup, including 2000 winner Albert the Great, whose owner Tracy Farmer is represented this afternoon by GII Pennsylvania Derby winner **Sun King** (Charismatic).

In the Flow...

Despite being vanned off following his third-place finish in the GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar Aug. 21, **Lava Man** (Slew City Slew) looms the biggest threat to Flower Alley. The runner-up to Rock Hard Ten in the GI Malibu S. last December, the dark bay was unplaced in three restricted stakes tries, but has since rattled off three wins from his last four starts. He posted an 8 3/4-length tour-de-force over **Borrego** (El Prado {Ire}) in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup July 9 (120 Beyer) before his latest, where he was beaten 3/4 of a length by Borrego. **Imperialism** (Langfuhr) is the third of the Golden State trio and connections look to get a read on his Breeders' Cup credentials. A nose second to Rock Hard Ten in the GII Strub S. in February, the gray was seventh to that foe in the GI Santa Anita H. the following month before being sidelined. He returned to action with a last-to-first victory in the seven-furlong GII Pat O'Brien Breeders' Cup H. Aug. 21 and earns a trip to the Breeders' Cup Classic with a solid performance this afternoon.

Amadeus Wolf scored on debut at Ayr May 26 before finishing third behind Red Clubs in the June 14 G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot at York. He found the subsequent G2 Richmond S. third Mullaad (Ire) too strong in a conditions race at Chester July 8, but rebounded off a break to turn the tables on Red Clubs receiving five pounds in the Gimcrack last time. Trainer Kevin Ryan was not surprised that he had made the subsequent improvement to deny his arch rival on level terms. "He has improved as the year has gone on and is a stronger horse than at York," Ryan explained. "We gave him a nice break and he's proved he's a good horse. He won't run again this year and we'll have to give the G1 2000 Guineas a go." Amadeus Wolf was bought back for 50,000gns at TATAPR earlier this year. His jockey is convinced he will see out the mile next May. "He's a proper horse and I think he has the ability and scope to stay a mile, so he's definitely a Guineas contender now," he said. "I wasn't worried about the ground and when they went a nice pace I knew he'd stay, as he's straightforward." Trainer Barry Hills was hardly disappointed with the effort of Red Clubs. "It's no good making excuses after the race, but he's a horse that needs ground with a bit more life in it," he commented. "He's a good horse. If he runs again [this year] it will be in the [Oct. 15] G1 Dewhurst S., otherwise that will be it." Aidan O'Brien, who was forced to scratch Art Museum (Storm Cat) due to a stone bruise, was out of luck with the 2-1 pick Ivan Denisovich (Ire) (Danehill), who failed to pick up in the rain-softened ground before staying on at one pace into fourth.

After a fetching debut success at this meeting 12 months ago, Rob Roy was the talk of the town this spring, when sterling homework saw him take precedence in the ante-post lists for the G1 2000 Guineas. He kept the dream alive with a strong-finishing second in the G3 Craven S. over course and distance Apr. 14, but beat no rivals in the mile Classic 16 days later and returned lame. Coaxed back to the track for a Doncaster conditions race Sept. 9, he failed to threaten in the testing ground when only third, but built on that effort to deliver on his early promise. Placed up with the early pace by Michael Kinane, he grabbed the lead at the eighth pole and pulled away from Ancient World on the uphill rise to the line. "He's very honest and today he was just a bit rusty--when Mick got hold of him he was really going away at the end," said winning trainer Sir Michael Stoute. "I'd like to turn him out now and let him forget about it and next year he'll be better over a mile and a quarter."

Damoiselle took five starts to get off the mark, but the penny dropped in first-time blinkers when winning a conditions race at Longchamp last time Sept. 11. Breaking smartly here, she disputed the early lead before asserting inside the final quarter and dug in when pressed on either side in the closing stages by Sweet Travel and Azylea. "I've always thought she was a nice filly and she has never stopped improving," trainer Freddie Head said. "She is better on a straight course as she is a huge filly with a lot of speed, so the trip today was perfect. She's done a lot this year, so with only the [Nov. 1] G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte coming up, she will most probably be put away for next year." [Click for the Racing Post chart.](#)

Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe

DERBY WINNERS CLASH IN ARC Tomorrow's showpiece will feature a strong contingent of sophomore colts including Michael Tabor's G1 Irish Derby hero **Hurricane Run (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who was drawn in stall six; and the Royal Ascot Racing Club's G1 Epsom Derby winner **Motivator (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), due to exit from the eight hole. The Niarchos Family's **Bago (Fr)** (Nashwan) faces no mean feat from an outside post in 13 attempting to emulate Alleged in winning back-to-back renewals in 1977 and 1978. He would be a fitting successor, having been crowned a champion at two and three, and held his own in some tough encounters this term. After a return score in the Apr. 24 G1 Prix Ganay here, he ran second to Grey Swallow (Ire) in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh May 22 and third behind Alkaased in the June 26 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. He filled the same spot behind Azamour (Ire) in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. on his last start at Newbury July 23 and is back on home soil after a freshener. "Everything's fine and, being a year older, he's a bit stronger," trainer Jonathan Pease told the *Racing Post*. "I feel Bago is as well as he was this time last year, but the opposition might be different." Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's **Mubtaker** (Silver Hawk) is back for another bite of the cherry, having been denied by Dalakhani (Ire) two years ago. He has been brought steadily back to form by Marcus Tregoning and has won his last three, culminating in Sunday's exploits in the G3 Cumberland Lodge S. at Newmarket. "He's in great form and I'm pleased with the draw in nine," jockey Richard Hills said yesterday. "There are a lot of pacemakers in the race and he likes to run his race at his pace, so I'd rather be there than be penned in on the inside. He's been round there once before, so we just need to go one better, and let's hope they get the rain."

Alkaased Drops Out...

Mike Charlton's **Alkaased** (Kingmambo) after the five-year-old was taken out of Arc consideration due to a minor setback. Trainer Luca Cumani revealed that the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud winner had an infected leg after sustaining a cut. "He has a little cut on his leg and despite all the preventative measures, it has become infected," he told *PA Sport* yesterday. "The horse was sore when he pulled out this morning and with the rules on medication you can use, we can't get it right by Sunday, so we have just had to grit our teeth. It is only a small problem, but unfortunately we have had to take him out." Cumani added that the five-year-old would contest either the Oct. 29 GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Belmont or G1 Champion S. at Newmarket Oct. 15.

Trainer Bill Mott has won the Turf Classic just once in its 29-year history, saddling Theatrical (Ire) to the victory in 1987. **Shakespeare**, an undefeated son of the latter and 1991 Flower Bowl winner Lady Shirl, looks to punch his ticket to the Breeders' Cup Turf, a race in which his sire followed up. After winning his first two starts last year, Shakespeare has been nothing short of spectacular this summer and turned in a track-record setting performance in his latest, taking the nine-furlong GII Belmont Breeders' Cup H. in 1:45. "I really like him. He really gives me the chills," said jockey Jerry Bailey. One question surrounding the colt is his ability to stay this afternoon's trip, but Bailey is among the believers. "He surprised me the way he relaxed," he commented. "The way he settled the other day, I don't think [the distance] will be a problem." **English Channel** won the GIII Virginia Derby over 10 furlongs July 16, but found himself on the lead in the GI Secretariat S. Aug. 13 and succumbed late to finish second. "He's better when he's covered up, but there doesn't appear to be much speed in the Turf Classic," trainer Todd Pletcher commented. "It's going to be a fine line between not strangling him to death and getting him to relax, keeping him covered up."

Jockey Jerry Bailey, who guided Imperial Gesture to victory in this race in 2002 and came back to win it with Sightseek in 2003, looks to make it three out of four with unbeaten **Sweet Symphony** this afternoon. A maiden winner in her May 12 debut at Belmont Park, the three-year-old teamed with Bailey for the first time in an allowance test June 24 and came home six lengths in front. She made it three-for-three in a Saratoga allowance test July 28, then jumped right into Grade I company and cruised to a 6 1/4-length victory in the Aug. 20 Alabama S. "She's taken everything that's been thrown at her," Bailey said. "She's done it all without flinching. She hasn't been able to take advantage of perfect scenarios in any of her races and she's earned everything she's gotten. I know it's a tough race against older fillies, but I expect her to step up." The Kinsman homebred takes on reigning champion **Ashado**. The four-year-old was beaten in her first two starts this term, but returned to form with a front-running score in the June 18 GI Ogden Phipps H. She looked every inch the champ when taking the July 31 GI Go for Wand H. by 9 1/2 lengths, but faded in the Aug. 26 GI Personal Ensign H. and finished a well-beaten fourth. The filly came out of it with a bruised foot, and trainer Todd Pletcher is ready to throw out the race. "To me, that day, she never looked like she was going well," he said. "Having watched her run so many times, she's usually got a certain posture where her neck's bowed a little bit and she's on the bridle. She wasn't dragging [jockey John Velazquez]." But Ashado has rebounded from that effort. "She looks good and she's trained well," Pletcher said. "We've got to forgive her for one bad race and try again." Second in the Beldame last year, **Society Selection** has two wins and four seconds from her seven starts at Belmont. She comes off a runner-up finish in the Sept. 11 GI Ruffian H.

It's been nearly 20 years since a domestically based sophomore filly has landed this prestigious event, but **Melhor Ainda** could snap that streak this afternoon. The winner of her first four career outings, including this track's Gill Sands Point S. June 5, the bay could not quite overcome a tough trip and a classy Japanese invader in Cesario (Jpn) when second over this distance in the GI American Oaks July 3. The TNT Stud runner never got to fire her best shot when blocked for most of the stretch in the GI Beverly D. S. Aug. 13, but flew home to be third by a half length to **Angara**. "Finally, when things opened up, she just missed winning," said jockey John Velazquez. "I tell you what: if she repeats that race, she's going to be very tough to beat." **Sand Springs** figures to be the controlling speed of the race and she need only handle today's trip to continue her winning ways. The dark bay has won three of five this season and two straight, including the one-mile Gil Just a Game BC H. June 11 and the GI Diana S. over nine panels July 30. **Riskaverse**, the defending champion of this event, and **Wonder Again**, sixth as the odds-on favorite last year, are each in search of their first victory in 2005.

Even with the unbeaten sprinting sensation Lost in the Fog sitting this out for a tilt in today's Bay Meadows Speed H., a Breeders' Cup caliber field of 10 will line up for this wide-open event, with **Woke Up Dreamin** leading the way. The five-year-old has improved dramatically this season since finishing seventh in the GIII Palos Verdes H. in January. The Bob Baffert trainee got on track with consecutive tallies at Santa Anita Feb. 9 and Apr. 1, then ran a respectable third in the GIII Los Angeles Times H. at Hollywood May 14. Shipped to Belmont for his next start, the Mike Pegram colorbearer had no problem defeating a field of 10 in the GII True North Breeders' Cup H. June 11 and followed up with an equally-impressive score in Calder's GII Smile Sprint H. last out July 10. **Pomeroy** was certainly on top of his game last time, notching the GII Alfred G Vanderbilt H. at the Spa Aug. 13. Given a 114 Beyer Speed Figure for that performance, he seeks his third straight tally after notching a Monmouth optional claimer in his prior start July 10. With so much speed entered, Californian invader **Taste of Paradise** should enjoy a perfect trip sitting off the pace. The six-year-old finished third in his last two starts, the GI Bing Crosby H. July 31 and the GII Pat O'Brien Breeders' Cup H. Aug. 21. "He certainly has no one over a barrel, but I think I'm bringing the right kind of horse into the Vosburgh because he can stalk and pounce," trainer Gary Mandella commented. With the news of the retirement of Attraction (GB) still fresh, **Chic** has a prime opportunity to emerge from her shadow and gain a victory at the highest level. Denied a neck by that rival in a memorable renewal 12 months ago, the chestnut showed she retained her ability when besting Majors Cast (Ire) to win back-to-back renewals of the Aug. 28 G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood. Delayed riding tactics were blamed for her defeat when 3/4-length second to Attraction in the G1 Matron S. at Leopardstown last time Sept. 10 and she sets the standard on that form. She is joined by stable companions **Peeress**, who followed success in the June 15 G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot at York with a fine third to Soviet Song (Ire) in the G1 Falmouth S. when last seen July 5; and **Favourable Terms**. Last year's Windsor Forest and G1 Nassau S. heroine, who made a successful belated return in the Listed Sceptre S. over seven furlongs at Doncaster Sept. 8, provides Sir Michael Stoute with strong claims to his second renewal. "Chic seems in good form and she'll like the ground, but the other two fillies are in good shape as well, so let's hope one of them win," the Freemason Lodge conditioner said yesterday. Three-year-olds have dominated this race since it was opened up to the older fillies and mares in 1974, with their elders prevailing just three times. Heading the sophomore challenge is **Maids Causeway**, who makes her eagerly awaited return to the track after a layoff enforced by injury sustained during her heroic success in the June 17 G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot at York. That was a richly deserved first Group 1 score for the game filly, who had split Playful Act (Ire) and Dash to the Top (GB) in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Ascot last September before winning the G2 Rockfel S. at this track the following month. She was a 2 1/2-length runner-up to **Virginia Waters** in the May 1 G1 1000 Guineas on her return here before finishing fifth in the Irish equivalent at The Curragh May 22. Virginia Waters comes here off a third in the Matron and jockey Kieren Fallon is hoping for the best. "I know Aidan [O'Brien] is confident and he thinks she is better than she was at Leopardstown," he said. "I liked her at Leopardstown as she came back to herself again after having an off mid-season."

Rock Hard Ten has been beaten only once at Santa Anita, finishing second by a head in the GI Santa Anita Derby before being DQ'd and placed third. The four-year-old capped his 2004 campaign with a victory in the Dec. 26 GI Malibu S. and opened 2005 with a nose decision in the Feb. 5 GII Strub S. He has been sidelined since making it three in a row in the Mar. 5 GI Santa Anita H., but has been posting solid works, including a bullet seven panels in 1:26 1/5 at Santa Anita Sept. 22 and a three-furlong blowout in :34 4/5 six days later. "He's as good as we're going to get," trainer Richard Mandella said. "He couldn't be better. He's come along great, but he'll have to run good [today] and I expect him to." "It's going to be a good test for him," commented trainer Bob Baffert. "It's a tough race, but he's training great, so we'll see what happens." The late-running **Choctaw Nation** has won three of his four starts at Santa Anita, and bounced back from a four-race losing streak to take the July 24 GII San Diego H. at Del Mar. Scrappy T is perhaps best known as the horse that ducked out turning for home in the GI Preakness S. May 21, nearly knocking down Afleet Alex before that one righted himself and went on to take the second leg of the Triple Crown. But that dubious claim shouldn't overshadow what the gelding has accomplished. Winner of the Count Fleet S. in January, Scrappy T ran third to Bellamy Road in the GI Wood Memorial S., won the GIII Withers S. in May and had five lengths on Derby winner Giacomo when runner-up in the Preakness. He has lived up to his name by being first or second in eight of 10 and, with a plenty of tactical speed, should be able to lay just off the pace of **Thor's Echo**. **Greater Good's** late-running style has propelled him to victory in five of his nine starts, including a trio of graded efforts. Afleet Alex suffered a condylar fracture of his left-front cannon bone while preparing for a start in the GI Haskell Invitational H. and a screw was surgically inserted shortly thereafter. Ritchey has been pleased with the colt's progress. "I was sitting on the pony on the backstretch and he didn't show any stress from the injury at all," he said. "I expected him to be blowing much harder than he was after pulling up, being that it was his first work in two months." Afleet Alex is scheduled to work again next week and could have a prep race the weekend of Oct. 15 and 16, which would give him two weeks to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

Katrina Victims Nominated for White Horse Award:

Luis Pomes, who lost his home, his farm and 26 horses to Hurricane Katrina, but put aside his own tragedy to rescue horses that had been abandoned, has been nominated for the Racetrack Chaplaincy of America's 2005 White Horse Award. Pomes, 43, was stranded on the top of a building when Katrina struck Aug. 29, and was rescued the next morning. His home had been destroyed and all of his horses had drowned, but, instead of evacuating, he brought stranded horses to high ground, gathered hay and drove miles to fill containers with water, then delivered it to the abandoned animals. It took 10 days before veterinarians and a team from Louisiana State University arrived to take the horses to their Baton Rouge campus. According to LSU officials, Pomes had saved more than 100 horses. "I have never left an animal in my life," Pomes said. "It ain't gonna happen. I'm not a hero, just an animal lover." The four finalists for the White Horse Award will each receive an all-expense paid trip to the Oct. 29 Breeders' Cup at Belmont Park. The winner gets \$5,000 and a bronze trophy, while the three runners-up will get \$1,000 apiece.
